Sweden currently top of UEFA Fair Play ranking

Thirteen countries in contention for three UEFA Cup places

UEFA's Fair Play ranking, based on all UEFA competition matches played, at both club and national team level, between 1 June 2003 and 31 May 2004, is currently headed by Sweden. If they can hang on to the top spot until the end of the season, they will be rewarded with an additional place in the first qualifying round of the 2004/05 UEFA Cup. The current ranking list takes into account matches up to and including 31 December 2003.

Once the UEFA Fair Play ranking is finalised at the end of the season, all national associations who have attained an average of eight points or more will go into a draw to determine which two countries will have the right, along with the outright winner, to enter an additional team for next season's UEFA Cup. At the moment, leaders Sweden and another twelve national associations are above this 'pass mark'. However, any associations ranked with less than eight points today, could still join this draw for the two UEFA Cup places, should their Fair Play record improve by the end of the season and they reach at least 8 points.

The UEFA Fair Play ranking only takes into account national associations that have played a reasonable number of games. For the purposes of the attached list, a cut-off point of twenty-two matches has been applied.

The Fair Play coefficient is based on criteria such as positive play, respect of the opponent, respect of the referee, behaviour of the crowd and of the team officials as well as cautions and dismissals.

The three associations which are allocated an additional UEFA Cup place will be entitled to enter the club that has won the domestic top-division Fair Play competition. If this club has already qualified for a UEFA club competition the second-placed team in the domestic competition may be entered and, should they also have already qualified, the third-placed team would be considered and so forth.

It is even possible for a team that has been relegated to the second highest division to qualify for the UEFA Cup, as a result of its exemplary Fair Play conduct during the domestic championship.
