**UEFA CHAMPIONS LEAGUE
GROUP D, MATCHDAY 1**

ROSENBERG BK v INTERNAZIONALE FC

Rosenborg BK are laying a new milestone by starting their eighth consecutive season in the UEFA Champions League – and they could hardly wish for a more spectacular opening fixture than the one that pits them against Internazionale FC, led by Héctor Cúper who took Valencia CF to two successive finals and who now returns to the UEFA Champions League at the helm of the Italian club. While the Norwegian hosts have been assiduous participants in Europe's top club competition, the Italian visitors are preparing to start their second-ever UEFA Champions League campaign and their first match in the competition since they were eliminated by the eventual champions, Manchester United FC, in the quarter-finals of the 1998/99 campaign.

- ❖ Rosenborg BK have never beaten Italian opposition at the Lerkendal stadium. Indeed, their only victory against an Italian side was the famous one at San Siro in 1996 when they beat Milan AC and eliminated them from the competition. At home, the Norwegians have been beaten 2-1 by Sampdoria UC and 4-1 by Milan AC prior to registering three 1-1 draws with Juventus FC.
- ❖ This is the first direct confrontation between the two clubs and, for Inter, only the second visit to Norway. The first was 24 years ago, when the Italians recorded a 2-1 victory over FK Bodø/Glimt.
- ❖ Sergio Conceição, however, is no stranger. He played against Rosenborg BK during his time at FC Porto. The financial conditions for the 2002/03 UEFA Champions League campaign remain essentially unchanged in relation to last season.
- ❖ Rosenborg BK booked their place in the group with a 4-2 aggregate third qualifying round defeat of Danish champions Brøndby IF.
- ❖ After a 1-0 home victory, Rosenborg BK negotiated a tricky trip to Denmark with two goals from Frode Johnsen and a third from Harald Brattbakk to clinch a 3-2 win.
- ❖ Rosenborg BK go into this match having seen their seven-game winning streak in the Norwegian League come to an end on Saturday.
- ❖ The Norwegian champions were held 1-1 by Vålerenga at Lerkendal who scored an injury time equaliser. This is particularly ironic for Rosenborg who have specialised in winning matches with late goals.
- ❖ Harald Brattbakk scored the Rosenborg BK goal to take his tally to 14 – he currently tops the domestic league scoring charts.
- ❖ Rosenborg BK team was: Arason; Strand (Karadas), Basma, Hoftun, Saarinen (Stensaas 81); Inge Olsen, Skammelsrud, Berg; Ludvigsen (Enerly 74), Johnsen and Brattbakk.
- ❖ There are four weeks to go in the Norwegian League and Rosenborg BK face a tough time to retain their crown in what is one of the closest domestic finishes for years.
- ❖ Oslo side Lyn are one point behind them and Molde are only three points further adrift.
- ❖ Rosenborg BK will be assured of capacity support in all of their games at Lerkendal. All three home group games are already sold out to home supporters with three capacity 21,000 crowds expected.

ROSENBERG BK – INTERNAZIONALE FC

- ❖ New coach Age Hareide does not officially take over until January 1 but has been getting in some advance work.
- ❖ The former Brøndby IF coach went on a spying mission at the weekend to see Internazionale earn a 1-0 victory over Torino.
- ❖ Rosenborg BK assistant coach Ola By Rise said “none of the sides in our group are unbeatable. We were bound to face some stiff opposition due to our low seeding.”
- ❖ Internazionale take their place in the group after coming through a potentially difficult third qualifying round tie with Sporting Club de Portugal.
- ❖ The Portugese side were unbeaten in 33 matches going into the tie but Héctor Cúper’s side did the hard work with a goalless draw in Lisbon.
- ❖ Goals in the San Siro Stadium in the return leg from Luigi Di Biagio and Uruguayan Alvaro Recoba in the opening 45 minutes paved the way for a 2-0 victory.
- ❖ The Milan club will have to make do without Brazilian World Cup winner Ronaldo who was the subject of a summer transfer to Real Madrid CF.
- ❖ But they have an excellent replacement in Argentinian international Hernán Crespo who has joined the club from S.S. Lazio and who made his debut against Torino Calcio on Saturday, forming a striking partnership with Christian Vieri.
- ❖ Internazionale made up for lost time with the delayed start to the Italian Serie A season with a 1-0 win on Saturday in front of a 66,134 crowd at the San Siro stadium.
- ❖ International striker Christian Vieri scored the only goal of the game in the 23rd minute.
- ❖ The Internazionale team was: Toldo; Córdoba, Cannavaro, Materazzi, Coco; Javier Zanetti, Di Biagio (Almeyda 65), Dalmat, Recoba (Emre 87); Crespo, Vieri. The unused subs were Fontana, Vivas, Adani, Pasquale and Conceição.
- ❖ Serie A matches started several weeks late as a result of the lack of an agreement over television broadcast contracts affecting many clubs.
- ❖ The San Siro club will be without midfielder Andrés Guglielminpietro for virtually the whole of the first group phase. ‘Guly’ damaged his foot in training and faces a lay-off of up to eight weeks.
- ❖ This match will be the biggest-ever football television broadcasting operation in Scandanavia. There are no fewer than 16 slow-motion cameras being deployed, of which four are ‘super slo-mo’.
- ❖ Rosenborg BK will have a training session at Lerkendal which is open to the media on Monday at 13.00. This will be followed by a Press Conference with coach Nils Arne Eggen at 15.00 at the stadium.
- ❖ Rosenborg BK players will be available for informal interviews between the training session and the Press Conference.
- ❖ The Internazionale party arrive in Trondheim at 12.40 on Monday and coach Héctor Cúper will hold a Press Conference at the stadium at 18.00. Training will start at the stadium at 19.00.
- ❖ This season’s UEFA Champions League sets a new record by featuring players from 70 different countries, making it a genuine showcase for top talent from all over the world. Last season, players from 51 different countries took part in the competition.
- ❖ As usual, some new publications should be available at all venues on Matchday 1 even though it’s been a rush to print and distribute on time. The UEFA Champions League Statistics Handbook includes the usual information about the 32 clubs, the 32 coaches, the referees, about 800 players and the history of the competition.
- ❖ An expanded and updated version of the All-Time Players’ Appearances handbook is also available. It provides a 130-page record of the 2,485 footballers who contributed to the match action during the first ten years of the UEFA Champions League.

ROSENBERG BK – INTERNAZIONALE FC

- ❖ The handbook is enclosed with the first issue of the official UEFA Champions League Magazine which includes squad-lists, background information, interviews and features. There's an old saying that if you start to read something you've written, the first thing you'll spot is a mistake. Unfortunately, it's true this time round because – nobody can explain why – Manchester United FC's UEFA Champions League record is pure fiction. If you would like to pencil in the correct version, it reads like this:

- ❖ The gross amount in the pool will be at least 1,055 million Swiss francs with 809 million earmarked for the clubs (including 41 million for the professional leagues of the participating associations).
- ❖ Each of the 32 participants will receive a starting fee of 2.5 million Swiss francs plus an appearance fee of 500,000 per match. In addition, there are performance bonuses of 500,000 francs for a win and 250,000 for a draw. In other words, a team winning all six matches in the first group stage would be guaranteed 8.5 million francs – plus the gate receipts from all home games. In the second group stage, the appearance fee and the performance bonuses are the same.
- ❖ The eight quarter-finalists receive 4 million francs apiece; the four semi-finalists earn 5 million each; the beaten finalist receives 6 million and the winner of the UEFA Champions League receives 10 million. One Swiss franc is approximately 0.68 euros.
- ❖ Clubs can also earn additional income from the so-called Market Pool, based on the proportional values of different TV markets and the number of clubs competing from any specific country. This is a complex calculation and precise figures are not usually available until the end of the season.
- ❖ In this phase of the competition, teams' results against each other have a special relevance, bearing in mind the criteria used to decide the final group positions if two or more teams are tied on the same number of points:
 - ❖ Higher number of points in the matches between the teams in question
 - ❖ Superior goal difference from matches between the teams in question
 - ❖ Higher number of goals scored away from home in matches between the teams in question
 - ❖ Goal difference from all group matches
 - ❖ Higher number of goals scored
 - ❖ UEFA coefficient (club + national association) based on past five seasons
- ❖ Talking about regulations, a game that has to be postponed because of adverse weather conditions must, in principle, be played on the following day. Having said that, UEFA likes to adopt as flexible a position as possible. But, in cases of controversy or lack of agreement between the two clubs on the re-scheduling of the game, UEFA takes the final decision.

- ❖ Rosenborg BK coach Nils Arne Eggen said he had two main question marks about his team line-up for the game. He would make a decision for the left-back berth between Saarinen and Stensås, and the other problem area was on the right wing where his choice was between Karadas and Enerly.
- ❖ Looking ahead to the game at his press conference at Lerkendal on Monday, Eggen said: “Inter play a classical 4-4-2. They are very well organised in defence and very compact and hard to break down. They have extremely good players with world stars in attack like Vieri, Crespo and Recoba. If you look at the whole squad it is a giant gallery of stars but it is not only the names that count - it is what you do on the pitch. I think it is not good to think too much about the opponents. Our players must not think about Inter - they have to think about Rosenborg.”
- ❖ “Our strength is in attacking we always play the same style. We always try to score and to win and we will do the same in this match. However, when you play a strong team like Inter all the players have to have their best day. That is our only chance.”
- ❖ Internazionale FC’s head coach, Héctor Cúper, declined to discuss the exact composition of his team and said this would not be announced until shortly before kick-off.
- ❖ The Argentinian, who recently signed a two-year extension to his contract linking him to the club till 2005, said: “Everything is good after the first match in the league and both teams played on Saturday so they have equal days to recover from those matches. Christian Vieri is in good shape and I’m hoping for another good performance.”
- ❖ “Inter will win because I think Inter is the best team in Europe right now and it is my mentality to think in this way. I always think about my teams and players in this way. I want my players to learn that mentality.”
- ❖ “We have studied Rosenborg carefully,” he added. “They are a very physically strong side, a speedy team with good movement and you have to watch out on set plays because they are very good headers of the ball.”
- ❖ Club captain Javier Zanetti, now in his seventh season with the Italians, is relishing the opportunity of a second crack at the UEFA Champions League ... but is hoping for a much better start to the campaign than the last. “This will be my second time in the Champions League. My first was in 1998/99. We lost the first match when we were beaten 2-0 by Real Madrid. After that we played very well and won the group but went out in the quarter final to Manchester United and were not very lucky.”
- ❖ “In my second experience I hope to repeat winning the group but I hope to open the competition in a better way by winning on Wednesday.”
- ❖ “You have to be impressed by Rosenborg’s record in the league in Norway for many seasons. The team is quick and strong in attack and we have to be especially very cautious with their crossing abilities.”
- ❖ It will be a case of divided loyalties for one celebrity couple at Lerkendal on Wednesday. Among the capacity 21,000 crowd will be Norwegian biathlon star Ole Einar Bjordalem. Ole was the most successful athlete in the Winter Olympics in Salt Lake City, US, where he won five biathlon gold medals. He lives in Trondheim with girlfriend Natalia Santer, who competed for Italy in the ladies’ biathlon.
- ❖ Large numbers of fans queued for the remaining 300 tickets which went on sale on Tuesday and the match will now be a sell-out.
- ❖ The weather leading up to the game was grey and rainy and a heavy pitch is expected at Lerkendal.
