## **AEK ATHENS v AS MONACO**

Sadly, one point from five matches means that AEK go into their final home fixture of the UEFA Champions League campaign with nothing to play for except the cash and sporting pride. Even though the third place that would open the door to the UEFA Cup is out of their reach, they would surely not wish to bow out of the competition without winning a game and ending a frustratingly long run of negative results in the UEFA Champions League. By contrast, AS Monaco travel to Athens with a ticket for the first knock-out round already in their pockets but needing to aim for a victory if they wish to ensure the first place in the group which would earn certain privileges in Friday's draw.

- ❖ With AS Monaco already assured of a place in Friday's draw for the first knock-out round of the UEFA Champions League, their aim is to clinch the privileges in Friday's draw conceded to the group-winners. Describing this game as Match A and the other Group C game in Eindhoven as Match B, here are the permutations, using 1 for a home win; X for a draw; and 2 for an away win:

- ❖ The clubs have met in four previous ties in European club competitions with AS Monaco successful on each occasion. The first meeting was in the Champion Clubs' Cup in 1963/64 when four goals from Louis Cossou enabled AS Monaco to win their home leg at nearby Nice 7-2 and a 1-1 draw in Athens was enough to take AS Monaco through to the second round.
- ❖ The other fixtures were closer affairs. In the 1993/94 UEFA Champions League preliminary round AS Monaco won their home game 1-0 and drew the return leg 2-2, while in the 1999/2000 UEFA Cup 3rd round, a similar situation occurred with an Athens draw (2-2) and a 1-0 home win for AS Monaco.
- ❖ AEK Athens have yet to beat a French club in European club competitions with five draws and six defeats in 11 previous fixtures.
- ❖ AEK Athens FC, in their third UEFA Champions League campaign, are still looking for their first victory in the competition proper at the 18th attempt.
- ❖ Their first fixture in this competition ended in a 0-0-draw against Austrian side SV Casio Salzburg on 14.09.1994.
- ❖ AEK's UEFA Champions League record is: P 17 W 0 D 9 L 8 F 11 A 27.

- ❖ They have beaten both APOEL Nicosia FC and Grasshopper-Club in qualifying games in recent seasons but that first win in the group stage still remains elusive.
- ❖ Nine of their previous 17 games have now ended in draws including all six in last season's first group phase. The Greeks are the only side to draw all six matches in a single UEFA Champions League group phase.
- ❖ The 0-4 loss at AS Monaco in September and the 0-3 defeat at RC Deportivo last month are easily the worst of their eight defeats in this competition.
- ❖ Just to compound matters, they have the worst attack in this season's competition with one goal in five games (450 minutes).
- ❖ AS Monaco, not surprisingly, are the leading scorers in this season's competition with 15 goals from five games at three per game or one every 30 minutes.
- ❖ Ironically, they had failed to score on their trip to La Coruña before rattling in eight goals in the return match against Depor at the Stade Louis II.
- ❖ Monaco's UEFA Champions League record is: P 28 W 13 D 6 L 9 F 57 A 38.
- ❖ Monaco sailed past 50 UEFA Champions League goals during their record 8-3 win over the 2000 Spanish champions to become the first French side to reach the landmark in this competition.
- ❖ Their five games this season have produced 21 goals (15 for and 6 against) in all at an average of over four per game.
- ❖ Didier Deschamps' side have taken part in three previous group series – they finished runners-up in their section in 1993/94 before finishing group winners in 1997/98. They ended up bottom of a closely fought group in 2000/01 despite accumulating seven points from six games.
- ❖ Judging from their first meeting this season on Matchday 2 which ended in a 4-0 defeat at the Stade Louis II, AEK could be in for a rough ride against the French league leaders. Managing no shots on goal in the first-half and only two shots in the second-half, it is hardly surprising that AEK were unable to score. Monaco with 58% of possession in the first-half, scored two goals in four minutes (Giuly 24 and Morientes 27) in order to put the result out of reach of AEK. They then repeated the feat in the second period by scoring twice again (Morientes 56 and Prso 86).
- ❖ Dusan Bajevic selected the following team for the match against Monaco: Hiotis, Zagorakis (Kasapis 76), Maladenis, Kreek (Kostenoglou 15), Okkas, Georgeas, Moras (Tsiartas 61), Amponsah, Katsouranis, Georgatos, Lyberopoulos. Unused subs: Mihailidis, Borbokis, Konstantinidis, Ivic.
- ❖ Didier Deschamps fielded: Roma; Givet, Squillaci, Rodriguez, Evra; Adebayor (Cissé 69), Bernardi, Zikos; Giuly, Rothen (Plašil 85); Morientes (Pršo 76). The unused subs were Sylva, Ibarra, Camara and Oshadogan.
- ❖ After the match, AEK's concerned coach, Dusan Bajevic, hinted that the result has left his own future in doubt. "I take full responsibility," he explained. "It is now up to the president of the club and other people, such as the Greek media, to decide what that entails. Tonight was unacceptable", said Bajevic.
- ❖ There was never any doubt of the outcome at the Riazor on Matchday 5 when Deportivo effectively exploited the Greek defensive deficiencies in a match which saw the Spaniards produce no less than 12 corners against only 2 for AEK and Deportivo's ten shots on target translated into three goals by Héctor (22), Valerón (51) and Luque (71) without AEK being able to get on the scoreboard.
- ❖ The AEK line-up was: Mihailidis, Borbokis, Zagorakis, Okkas (Konstantinidis 77), Tsiartas, Kapasis (Kostenoglou 44), Amponsah, Katsouranis, Lakis (Milen Petkov 73), Kapsis, Nalitzis. The unused subs were: Hiotis, Maladenis, Georgeas, Moras,

- ❖ Having scored 12 goals in their previous two home UEFA Champions League matches, it must have come as a huge surprise for coach Didier Deschamps that his side only saw the ball 38% of the time at the Stade Louis II against PSV Eindhoven on Matchday 5. Incredibly Monaco could only muster one effort on target during the 90 minutes against four for the Dutch visitors but it was still good enough to earn the hosts a share of the spoils as Fernando Morientes gave the hosts the lead after 34 minutes with a well-timed header. Jan Vennegoor of Hesselink restored parity six minutes before the end to the immense disappointment of the Monaco crowd.
- ❖ Didier Deschamps fielded: Roma, Evra (Ibarra 75), Bernardi, Giuly, Pršo (Cissé 59), Morientes (Adebayor 81), Zikos, Squillaci, Rothen, Rodriguez, Givet. The unused subs were: Sylva, Plašil, Camara, El Fakiri.
- ❖ Following the embarrassment against Deportivo, there was more heartache for Dusan Bajevic and his troops on 30 November when a 1-0 defeat away against Paniliakos FC left them further behind in the Greek title race, ten points adrift of Olympiacos CFP. Yannis Thomaidis scored the only goal of the match on the hour-mark with a close-range header after a save from goalkeeper Hrysostomos Mihailidis was deflected into his path.
- ❖ The line-up was: Mihailidis, Moras, Kapsis, Amponsah, Zagorakis, Katsouranis, Rusev (Borbokis 67), Tsiartas, Lakis (Maladenis 75), Okkas, Nalitzis (Lyberopoulos 67).
- ❖ This was Panaliakos first win against AEK in seven encounters after Bajevic's side had claimed all three points in the previous six.
- ❖ "Our objectives now seem further away", said Bajevic after the match. "We shall see how we'll continue in the championship. The final score seems unfair as we had many chances to score in the second half."
- ❖ Playing behind closed doors (due to the three-match ban AEK have been given) at "Apostolos Nikolaidis" Stadium, Dusan Bajevic's side then got a much needed boost when they, on 7 December, overcame Xanthi FC 3-0 on home ground. Nikos Lyberopoulos got them off to a bright start with a clinical finish after 16 minutes and Yiannakis Okkas and Vassilios Lakis scored further to round off a memorable evening which could even have been more joyful had the woodwork not saved late efforts from Vassilis Tsiartas and Eros Perez.
- ❖ The AEK line-up was: Michailidis, Borbokis (Georgeas 78), Kreek, Moras, Kapsis (Amponsah 83), Zagorakis, Tsartas, Katsouranis, Lakis, Okkas, (Konstantinidis 84), Lyberopoulos.
- ❖ "We played very well", said Dusan Bajevic after the match. "I am very satisfied with the performance of my team. It was not an easy game for us because we had a lot of problems after the defeat at the previous weekend. I congratulate my players".
- ❖ A solitary goal from Lucas Bernardi ensured AS Monaco FC's tremendous week continued by securing a 1-0 win against FC Nantes-Atlantique in the French league on Saturday 29 November. After having made sure of their place in the last 16 of the UEFA Champions League in midweek, Didier Deschamps' men took advantage of second-placed Olympique Lyonnais' 3-1 defeat against Stade Rennais FC to stretch their domestic advantage to six points. The goal came 76 minutes into the encounter at La Beaujoire, Bernardi firing in from the edge of the area after being set up by Fernando Morientes.
- ❖ The Monaco line-up was: Roma, Rodriguez, Ibarra (Givet 60), Squillaci, Evra, Cissé, Bernadi, Zikos, Plašil (Giuly 67), Pršo, Morientes.
- ❖ Two goals in a minute then gave AS Monaco FC a 2-1 win at the Stade Vélodrome in Marseille on Friday 5 December and kept them six points clear of Olympique Lyonnais at the top of the French league. With all three of France's UEFA Champions League contenders in Friday night action, it seemed as if Monaco's closest followers would have a chance to halve the gap at the top of the league when Ahmed Hossam 'Mido' gave

Marseille the lead just before half-time. But not long after the hour mark defender Sébastien Squillaci headed in Jérôme Rothen's free-kick. And seconds later Ludovic Giuly embarked on a solo run that ended with a shot flicked into the goal - his ninth of the season, confirming a defeat that left Monaco in solid control at the top.

- ❖ Didier Deschamps fielded: Roma, Rodriguez, Squillaci, Evra, Givet, Giuly, Rothen (Plašil 90) Bernadi, Zikos, Pršo (Cissé 81), Morientes.
- ❖ Grigorios Georgatos left AEK Athens FC on Wednesday night after the Greek club agreed to terminate the midfielder player's contract. Georgatos joined AEK in summer 2002 and enjoyed a fine first season, playing 23 games in the Alpha Ethniki and four times in the UEFA Champions League. However, the 31-year old was unsettled at the club he had been seeking his release for the past two weeks.
- ❖ AS Monaco are without Ludovic Giuly and Jérôme Rothen for this match. Both are suspended as a result of their dismissals during the game against PSV Eindhoven.
- ❖ AEK Athens have Kofi Amponsah, Yannis Okkas and Vassilios Tsiartas within one yellow card of a one-match suspension.
- ❖ The format for the 2003/04 UEFA Champions League comprises a total of 125 matches (compared with 157 in previous campaigns) and four matchdays fewer. The fixture list includes only one group stage, from which the eight group-winners and the eight runners-up will progress to the first knock-out round. The third-placed club in each group will continue its European campaign in the UEFA Cup. The fourth team will be eliminated from UEFA club competitions.
- ❖ If two or more teams finish the group stage level on points, the following criteria will be used in order to determine group standings:
  - (a) Higher number of points from games involving the teams in question
  - (b) Superior goal difference from games involving the teams in question
  - (c) Higher number of goals scored away from home in games involving the teams in question
  - (d) Superior goal difference in *all* group matches played
  - (e) Higher number of goals scored in the six matches played
  - (f) Club/national association coefficient based on the five previous seasons
- ❖ The draw for the first round of the knock-out phase of the competition will take place at UEFA's headquarters in Nyon, starting at 12.00 on Friday 12 December. Media representatives wishing to attend the draw must apply for accreditation using the usual on-line system. The opening matches of 2004 will be played on Tuesday 24 and Wednesday 25 February, with the return legs on Tuesday 9 and Wednesday 10 March.
- ❖ In the draw for the first knock-out round, clubs from the same national association will not be drawn against each other. In addition, the winner and runner-up from the same group will not be drawn against each other; each group-winner will be drawn against a group runner-up; and the runner-up will play the first leg at home.
- ❖ From the quarter-finals onwards, there will be no such stipulations. In other words, clubs from the same national association may be drawn against each other.
- ❖ The financial conditions for the 2003/04 UEFA Champions League will inevitably undergo changes derived from the new format, but the parameters for the first phase remain essentially unchanged. Each of the 32 clubs receives a starting fee of 2.5 million Swiss francs, plus an appearance fee of 500,000 francs per game during the group phase (i.e. 3 million for six matches).
- ❖ For the knock-out rounds, the bonus for reaching the last 16 is 2.5 million; each of the eight quarter-finalists will receive 3 million; the semi-finalists will add a further 4 million; the runner-up will receive 6 million; and the winner of the final will pocket 10 million.
- ❖ In addition, clubs retain all gate receipts from home games and will receive additional payments from the so-called Market Pool. This is based on the proportional values of different TV markets and the number of clubs competing from any specific country. This is a

complex calculation and precise figures are not usually available until the latter stages of the campaign.

- ❖ Last season, Juventus were the top earners, netting almost 53.5 million Swiss francs; BV Borussia Dortmund received almost 52 million; and the title-holders, AC Milan, earned 48.6 million Swiss francs. As a (very) rough guide, three Swiss francs are equivalent to two euros.
