

# Fenerbahçe SK v FC Schalke 04 PRESS KIT

Fenerbahçe SK play host to German club FC Schalke 04 looking to continue a run of consecutive 3-0 home victories in the UEFA Champions League. Fenerbahçe were 3-0 winners against last season's beaten semi-finalists PSV Eindhoven at the Sükrü Saraçoğlu stadium on Matchday 2, the same scoreline by which they defeated Manchester United FC in their final home match in Group D of the UEFA Champions League last season. Schalke are looking for their first UEFA Champions League win this season. A 1-0 defeat at PSV was followed by an exhilarating 2-2 draw with AC Milan on Matchday 2, and expectations are high for another top quality game.

## **No previous meetings**

- Fenerbahçe and Schalke are meeting for the first time in UEFA club competition and Fenerbahçe are looking to break a hoodoo against German clubs. The Istanbul side have played six previous matches against German clubs over three ties, and lost on all six occasions.

## **Three German ties**

- 1. FC Nürnberg were the first German side to play Fenerbahçe in the 1961/62 European Champion Clubs' Cup first round. Fenerbahçe lost the home leg 2-1, and were beaten 1-0 in the return leg in Germany for a 3-1 aggregate defeat.
- In 1970/71, Fenerbahçe met the East German champions FC Carl Zeiss Jena in the first round of the European Cup. Jena were convincing 4-0 winners in the first leg in Turkey then won the return leg 1-0 for a 5-0 aggregate success.
- In the first group stage of the 2001/02 UEFA Champions League, Fenerbahçe were paired with Bayer 04 Leverkusen, who won both group matches by the same 2-1 scoreline. Leverkusen would reach the final, Fenerbahçe lost all six of their group games.

## **No wins in six**

- Fenerbahçe have scored three goals and conceded 12 in their six straight defeats against German clubs, while the three home games have produced a goal difference of 2-8.

## **Turkish test**

- Schalke have played one previous tie against a Turkish club. Schalke met Trabzonspor in 1996/97 in the UEFA Cup second round, and won the first leg in Gelsenkirchen 1-0 with a Martin Max goal. Two goals from defender Johan de Kock had appeared to settle the tie in Trabzon, but Jens Lehmann was then beaten three times in quick succession. Schalke held the advantage on the away goals advantage, before a late goal from Max put the tie beyond doubt. Schalke, boosted by this escape, went on to win the cup.

### Match facts: Fenerbahçe v Schalke

#### Fenerbahçe key facts

- Fenerbahçe are competing in the UEFA Champions League for the fourth time in their history and the third occasion since the 2001/02 season. To date, their best group stage campaign was a third-placed finish last season which resulted in their transfer to the knockout stages of the UEFA Cup although they would exit that competition at the first possible opportunity, losing 3-1 on aggregate to Spanish side Real Zaragoza.
- Having not passed beyond the group stage, Fenerbahçe have played only 20 games thus far in the competition with six wins, 13 losses and only one draw. That point came in their first-ever game in the group stage when they shared a 1-1 draw away against SK Rapid Wien on 11 September 1996. Elvir Bolić opened the scoring for Fenerbahçe on the half hour before the home side equalised through Christian Stumpf.
- Fenerbahçe won the Turkish Super League by three points from Trabzonspor, thus winning a place in the group stage of the competition.
- Although they battled bravely in Milan, Fenerbahçe were on the receiving end of two goals in the last three minutes from Kaká and Andriy Shevchenko against the Italian giants in a 3-1 defeat. Kaká had put Milan ahead after 18 minutes only for Alex to level from the penalty spot after 63 minutes for the Turkish champions.
- Things got decidedly better on Matchday 2 as Fenerbahçe recorded an emphatic 3-0 win at PSV Eindhoven's expense thanks to two goals from Alex (40pen, 68) before Stephen Appiah added a third two minutes into second half added time.
- Before the 3-0 victory against PSV, Fenerbahçe's last win in UEFA club competitions had come on 8 December 2004 where they defeated Manchester United FC by the same scoreline with Tuncay Sanli scoring a hat-trick.
- The 3-0 result also equalled Fenerbahçe's largest margin of victory in their 59 games to date in both the European Champion Clubs' Cup and the UEFA Champions League. In those 59 matches, Fenerbahçe have won 17, drawn seven and lost 35 with 54 goals scored and 109 conceded.
- Fenerbahçe have featured in the last eight of a UEFA club competition on one occasion when they took MTK Budapest (now MTK Hungária FC) to a replay in the 1963/64 UEFA Cup Winners' Cup after the two sides had shared a 3-3 aggregate draw. MTK prevailed 1-0 in the replay and would eventually advance to the final where they lost 1-0 in a replay to Sporting Clube de Portugal after the final ended in a 3-3 draw.
- Fenerbahçe extended their winning sequence in this season's Turkish Super League to seven matches following their defeat of MKE Ankaragücü at the weekend.
- Of the 22 goals Fenerbahçe have scored so far this season, 13 were scored by Brazilian players.

- German coach **Christoph Daum** became the first-ever German coach to lead Fenerbahçe to a Turkish Super League title when he first achieved this feat during the 2003/04 season.

- **Servet Çetin** played his first game this season against Ankaragücü after undergoing groin surgery in Germany. He replaced Serkan Balcı in the 69th minute of the game.

### Schalke key facts

- Schalke have recorded 50 victories from their 91 matches in UEFA club competitions to date with 22 draws and 19 defeats. They need another goal to reach 150 having also conceded 91 times.

- The German side are competing in the UEFA Champions League for the second time having featured in the first group stage during the 2001/02 campaign, when they recorded two victories and four defeats from their six outings.

- Schalke finished second in the German Bundesliga, 14 points behind FC Bayern München and four points ahead of Werder Bremen. It was a classification that brought with it an automatic place in the group stage of the 2005/06 UEFA Champions League although the Germans were to open their account with a 1-0 defeat away against PSV Eindhoven, for whom Jan Vennegoor of Hesselink was the matchwinner.

- Having lost to one of last season's semi-finalists, next up for Schalke were the defeated finalists from May in the form of AC Milan. The Italian giants took the lead on two occasions through Clarence Seedorf and Andriy Shevchenko, but on both occasions Schalke found an equaliser, firstly from Søren Larsen and then from Hamit Altıntop.

- Schalke have appeared in one UEFA final to date when they defeated FC Internazionale Milano on penalties after the 1996/97 UEFA Cup final ended 1-1 on aggregate. Marc Wilmots scored the only goal of the game at the Parkstadion in the opening leg, and though Inter levelled the tie through Iván Zamorano in the return in Milan, Schalke made no mistake from the ensuing penalty shoot-out with Ingo Anderbrügge, Olaf Thon, Martin Max and Wilmots on target in a 4-1 spot-kick success.

- **Mladen Krstajić** captained Serbia and Montenegro to a 1-0 win against Bosnia-Herzegovina on Wednesday to secure his country a place at the 2006 FIFA World Cup in Germany. However, it was a completely different experience for the club team-mate Zlatan Bajramović who saw his chances of qualifying ended by the defeat. Krstajić was also involved in Serbia and Montenegro's 2-0 win at Lithuania on Saturday, whereas Bajramović sat out Bosnia-Herzegovina's 3-0 triumph against San Marino.

- **Christian Poulsen** and **Søren Larsen** enjoyed a successful week with Denmark following a 1-0 win against Greece on Saturday and a 2-1 win at Kazakhstan four days later. However, in the end luck was not on their side as the Danes only finished third in Group 2 and missed out on a place in Germany. Their Schalke team-mate and Turkish international Hamit Altıntop was also in action in Group 2 on Wednesday and helped his country earn a 1-0 win in Albania to secure a place in the play-off round. group, Levan Kobiashvili and Georgia slipped to a 1-0 defeat at Greece.

- **Darío Rodríguez** and **Gustavo Varela** are also hopeful of making the World Cup finals after helping Uruguay defeat Argentina 1-0 to hold on to fifth place in the South American zone, which will see them take on Australia in the play-off for a place at the World Cup.
- All of Schalke's Bundesliga home games to date this season have been played in front of sell-out crowds at the Arena AufSchalke.
- Goalkeeper **Frank Rost**, defender **Mladen Krstajić** and midfielder **Levan Kobiashvili** are the only three Schalke players to play every minute of their matches in the Bundesliga this season.
- Schalke are the only team in the Bundesliga yet to lose a domestic match this season. They have won four games and drawn five leaving them five points adrift of leaders Werder Bremen and FC Bayern München.
- Schalke have conceded the first goal five times in Bundesliga matches so far this season but have always managed to salvage at least a point. The only match they failed to turn around came on the opening matchday of the UEFA Champions League when they lost 1-0 at PSV Eindhoven.
- **Tomasz Waldoch**, **Ebbe Sand** and **Gerald Asamoah** are the only three players in the Schalke squad that featured in Schalke's only previous UEFA Champions League campaign in the 2001/2002 season.

### Head coach profiles

#### **Christoph Daum**

There are few coaches who can claim to rival Fenerbahçe SK's Christoph Daum in the tactical stakes. Being one of Germany's best coaches, Daum is back on top of European football again after coming through an ordeal which led to him missing out on becoming coach of his country.

As a player, Daum failed to progress higher than the third tier of German football. His career really took off when he made the transition into management, taking over as head coach at 1. FC Köln in September 1986. He then made the switch to VfB Stuttgart for another four campaigns, helping them win a Bundesliga title in 1992. Two more seasons with Turkish side Besiktas JK followed where he collected another championship trophy in 1995.

When Germany won UEFA EURO '96™, Daum transferred to Bayer 04 Leverkusen, stayed there for five seasons and turned the club into a national powerhouse. Following a forgettable year in 2000 when he confessed to taking drugs (thus preventing him from becoming Germany coach), Daum returned to Turkey where he was still regarded as a national hero and guided Fenerbahçe to back-to-back Superleague trophies in 2004 and 2005.

#### **Ralf Rangnick**

Ralf Rangnick is a thoughtful, academic coach more at home on the training ground than delivering a rousing team talk or orchestrating a transfer deal. He showed his ability at FC Schalke 04, leading them to second place in the Bundesliga during his first season in charge and therefore bringing UEFA Champions League football to the Gelsenkirchen-based side.

As a player, Rangnick never made it past the amateur ranks at VfB Stuttgart, but returned to the club to take charge of the amateur team in 1985 having cut his teeth at regional league side FC Viktoria Backnang. He went on to become youth director before accepting the coaching job at second division SSV Ulm 1846.

Having nearly guided the part-timers of Ulm to promotion to the top flight, Stuttgart made him head coach, but he failed to bring the same kind of success, although he did win a UEFA Intertoto Cup title in summer 2000 before leaving in February 2001. His next stop was Hannover 96, where he achieved promotion to the first division, only to be sacked near the end of his third season with the side slipping down the table. However, Schalke had seen enough to appoint Rangnick at the start of the 2004/05 season, and promptly saw him seal a return to the UEFA Champions League.

Having only started refereeing in 1982, Alain Hamer was taking charge of top-flight matches in his native Luxembourg before the turn of the next decade.

Hamer, an account manager from the town of Wasserbillig, was awarded his **FIFA badge** in 1993 and went on to form part of the refereeing teams at the 1995 FIFA Women's World Cup, 1998 UEFA European Under-21 Championship and 2001 FIFA World Youth Championship. In addition to covering league games in his homeland, Hamer also experienced domestic football in France and Belgium - assignments which stood him in good stead for the European and world appointments that have since come his way.

At the end of the 2003/04 campaign he was selected to travel to the **UEFA European Championship** in Portugal as one of four fourth officials, and the following season was in the middle for four UEFA Champions League games, two in the UEFA Cup – including the semi-final second leg between PFC CSKA Moskva and Parma FC – and three FIFA World Cup qualifiers.

Like any top referee, Hamer is ambitious for further progress, saying: "I am someone who always looks forward. You have the right to dream."

The UEFA Champions League Group E contenders enjoyed a successful weekend as three teams won and the fourth, FC Schalke 04, held FC Bayern München to a draw. AC Milan struck early in their game, while PSV Eindhoven and Fenerbahçe SK remained second in the Netherlands and Turkey.

#### **Cagliari Calcio 0-2 AC Milan**

First-half goals from Alberto Gilardino and Andriy Shevchenko gave Milan a regulation win at Cagliari Calcio. Gilardino opened the scoring after just 26 seconds when a defensive mix-up allowed him a close-range opportunity. Shevchenko added a second on 27 minutes with a tame long-distance shot that Cagliari goalkeeper Fabian Carini let slip through his grasp.

Coach Carlo Ancelotti was boosted by the return of Marek Jankulovski and Filippo Inzaghi, who has been out for five months, but was without Massimo Ambrosini and Alessandro Nesta, who will be sidelined for four weeks after undergoing surgery on a tendon in his hand. A muscle injury ruled out Brazilian right-back Cafu while Ancelotti rested Italy duo Christian Vieri and Andrea Pirlo, along with attacking midfielder Kaká.

Ancelotti said: "It was not that easy as we were in some trouble for a while after the second goal. The defenders and midfielders performed really well, they were very careful and alert. It is not true that we are playing a weakened team in Serie A in order to concentrate on the UEFA Champions League. My plan is always to field the players that are in the best shape."

#### **FC Schalke 04 1-1 FC Bayern München**

Schalke avoided a first-ever defeat by FC Bayern München at the Arena AufSchalke on Saturday thanks to Søren Larsen's late penalty. The Danish international was fouled by Bastian Schweinsteiger in added time, and picked himself up to confidently tuck away the spot-kick. A goal on 19 minutes from Roque Santa Cruz had put the visitors ahead.

Schalke coach Ralf Rangnick was without long-term casualties Marco van Hoogdalem (hip), Christian Pander, Gerald Asamoah, Tim Hoogland (all knee), and Simon Cziommer (ankle). Meanwhile, Mimoun Azaouagh has returned to training after recovering from a serious knee injury but is not fully fit. Marcelo Bordon and Lincoln shook off minor injuries to play.

Rangnick said: "We were terrible in the first half but we showed determination after the break and raised our game slightly. That is what won us a point. But all in all it wasn't a very good performance."

Saturday. Coach Christoph Daum kept faith with the side that lined up against Konyaspor and PSV Eindhoven in recent weeks, having no hesitation in fielding Brazilian playmaker Alex despite the player returning tired from international duty with Brazil.

Brazilian defender Fábio Luciano opened the scoring on 16 minutes after collecting Márcio Nobre's pass. Seven minutes into the second half Ankaragücü found the equaliser through Umut Bulut, who scored with a powerful shot. Ankaragücü's joy only lasted for eleven minutes before Alex scored from the spot following a foul on Nicolas Anelka.

Turkish international forward Tuncay Şanlı came on for the last eight minutes after recovering from injury. Daum said: "It is important we got three points. Some of my players' minds had gone to the [FC] Schalke 04 match. After Ankaragücü's goal my players pumped up the gas."

### **PSV Eindhoven 3-0 AZ Alkmaar**

PSV triumphed in this crucial encounter against leaders AZ Alkmaar 3-0 to briefly take the lead in the league standings before Feyenoord won on Sunday. The Dutch champions opened the scoring two minutes before the break when Arouna Koné set up Phillip Cocu and the PSV captain's shot from ten metres found the net.

Goalkeeper Heurlho Gomes was forced to save a free-kick from Kenneth Perez in the second half, but when Alkmaar's Ron Vlaar was sent off for a second bookable offence ten minutes from time, Cocu doubled PSV's lead a minute later. With four minutes left Jan Vennegoor of Hesselink scored after DaMarcus Beasley had hit the post. Michael Reiziger was on the bench recovering from a hip injury, but did not feature, while Jefferson Farfán was rested after returning from international duty with Peru with a bruised heel. Theo Lucius (hamstring), John de Jong (knee), Mika Väyrynen (ankle), Michael Ball (knee) and Gerald Sibon (neck) are all out injured.

"We took advantage of some sloppy play to open the scoring on the verge of half-time," said PSV coach Guus Hiddink. "Alkmaar started the second half brightly, but we responded tactically well. All in all, this is a fine result - in fact, bearing in mind the circumstances we are in, it is excellent."

#### The week in UEFA

##### • UEFA supports FARE Action Week

As part of UEFA's concerted anti-racism campaign, European football's governing body is using this week's UEFA Champions League games to make a stand against racism. The campaign, which is part of the Action Week organised by the Football Against Racism in Europe (FARE) network, will take place at all 16 Matchday 3 games played on Tuesday and Wednesday, where Europe's biggest stars are supporting the message against racism.

Each team will be accompanied on to the pitch by children wearing 'Unite Against Racism' T-shirts, and tannoy announcements will be made before each match. For its Action Week, the FARE network is co-ordinating activities that will involve supporters groups, football clubs from 35 countries, national associations, community and migrant organisations, anti-discrimination initiatives and schools.

##### • Out-of-competition doping controls

UEFA is undertaking out-of-competition doping controls for the first time in this season's UEFA Champions League. The move - whereby any player can be tested outside of the regular random post-match testing - is part of UEFA's reinforcement of its anti-doping activities.

These campaigns have seen an increase in the number of drug tests in its competitions, greater financial outlay in the sector, the creation of an anti-doping unit within the UEFA administration, as well as an expert anti-doping panel and an education programme aimed at the broad spectrum of the European football community.

##### • Opening action draws big crowds

The UEFA Champions League remains a top-draw attraction, with some excellent attendances recorded on the opening two Matchdays. A total of 513,066 fans watched the action on Matchday 1, with many stadiums packed either to full, or almost full capacity. A sell-out at the Stade Gerland (40,309) watched Olympique Lyonnais defeat Real Madrid CF, while Werder Bremen's Weserstadion was 99 per cent full (37,001) for the visit of FC Barcelona.

Two capacity crowds were registered in Germany on Matchday 2 - at the Fussball Arena München (66,000) for the FC Bayern München-Club Brugge KV encounter, and at the Arena AufSchalke in Gelsenkirchen (53,993) for the match between FC Schalke 04 and AC Milan. Old Trafford was 99 per cent full (66,112) for Manchester United FC's match with SL Benfica. Swiss side FC Thun's first home game at the nearby Stade de Suisse in Berne brought a 30,783 crowd (98 per cent of capacity) for the visit of AC Sparta Praha. A total of 634,335 fans attended games on Matchday 2.

### General competition information

#### Competition summary

UEFA's most prestigious club competition was originally created as the European Champion Clubs' Cup for the 1955/56 season, before its revamping as the UEFA Champions League in 1992.

• **Competition format:** The UEFA Champions League is open to each national association's domestic champions, as well as clubs who finish just behind them in their respective domestic championship. The number of clubs that can be entered by an association and their entry point in the competition depends on the association's position in UEFA's coefficient ranking list. The current format was introduced in 2003/04. After three qualifying rounds, 32 teams contest the group stage, divided into eight groups of four. The group winners and runners-up advance to the knockout stage, the eight third-placed teams move into the UEFA Cup third round, and the eight fourth-placed teams are eliminated.

A draw determines who each of the 16 clubs will play in the first knockout stage, with ties decided over two matches on a home and away basis. The club that scores the greater aggregate of goals advances, or in the event of both teams scoring the same number of goals, the team which scores more away goals. If the away-goals rule proves inconclusive, extra time of two periods of 15 minutes is played after the second match. Away goals count double in that period, with penalty kicks coming into play if needed. The same rules apply to subsequent rounds with a one-off final match deciding the winners.

• **Key dates:** The draw for the first knockout round will take place in Nyon on 16 December with matches being played on 21/22 February and 7/8 March. The draws for the quarter-finals (to be played on 28/29 March and 4/5 April), semi-finals (18/19 & 25/26 April) and final are scheduled for 17 March 2006. This season's showpiece will be played at the Stade de France, Paris on Wednesday 17 May 2006.

• **Financial information:** UEFA has estimated that the gross budgeted income for the 2005/06 UEFA Champions League will be €598m - higher than the revenue obtained last season. Based on those amounts, €453m would go to the 32 clubs, including €22.5m for the professional leagues of the participating associations, and €145m to UEFA for European football. Clubs in the group stage will receive a starting fee of €1.6m and a bonus of €321,000 per match.

Performance bonuses will involve €321,000 for a win and €161,000 for a draw in the group stage. The 16 teams playing in the first knockout round will receive €1.6m each, the eight quarter-finalists €1.9m each and the four semi-finalists €2.6m. The Champions League winners will receive €6.4m, and the runners-up €3.9m. This means that a total minimum amount of €3.5m per club is guaranteed for the group stage. A club could receive, at best, up to €18m, not counting the TV market pool share and gate receipts.

• **Record holders/new faces:** Real Madrid CF are the most successful side in the history of the competition with nine triumphs (three coming in the new era) followed by

six for AC Milan and five for current champions Liverpool FC. FC Bayern München and AFC Ajax have each lifted the famous trophy on four occasions, while, in contrast, FC Artmedia, FC Thun, Real Betis Balompie, Udinese Calcio and Villarreal CF are all competing in the group stage for the first time this season.

- **Deadlines:** UEFA Champions League press kits are provided to media by uefa.com. For every UEFA Champions League match, two press kits are issued: Sunday at 22:00CET with a match preview update on Monday at 22:00CET for Tuesday's matches. For Wednesday's matches, the press kit is issued on Monday at 22:00CET with the match preview update version published on Tuesday at 22:00CET.
