First knockout round - Matchday 7



After facing Arsenal FC and then Chelsea FC in last season's first two knockout rounds of the UEFA Champions League, FC Bayern München would have hoped to avoid the competition's big names this time round. Negotiating a route past AC Milan poses another tough challenge as past encounters underline.

### Milan supreme

- On all three previous occasions that the sides, who together have won the European Champion Clubs' Cup ten times, have come up against each other in UEFA club competition it has been the Italian team left celebrating at the end. And in each case the victory has proved a stepping stone to them winning the trophy. It happened in the UEFA Champions League of 1989/90 and 2002/03 and also in the 1967/68 UEFA Cup Winners' Cup.

- In those six matches Bayern have prevailed just once with Milan claiming four victories. The last encounter, the 2002/03 first group stage, ended 2-1 home and away to Carlo Ancelotti's team with Filippo Inzaghi notching three of his side's four goals.

### Familiar foes

- Facing opponents from these respective countries is not a new experience for Bayern and Milan this season, while the latter have twice faced German clubs in the Cup Winners' Cup final.

- In the 1967/68 final, Milan defeated Hamburger SV 2-0 in Rotterdam, while in the 1973/74 edition, played again in the Dutch city, they lost by the same scoreline to 1. FC Magdeburg.

### Bayern strong in group

- This season, Felix Magath's Bayern team came out of the hat with Juventus and honours finished even in that particular contest with both sides winning at home – again by 2-1. However, Bayern, who reeled off three victories in the first three games, had to settle for runners-up spot after they dropped two points on Matchday 6 away to Club Brugge KV. Sebastian Deisler's two goals home and away against Juventus helped him finish as the Bundesliga side's leading scorer with three.

### Last season's run

- It will serve as comfort to the German champions that at this stage last season they hit top form, winning their first game with Arsenal 3-1 to take firm control of the tie. Although the English team gained a measure of revenge at Highbury two weeks later they could only reduce the arrears by a single goal.

- Two thrilling games with Chelsea then ensued and the two-goal margin of defeat suffered on their return to London gave Bayern plenty to do on their own turf. A 3-2 victory was not quite enough to prolong the Munich team's participation.

### Milan win group

- Milan, UEFA Champions League finalists in two of the last three seasons and, like Bayern, competing in Europe's premier club competition for the tenth time, are aiming for their fourth successive appearance at the quarter-final stage.

### Last visit to Germany

- Their campaign in Group G hit something of a roadblock on Matchday 2 with a 2-2 draw against FC Schalke 04 from their last trip to Germany and another draw followed by defeat away by PSV Eindhoven made them fear for their qualifying ticket.

- Two finishing victories, including a 4-0 away win against Fenerbahçe SK with Andriy Shevchenko scoring all four, put them in better heart and a narrow home success against Schalke kept PSV's strong challenge at bay. Shevchenko's total of six goals left him as the competition's leading scorer after the group stage while Kaká's contribution was also significant as he weighed in with four goals.

### Tough test last year

- Milan's passage to last season's final where they lost a dramatic encounter to Liverpool FC on penalties, included 1-0 wins, home and away against Manchester United FC in the first knockout round. The striking skills of Hernán Crespo proved the difference each time.

### Contrasting records

- It will boost the Rossoneri's confidence still further that they have remained unbeaten on their last three visits to face German clubs.

- Bayern will be hoping to build a significant lead at home. Games at Italian clubs - the second leg is on 8 March - have not gone well for them of late and they have lost on their last five outings. However, they did win the 2000/01 UEFA Champions League final in Milan, with a 5-4 success on penalties against Valencia CF after a 1-1 draw.

## Match facts

- **Oliver Kahn** and **Valérien Ismaël** are the only two Bayern players to have played every minute of their six UEFA Champions League group-stage games.

- If Bayern were to get to the 2005/06 final and **Kahn** was to play every match, the showpiece in Paris would be his 100th game in the UEFA Champions League.

- Aside from Kahn and Ismaël, **Martin Demichelis**, **Zé Roberto**, **Bastian Schweinsteiger** and **Roy Makaay** have also featured in all six games.

- **Jens Jeremies** needs just one more game for his 50th in the UEFA Champions League, while **Hasan Salihamidži** is a match off his 75th in Europe's premier club competition.

- **Bixente Lizarazu** is two matches away from his 100th appearance in UEFA club competition.

- **Lucio** was left out of the 1-1 draw at Hannover 96 on Saturday after only just arriving back from a non-stop flight from Brazil. He had been allowed to return to his homeland for personal reasons.
- **Philipp Lahm** and **Lizarazu** are thought to be vying for a starting position at left-back, but against Hannover the pair started together on the left flank with Lahm playing in front of Lizarazu.
- **Sebastian Deisler** is still waiting for his first Bundesliga goal this season.
- **Michael Ballack** has said he will take his time about deciding his future, even though his contract is due to run out in the summer.
- Back-up keeper **Michael Rensing** celebrated his first Bundesliga appearance this season when he came on for **Oliver Kahn** after 51 minutes against Hannover because the German international suffered a thigh injury.
- Bayern have not lost one of their last 15 Bundesliga matches.
- Additionally, Bayern have not lost a point on home soil since moving to their new Fußball Arena München.
- **Bastian Schweinsteiger** has only completed 90 minutes in five of his 19 Bundesliga matches this season.
- **Mehmet Scholl** has not managed to play a full 90 minutes in any of his nine Bundesliga games in 2005/06.
- **José Paulo Guerrero** has been a replacement in seven of his nine Bundesliga matches so far this season, recording two goals and three assists. However, he has also played five matches for Bayern's third-division amateurs in this campaign and struck three times.
- Bayern's board of directors have extended their contracts this winter with chairman Karl-Heinz Rummenigge and general manager Uli Hoeness until 2008 and 2009 respectively.
- **Dida** is the only Milan player to have not missed a minute of their six UEFA Champions League group-stage games to date. **Paolo Maldini** had also been a constant presence until his injury early in the 3-2 defeat of FC Schalke 04 on Matchday 6.
- Aside from Dida and Maldini, **Gennaro Gattuso** and **Andriy Shevchenko** have each played some part in all six group-stage games.
- **Gattuso** and **Johann Vogel** each need one more appearance to make it 50 in the UEFA Champions League proper. **Shevchenko** is two matches from his 75th.
- **Kakha Kaladze** is two matches away from his half-century in the UEFA Champions League. **Dida** and **Cafu** are each four games away from the 50-mark.

- **Kaladze** will celebrate his 28th birthday on 27 February.
- **Filippo Inzaghi** needs two more goals for 50 in UEFA club competition.
- **Alberto Gilardino's** goal in the 1-0 home victory against Cagliari Calcio on Saturday was his 15th league goal of the season but his first from the penalty spot. His season record in Serie A is 23 goals, a feat he achieved twice with Parma FC.
- Milan have agreed to play FC Barcelona on 15 March in a benefit match for newly-retired former midfielder Demetrio Albertini.
- In January, Milan were eliminated in the Coppa Italia quarter-finals with a 3-1 aggregate defeat by US Città di Palermo.
- **Jaap Stam** has announced that he will leave Milan next summer - a year before the end of his contract - to join AFC Ajax on a two-year deal.
- Three Milan players finished in top ten in the voting for the European Footballer of the Year award – **Andriy Shevchenko** was fifth, **Paolo Maldini** sixth and **Kakà** ninth.
- With the two goals he scored against Treviso FC on 8 February, **Shevchenko** overtook Milan legend Gianni Rivera in the Rossoneri all-time scoring chart. The Ukrainian forward has now scored 165 goals and is second to Gunnar Nordhal on 221.
- **Maldini** and **Shevchenko** - alongside **Cafu** - were also voted into uefa.com's Team of the Year for 2005.
- In the win against Treviso, **Kakà** scored his eighth goal of the season, one more than he achieved last season. He is just two goals from his matching his Milan record in one season.
- In the 4-1 win against Reggina Calcio on 12 February, **Filippo Inzaghi** scored his first hat-trick since October 2002 when he got three goals in Milan's 6-0 win against Torino Calcio.
- Milan scored nine goals in four days in the games against Treviso and Reggina and have the best attacking record in Serie A, with 58 goals from 26 games.
- **Dida** is the only Milan player to have played every game in Serie A and UEFA Champions League this season - a total of 32 matches.

### Team facts

- FC Bayern München are competing in their ninth successive UEFA Champions League having won the competition in the 2000/01 season. The German side have advanced to the knockout stage in the past eight seasons with the exception of their 2002/03 campaign.

- Bayern are chasing their first appearance in the European Champion Clubs' Cup final - and their eighth overall - since their penalty shoot-out defeat of Valencia CF at the end of the 2000/01 season having recovered from the heartbreak of conceding two goals in added time against Manchester United FC in the final two years previously.
- The German side, together with AFC Ajax, dominated the European football landscape during the 1970s with three successive victories in the competition against Club Atlético de Madrid (1973/74), Leeds United AFC (1974/75) and AS Saint-Etienne (1975/76). They also played in the 1981/82 and 1985/86 finals, but lost out to Aston Villa FC (1-0) and FC Porto (2-1) respectively.
- Both Bayern and Juventus hold the distinct record of being the only teams to compete in the European Champion Clubs' Cup final in each of the last four decades. Bayern's record is as follows:

1998/99: Manchester United FC 2-1 FC Bayern München  
1986/87: FC Bayern München 1-2 FC Porto

1973/74: Club Atlético de Madrid 0-4 FC Bayern München (final replay after the two sides drew 1-1 in the final).
- Bayern advanced as one of the 16 clubs to qualify automatically for the competition having won last season's German Bundesliga by 14 points from FC Schalke 04. It was Bayern's sixth Bundesliga title in the past nine seasons and their 18th since the current league format came into being at the start of the 1963/64 campaign.
- The German giants achieved their 50th victory in the UEFA Champions League on Matchday 5 with a 4-0 demolition of Austrian champions SK Rapid Wien in snowy conditions in Munich. Roy Makaay broke his UEFA Champions League duck this season with two second-half strikes, while Sebastian Deisler and Ali Karimi were also on target.
- Having entered the season with 100 matches under their belt in the UEFA Champions League, Bayern are ranked third in the list of the 32 clubs competing this season. Of the participating teams, only Manchester United FC and Real Madrid CF had played more than the Bavaria-based club at the start of the group phase.
- Bayern have played 204 matches overall in the European Champion Clubs' Cup and the UEFA Champions League combined. In that time, Bayern won 111, drew 51 and lost 42 times with 382 goals scored and 199 conceded.
- Their match against Club Brugge on Matchday 6 was their 305th match overall in all UEFA club competition. Bayern have won 166, drawn 73 and lost 66 times with 575 goals scored against 309 conceded.

- AC Milan are involved in the UEFA Champions League for the sixth time in the past seven seasons, missing out only in the 2001/02 season when they participated in the UEFA Cup.
- The Italian giants have made it as far as the final in two of the last three seasons with one victory and defeat. Last season, Milan surrendered a three-goal lead to Liverpool FC before losing on penalties while during the 2002/03 season, they won the competition by the same method against Juventus at Old Trafford. Sandwiched between those two finals, Milan advanced to the quarter-finals, so 2004/05 therefore represented a third successive qualification for the knockout stages.
- Prior to their victory in the 2002/03 season, Milan had not reached the knockout stages of the competition since taking part in the first three finals between 1992/93 and 1994/95.
- Milan won the 1993/94 final by defeating FC Barcelona 4-0, to date the largest margin of victory in a final since the inception of the UEFA Champions League. Daniele Massaro (22,45), Dejan Savi evi (47) and Marcel Desailly (58) all found the net on that occasion although Milan suffered final disappointments either side of their resounding success, losing 1-0 to both Olympique de Marseille in 1992/93 and AFC Ajax two seasons later.
- Prior to their involvement in the UEFA Champions League, Milan appeared in five European Champion Clubs' Cup finals, winning four at the expense of SL Benfica (1962/63 and 1989/90), AFC Ajax (1968/69) and CSA Steaua Bucuresti (1988/89).
- Overall, Milan have played in ten European Champion Clubs' Cup finals, winning six.
- Milan trailed Juventus by seven points to finish runners-up in Italy's Serie A, seven points ahead of rivals FC Internazionale Milano and 17 ahead of Udinese Calcio in fourth.
- Second place proved sufficient for Milan to advance directly to the 2005/06 UEFA Champions League group stage as one of the 16 automatic qualifiers.
- Andriy Shevchenko scored a UEFA Champions League record-equalling four goals on Matchday 5 as Milan marked their return to Istanbul in style, sauntering to a 4-0 victory against Fenerbahçe SK. Shevchenko becoming the first player in UEFA Champions League history to score four goals away from home.
- The victory in Istanbul matched Milan's best result away from home to date in the UEFA Champions League. Previously, the Italian side defeated RC Deportivo La Coruña by the same margin on Matchday 2 of the 2002/03 season. On that occasion, Filippo Inzaghi scored a hat-trick with Clarence Seedorf scoring the other. Milan would eventually advance to the final of the competition, defeating Juventus on penalties where Shevchenko scored the last spot-kick to ensure victory.
- Milan are one of four teams in this season's competition to have played 100 games in the UEFA Champions League, following Manchester United FC, Real Madrid CF and FC Bayern München.

Juventus, FC Barcelona and FC Porto also reached that milestone during this season's group stage.

- In the UEFA Champions League, Milan's overall record reads: played 104, won 56, drawn 27, lost 21 with 160 goals scored and 79 conceded.
- Their overall European Champion Clubs' Cup record (including all qualifying round matches) reads, played 177, won 97, drawn 40 and lost 40 with 318 goals scored and 153 conceded.
- Milan's Matchday 6 engagement against FC Schalke 04 was their 288th in UEFA club competition. Milan's record reads: 155 wins, 67 draws and 66 losses, 485 goals scored and 255 conceded.

### Competition Facts

#### UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- In qualifying for the knockout phase, Real Madrid CF have tied Manchester United FC's record of nine consecutive seasons in advancing past the group stage. While United's streak came to an end this season, Madrid have featured in the knockout phase every time since the 1996/97 campaign. Regarding other teams in this season's knockout phase, both AC Milan and Juventus have qualified for the last four knockout stages, one ahead of Arsenal FC, FC Bayern München, Chelsea FC and Olympique Lyonnais.
- Arsenal are the only club in this season's knockout phase never to have played a UEFA Champions League qualifying-round match. To date, all of Arsenal's 74 matches have been restricted to the group stage and beyond.
- Villarreal CF are the only debutants to advance to this season's knockout phase as FC Artmedia, FC Thun, Real Betis Balompié and Udinese Calcio all failed to advance beyond the group stage. To date, three debutants have won the competition Olympique de Marseille (1992/93, first UEFA Champions League final), AFC Ajax (1994/95) and Juventus (1995/96).

### Head coach profiles

Once an elegant creative midfielder for West Germany and Hamburger SV, Felix Magath has added steel and discipline to his methods to become the country's foremost coach. He has proved himself equal to the task of replacing Ottmar Hitzfeld at FC Bayern München, helping the Bavarians achieve domestic dominance.

Magath enjoyed a glittering international career, his 43 caps encompassing victory in the 1980 UEFA European Championship in Italy and the 1982 and 1986 FIFA World Cups, both of which saw the midfielder collect runners-up medals. A one-club man, Magath scored 46 times in 306

Bundesliga matches during a ten-year playing career at Hamburg, writing himself into Volksparkstadion folklore by scoring the only goal of the 1983 European Champion Clubs' Cup final against Juventus, Hamburg's only continental title.

Magath has been rather more nomadic as a coach. He started at Hamburg, moving on to 1. FC Nürnberg, Werder Bremen, Eintracht Frankfurt and VfB Stuttgart, where he enjoyed four fruitful seasons. In 2002/03, Magath was voted coach of the year in Germany after guiding his young team to second place in the Bundesliga - feats which attracted Bayern's attention. He switched to Munich in May 2004, and promptly won the title at the first attempt having set a Bundesliga record of 15 successive league wins.

One of only four people – the others being Miguel Muñoz, Giovanni Trapattoni and Johan Cruyff – to have lifted the European Champion Clubs' Cup as both a player and coach, Carlo Ancelotti is one of the most highly-regarded young coaches in European football. He claimed the UEFA Champions League in 2003 in only his second season at the AC Milan helm (and would have added another were it not for Liverpool FC's stunning fightback in Istanbul), and has added Serie A and Coppa Italia medals to an individual trophy cabinet teeming with honours.

His coaching career is promising to become every bit as illustrious as his days as a no-nonsense midfielder. Ancelotti started out at AS Roma, winning the Scudetto in 1983, before moving to Milan three years later after his hometown club deemed him too injury-prone. He quickly went about proving them wrong, thriving at the San Siro in five years of unyielding success which brought two more Serie A crowns and back-to-back European Cup wins in 1989 and 1990.

He started his coaching career in similar vein, leading AC Reggiana to promotion in his debut season in 1996. His success attracted the attention of Parma FC, whose decision to bring him to the Ennio Tardini was duly rewarded with an unprecedented second-placed finish. By 1998 he was at Juventus and although he never managed to better runners-up spot, Ancelotti did earn a return to the San Siro.

Belgian referee Frank De Bleeckere is carrying on a family tradition which has endured for more than four decades. De Bleeckere's grandfather was a referee in Belgium in the 1950s and 1960s, and his father René a top-flight match official in the domestic game some 20 years ago.

The third generation of the De Bleeckere dynasty was born in Oudenaarde on 1 July 1966. A sales manager and commercial representative, he speaks English, Flemish, French and German. He started refereeing in 1984, oversaw his first Belgian top-flight match in 1995, before receiving his FIFA badge in 1998. The same year he officiated at his first UEFA tournament, the UEFA European Under-16 Championship in Scotland.

He then participated at the 2001 UEFA-CAF Meridian Cup in Italy and quickly graduated to UEFA Champions League and UEFA Cup duties, continuing his rise up the refereeing ladder with his appointment as one of four specialist fourth officials at UEFA EURO 2004™ in Portugal. There was also an appearance at the 2003 FIFA World Youth Championship in the United Arab Emirates.

De Bleeckere was in the middle for six Champions League matches in 2004/05, including the quarter-final first leg between Liverpool FC and Juventus. His two group stage appointments to date this term took him to Panathinaikos FC and SL Benfica, while he also oversaw the final of the FIFA Under-17 Championship between Brazil and Mexico and Switzerland's progress to the FIFA World Cup at the expense of Turkey in Istanbul on 16 November.

### Domestic news

FC Bayern München suffered a rare setback on a largely unobstructed path towards regaining their Bundesliga title at the weekend as they failed to win for only the second time in nine outings since completing their UEFA Champions League group campaign. First knockout round opponents AC Milan will know all about slips having endured a mixed couple of months although they do go into Tuesday's first leg after securing their third consecutive victory.

#### Hannover 96 1-1 **FC Bayern München**

Having completed their UEFA Champions League group campaign with a disappointing 1-1 draw against Club Brugge KV, Bayern found familiar form on their return to domestic action. Victories against 1. FC Kaiserslautern and at BV Borussia Dortmund took them to 14 wins in 17 matches to complete a record-breaking first half of the Bundesliga season. Felix Magath's team remain on course to match last year's league and cup double after booking a place in the German Cup semi-finals with a 3-2 victory against 1. FSV Mainz 05.

The wins will have made their training camp in Dubai all the more enjoyable, and could have influenced Willy Sagnol's decision to extend his contract at Bayern until summer 2010 despite offers from several clubs in Italy. The Bavarian side also strengthened their squad, signing Paraguayan Julio dos Santos as cover for Michael Ballack but the Germany midfielder soon showed what a void his absence would leave after a blistering start to the new year. The 29-year-old scored three in four games as the champions returned to action with ten points in four matches.

Ballack added another on Saturday to earn Bayern a dramatic last-gasp draw at in-form Hannover and leave Magath in awe, saying: "Michael Ballack is the world's most dangerous midfielder in the opponents' penalty area and he proved that again today. It was a pleasure to watch my team - they showed great fight." Magath will have been less enamoured by the sight of Oliver Kahn leaving the field on 51 minutes after suffering heavy bruising to his thigh, which leaves him doubtful for the game against Milan. Owen Hargreaves and Roque Santa Cruz are definitely out, but Lucio should return after he was rested against Hannover.

#### **AC Milan** 1-0 Cagliari Calcio

After securing their progress to the UEFA Champions League knockout stages with a 3-2 win against Group E rivals FC Schalke 04, Milan were brought to earth with a bump as FC Internazionale Milano edged a derby victory by the same scoreline. Wins against FC Messina Peloro and AS Livorno Calcio helped Carlo Ancelotti's team recover before the winter break in Italy, but inconsistency has continued to plague them since the restart and any concerted effort to rein in runaway leaders Juventus looks all but lost.

The Rossoneri started 2006 with an absorbing 4-3 win against Parma FC. Luck deserted them in a 1-0 defeat at AS Roma, but true to form, they responded with comfortable wins against Ascoli Calcio 1898 and AC Siena. A shock Coppa Italia exit by US Città di Palermo provided another blip

and sent Milan on a mini-downward spiral in which they dropped points against UC Sampdoria and S.S. Lazio.

Successive wins at Treviso FC and Reggina Calcio have apparently arrested that slide, while Alberto Gilardino's first-half penalty against Cagliari on Saturday made it three victories in a row. Jaap Stam was withdrawn at the break as a precaution, with Carlo Ancelotti reluctant for any other defenders to join Paolo Maldini (knee) and Cafu (cartilage) on the sidelines. The coach, who also rested Andrea Pirlo (flu) and Andriy Shevchenko, said: "The difficult period is over. We are improving and gained self-confidence after three consecutive wins. Now we only have to think of playing well against Bayern. We are in very good condition."

### General competition information

UEFA's most prestigious club competition was originally created as the European Champion Clubs' Cup for the 1955/56 season, before its revamping as the UEFA Champions League in 1992.

- **Key dates:** The draws for the quarter-finals (to be played on 28/29 March and 4/5 April), semi-finals (18/19 & 25/26 April) and final are scheduled for Paris on 10 March 2006. This season's showpiece will be played at the city's Stade de France on Wednesday 17 May 2006.
- **Financial information:** UEFA has estimated that the gross budgeted income for the 2005/06 UEFA Champions League will be €598m - higher than the revenue obtained last season. Based on those amounts, €453m would go to the 32 clubs, including €22.5m for the professional leagues of the participating associations, and €145m to UEFA for European football. Clubs in the group stage will receive a starting fee of €1.6m and a bonus of €321,000 per match. Performance bonuses will involve €321,000 for a win and €161,000 for a draw in the group stage. The 16 teams playing in the first knockout round will receive €1.6m each, the eight quarter-finalists €1.9m each and the four semi-finalists €2.6m. The Champions League winners will receive €6.4m, and the runners-up €3.9m. This means that a total minimum amount of €3.5m per club is guaranteed for the group stage. A club could receive, at best, up to €18m, not counting the TV market pool share and gate receipts.

### UEFA information

UEFA and the Football Against Racism in Europe network are preparing a guide for clubs on how to combat racism, as they continue to use the UEFA Champions League and other UEFA competitions to transmit the message that racist conduct will not be tolerated on or off the pitch.

#### Serious problem

The guide is likely to include issues such as racial abuse, institutional exclusion, and clubs' work with minority and migrant communities. At a recent keynote conference in Barcelona, UEFA was urged to take a leading role in the anti-racism campaign and UEFA Chief Executive Lars-Christer Olsson said that racism has to be acknowledged as a serious problem within football and society.

As UEFA club competitions resume after the winter break, UEFA and a number of teams have met for talks under the common banner of the European Club Forum, set up in 2002 as a platform for mutual debate. It was agreed that the format of the UEFA Champions League and UEFA Cup will continue to evolve as the organisation attempts to foresee trends. "UEFA's club competitions have an impact in various areas, including domestic football, so we think it is wise to plan and think ahead," said UEFA professional football director Giorgio Marchetti.

### Lille record

The distribution of competition revenue and payments for the release of national-team players were also on the agenda, while the UEFA Champions League group-stage attendances were analysed. In total, 3,568,172 spectators watched the 96 games, meaning that on average, stadiums were three-quarters full. The match between LOSC Lille Métropole and SL Benfica at the Stade de France drew the biggest crowd – 76,187.

### Communication system

UEFA is testing a referee communication system in the UEFA Champions League this week, having also carried out tests in last week's UEFA Cup Round of 32 first-leg matches. The Matchday 7 games in question are FC Bayern München-AC Milan (refereed by Belgium's Frank de Bleckere); PSV Eindhoven–Olympique Lyonnais (Greece's Kyros Vassaras); and AFC Ajax–FC Internazionale Milano (Germany's Wolfgang Stark).

### 'Importance'

"The decision to conduct a full battery of tests comes following the proposal of the UEFA Referees Committee, which also stressed the importance of the tests being carried out at the highest level of the game in order to test the system in a real big-match atmosphere," said UEFA
