

# Olympique Lyonnais v FC Dynamo Kyiv

Olympique Lyonnais go into their Matchday 4 meeting with FC Dynamo Kyiv confident of claiming their place in the UEFA Champions League knockout rounds for the fourth season running. A victory or a draw will complete the job for the French champions if FC Steaua Bucuresti lose at Real Madrid CF in the night's other Group E game, while Lyon will also go through with a win if Steaua manage a draw.

- The French champions continued their 100 per cent winning start in the section on 17 October with a 3-0 victory in Kiev, courtesy of goals from Juninho Pernambucano (31 minutes), Kim Källström (38') and Florent Malouda (50').
- That result followed a 2-0 defeat of Madrid and 3-0 triumph at Steaua on the opening two matchdays. Gérard Houllier's team are now 90 minutes away from equalling their performance in last season's group stage where they won their four opening games.

### Lyon eye repeat

- With a three-point lead over Madrid at present, Lyon are aiming to top their group ahead of Madrid for the second consecutive season. They have gone into the last 16 as group winners for the past three seasons, having previously consigned Manchester United FC to the runners-up spot in 2004/05 and done the same to FC Bayern München 12 months earlier.
- Dynamo have also made a 100 per cent start – but of the worst kind, with three straight defeats. This is their tenth appearance in a UEFA Champions League group stage and never have they begun so badly.
- Prior to losing to Lyon, Anatoli Demianenko's men suffered defeats against Steaua (1-4) and Real Madrid (1-5) and no team has conceded more goals in the group stage than the 12 they have shipped.

### On the brink

- Dynamo's fading hopes will disappear altogether if they pick up fewer points at Lyon than Madrid manage against Steaua – and given the Spanish side won 4-1 in Bucharest a fortnight ago, few will be betting against a home win when Steaua visit the Santiago Bernabéu.
- This is the first time the Stade Gerland has hosted Ukrainian opposition. However, Dynamo have made three previous trips to France, recording one win and two losses. They beat RC Lens 3-1 on their last visit in the 1998/99 UEFA Champions League and defender Vladyslav Vaschuk – who is still at the club – found the net along with Kakha Kaladze and Andriy Shevchenko.
- That result helped Dynamo top their group above both Arsenal FC and Lens in a memorable campaign where they went as far as the semi-finals before losing to Bayern.

##### UEFA club competition milestones

- Having fallen at the UEFA Champions League quarter-finals for the past three seasons, Lyon have yet to taste true success in Europe's premier club competition.

- Aside from winning the 1997 UEFA Intertoto Cup, Lyon's furthest venture in a UEFA club competition came when they reached the semi-finals of the 1963/64 UEFA Cup Winners' Cup, overcoming B1913 Odense, Olympiacos CFP and Hamburger SV. They would exit following a replay to the eventual winners of the competition, Sporting Clube de Portugal.

##### Ten-year record (including current season)

- This is Lyon's seventh consecutive appearance in the UEFA Champions League with their best performances coming in the past three seasons as they advanced to the quarter-finals of the competition. Eventual winners FC Porto defeated Lyon 4-2 on aggregate during the 2003/04 campaign, while during the 2004/05 season, PSV Eindhoven denied the French side a place in the last four as they qualified 4-2 on penalties after the sides were locked at 2-2. In 2005/06, AC Milan triumphed 3-1 on aggregate.

##### 2005/06 season

**Domestic record:** Lyon won Ligue 1 for the fifth straight season, finishing 15 points ahead of nearest rivals FC Girondins de Bordeaux and a further seven ahead of LOSC Lille Métropole. It was more than enough to guarantee them a group-stage berth for the UEFA Champions League.

**European record:** The French side took 16 points from their six outings in the group stage, their only dropped points coming on Matchday 5 when they were held to a 1-1 draw at Real Madrid CF. Their 13 goals were second only to FC Barcelona (16) in the group stage of the competition. Lyon subsequently overcame PSV in the first knockout round, winning 5-0 on aggregate to avenge their defeat from the 2004/05 season, before falling to Milan.

##### Key facts

- Lyon have played 57 games in the UEFA Champions League (group stage to final), with 31 wins, eleven draws and 15 defeats. In that time they have scored 105 goals while conceding 58.

- With only two defeats in their last 24 games in the UEFA Champions League, Lyon have been the model of consistency in European football's premier club competition. Their overall European Champion Clubs' Cup record (including all qualifying round matches) reads, played 61, won 33, drawn eleven and lost 17 with 109 goals scored and 63 conceded.

- To date, Lyon have been involved in only one scoreless draw in either the European Champion Clubs' Cup/UEFA Champions League including all qualifying round matches. That scoreless stalemate took place on 29 March 2006 at home to AC Milan.

### FC Dynamo Kyiv

#### UEFA club competition milestones

- Dynamo Kyiv have reached the semi-finals of the European Champion Clubs' Cup on three occasions. The first time came in the 1976/77 campaign, losing 2-1 on aggregate to VfL Borussia Mönchengladbach. They then lost 4-2 over two legs to FC Porto in the 1986/87 season.

- The third time Dynamo reached the last four came in the 1998/99 UEFA Champions League. After a 3-3 draw at home against FC Bayern München, Dynamo missed out on the final with a 1-0 loss in Germany.

- Dynamo have twice won the UEFA Cup Winners' Cup, in the 1974/75 and 1985/86 seasons, recording a 3-0 victory each time. They beat Ferencvárosi TC in Basel and then Club Atlético de Madrid in Lyon.

### Ten-year record (including current season)

• Dynamo return to the group stage after a one-year absence following their elimination at the second qualifying round stage to FC Thun at the start of the 2005/06 season. They booked their place in the group stage with a 5-3 aggregate success against Fenerbahçe SK having earlier negotiated the second qualifying round thanks to an 8-1 aggregate defeat of FHK Liepajas Metalurgs.

### 2005/06 season

**Domestic record:** Eleven-time champions of Ukraine since 1992, Dynamo finished level on 75 points with FC Shakhtar Donetsk, which meant a play-off was required to determine the champions. Shakhtar won 2-1 after extra time. Dynamo claimed the Ukrainian Cup with a 1-0 win against FC Metalurh Zaporizhyya.

**European record:** Dynamo had an aborted campaign in the 2005/06 UEFA Champions League, losing at the first hurdle. They were beaten 3-2 on aggregate in the second qualifying round, which meant they did not even transfer to the UEFA Cup.

### Key facts

• To date, Dynamo have played 169 games in the European Champion Clubs' Cup/UEFA Champions League, winning 78 matches, drawing 34 and losing 57. They had scored 253 goals and conceded 196. In the UEFA Champions League (group stage to final only), they have been involved in 69 matches, with 22 victories, 14 draws, 33 losses, 94 goals scored and 104 conceded.

• In total, the Ukrainian side have played a total of 236 games in the UEFA club competition. They had won 112, drawn 51 and lost 73, scoring 364 goals and conceding 256.

### Match facts

#### Lyon

- Lyon have had six goalscorers in this season's competition; **Tiago** and **Fred** have scored twice while **Karim Benzema**, **Kim Källström**, **Juninho Pernambucano** and **Florent Malouda** have also found the net. Benzema has scored in each of his first two UEFA Champions League appearances having also struck on his competition debut against Rosenborg BK last season.
- **Sylvain Wiltord** is the most experienced member of this Lyon squad with 73 UEFA Champions League appearances to his name; **Grégory Coupet** and **John Carew** have both played 52 times in the competition while **Sidney Govou** could bring up his half-century this season having currently played 44 times.
- **Govou** could make his 50th UEFA club competition appearance away to Madrid on Matchday 5 having already played 48 times. **Juninho** could also feature for the 50th time in UEFA competition before the group stage is out having played 47 matches to date. **Coupet** (87 appearances), **Wiltord** (83), **Carew** (78) and **Patrick Müller** (53) have already passed the landmark.
- **Källström** made his UEFA Champions League debut against Madrid on Matchday 1 while **Alou Diarra** made his bow in the competition in the previous fixture against Dynamo.
- **Carew** is Lyon's top scorer in the UEFA Champions League with 17 goals; **Wiltord** (15 goals) and **Juninho** (12) have also reached double figures.
- The same trio are Lyon's leading scorers in UEFA competition overall; **Carew** heads the list with 24 goals, four more than **Wiltord**, with **Juninho** third on 13. **Govou** needs two goals to reach double figures in UEFA club competition.
- **Fred** and **Tiago** are two of 13 players who have scored twice in this season's competition. Didier Drogba leads the way with four goals after three games.
- **Juninho** is the leading assist provider with four. The Brazilian playmaker has also had eight shots on goal, the joint highest after Matchday 3 with David Villa and Kaká.
- **Malouda** has committed eleven fouls in the competition after three games, one fewer than Mark van Bommel.
- **Fred** has been fouled eleven times in the UEFA Champions League this season; only Diego, Franck Jurietti and João Moutinho have been impeded more frequently with 12.
- Only Real Madrid CF, with 27, have had more shots on goal than Lyon, who have managed 24 in their first three games.
- The Spanish side are the competition's leading scorers with nine goals in three games, one more than Lyon.
- Lyon are one of four teams who are yet to concede after three games; FC Bayern München, PFC CSKA Moskva and AC Milan are the others.
- **Anthony Réveillère** celebrates his 27th birthday on 10 November.
- A solitary goal by **Carew** gave Lyon victory on Sunday night as they overcame AS Nancy-Lorraine 1-0 at Stade Gerland. The Norwegian found the net inside the opening quarter of the game, volleying in **Florent Malouda**'s cross, and it proved enough to guide the champions to another three points.

- The win was Lyon's 13th in succession in all competitions and put them eleven points clear at the top of Ligue 1.
- It was their 14th win from 15 games in all competitions so far this season. The only side to deny Lyon victory to date was Toulouse FC, who earned a 1-1 draw on 12 August.
- **Carew's** goal was his first of the season and the first time he had found the net since 23 April against AS Monaco FC.
- After four games in the starting eleven goalkeeper **Rémy Vercoutre** returned to the bench following **Coupet's** recovery from a hand injury. Coach **Gérard Houllier** was without striker **Fred** (hamstring) and **Claudio Caçapa** (thigh) however. **Benzema** came on as a second-half substitute for Carew but was only on the pitch for just over ten minutes before coming off with a head injury. The changes meant that **Juninho** finished the game up front.
- Swiss central defender **Müller** also missed the game because of a dislocated shoulder.
- **Houllier** said: "The win was deserved and I'm satisfied from a defensive point of view as Nancy had no real chances to score. We only scored one goal but to hold on for a result is an important quality in a team. We did it to Madrid in our opening Champions League game and it was no easier tonight."
- On 22 October Lyon strengthened their position at the top of Ligue 1 with a 4-1 victory at their nearest rivals, Olympique de Marseille. **Juninho** scored twice and **Benzema** once before **Källström** wrapped up the points in the final minutes with Lyon's fourth goal.
- If Lyon win against Stade Rennais FC on 4 November they will equal the record for the most consecutive victories in Ligue 1. The champions have won their last nine game, one short of the record that is shared by Stade de Reims Champagne (in 1948/49), FC Girondins de Bordeaux (1953/54) and AS Saint-Etienne (1969/70), who all won ten in a row.
- The team have already equalled Bordeaux's record, set in 1953/54, of the best ever start to a league season after picking up 31 points from a possible 33.
- **Juninho** scored his 30th free-kick in a Lyon shirt (19 at home and eleven away) in the win against Marseille. The Brazilian has scored a total of 71 goals in his six seasons with Les Gones and when he has scored a free-kick Lyon have never lost; the 28 games have finished in 26 wins and two draws.
- Three days after the victory against Marseille, Lyon made it into the last eight of the French League Cup with a 2-1 home win against Paris Saint-Germain FC. The French champions needed two late strikes from Sylvain Wiltord to go through after Paulo César penalty earlier in the second half had seemingly put PSG on course for victory.
- Lyon have been behind five times in matches so far this season and come back to win on each occasion.
- They have scored 17 goals in the last 30 minutes of league games this season and have found the net 27 times overall in Ligue 1. At the other end of the pitch they are yet to concede a league goal in the 15-minute period either side of half-time.
- **Källström** and **Benzema** are the only Lyon players to have featured in all of their league games this season.
- **Coupet** missed three games after he slashed two fingers on his right hand trying to fix an aluminium shelf at home.
- Coupet joined **Fred** in the treatment room with Lyon's top scorer, who has seven goals to his name, ruled out until the end of the year with a hamstring injury sustained against Marseille. **Malouda** was also forced to come off against Marseille with an achilles problem.

• Lyon president **Jean-Michel Aulas** received the medal of Chevalier de la Légion d'honneur on 23 October at Lyon's City Hall for his achievements in sport and business and services to France. "I'm moved," Aulas said. "It's something which refers to the roots of who you are professionally and personally and I feel very happy what I've done has been acknowledged in that way."

• Also on 23 October details of Lyon's new stadium were revealed by the city's mayor Gérard Collomb. To be built in Décines, 10km east of downtown Lyon, the stadium will be based on the same model as Arsenal FC's new ground in London.

### Dynamo

• Only three Dynamo players have featured in all seven of their games in the competition this season, including qualifying: **Carlos Corrêa**, **Oleh Gusev** and **Maksim Shatskikh**.

• **Florin Cernat**, **Ruslan Rotan**, **Vitaliy Mandzyuk** and **Maris Verpakovskis** all featured in qualifying but are yet to appear in the competition proper.

• **Taras Lutsenko**, **Rodolfo**, **Andriy Neshchyn**, **Harrison Otalvaro**, **Kleber**, **José Moreno** and **Olexandr Aliyev** have all appeared in the competition proper this season having sat out qualifying.

• **Olexandr Shovkovskiy** is the most experienced member of the Dynamo squad in UEFA Champions League terms with 55 appearances to his name. **Valentin Belkevich** is next on the list with 44.

• **Lutsenko**, **Olexandr Rybka**, **Rodrigo**, **Marjan Marković**, **Corrêa**, **Taras Mikhalik**, **Harrison Otalvaro**, **José Moreno** and **Aliyev** have all made their debuts in the UEFA Champions League this season. Of those, **Lutsenko** took his bow against Lyon in Kiev.

• The Matchday 3 meeting with Lyon was **Shatskikh's** 60th appearance in UEFA club competition. **Shovkovskiy** (86 appearances), **Valentin Belkevich** (72), **Serhiy Rebrov** (66) and **Vladyslav Vaschuk** (61) have also passed a half-century of European games while **Andriy Neshchyn** has made 46 appearances to date.

• **Rebrov** is the most prolific member of the Dynamo squad in the UEFA Champions League having scored 20 goals. **Shatskikh's** next goal in the competition will be his tenth.

• **Rebrov** is also Dynamo's top scorer in UEFA club competition with 30 goals; **Shatskikh** is second with 20 while **Belkevich** (12 goals) and **Diogo Rincón** (ten) are also in double figures.

• Only PFC CSKA Moskva, with 24, had more corners than Dynamo's total of 21 in the first three games.

• Dynamo have conceded 12 goals in their first three games, the most in the competition.

• **Rodolfo** celebrated his 24th birthday six days after the first Lyon game, on 23 October. **Ayila Yussuf** turns 22 on 4 November.

• Dynamo maintained their slender advantage over FC Shakhtar Donetsk at the head of the Ukrainian Premier League standings with a 2-0 win away to FC Kharkiv on Saturday. Anatoli Demianenko's side struggled to break down the home team before **Kleber** eventually unlocked the defence ten minutes from time with substitute **Shatskikh** adding a second in the closing minutes. Dynamo therefore have a three-point cushion ahead of their next fixture, at home to Shakhtar on 5 November.

- **Shovkovskiy** returned to the Dynamo goal after being displaced by first **Lutsenko** and then **Rybka** while **Diogo Rincón** was left out for disciplinary reasons so **Cernat** came into midfield. **Taras Mikhalik** took the place of **Corrêa**, who was rested ahead of the trip to France, and **Kleber** led the attack in a 4-5-1 formation in which **Gusev** took over on the right wing.
- "I am happy that the team is improving in terms of psychological and physical condition," said **Demianenko**. "Before a game with Lyon in the UEFA Champions League, where the drama and the emotion is much higher, this improvement is a very pleasing factor. It's good Dynamo are getting better; we'll give them a real battle despite our position in the group."
- On 21 October Dynamo defeated struggling FC Stal Alchevsk 3-1 at home in the league. **Mikhalik** opened the scoring before a free-kick by Artem Kasyanov pulled the guests level going into the break. However **Kleber** decided the game in Dynamo's favour, first winning a penalty just short of the hour converted by **Rebrov** before scoring himself late on.
- Dynamo only had four foreign players in their starting lineup for the match. Goalkeeper **Rybka** recovered from concussion to start ahead of **Shovkovskiy**, while in defence **Mandzyuk** was picked ahead of **Goran Gavrančić**. Midfielder **Corrêa** lost his starting place to **Mikhalik** and after appearing as a second-half substitute was forced to come off injured. The Brazilian was replaced by Hungarian **Balász Farkas**, giving the 18-year-old his debut.
- "I am satisfied with the result but the way we played was far from perfect," said Dynamo coach **Anatoli Demianenko**.
- Talking about recent addition **Farkus**, Dynamo vice-president Jozsef Szabo said: "We negotiated with him earlier but we had to wait for him to turn 18 so we could sign a personal contract. This guy is able to do whatever he wants on the pitch. He also appreciates the chance to play football. A lot of things were offered to him, but he just wants to play. He can be compared to Lionel Messi of [FC] Barcelona, but he will be better."
- Four days after the league win Dynamo also tasted victory in the Ukrainian Cup, beating FC Kharkiv 2-0 away. The third-round win for the holders was secured with a goal in each half from **Mikhalik** and **Cernat**, although Dynamo ended the game with ten men after **Artem Milevskiy** was sent off.
- Demianenko made a number of changes for the cup tie with the fit-again **Vaschuk** starting at centre-back alongside **Mandzyuk** as **Rodolfo** was rested. Vaschuk was forced to limp off early on however with a serious knee injury that could rule him out for the remainder of the year after he needed surgery. Meanwhile, **Cernat** was a surprise inclusion in midfield.
- **Demianenko** said: "There were a lot of cards shown, there was a sending off, but we still controlled the game. We set ourselves the task of winning everything, which means winning the cup and the league. We need to get used to this kind of demanding calendar."
- After going without a goal in his first 16 games for Dynamo since joining from FC Zarkapattya Uzhgorod last winter, **Mikhalik** then scored twice in successive games against Stal and Kharkiv. "I am trusted now and this gives me confidence," said the 22-year-old midfielder. "I did not do anything extraordinary, just arrived in the right place at the right time."
- Dynamo have scored 17 of their 28 league goals in the second half.
- **Shatskikh** is the only ever-present in the league for Dynamo so far this season having come on as a substitute against Kharkiv.
- Goalkeeper **Shovkovskiy** is available again on Matchday 4 after serving a suspension for his red card against Madrid in the second round of matches.

### Competition facts

• **UEFA Champions League:** Did you know?

**Domestic champions:** This season's competition features 16 domestic league winners from last season, but none of the eight groups comprising the 2006/07 UEFA Champions League features four champions. Only Group A features three league winners from the last campaign with England, Spain and Bulgaria represented by their champions, namely Chelsea FC, FC Barcelona and PFC Levski Sofia. The fourth club in the group, Werder Bremen, finished second in last season's Bundesliga, five points behind FC Bayern München. All of the remaining groups feature two domestic league winners with the exception of Group H, where Belgian side RSC Anderlecht are the only champions. Group rivals AEK Athens FC were runners-up in Greece, while LOSC Lille Métropole and AC Milan were classified in third place in Ligue 1 and Serie A respectively. Alongside 16 champions, there are nine runners-up and six third-placed finishers. Arsenal FC are the only club in the group stage to have finished in fourth place in their domestic league championship last season.

**Consecutive participations:** This season, Manchester United FC have extended their consecutive participation in the UEFA Champions League to eleven, a record in the competition. Bayern, PSV Eindhoven, Olympiacos CFP and Real Madrid CF are making their tenth consecutive appearances, one ahead of Arsenal.

**Knockout streak:** In qualifying for the 2005/06 knockout phase, Real Madrid CF equalled Manchester United FC's record of nine consecutive seasons in advancing past the group stage. While United's streak came to an end last season, Madrid have featured in the knockout phase every time since the 1996/97 campaign. In those nine seasons, United won the competition once while they also advanced as far as the semi-finals twice, the quarter-finals four times and the first knockout round twice in the other eight seasons. Madrid, meanwhile, have won the competition three times in the last nine years while they advanced as far as the semi-finals twice and the quarter-finals twice. However, in the last two seasons their interest in the competition has ended at the first knockout round.

**European return:** Of all 32 clubs competing in this season's UEFA Champions League, only FC Spartak Moskva and FC Girondins de Bordeaux did not participate in a UEFA club competition during the 2005/06 season. Indeed, the two clubs are making their first appearance in UEFA club competition since the 2003/04 season.

**Past masters:** Four clubs competing in the 2006/07 UEFA Champions League were involved in the competition when it started during the 1992/93 season. AC Milan were beaten finalists (losing to Olympique de Marseille), while PSV Eindhoven, PFC CSKA Moskva and FC Porto all participated in the group stage. In addition, AEK Athens FC and FC Barcelona were knocked out in the second round, the last hurdle before the group stage.

**Long road for debutants:** Five clubs have advanced to the group stage from the European Champion Clubs' Cup second qualifying round including this season's two debutants, FC København and PFC Levski Sofia. They are joined by FC Spartak Moskva, FC Dynamo Kyiv and FC Steaua Bucuresti as clubs who had to play four matches to claim their place in the group stage of the competition. A debutant has not won the competition since Juventus in 1995/96, the Italian side becoming the third club to achieve this following Olympique de Marseille (1992/93, first UEFA Champions League final) and AFC Ajax (1994/95).

**No qualifiers:** Of the 32 clubs involved in the group stage, only AS Roma and FC Girondins de Bordeaux have yet to play a qualifying round match in order to reach the UEFA Champions League. Roma are making their fourth appearance in the competition, while Bordeaux are involved for the second time.

**Pedigree:** Four of the former winners of the competition since it included a group stage element from the 1992/93 season are not participating in this season's UEFA Champions League, namely Olympique de Marseille (1992/93), AFC Ajax (1994/95), Juventus (1995/96) and BV Borussia Dortmund (1996/97). The last ten winners of the competition, Real Madrid CF (three), Manchester United FC, FC Bayern München, AC Milan, FC Porto, Liverpool FC and FC Barcelona are involved in this season's group stage. Only three winners from the last ten UEFA Cup finals are not involved in this season's UEFA Champions League group stage, namely Parma FC (1998/99), Feyenoord (2001/02) and Sevilla FC (2005/06). Liverpool and Porto have won both competitions in the past decade, while the remaining UEFA Cup winners in that time are FC Internazionale Milano, Galatasaray SK, Valencia CF and PFC CSKA Moskva.

### UEFA information

#### **Athens final**

UEFA will unveil the new visual identity created for the 2007 UEFA Champions League final at a special ceremony from 11.00CET on 9 November in the Ceremonies Hall at the City Hall, Kotzia Square, Athens. The UEFA Champions League final has, in recent years, been given an identity of its own with a unique logo, a design concept and an overall theme. The objective is to help promote the final and enhance the prestige of one of the world's biggest sporting events. The 2007 final will be held on 23 May at the city's Olympic Spyros Louis Stadium.

#### **FARE Action Week**

The global profile of Europe's premier club competition - the UEFA Champions League - has proved an ideal vehicle to spread the word against the evil of racism in football. Matchday 3 saw a number of anti-racist activities to support the Football Against Racism in Europe (FARE) network Action Week against racism, intolerance and discrimination. Activities included the captains of all the teams wearing Unite Against Racism armbands, while player-escort children sported Unite Against Racism T-shirts.

In addition, announcements were made to fans in stadiums over the loudspeaker systems calling for opposition to all forms of racism, and Unite Against Racism adverts were placed in matchday programmes as well as the official UEFA Champions League magazine Champions. Supporters, players, clubs, associations, minority organisations, anti-discrimination groups, youth centres, schools and the sports media are all involved in campaigning work for the Action Week, which continued until 30 October. Participation by ethnic minorities and migrants, inclusion of women and girls, and action against homophobia in football are all on the agenda.

UEFA staff made their on-field contribution to the Action Week last Monday with UEFA's staff side and the Geneva-based HOPE team comprising players of various nationalities braved the pouring rain at the Colovray Stadium in Nyon, Switzerland to help spread the message that racism has no place in the game. UEFA's team ran out 7-1 winners in the match.

#### **Coach Educators course**

Speaking at last week's 16th UEFA Course for Coach Educators at the Italian Football Federation's (FIGC) technical centre in Coverciano, Andy Roxburgh, the UEFA technical director, offered a detailed overview of the proposed A-level Elite Youth Diploma for coaches, which he hopes will raise the standard of youth coaching across the continent. "The whole idea of this new licence is to turn today's talents into tomorrow's heroes," said Roxburgh. "Our job is to educate the coaches because they are the ones involved in the process of turning the talents into heroes."

Marcello Lippi, who led Juventus to the 1996 UEFA Champions League, was a star attraction at the course and in a question-and-answer session, he recalled taking his first steps in coaching with the UC Sampdoria youth team in the 1970s. "Coaching young people is a mission – at least that is how I felt about it and that's what I want to say to educators who coach young people. After three years as a youth coach, I realised it was not what I wanted in the long term. But coaching youngsters should not be viewed as a stop-gap."

#### **UEFA donations**

UEFA is to donate CHF2.2m (€1.38m) to its four major Social Responsibility partners for the 2006/07 campaign. The amount was approved by UEFA's Executive Committee at its recent meeting in Ljubljana, Slovenia. The donations - to be paid out of money raised from fines imposed by the UEFA disciplinary authorities on clubs, players and national teams in the 2005/06 season - are being made to the Special Olympics Europe/Eurasia (SOEE) body, the International Committee of the Red Cross (ICRC), the Football Against Racism in Europe (FARE) network, and the Danish Cross Cultures Project Association (CCPA).

#### **Gérard Houllier**

**Coaching career:** Le Touquet AC (player-coach), Arras FA (youth coach), US Noeux-les-Mines, RC Lens, Paris Saint-Germain FC, France, Liverpool FC, Olympique Lyonnais

The speed at which Gérard Houllier returned to the Liverpool FC training ground following a heart operation provided proof, if ever it was needed, that football is the Frenchman's lifeblood. He underlined that with a terrific first season at Lyon, winning the title and guiding them to the UEFA Champions League quarter-finals.

An English teacher who never played the game professionally, Houllier established his credentials during a six-year stay at lowly US Noeux-les-Mines, famously masterminding a French Cup defeat of FC Nantes Atlantique. He moved on to RC Lens (1982-85) and Paris Saint-Germain FC (1985-88) where he won the French title in 1986. A deep thinker, Houllier assisted France coach Michel Platini for almost four years before taking the top job following the 1992 UEFA European Championship.

Things did not quite go to plan as Les Bleus failed to qualify for the 1994 FIFA World Cup, but following a rewarding stint as the French Football Federation's technical director, Houllier could not refuse when Liverpool called in 1998. Initially joint manager alongside Roy Evans, he took sole charge that November. He led the Reds to a treble of UEFA Cup, FA Cup and English League Cup, followed by the UEFA Super Cup, in 2001 before leaving in summer 2004. Houllier returned to France and the following May was offered another plum role as Lyon coach. After securing their fifth straight Ligue 1 title, he quickly agreed a new contract until 2008.

#### **Anatoli Demianenko**

**Date of birth:** 19 January 1959

**Nationality:** Ukrainian

**Playing career:** FC Dnipro Dnipropetrovsk, FC Dynamo Kyiv, 1. FC Magdeburg, RTS Widzew Łódź

**Coaching career:** FC Dynamo Kyiv

Anatoli Demianenko began his playing career with his hometown club FC Dnipro Dnipropetrovsk, though his greatest triumphs came with FC Dynamo Kyiv, where he first moved in 1979. He won the Soviet championship in his first season and capped a fine campaign with a starring role at the 1980 UEFA European Under-21 Championship as the USSR team conceded just once in six matches on their way to the title. He has since described the achievement, in which he played at the heart of the defence, as "unforgettable".

Demianenko won the first of his 80 senior caps the following year, going on to represent USSR in three FIFA World Cups and the 1988 UEFA European Championship, where he played a pivotal role as his team reached the final before losing to the Netherlands. The centre-back won four more league titles and four cups at Dynamo, as well as the 1986 UEFA Cup Winners' Cup. After spells in Germany and Poland, he returned to Dynamo and in 1992 helped them to their first championship since Ukrainian independence.

Demianenko joined the club's coaching staff before taking over as head coach in September 2005, moving up from an assistant's role after Dynamo failed to reach the UEFA Champions League group stage for the first time in nine years. Demianenko flourished immediately, putting the advice he has received down the years from the likes of Jozsef Szabo, Valeriy Lobanovskiy and Leonid Buryak into practice. He won his first trophy as a coach in May 2006 as Dynamo lifted the Ukrainian Cup, although FC Shakhtar Donetsk denied the Kiev club a domestic double by claiming the league title a few days later.

The policeman from Noordwijkerhout has been on the FIFA list since 2001, but actually began refereeing back in 1987. His first European appointment came with two UEFA European Under-17 Championship matches involving eventual semi-finalists Portugal back in March 2004, as Greece and Israel were defeated 2-0 and 3-0 respectively. ### Competition information

UEFA's most prestigious club competition was originally created as the European Champion Clubs' Cup for the 1955/56 season, before its revamping as the UEFA Champions League in 1992.

• **Locally-trained players rule:** In February 2005, UEFA announced that the 'A' list that teams submit for UEFA club competitions will continue to be limited to 25 players, and from season 2006/07, at least four places on this list will be reserved for players trained by the club's own football academy of which half can be players trained by other clubs from within the same association of the said club.

The 'B' list will also continue to exist - involving an unlimited number of Under-21 players who have been at the club for two seasons. In 2007/08, the number of locally-trained players in a squad will increase to six before rising to eight in 2008/09, with up to half of each figure allowed to be association trained.

A club-trained player is defined as a player who has been registered for a minimum of three seasons with the club between the age of 15 and 21, whereas an association-trained player is one who has been registered for at least three seasons by the club or by other clubs affiliated to the same association between the age of 15 and 21.

UEFA is concerned some clubs are not training enough of their own players, but simply taking them from elsewhere. The proposed measures have the objective of creating a better balance in domestic competitions, preventing clubs from simply 'hoarding' players in squads and creating a system whereby locally-trained players would be given a greater opportunity to play regularly in club sides - ensuring a large reservoir of talent for national teams as a consequence.

• **Financial information:** UEFA says the estimated budgeted income for the 2006/07 UEFA Champions League is €750m – higher than the 2005/06 campaign revenue which amounted to CHF943m (approx. €610m).

Under the competition regulations, 75 per cent of the total revenue received from television and commercial contracts concluded by UEFA, up to a maximum of €530m will go to the 32 clubs taking part in the group stage of Europe's premier club competition. The remaining 25 per cent is earmarked for European football and remains with UEFA to cover organisational and administrative costs, as well as for solidarity payments to associations, clubs and leagues.

It is also stipulated that participating clubs will receive 82 per cent of any revenue received from the same stream in excess of € 530m, with the remaining 18 per cent allocated to UEFA for European football. In addition, 50 per cent of the revenue received from new media contracts concluded by UEFA will also be available for distribution to the clubs, and the remaining 50 per cent will be allocated to the above-mentioned European football portion/quota.

The gross income for 2006/07 is estimated at €750m, and according to projections, will be made up of € 743.3m from TV and commercial contracts and €6.7m from new media contracts.

The fixed amount to the clubs is €276.6m. Each of the 32 clubs in the group stage will receive a starting bonus of €2m. In addition, they will receive a match bonus of €400,000 per match. Performance bonuses will amount to €600,000 for a win and €300,000 for a draw in the group stage. The 16 teams playing in the first knockout round will receive €2.2m, the eight quarter-finalists €2.5m each and the four semi-finalists €3m each. The UEFA Champions League winners will receive €7m, and the runners-up €4m.

This means that a total minimum amount of €4.4m per club is guaranteed for the group stage. A club could receive, at best, up to €22.7m, not counting the market pool share and gate receipts.

The remaining €270.4m will be distributed according to the proportional value of each TV market represented by the clubs taking part in the UEFA Champions League, and to be split among the number of teams – four, three, two or one – participating from a given association.

• **Format:** The UEFA Champions League group stage draw in Monaco on 24 August saw the 32 teams divided into eight groups of four. Clubs from the same association could not be drawn into the same group. Each club plays one home and one away match against each other club in its group. Three points are awarded for a win, one point for a draw and no points for a defeat. If two or more teams are equal on points on completion of the group matches, the following criteria are applied to determine the rankings.

- a) higher number of points obtained in the group matches played among the teams in question;
- b) superior goal difference from the group matches played among the teams in question;
- c) higher number of goals scored away from home in the group matches played among the teams in question;
- d) superior goal difference from all group matches played;
- e) higher number of goals scored;
- f) higher number of coefficient points accumulated by the club in question as well as its association, over the previous five seasons.

The eight group-winners and eight runners-up of the group stage qualify for the first knockout round, to be played over two legs on 20 February and 7 March 2007. The clubs that finish this stage in third position in their group move into the round of 32 of the UEFA Cup. The clubs that finish this stage in fourth position in their group are eliminated from UEFA club competition for the season.

• **Deadlines:** UEFA Champions League matchday stats packs and match-by-match press kits are provided to media by uefa.com. For every matchday, a global stats pack is created and issued once matches from the previous matchday have been completed and the data verified. For every UEFA Champions League match, two press kits are issued in English: Sunday at 22:00CET with a match preview update on Monday at 22:00CET for Tuesday's matches. For Wednesday's matches, the press kit is issued on Monday at 22:00CET with the match preview update version published on Tuesday at 22:00CET. Multilingual versions of press kits, determined on a match-by-match basis, are also issued with similar deadlines.
