Match background

CFR 1907 Cluj will look to revive their hopes of progress from Group E when they welcome FC Bayern München to the Stadionul Dr Constantin Rădulescu on Matchday 4.

- Sorin Cârțu's men won their opening home game against FC Basel 1893 but will need another big performance as they look to avenge their unfortunate 3-2 defeat by Bayern in Bavaria on 19 October. That result, achieved by two own goals and a deflection, put Bayern six points clear at the section summit but CFR remain in contention for second place, lying level on three points with Basel and AS Roma.

- To avoid losing further ground, CFR must find a way of stopping a Bayern side with a strong recent away record in the UEFA Champions League. The Bundesliga titleholders' Matchday 2 victory at Basel, secured by Bastian Schweinsteiger's 89th-minute goal, was their fourth in seven UEFA Champions League away games since the start of last season.

Match background

- This is the first time CFR have welcomed German opposition while Bayern have visited Romania three times previously. The German side's most recent trip to the country came in the 2008/09 UEFA Champions League group stage when Daniel Van Buyten earned them a 1-0 win at FC Steaua București.

- That was their first visit since Karl-Heinz Rummenigge, now chairman of Bayern's board, scored in a 2-0 first-leg victory at FC Universitatea Craiova in the 1981/82 European Champion Clubs' Cup quarter-final, setting up a 3-1 aggregate success.

- Bayern's maiden trip to Romania was to face Steaua in the 1971/72 UEFA Cup Winners' Cup quarter-final and it yielded a 1-1 draw, Gerd Müller's goal proving pivotal as the Bundesliga club eventually advanced on away goals after a home stalemate.

Team ties

- As a young player at AFC Ajax, Bayern coach Louis van Gaal worked under Romanian coach Ștefan Kovács. Kovács, who played for CFR in the late 1940s, died in Cluj-Napoca 12 days before Van Gaal led Ajax to their fourth European crown in May 1995.

- CFR owner Árpád Pászkány lived in Munich for several years and still has a house there.

- Philipp Lahm scored Germany's 88th-minute goal in a 5-1 friendly defeat by Romania in Bucharest in April 2004.

- Christian Nerlinger, Bayern's sporting director, struck an 86th-minute equaliser for Germany in a 1-1 friendly draw with Romania in Malta in September 1998.

- Franck Ribéry played under one of Romania's greatest footballers, Gheorghe Hagi, after signing for Galatasaray AŞ in 2005. He scored for France in a 2-2 FIFA World Cup qualifying draw in Romania in October 2008, which featured Gabriel Mureșan in the home lineup.

- Arjen Robben played in the Netherlands' 2-0 defeat of Romania at UEFA EURO 2008. He had earlier scored in a 2-0 World Cup qualifying win against the same opponents in June 2005.

- Hugo Alcântara was in the CF Os Belenenses side that lost away (0-1) and home (0-2) to Bayern in the 2007/08 UEFA Cup first round.

- Dominique Kivuvu was part of the NEC Nijmegen team that suffered home (0-3) and away (0-1) defeats by Ivica Olić's old side Hamburger SV in the 2008/09 UEFA Cup round of 32 – the Croatia forward scoring in both legs.

- For the third away league game this season CFR ended with nine men after Lacina Traoré (69) and Leo Veloşo (85) were dismissed.
- Not in CFR's UEFA Champions League squad, Sixto Peralta scored his first goal of the season to earn a point against the league leaders.
- After 13 league games CFR have amassed 16 points – their worst start to a campaign since returning to Liga 1.
- CFR have won just once in ten away games this season – 1-0 at second tier CS ACU Arad in the last 32 of the Romanian Cup on 21 September.
- CFR have lost seven of their last 16 matches in all competitions.
- Roberto De Zerbi, who was rested at Oțelul Galați, has scored in each of his last three league appearances, including two as Sorin Cârțu's side beat FC Unirea Urziceni 3-0 on 24 October.
- Three days later a largely second-string CFR team advanced to the Romanian Cup quarter-finals, Ferdinando Sforzini's first goal of the season wrapping up a 2-0 victory against FCM Târgu Mureş.
- Winners for the past three years, CFR have not lost a Romanian Cup tie since 8 November 2006 and a 2-0 defeat by FC Timișoara.
- The Romanian titleholders have won their last three home matches and have not conceded at the Stadionul Dr Constantin Rădulescu in 275 minutes.
- CFR have lost just three home league games since the start of 2006/07.
- CFR's 5-3 loss to FC Vaslui on 15 October was only the third time they have conceded five goals in a game since returning to the Romanian top flight in 2004 and the first since a 5-1 loss at CS Jiul Petroşani on 19 March 2006.
- Andrea Mandorlini was sacked after a 2-0 defeat at FC Rapid Bucureşti on 10 September and replaced by Cârțu.

Injury news

- Gabriel Mureşan has not played since picking up a right leg injury on 24 September.
- Yssouf Koné is not in the UEFA Champions League squad having suffered knee ligament damage in CFR's win against FC Victoria Brăneşti on 2 August.

- Pranjic set up Bayern's first three goals: the opening two from corners and the third with a pass that allowed Anatoliy Tymoshchuk to score his first Bundesliga goal.
- Bayern are five matches unbeaten; winning four at home and drawing 0-0 at Hamburger SV on 22 October.
- Schweinsteiger scored twice as holders Bayern came from behind to beat SV Werder Bremen 2-1 in the German Cup second round on 26 October, in a repeat of last year's final which the Bavarian side won 4-0.
- Bayern will travel to VfB Stuttgart in the round of 16 on 21/22 December, having met in the Bundesliga on 19 December.
- Bayern picked up eight points from their first seven games – their worst ever start to a Bundesliga campaign.
- Louis van Gaal's side drew 0-0 with 1. FC Köln on 18 September and against Bremen a week earlier – the first time the German champions have ever recorded back-to-back goalless draws at home in the Bundesliga.

Injury news

- Holger Badstuber pulled up with a groin problem in the pre-match warm-up on Friday. Martín Demichelis was drafted into the starting XI for the first time in the league this season as Van Gaal named only five substitutes.
- Miroslav Klose was ruled out for three weeks after tearing his hamstring in training on 27 October, 15 days after suffering a similar injury on international duty.
- Mark van Bommel has also been out of action since sustaining a knock playing for the Netherlands on 12 October.
- Ivica Olić, who broke his nose at the start of October, has been ruled out for six months after learning he must undergo surgery on meniscus and cartilage damage in his knee.
- Breno is back in training having ruptured his cruciate ligament while on loan at 1. FC Nürnberg in March.
- Franck Ribéry (right ankle ligaments, injured on 21 September), Diego Contento (groin, 21 September) and David Alaba (ankle, 27 September) are all sidelined.
- Arjen Robben (torn left thigh muscle) and third-choice goalkeeper Rouven Sattelmaier (bicep) are both expected to be out until the new year.

Miscellaneous

- Klose, Philipp Lahm, Müller, Schweinsteiger and Robben have been shortlisted for the FIFA Ballon d'Or, the winner of which will be announced in Zurich on 11 January. Van Gaal is among the FIFA World Coach of the Year nominees.
- Tymoshchuk made his 100th international appearance in Ukraine's 2-0 defeat by Brazil on 11 October.

Head coach

CFR 1907 Cluj: Sorin Cârțu

Date of birth: 12 November 1955

Nationality: Romanian

Playing career: FC Universitatea Craiova, FC Electroputere Craiova (now FC Caracal)

Coaching career: FC Universitatea Craiova (three times), FC Electroputere Craiova/FC Extensiv Craiova (now FC Caracal) (three times), Romania Under-21, FC Rapid București, Veria FC, FC Oțelul Galați, FC Argeș Pitești, FC Timișoara, FC Progresul București, CS Mioveni, CS Pandurii Lignitul Târgu Jiu, CFR 1907 Cluj

- A celebrated forward, Cârțu scored 107 goals in 283 games in the top division, winning three domestic titles and four Romanian Cups during Universitatea's golden age in the 1970s and 1980s.
- Capped seven times, he helped the club reach the 1982/83 UEFA Cup semi-finals, losing out to SL Benfica on away goals after a 1-1 aggregate draw.
- Stayed on for his first coaching assignment, winning a domestic double in 1990/91. Returned for a second spell after losing the 1994/95 Romanian Cup final on penalties with Rapid.
- Coached Veria in Greece and led Extensiv to the Romanian top division, but their adventure ended in relegation at the first time of asking. A similar fate befell Cârțu's Progresul and Mioveni sides, though he saved Pandurii Lignitul from the drop in 2008/09.
- With a reputation for making smaller clubs punch above their weight, Cârțu replaced Andrea Mandorlini as CFR coach two days before their opening 2010/11 UEFA Champions League group stage game.

FC Bayern München: Louis van Gaal

Date of birth: August 8 1951

Nationality: Dutch

Playing career: AFC Ajax, R. Antwerp FC, Stormvogels Telstar, Sparta Rotterdam, AZ Alkmaar

Coaching career: AFC Ajax, FC Barcelona (twice), Netherlands, AZ Alkmaar, FC Bayern München

- Having never made it beyond the reserve team at his first club, Ajax, Van Gaal spent most of his playing career as a Sparta midfielder, retiring in 1987 after a season with AZ, where he started his coaching career as an assistant.
- Took on a similar coaching role at hometown club Ajax, under Leo Beenhakker, from 1988 to 1991 before moving up to the top job on his mentor's departure.
- Had six glorious years at Ajax, winning three Eredivisie titles, a Dutch Cup, the 1992 UEFA Cup and the 1995 UEFA Champions League; defended that title in 1996 all the way to a penalty shoot-out defeat by Juventus in the final. Was awarded an Order of the Oranje-Nassau in 1997 and made a knight.
- Moved to Spain the same year for a three-season stint at Barcelona, winning two Liga titles and a Copa del Rey. Became Netherlands coach in 2000 in an unsuccessful bid to qualify the Oranje for the 2002 FIFA World Cup. Returned briefly to Barça before a spell out of coaching.
- Took over at Alkmaar in 2005, steering them to their first Eredivisie title since 1981 in April 2009. Appointed coach of Bayern a month later, as a replacement for caretaker Jupp Heynckes, and became the first Dutch coach to win the Bundesliga in his first season, also adding the German Cup and reaching the UEFA Champions League final.

Serge Gumienny	14/04/1972	1	56

- Born in Sint-Truiden in April 1972, Serge Gumienny had his first taste of UEFA competition in 2001 and has not looked back.
- Featured as a fourth official in qualifying for the UEFA Champions League, UEFA Cup and 2002 UEFA European Under-21 Championship before taking charge of U17 qualifiers and UEFA Intertoto Cup matches in summer 2003 – the same year he was awarded his FIFA badge.
- Went onto figure frequently across UEFA competition, also appearing at the 2005 UEFA-CAF Meridian Cup in Turkey. Took charge of two matches at the U21 finals in 2006, also acting as fourth official in two more including the Ukraine v Serbia and Montenegro semi-final.
- Gumienny, who in addition to working in his native Belgium also often oversees matches in the Netherlands, continued to work regularly as a referee in the UEFA Cup and as a fourth official in the UEFA Champions League. Was in the middle for the 2008 Belgian Cup final.
- Took charge of one qualifier for UEFA EURO 2008 and three for the 2010 FIFA World Cup finals. The fourth official for the Hamburger SV-SV Werder Bremen UEFA Cup semi-final in 2008/09 and the second leg between FC Barcelona and FC Internazionale Milano at the same stage of the following season's UEFA Champions League.

Competition facts

• **UEFA Champions League:** Group stage milestones

Holders FC Internazionale Milano are looking to avoid becoming the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage).

In 1992/93, FC Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and were beaten 4-3 on aggregate in the second round by PFC CSKA Moskva.

S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta became the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League in 2007/08 when he featured against Olympiacos FC on Matchday 1 at the age of 43 years and 168 days. The record was previously held by Alessandro Costacurta, the AC Milan defender who played against AEK Athens FC in 2006/07 at the age of 40 years and 211 days. Ballotta was aged 43 years 252 days when he featured against Real Madrid CF on Matchday 6.

Javier Zanetti is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 72 days, having found the net for FC Internazionale Milano in their 4-3 defeat of Tottenham Hotspur FC on 20 October 2010.

Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared in the UEFA Champions League. He was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was then sent off in the 37th minute.

Barcelona and Manchester United have both finished as group winners on 11 occasions, one more than Milan and Real Madrid.

Four teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain FC (1994/95), FC Spartak Moskva (1995/96) and Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage).

Ten teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, including Maccabi Haifa FC and Debreceni VSC in 2009/10. The other eight are: FC Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08), PFC Levski Sofia (2006/07), SK Rapid Wien (2005/06), RSC Anderlecht (2004/05), FC Spartak Moskva and Bayer 04 Leverkusen (2002/03, first and second group stage respectively), Fenerbahçe SK (2001/02, first group stage) and 1. FC Košice (1997/98).

Manchester United scored 20 goals in the 1998/99 group stage, more than any other side has managed. Barcelona scored 19 times in the 1999/2000 first group stage.

Debrecen conceded 19 goals in their six outings in 2009/10, equalling the record let in during a group stage set by Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08) and Ferencvárosi TC in 1995/96.

No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), AFC Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea FC (2005/06), Liverpool FC (2005/06) and Villarreal CF (2005/06) all let in just one.

Before their 3-1 win against Sporting Clube de Portugal on Matchday 6 of the 2006/07 campaign, FC Spartak Moskva went 22 games without a victory in the competition, surpassing the unwanted record set by AEK Athens FC on Matchday 3 of the same campaign.

The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is seven points. The first to do it, since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96, were Legia Warszawa that same season before FC Dynamo Kyiv and Bayer Leverkusen managed it in 1999/2000 and Liverpool in 2001/02. FC Lokomotiv Moskva and eventual finalists Juventus both progressed with seven points in 2002/03, a feat achieved by Rangers FC and Werder Bremen in 2005/06.
