## Match background

---

After waiting 38 years to get back to San Siro, Tottenham Hotspur FC return there for the second time in just four months to take on AC Milan in the first leg of their UEFA Champions League round of 16 tie.

- Harry Redknapp's side got the better of Milan's city rivals, FC Internazionale Milano, in the group stage. Tottenham finished a point clear of Inter at the Group A summit thanks, in part, to a 3-1 home success against the Nerazzurri.
- Tottenham can also take heart from an impressive second-half showing when losing 4-3 to Inter at San Siro on 20 October. Gareth Bale hit a second-half hat-trick after his team, down to ten men, had trailed 4-0.
- Massimiliano Allegri's Milan qualified second in Group G behind Real Madrid CF and their goal now is to avoid a third round of 16 elimination by English opposition in four seasons after defeats by Manchester United FC last term and Arsenal FC in 2008. The Rossoneri have not been beyond this stage since their last European triumph in 2007.

### Previous meetings

- Tottenham prevailed in the clubs' one previous two-legged encounter in the 1971/72 UEFA Cup semi-final. They won the first leg in north London 2-1 as Steve Perryman's double overturned Romeo Benetti's opener before a 1-1 draw in Milan, Alan Mullery's goal taking Spurs through despite Gianni Rivera's penalty equaliser. Keeping goal for Milan was Fabio Cudicini, father of Tottenham's reserve custodian Carlo.

### Match background

- Seven-time winners Milan may have a greater pedigree in Europe's elite competition than a Tottenham side competing for only the second time, but the London club had the more impressive group stage statistics.
- Tottenham are the competition's joint-leading scorers after hitting 18 goals in Group A, including eight on their travels. Milan, by contrast, qualified with fewer points than any other team (eight) and were the joint lowest scorers (seven). At home they recorded one win, one draw and one defeat.
- Since overcoming Liverpool FC in the 2007 UEFA Champions League final, Milan have failed to win in five meetings with English teams. After a 2-0 aggregate loss to Arsenal in 2007/08, they drew at Portsmouth FC in the 2008/09 UEFA Cup group stage before a 7-2 aggregate defeat by United 12 months ago.
- Prior to their home reverses against Arsenal (0-2, 2007/08) and United (2-3, 2009/10), Milan had not lost to visitors from England; their record now reads W7 D4 L2.
- Besides facing Milan and Inter, Spurs' only other encounter with Serie A opposition was a 2-0 loss at Udinese Calcio in the 2008/09 UEFA Cup group stage.
- Milan lost the 2005 UEFA Champions League final to Liverpool on penalties but gained revenge with victory in a 2007 final in which Peter Crouch featured as a 78th-minute substitute for the English side.

### Team ties

- Kevin-Prince Boateng joined Tottenham from Hertha BSC Berlin in July 2007 and made 14 league appearances before moving to Portsmouth in 2009. He scored a penalty in Portsmouth's 2-0 FA Cup semi-final defeat of Tottenham last April.
- Mathieu Flamini spent four seasons with Spurs' arch-rivals Arsenal and played in five north London derbies, winning two and drawing three.
- Robinho was at Manchester City FC from September 2008 to January 2010. He faced Tottenham twice and lost both times, a 2-1 home reverse in November 2008 in which he scored, and a 3-0 away loss in December 2009.
- Carlo Cudicini was born in Milan and came through the Rossoneri's youth system. He made two UEFA Champions League appearances in 1992/93 but never appeared in Serie A.
- William Gallas captained the Arsenal side that beat Milan in 2007/08.
- Heurlho Gomes was in the PSV Eindhoven team defeated on away goals by Milan in the 2004/05 semi-finals.
- Tottenham's January signing Steven Pienaar was in the AFC Ajax team that lost 3-2 on aggregate to Milan in the 2002/03 quarter-finals, scoring in the 3-2 second-leg defeat at San Siro. He also played in Ajax's 1-0 group-stage defeat in Milan the following season.
- Rafael van der Vaart played in the Netherlands side that were 4-1 winners against Zlatan Ibrahimović's Sweden in a UEFA EURO 2012 qualifier in October.

• Milan have scored 197 goals in the UEFA Champions League, group stage to final. They have conceded 196 European Champion Clubs' Cup goals.

- Milan scored seven times in the group stage, the lowest total of the teams to reach the round of 16 along with Manchester United FC and FC København.
- Milan have collected more yellow cards (17) than any other side in the competition.
- Luca Antonini, Kevin-Prince Boateng, Gennaro Gattuso and Gianluca Zambrotta are a booking away from a ban.

- Clarence Seedorf scored his first goal since 24 April to maintain his record of having registered in all 12 seasons he has played in Serie A.
- Massimiliano Allegri's side are ten matches unbeaten in all competitions, winning six.
- Milan ended 2010 with a 1-0 defeat by AS Roma and had won three of their subsequent seven league games before Saturday, drawing the rest. SSC Napoli, S.S. Lazio and Roma have also faltered so the Rossoneri's lead remains intact but FC Internazionale Milano, 13 points adrift at the turn of the year, have closed the deficit.
- Allegri made his competitive debut in the Milan dugout in the 4-0 triumph over US Lecce on 29 August. It is the second time Milan have beaten Lecce on the opening day of a season, having won 1-0 on the same date in 1993. The Rossoneri, then coached by Fabio Capello, went on to win the Scudetto and UEFA Champions League.

#### Injury news

- Andrea Pirlo was set for his second appearance since 18 December on Saturday after recovering from a thigh problem, but was ruled out for another six weeks when he suffered knee ligament damage in Friday training.
- Alessandro Nesta (dislocated shoulder, out since 23 January) and Antonini (hamstring, 1 February) returned to the side on Saturday after injuries while Marco Amelia was on the bench on his comeback from a hamstring problem picked up on 18 January.
- Milan's injury list includes Zambrotta (knee, 12 December), Boateng (Achilles, winter break), Rodney Strasser (thigh, 19 January), Ignazio Abate (thigh, out since 23 January) and Massimo Ambrosini (thigh, 29 January).
- Nicola Legrottaglie has not played since suffering a head injury on his Milan debut against Lazio on 1 February.
- Pato (left thigh, out 10 November to 6 January), Massimo Oddo (left thigh, 29 October to 20 January), Mathieu Flamini (right knee, 8 December to 16 January) and Gattuso (thigh, 23 January to 6 February) are all back in action.
- Filippo Inzaghi is likely to miss the rest of the season after injuring his left knee against Palermo on 10 November.

• For the second successive week Niko Kranjčar scored the decisive goal in a 2-1 win, following his added-time effort against Bolton Wanderers FC on 5 February.

• Michael Dawson scored his first goal in 45 games, since a 2-2 draw at Everton FC on 6 December 2009.

• Harry Redknapp's side have lost just two of their last 19 games, winning 11.

• Prior to defeating Newcastle United FC 2-0 on 28 December, Tottenham had kept one clean sheet in 23 matches – against Werder Bremen on Matchday 5. They have kept five in their last ten games.

### **Injury news**

• Gareth Bale (back, out since 22 January) and Rafael van der Vaart (calf, 5 February) missed the Sunderland game, as did Luka Modrić (appendix) and Younes Kaboul (knee) having both undergone surgery at the start of February.

• Jonathan Woodgate has not played a competitive fixture since November 2009 due to a groin injury but was an unused substitute on Saturday. He managed 90 minutes in a friendly against Queens Park Rangers FC on 9 February.

• Peter Crouch missed England's friendly against Denmark on 9 February because of a back problem and was rested on the bench against Sunderland.

• A recurrent groin strain has restricted Ledley King to one appearance since 29 September. The Tottenham captain had an operation in Germany on 8 February.

• On 15 November Tom Huddlestone was ruled out for three months with an injury to his right ankle.

**Nationality:** Italian

**Playing career:** UC Cuoioielli, AS Livorno Calcio (twice), Pisa Calcio, AC Pavia, Pescara Calcio (twice), Cagliari Calcio, AC Perugia, Calcio Padova, SSC Napoli, AC Pistoiese, Aglianese Calcio 1923

**Coaching career:** Aglianese Calcio 1923, SPAL 1907, US Grosseto FC, US Sassuolo Calcio, Cagliari Calcio, AC Milan

- A creative attacking midfielder, Allegri started out in his native Tuscany with Cuoioielli and then Livorno, his hometown club. First appeared in Serie A for Pisa against Milan in 1988/89 but played only twice that season before returning to Livorno.
- He returned to Serie A after helping Pescara win promotion in 1992. The following term he scored 12 goals under Giovanni Galeone, the coach Allegri still considers his mentor.
- After leaving Pescara in 1993, Allegri had spells at Cagliari, Perugia, Padova and Napoli before hanging up his boots back in Tuscany with fourth division Aglianese in 2003.
- Moved straight into coaching at Aglianese, prior to taking charge at SPAL and Grosseto. In November 2008 he won the Panchina d'Oro (golden bench) as the third division's best coach having led Sassuolo to promotion.
- Had earlier been appointed by Cagliari whom he led to ninth place in 2009, winning the golden bench again, this time as Serie A's best coach. Cagliari started the following season superbly but a bad run of results prompted Allegri's dismissal on 13 April 2010 – although he had already done enough to earn a two-year contract at Milan.

### Tottenham Hotspur FC: Harry Redknapp

**Date of birth:** 2 March 1947

**Nationality:** English

**Playing career:** West Ham United FC, AFC Bournemouth (twice), Brentford FC, Seattle Sounders

**Coaching career:** AFC Bournemouth, West Ham United FC, Portsmouth FC (twice), Southampton FC, Tottenham Hotspur FC

- Started out at West Ham, where his team-mates included future England FIFA World Cup-winning captain Bobby Moore. A midfielder, Redknapp scored seven goals in 149 appearances before joining Bournemouth in 1972, where he also played over 100 games.
- Moved to America via Brentford in 1976, spending three years in Seattle where he also worked as assistant coach. Held the same post to Moore at non-league Oxford City FC and then went to Bournemouth, where he was appointed manager in late 1983. Masterminded an FA Cup shock against holders Manchester United FC in January 1984.
- Left in summer 1992, returning to West Ham as assistant to Billy Bonds, whom he succeeded as manager in 1994. Gave first-team chances to the likes of Frank Lampard, Rio Ferdinand and Joe Cole during his seven years in charge.
- Appointed Portsmouth's director of football in 2001, Redknapp stepped into the manager's chair the following year. Took them into the Premier League in 2003 and, after a year in charge of local rivals Southampton, returned in December 2005, winning the FA Cup in 2008.
- Struggling Tottenham turned to Redknapp that October and he steered the team away from relegation trouble, also reaching the League Cup final. In 2009/10 he led the club to fourth position in the Premier League, earning a new contract until 2013.

Oversaw five UEFA Champions League games in 2009/10, including the quarter-final second leg between PFC CSKA Moskva and eventual winners FC Internazionale Milano, and two group games at the 2010 FIFA World Cup.

## Competition facts

---

### UEFA Champions League knockout stage: Did you know?

- Teams have recovered from a first-leg deficit to go through to the next stage on 22 occasions, although only once – AFC Ajax's defeat of Panathinaikos FC in the 1995/96 semi-finals – has a side gone through after losing the first leg at home. The biggest losing margin a side has overturned was achieved by RC Deportivo La Coruña in the 2003/04 quarter-finals when they fought back from a 4-1 defeat at AC Milan to win 4-0 at home.
- Nineteen ties have been decided on the away goals rule, including five where the triumphant team lost the first leg.
- FC Bayern München hold the record for the biggest first-leg lead with a 5-0 success at Sporting Clube de Portugal in the 2008/09 first knockout round, eventually going through 12-1 after a 7-1 home victory in the second leg.
- Ten ties have now gone to penalties, including the game between Arsenal FC and AS Roma in the 2008/09 first knockout round. Five of these were finals – 1996, 2001, 2003, 2005 and 2008. The first two-legged tie decided on spot-kicks was PSV Eindhoven's 4-2 win against Olympique Lyonnais on 13 April 2005 after a 2-2 aggregate draw.
- In all, 17 ties have required extra time. So far seven have been decided by extra time alone: four quarter-finals, two first knockout round encounters and the 2007/08 semi-final between Chelsea FC and Liverpool FC.
- The 2008/09 last-16 encounter between Bayern and Sporting featured more goals (13) over its two legs than any previous UEFA Champions League knockout tie, Bayern prevailing 12-1.
- There has never been a knockout tie ending goalless after two legs. Nine have finished 1-0 on aggregate, most recently Manchester United FC's narrow victory against FC Barcelona in the 2007/08 semi-finals.
- Bayern's 4-0 defeat of Lyon in 2009/10 is the joint biggest aggregate win in a UEFA Champions League semi-final, equalling Juventus' 6-2 victory against Ajax in 1996/97.
- Clarence Seedorf is the only player to win the European Champion Clubs' Cup with three clubs (AFC Ajax 1995, Real Madrid CF 1998, AC Milan 2003, 2007). Liverpool's Bob Paisley (1977, 1978, 1981) is the only coach to win three times.
- Ottmar Hitzfeld (BV Borussia Dortmund 1997, Bayern 2001), Ernst Happel (Feyenoord 1970, Hamburger SV 1983) and José Mourinho (FC Porto 2004, FC Internazionale Milano 2010) are the only coaches to win the trophy with two clubs.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Champion Clubs' Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United (2008, 2009) have all returned to the final as holders only to lose.

### UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having been aged 43 years 252 days when he featured against Real Madrid CF on Matchday 6 of the 2007/08 competition.
- Filippo Inzaghi is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 87 days, in AC Milan's 2-2 draw against Real Madrid CF on 3 November 2010.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared in the UEFA Champions League. He was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against Steaua on 23 November 1994. He was then sent off in the 37th minute.
