## Match background

---

As if a 3-0 first-leg cushion was not enough, Juventus will defend an unbeaten home European record that has stood for more than three years when they entertain Celtic FC in the second leg of their UEFA Champions League round of 16 tie.

- The teams are on opposite sides again 11 years on from contesting two outstanding group stage fixtures, Juventus winning 3-2 in Turin and Celtic turning the tables in Glasgow with a 4-3 success.
- This time round, the first leg proved to be a more comfortable experience for Juve as goals from Alessandro Matri (3), Claudio Marchisio (77) and Mirko Vučinić (83) left them on the verge of a first quarter-final appearance since 2005/06 and equalled Celtic's heaviest home defeat in UEFA competition.

### Previous meetings

- Celtic manager Neil Lennon and his assistant Johan Mjällby played in both those 2001 games. On 18 September in Turin, David Trezeguet's double (43, 55) gave Juve a two-goal lead, but Stiliyan Petrov pulled one back in the 67th minute and Henrik Larsson looked to have earned Celtic a point from the penalty spot with four minutes left. In the final minute, however, Nicola Amoroso struck with a penalty of his own to give Juve the spoils.
- In the reverse fixture, Alessandro Del Piero gave Juve a 19th-minute lead, but goals from Joos Valgaeren (24) and Chris Sutton (45) turned the match around. Trezeguet (51) levelled, but again Celtic responded strongly, another Larsson penalty (57) restoring their advantage before Sutton's second (64). Trezeguet (77) struck again to set up a barnstorming finish, but Celtic held on.
- Gianluigi Buffon started in Turin and was on the bench in Glasgow and is the only survivor from those games. Pavel Nedvěd, now a Juventus director, featured at Celtic Park.
- The lineups for the game at the Delle Alpi were:  
**Juventus:** Buffon, Thuram, Montero, Pessotto (Birindelli 63), Tacchinardi, Iuliano, Davids, Zenoni, Del Piero (Amoroso 87), Trezeguet, Salas (O'Neill 69).  
**Celtic:** Douglas, Valgaeren, Baldé, Mjällby, Lambert, Petrov, Agathe, Lennon, Thompson (Petta 58), Larsson, Sutton.
- The sides also met in the 1981/82 European Champion Clubs' Cup first round, Celtic winning 1-0 at home but Juventus went through with a 2-0 victory in the return. Celtic first-team coach Danny McGrain played in the first game.

### Match background

- Juventus, whose first-leg win in Glasgow extended their unbeaten run in UEFA competition to 17 games, are in the UEFA Champions League knockout rounds for the tenth time. They were last at this stage in 2008/09, when they lost 1-0 at Chelsea FC before drawing 2-2 in Turin.
- They have won six out of six against Scottish visitors, scoring 16 goals and conceding only three, keeping four clean sheets in the process. Their overall record against Scottish teams is W9 D1 L3.
- The Bianconeri's Group E home campaign began with a 1-1 draw against FC Shakhtar Donetsk before they overcame FC Nordsjælland and Chelsea 4-0 and 3-0 respectively. They drew at Chelsea (2-2) and in Denmark (1-1), while the 1-0 matchday six win in Donetsk ensured they finished top of the section.
- Juve have not been beaten in Europe since 18 March 2010, when they went down 4-1 at Fulham FC in the UEFA Europa League group stage round of 16 second leg, losing 5-4 on aggregate. Their subsequent fixtures have produced eight wins and nine draws.
- Juventus have won their last four European matches, keeping clean sheets in all of them.
- At home the Italian champions have lost just once in 29 European fixtures, including qualifying rounds. It came on 8 December 2009 when FC Bayern München won 4-1 in the UEFA Champions League group stage.
- Furthermore, Juve have won all 34 of the UEFA competition ties in which they triumphed in the first leg away from home, including two 3-0 successes in the first match; against AC Omonia in the 1977/78 European Cup first round (2-0 second leg) and PFC CSKA Sofia in the 1994/95 UEFA Cup first round (5-1 second leg), although in the latter tie Juve actually lost the first leg 3-2 but were subsequently awarded a 3-0 win as CSKA fielded an ineligible player.
- Indeed, only twice have they lost at home after an away victory, against Hamburger SV in the 1989/90 UEFA Cup quarter-finals (0-2 second leg, 3-2 on aggregate) and Olympiacos FC in the 1999/2000 UEFA Cup third round (1-2 second leg, 4-3 on aggregate).
- Juventus have won three and lost three of their previous penalty shoot-outs in UEFA club competition:

2-3 v AC Milan, 2002/03 UEFA Champions League final  
4-2 v AFC Ajax, 1995/96 UEFA Champions League final  
1-3 v Real Madrid CF, 1986/87 European Cup second round  
4-2 v Argentinos Juniors, 1987 European/South American Cup final  
1-4 v Widzew Łódź, 1980/81 UEFA Cup second round  
3-0 v Ajax, 1977/78 European Cup quarter-final

- Celtic, competing in the round of 16 for the first time in five seasons, have failed to win in any of their previous nine visits to Italy. Overall their 20 games against Italian sides have ended W5 D7 L8 (W0 D3 L6 in Italy). The most memorable contest was the first, Celtic beating FC Internazionale Milano 2-1 in the 1966/67 European Cup final in Lisbon to become the first British club to lift the trophy.

- In last season's UEFA Europa League group stage, Celtic drew 1-1 home and away against Udinese Calcio.

- Celtic won both away games in the qualifying rounds 2-0, defeating HJK Helsinki and Helsingborgs IF. In the group stage they recorded a 3-2 success at FC Spartak Moskva, their first away victory in 21 attempts in the UEFA Champions League proper, while the matches at FC Barcelona and SL Benfica both ended in 2-1 defeats. They had won four of their five fixtures at home, drawing the other with Benfica, before their first-leg defeat.

- The Bhoys are in the UEFA Champions League knockout rounds for the third time and have never reached the quarter-finals of the competition's modern incarnation. In 2006/07 they drew 0-0 at home to Milan and lost 1-0 in extra time in Italy; the following season they went down 3-2 at home to Barcelona and 1-0 in Catalonia.

- That Barcelona reverse is one of six occasions Celtic have lost the first leg at home in UEFA competition; they went down on aggregate five times. The sole exception came in the 2009/10 UEFA Champions League third qualifying round when they turned round a 1-0 home defeat by FC Dinamo Moskva with a 2-0 away success.

- Celtic's shoot-out record in UEFA club competition is:

#### **Team ties**

- Andrea Pirlo faced Celtic on five occasions with Milan, including both legs of the 2006/07 round of 16 tie.

- Mauricio Isla played in Udinese's 1-1 draw at Celtic last season, with Kwadwo Asamoah featuring for the Serie A side in Italy.

- Mikael Lustig's hosts Sweden lost 2-1 to an Italy team including Marchisio, Paolo De Ceglie and Sebastian Giovinco in the 2009 UEFA Under-21 European Championship group stage.

- Giorgio Chiellini scored the only goal as the senior Italian national side defeated Lustig's Sweden in a Cesena friendly on 18 November 2009.

- Victor Wanyama's brother, MacDonald Mariga, plays for FC Internazionale Milano.

- Buffon, Pirlo and Andrea Barzagli were in the Italian team that beat Scott Brown's Scotland side 2-1 in Glasgow during UEFA EURO 2008 qualifying on 17 November 2007.

- Buffon, Pirlo and Fabio Quagliarella, and Brown, were all involved when Italy won 2-0 at home to Scotland on 28 March 2007 during the same qualifying campaign.

### Juventus

#### UEFA Champions League statistics

- The Bianconeri's 3-0 first-leg victory was just shy of their biggest away win in the UEFA Champions League, a 4-0 triumph at Celtic's Glasgow rivals Rangers FC in the 1995/96 group stage.
- Ahead of the second legs, Juve were one of three unbeaten sides in the competition along with FC Schalke 04 and Borussia Dortmund.
- The Italian champions have conceded four goals, the joint lowest total among the last 16 along with FC Porto.
- Gianluigi Buffon, Leonardo Bonucci and Andrea Pirlo have played every minute of Juventus's campaign.
- Juventus's win against FC Nordsjælland on matchday four ended an unprecedented nine successive draws in European competition; the previous high was seven.
- The last time Juventus started the group stage with three draws, in 1998/99, they reached the semi-finals.
- On matchday one, Juventus became only the second team to avoid defeat against Chelsea FC in the UEFA Champions League after going two goals down, following AS Monaco FC in the 2004 semi-final second leg.
- Giorgio Chiellini is available after a one-game ban. Stephan Lichtsteiner, Claudio Marchisio and Arturo Vidal will incur a suspension with their next yellow cards.

- Fernando Llorente will join Juve on a four-year deal this summer when his contract runs out at Athletic Club.
- Bendtner will be out of action until mid-March with a thigh injury.

#### Miscellaneous

- Chiellini's first goal in over a year helped earn Juventus a 1-1 draw at second-placed SSC Napoli on Friday, the Bianconeri maintaining their six-point lead at the Serie A summit with 11 games to go.
- Chiellini came on as a substitute in the 3-0 victory against AC Siena on 24 February, his first appearance since picking up a calf injury in December.
- Unbeaten in the league last season, Juventus have lost four Serie A games this term.
- Simone Pepe underwent surgery last month on a thigh injury sustained in a pre-season friendly that has limited him to just 22 minutes of action this term.
- On 10 November Fabio Quagliarella scored his first professional hat-trick as Juventus won 6-1 at Pescara Calcio, their largest away victory in Serie A since beating AC Milan by the same scoreline on 6 April 1997.
- Juve's 49-game unbeaten run in Serie A ended on 3 November with a 3-1 loss at home to FC Internazionale Milano.

### Celtic

#### UEFA Champions League statistics

- Celtic have scored 48 goals in the UEFA Champions League, group stage to final.
- Celtic's 3-0 first-leg defeat equalled their heaviest home loss in Europe, matching the reverse they suffered against Paris Saint-Germain FC in the UEFA Cup Winners' Cup second round second leg in 1995.
- The 3-2 win at FC Spartak Moskva on matchday two was Celtic's first in 21 attempts away from home in the UEFA Champions League. They lost 19 of the previous 20 – and both since.
- Celtic have conceded 11 goals, the joint highest total among the teams in the round of 16 along with Arsenal FC.
- Fraser Forster has played all 990 minutes of Celtic's campaign, qualifying included. Kelvin Wilson has featured for all 630 minutes in the competition proper.

- The Scottish champions attempted fewer passes than any other side in the group stage and their pass completion rate (55%) and share of possession (38%) were lower than all but CFR 1907 Cluj.
- Ten of the side that started on matchday one were making group stage debuts, with Scott Brown the exception.
- Brown and James Forrest are within a booking of bans.

- Rami Gershon (R. Standard de Liège, loan) and Tom Rogic (Central Coast Mariners FC) arrived at Celtic during the winter but have not been registered for the UEFA Champions League.

#### **Miscellaneous**

- Celtic negotiated passage to the Scottish Cup semi-finals on Saturday with a 2-1 win at Saint Mirren FC. They will play Dundee United FC in the last four on 13/14 April.
- A point clear at the top of the Scottish Premier League at the beginning of December, a run of 11 wins in 14 top-flight games has helped Celtic increase their advantage to 16 points.
- Neil Lennon's side have won just three of their last seven away games in all competitions.
- Celtic suffered their fifth league defeat of the season on 27 February, going down 2-1 at Motherwell FC. Giorgos Samaras marked his return after nearly a month out with a hamstring injury by scoring Celtic's goal.
- Brown (hip) and Mikael Lustig (thigh) have been ruled out of the trip to Turin with knocks sustained in the first leg.
- Eight points from their opening five fixtures represented Celtic's worst start to a league season since 1998/99.
- Lennon celebrates his third anniversary in charge of Celtic on 25 March, having taken the reins on a caretaker basis following the departure of Tony Mowbray in 2010.

### **Juventus: Antonio Conte**

**Date of birth:** 31 July 1969

**Nationality:** Italian

**Playing career:** US Lecce, Juventus

**Coaching career:** AC Siena, USD Arezzo, AS Bari, Atalanta BC, Juventus

- A combative and versatile midfielder, Conte also weighed in with his share of goals – usually spectacular.
- Made Serie A debut with hometown club Lecce aged 16 in 1985/86 but not a regular until 1988/89 when his side returned to the top flight after two seasons away. Joined Juventus in November 1991.
- Spent the next 13 seasons at Juve, later describing the famous black-and-white shirt as his "second skin". Won five Scudettos, the UEFA Champions League in 1995/96 and the UEFA Cup in 1992/93 in addition to triumphs in the UEFA Super Cup, Italian Cup and a European/South American Cup, wearing the captain's armband from 1996. Capped 20 times by Italy, he was part of the team that finished runners-up in the 1994 FIFA World Cup and UEFA EURO 2000.
- Started coaching career as assistant at Siena in 2005, taking over Serie B side Arezzo the following season. After leading Bari and Siena to the top flight in 2009 and 2011 respectively, he signed a two-year contract with Juventus.
- Wasted no time in revamping the squad and enjoyed a debut season to remember as the Bianconeri claimed the Scudetto without losing a single game, suffering their sole defeat of the season against SSC Napoli in the Coppa Italia final. Rewarded with a new contract until 2015.

### **Celtic FC: Neil Lennon**

**Date of birth:** 25 June 1971

**Nationality:** Northern Irish

**Playing career:** Manchester City FC, Crewe Alexandra FC, Leicester City FC, Celtic FC, Nottingham Forest FC, Wycombe Wanderers FC

**Coaching career:** Celtic FC

- A hard-working midfielder, Lennon made his name at Crewe, featuring in almost 150 games before joining Leicester in 1996. Won two English League Cups in four and a half years under Martin O'Neill, whom he joined at Celtic in December 2000.
- Six and a half years as a player at Celtic Park yielded a domestic treble in 2000/01 and league and cup doubles in 2003/04 and 2006/07, plus two more league titles and further triumphs in both the Scottish Cup and League Cup.
- Capped 40 times by Northern Ireland, Lennon hung up his boots after short spells at Forest and Wycombe, whom he left to take up the position of first-team coach at Celtic under Gordon Strachan in April 2008.
- Appointed caretaker manager following Tony Mowbray's dismissal in March 2010, Lennon won every league game remaining that season though Celtic were beaten by second-tier Ross County FC in the Scottish Cup semi-finals.
- Given the job full time that June, Lennon missed out on the league title by a single point in his first full season but claimed the Scottish Cup. Led Celtic to a first championship in four years in 2011/12, when he was named manager of the year, and started the following campaign by securing UEFA Champions League group-stage football at Celtic Park for the first time since 2008.

- Firat Aydinus has made steady progress since setting out as a referee in 1993, taking charge of his first Süper Lig matches in his native Turkey a decade later.
- A geologist by profession and based in Istanbul, Aydinus got his first taste of international action as a fourth official in the FC Sheriff-Sliema Wanderers FC UEFA Champions League first qualifying round tie in July 2005. He went on to hold the same role in UEFA European Under-17 and Under-19 Championship qualifiers over the next few years, also working as a referee in both competitions.
- Given his FIFA badge in 2006, the same year he made his refereeing debut in UEFA Cup qualifying, Aydinus made his way into the competition proper as Hamburger SV took on FC Unirea Urziceni in the 2008/09 first round.
- Still a regular presence in U17 and U19 qualifying, in 2009/10 he also began working as an additional assistant referee in the UEFA Europa League, a role he held in the UEFA Champions League group game between FC Rubin Kazan and FC Barcelona the following year.
- Aydinus receives high-profile domestic assignments, including the 2007 Turkish Super Cup between Fenerbahçe SK and Beşiktaş JK, and took charge of five Istanbul derbies involving those two clubs and Galatasaray AŞ in the 2011/12 season.

## Competition facts

---

### UEFA Champions League knockout stage: Did you know?

- Teams have recovered from a first-leg deficit to go through on 28 occasions, including SL Benfica, APOEL FC, FC Bayern München and Chelsea FC in 2011/12. Only twice – AFC Ajax's defeat of Panathinaikos FC in the 1995/96 semi-finals and FC Internazionale Milano's win against FC Bayern München in the 2010/11 round of 16 – has a side progressed after a home first-leg loss.
- The biggest losing margin a side has overturned was achieved by RC Deportivo La Coruña in the 2003/04 quarter-finals when they lost 4-1 at AC Milan but won 4-0 at home.
- Twenty-one ties have been decided on away goals, including six where the triumphant team lost the first leg.
- In all, 21 ties have required extra time. Eight have been decided by extra time alone: four quarter-finals, three round of 16 encounters and the 2007/08 semi-final between Chelsea FC and Liverpool FC.
- Thirteen ties have gone to penalties, including six finals – 1996, 2001, 2003, 2005, 2008 and 2012. The first two-legged tie decided on spot kicks was PSV Eindhoven's 4-2 win against Lyon on 13 April 2005 after a 2-2 aggregate draw.
- There has never been a knockout tie ending goalless after two legs. Ten have finished 1-0 on aggregate, most recently Tottenham Hotspur FC's narrow victory against AC Milan in the 2010/11 round of 16.
- FC Bayern München hold the record for the biggest first-leg lead with a 5-0 success at Sporting Clube de Portugal in the 2008/09 round of 16, eventually going through 12-1 after a 7-1 home victory in the second leg. Those two games also featured more goals (13) over its two legs than any UEFA Champions League knockout tie.
- FC Bayern München's 7-0 second-leg defeat of FC Basel 1893 in the 2011/12 round of 16 is the largest margin of victory in a UEFA Champions League knockout match.
- Clarence Seedorf is the only player to win the European Cup with three clubs (AFC Ajax 1995, Real Madrid CF 1998, AC Milan 2003, 2007). Liverpool's Bob Paisley (1977, 1978, 1981) is the only coach to win three times.
- Ottmar Hitzfeld (Borussia Dortmund 1997, Bayern 2001), Ernst Happel (Feyenoord 1970, Hamburger SV 1983) and José Mourinho (FC Porto 2004, FC Internazionale Milano 2010) are the only coaches to win the trophy with two clubs.
- Chelsea FC have become the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, FC Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round by PFC CSKA Moskva.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Champion Clubs' Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United (2008, 2009) have all returned to the final as holders only to lose.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.

### UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in FC Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012. Eight players, including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently FC Bayern München's Mario Gomez on matchday eight last season.
- S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete having been aged 43 years 252 days when he featured against Real Madrid CF on matchday six of the 2007/08 edition.
- Ryan Giggs is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 289 days, in Manchester United's 1-1 draw at SL Benfica on 14 September 2011.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared. He was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored, aged 17 years and 195 days, in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 defeat at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.
