Match background

Club Atlético de Madrid and Leicester City FC have European history between them, with the latter in the UEFA Champions League quarter-finals for the first time and the Spanish side bidding for a third semi-final appearance in four years.

- While this is Atlético's ninth appearance in the European Cup quarter-finals, their opponents are in just their fourth season in European competition – two of their three previous campaigns having ended at Atlético's hands.

Previous meetings

- This is the third tie between the teams, with Atlético winning both the previous contests – and three of the four matches overall.

- Their most recent encounters came in the 1997/98 UEFA Cup first round, with the first game in Spain finishing 2-1 in Atlético's favour. Ian Marshall gave the visitors an 11th-minute lead but two goals in four second-half minutes from Juninho Paulista (69) and Christian Vieri (72pen) gave the Spanish club victory.

- Juninho also got Atlético's opener in the second leg at Leicester's old Filbert Street home, breaking the deadlock in the 70th minute; José Mari completed a 2-0 victory five minutes later. Each side ended with ten men, Atlético losing Juan Manuel López to a second booking in the 50th minute and Leicester's Garry Parker collecting his second yellow 15 minutes later.

- Leicester earned a 1-1 draw with Atlético in the 1961/62 European Cup Winners' Cup first round first leg, and were only denied victory by Jorge Mendonça's 89th-minute strike; Ken Keyworth had given the hosts a 56th-minute lead.

- Again Atlético were 2-0 winners in the second leg, their goals coming from Enrique Collar (60pen) and Miguel Jones (75).

Match background

Atlético

- Atlético are in the European Cup quarter-finals for a ninth time, and the fourth season in a row. Their last-eight record is W5 L3 – they have won two of their last three quarter-finals.

- The Rojiblancos were European Cup runners-up for the third time last season when going down 5-3 on penalties to neighbours Real Madrid CF in Milan on 28 May.

- Twelve months ago, Diego Simeone's men lost the first leg of their tie with FC Barcelona 2-1, but went through after a 2-0 home victory. Atlético also knocked out Barça at the same stage of the 2013/14 competition, winning 1-0 at home after a 1-1 away first-leg draw.

- In 2014/15, Atlético were beaten 1-0 on aggregate by Real Madrid, Javier Hernández scoring the only goal of the tie late in the second leg. Madrid have beaten Atlético in each of the last three seasons.

- Atlético have lost just one home game in the European Cup quarter-finals, going down 3-2 at home to AFC Ajax in the 1996/97 second leg to bow out 4-3 on aggregate; Simeone played in both matches. They have won five at home, with two draws.

- Atlético have won 28 of their last 34 European fixtures at the Vicente Calderón, losing only twice. They are nine games unbeaten at home in Europe (W7 D2); this season, they won their first three before a 0-0 draw with Bayer 04 Leverkusen in the round of 16 (4-2 aggregate).

- Simeone's charges last faced English opposition in the shape of Chelsea FC in the 2013/14 semi-finals, drawing the home first leg 0-0 and going through after a 3-1 away success. They are unbeaten in their last four matches against Premier League clubs, home and away.

- Atlético have never lost at home to English opposition, winning five games and drawing the other five. However, they have won only one of their last five home matches against English visitors.

- The Spanish side's record in two-legged ties against English clubs is W6 L2; they have won the last two contests,

last losing to Bolton Wanderers FC in the 2007/08 UEFA Cup round of 32 (0-1 aggregate).

Leicester

- Leicester are the 50th different club to have reached a UEFA Champions League quarter-final and the eighth from England – the most for any nation, overtaking both France and Spain, who have provided seven different quarter-finalists.
- Victory against Sevilla FC in the round of 16 was only Leicester's second in a two-legged European tie. The English champions were beaten 2-1 in the first game, in what proved Claudio Ranieri's last match in charge, but under Craig Shakespeare fought back to win the return 2-0.
- The Sevilla tie was Leicester's sole other experience of Spanish opposition aside from their losses to Atlético.
- The English title holders' only previous two-legged European victory had been a 7-2 aggregate triumph against Glenavon FC in the 1961/62 European Cup Winners' Cup preliminary round.
- This season, Leicester won their first away game at Club Brugge KV 3-0, but have since drawn one and lost the last two.

Coach and player links

- Simeone faced England four times during his international career with Argentina. (W1 D2 L1).
- Simeone has never lost to English opposition as a coach, having also overseen a 4-1 victory against Chelsea in the 2012 UEFA Super Cup.
- The Atlético coach was in the FC Internazionale Milano team that lost to Manchester United FC in the 1998/99 UEFA Champions League quarter-finals, succumbing 2-0 away before a 1-1 home draw. His overall record as a player against English clubs was W2 D3 L2.
- Leonardo Ulloa made 78 appearances for CD Castellón between 2008 and 2010, scoring 30 goals. He moved on to UD Almería, registering 39 goals in 90 games from 2010 to 2013, including two draws against Atlético.
- Filipe Luís made 15 appearances for Chelsea in 2014/15.
- Yohan Benalouane and Augusto Fernández were AS Saint-Étienne team-mates in 2009/10.

Match facts

Atlético

- José María Giménez will incur a suspension with his next booking.
- Atlético's three defeats in 2017 have all been at home, most recently 2-1 against Barcelona on 26 February.
- Simeone's men are eight games unbeaten since that Barcelona fixture (W5 D3).
- Filipe Luís scored in the victories against Málaga CF (2-0) and Real Sociedad de Fútbol (1-0) on 1 and 4 April respectively, having previously gone 59 appearances without a goal for Atlético.
- The Rojiblancos have kept five clean sheets in their last seven games.

Leicester

- Robert Huth, Wilfred Ndidi, Islam Slimani and Jamie Vardy are all a booking away from a ban.
- Leicester won their first six matches, five of them in the league, under new manager Shakespeare. Their previous six wins were achieved over the course of 25 games.
- Shakespeare is the third manager to win his first five Premier League fixtures, following Carlo Ancelotti (2009) and Josep Guardiola (2016), who both won their first six.
- The Foxes' winning run was ended by Sunday's 4-2 defeat at Everton FC.
- Vardy has scored seven goals in his last ten outings for club and country.
- Slimani's header in the 2-0 triumph over Sunderland AFC on 4 April was his first Leicester goal of 2017. He added another at Everton.

Head coach

Diego Simeone

Date of birth: 28 April 1970

Nationality: Argentinian

Playing career: CA Vélez Sarsfield, AC Pisa, Sevilla FC, Club Atlético de Madrid, FC Internazionale Milano, SS Lazio, Club Atlético de Madrid, Racing Club

Coaching career: Racing Club, Club Estudiantes de la Plata, CA River Plate, CA San Lorenzo, Calcio Catania, Racing Club, Club Atlético de Madrid

- Launched career as a combative midfielder with Vélez Sarsfield and was a full Argentinian international at 18, making debut in a July 1988 friendly against Australia; went on to play in three FIFA World Cups and retired as Argentina's most-capped player (106 appearances, 11 goals). Moved to Italy in 1990 to join Pisa; two years later he left for Sevilla, where he played under Argentina's 1986 World Cup-winning coach Carlos Bilardo and – for one season – alongside Diego Maradona.
- Joined Atlético in 1994 and won the Spanish domestic double in his second season, his first major club honours to add to two Copa América titles (1991 and 1993) plus the 1992 FIFA Confederations Cup with Argentina.
- Enjoyed further success after returning to Italy, winning the UEFA Cup with Inter, plus a Serie A and Coppa Italia double in his debut campaign with Lazio (1999/2000). After four years in Rome, he returned to Madrid for a second spell with Atlético before ending his playing career in Argentina with Racing Club.
- Started coaching career with Racing Club and won Argentinian titles with Estudiantes (2006 Apertura) and River Plate (2008 Clausura); brief spells at San Lorenzo, Italian club Catania and Racing (again) preceded his appointment in December 2011 at Atlético.
- Led Atletico to victory in the 2012 UEFA Europa League final against Athletic Club and to a Copa del Rey final triumph over Real Madrid CF in 2013. A year later, Atlético held off FC Barcelona and Madrid to win their first league title since 1996, although they lost to Madrid in the UEFA Champions League final. Took Atlético to another UEFA Champions League final in 2016, although again they lost to Madrid.

- Having spent almost a decade working as an assistant manager, Shakespeare took temporary charge of English champions Leicester in February 2017 following the dismissal of Claudio Ranieri.
- An attacking midfielder in his playing days, Shakespeare spent much of his career with Walsall – with whom he won promotion to the second division in 1988 – making over 350 appearances for the club.
- Joined top-flight outfit Sheffield Wednesday in 1989, but stayed less than a year before joining West Brom, where there was another promotion to the second tier in 1993; went on to make over 100 appearances for Grimsby before winding down his career in non-league.
- Rejoined West Brom in 1999 as football in the community officer and went on to become a coach with first the academy then the reserves; left to become Nigel Pearson's assistant at Leicester in 2008, following the manager to first Hull and then back to Leicester in 2011.
- Remained at Leicester when Pearson was dismissed in summer 2015, filling the same role alongside new manager Ranieri; remarkably, Leicester went on to win the Premier League title for the first time although, with the following campaign threatening to unravel, Shakespeare succeeded Ranieri the following spring after the Italian's dismissal.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League knockout stage: Did you know?

- Teams have overturned a first-leg deficit to go through 39 times, including FC Barcelona, Borussia Dortmund, Leicester City FC and AS Monaco FC in the 2016/17 round of 16. Only twice – AFC Ajax's defeat of Panathinaikos FC in the 1995/96 semi-finals and FC Internazionale Milano's victory against FC Bayern München in the 2010/11 round of 16 – has a side progressed after a home first-leg loss.
- The biggest losing margin a side has overhauled was achieved by FC Barcelona against Paris Saint-Germain in this season's last 16, when they lost 4-0 away but progressed thanks to a 6-1 home success. That eclipsed the previous record held by RC Deportivo La Coruña in the 2003/04 quarter-finals, when they went down 4-1 at AC Milan but won 4-0 at home.
- Twenty-eight ties have been decided on away goals, including nine where the triumphant team lost the first leg.
- In all, 27 ties have required extra time. Eleven have been settled by extra time alone: four quarter-finals, five round of 16 encounters – including Bayern-Juventus in 2015/16 – the 2007/08 semi-final between Chelsea and Liverpool FC, and the 2013/14 final.
- Sixteen ties have gone to penalties, including seven finals – 1996, 2001, 2003, 2005, 2008, 2012 and 2016. The first two-legged tie decided on spot kicks was PSV Eindhoven's 4-2 victory over Olympique Lyonnais on 13 April 2005 after a 2-2 aggregate draw, still the only quarter-final to go to penalties.
- The 2015/16 round of 16 tie between Club Atlético de Madrid and PSV was the first to finish goalless after two legs. Thirteen have finished 1-0 on aggregate, most recently Real Madrid CF's defeat of Manchester City FC in the 2015/16 semi-finals.
- Real Madrid won 6-1 at FC Schalke 04 in the 2013/14 round of 16, equalling the knockout phase record for the biggest first-leg lead – Bayern's 5-0 success at Sporting Clube de Portugal in the 2008/09 round of 16. Bayern eventually went through 12-1 after a 7-1 stroll in the home second leg; that tie also featured more goals (13) over its two legs than any UEFA Champions League knockout tie.
- Bayern hold the record for the largest margin of victory in a UEFA Champions League knockout match having beaten both FC Basel 1893 (2011/12) and FC Shakhtar Donetsk (2014/15) 7-0 in the round of 16 second leg.
- The biggest European Cup quarter-final victory was Real Madrid CF's 8-0 first-leg defeat of Sevilla FC in 1957/58.
- Manchester United FC's 7-1 win against AS Roma in 2006/07 is the biggest victory in a UEFA Champions League quarter-final match. Bayern beat FC Porto 6-1 in 2014/15, FC Barcelona have twice won 5-1, against Chelsea FC after extra time (1999/2000) and FC Shakhtar Donetsk (2010/11), while there have been four 4-0 victories.
- Chelsea FC-Liverpool FC in 2008/09 featured 12 goals over the two legs, a quarter-final record.
- Clarence Seedorf is the only player to lift the European Cup with three clubs (Ajax 1995, Real Madrid 1998, Milan 2003, 2007). Bob Paisley (Liverpool 1977, 1978, 1981) was the first coach to win three times, a feat Carlo Ancelotti (Milan 2003, 2007, Real Madrid 2014) replicated.
- In 2014 Ancelotti also became the fifth coach to win the trophy with two clubs; Ottmar Hitzfeld (Borussia Dortmund 1997, Bayern 2001), Ernst Happel (Feyenoord 1970, Hamburger SV 1983), José Mourinho (FC Porto 2004, Internazionale 2010) and Jupp Heynckes (Real Madrid 1998, Bayern 2013) had previously achieved the feat.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy, with Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to pick up consecutive European Champion Clubs' Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United FC (2008, 2009) have all returned to the final as holders only to lose.
- Only two sides have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome). Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in FC Barcelona's 7-1 triumph against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012, a feat reproduced by FC Shakhtar Donetsk's Luiz Adriano at FC BATE Borisov on 21 October 2014. Eleven more players, also including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Cristiano Ronaldo for Real Madrid on matchday six in 2015/16.
- Cristiano Ronaldo set a new record for a UEFA Champions League stage with 11 goals in 2015/16, eclipsing his own mark of nine goals in 2013/14, which Luiz Adriano matched in 2014/15. Lionel Messi got ten goals in 2016/17; Zlatan Ibrahimović (2013/14), Ruud van Nistelrooy (2004/05), Filippo Inzaghi and Hernán Crespo (both 2002/03) managed eight.

- Messi's hat-trick on matchday three of the 2016/17 competition was his seventh in the competition – two more than Ronaldo.
- SS Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete at this level, having been aged 43 years and 252 days when he figured against Madrid on matchday six of the 2007/08 edition.
- Francesco Totti is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 38 years and 59 days, in AS Roma's 1-1 draw at PFC CSKA Moskva on 25 November 2014. Ryan Giggs (37 years and 290 days) was the previous record holder.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared – he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua București on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored, aged 17 years and 195 days, in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 reverse at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.
