SK Sturm Graz need a win to revive their UEFA Europa League knockout phase hopes, with Matchday 3's 1-0 loss at Panathinaikos FC meaning a similar result would put the Austrian side out should Galatasaray AŞ collect at least a point at FC Dinamo 1948 Bucureşti.

Previous meetings

- The two teams met in the second group stage of the 2000/01 UEFA Champions League, with Ivica Osim's Sturm winning 2-0 in Austria and 2-1 against Angelos Anastasiadis' charges in Athens.

- Current Sturm midfielder Peter Hlinka and coach Franco Foda were unused substitutes for the Austrian side in that game.

Match background

- Sturm have won both of their European home games against Greek sides without conceding, having also beaten AEK Athens FC 1-0 in a UEFA Cup Winners' Cup match on 6 November 1997.
- Panathinaikos have lost all three of their games in Austria, losing to Sturm's neighbours Grazer AK (2-1, 21 October 1999) as well as FK Austria Wien (2-0, 15 September 1982).
- A 1-0 loss to FC Dinamo 1948 București on Matchday 1 ended a six-game unbeaten home run in Europe for Sturm.

Team facts

- German coach Franco Foda has been with Sturm for over a decade, having joined the club as a defender in 1997. The former 1. FC Kaiserslautern, Bayer 04 Leverkusen and VfB Stuttgart defender counts his son Sandro Foda – a midfielder – among his players at Sturm.
- Foda took on Panathinaikos as a Leverkusen player in the 1993/94 UEFA Cup Winners' Cup, with he and his colleagues winning 4-1 in Athens but losing the home leg 2-1.
- Panathinaikos trainer Henk ten Cate spent most of his playing career as a winger with Go Ahead Eagles, one of a number of Dutch clubs whom he then coached. He went on to assist Frank Rijkaard as FC Barcelona coach followed by Avram Grant as Chelsea FC manager either side of a spell at the AFC Ajax helm (2006/07).
- Ten Cate faced Austrian opposition in the 2006/07 UEFA Cup group stage, with his Ajax side beating Austria Wien 3-0 at home.
- Panathinaikos's Cédric Kanté and Sturm's Mario Haas were team-mates at RC Strasbourg from 1999 to 2001.
- Along with Sturm's Austrian rivals FC Salzburg, Panathinaikos were penalised for offside more times in the first three games than any other side – 18.
- Panathinaikos visit Galatasaray on Matchday 5, with Sturm travelling to face Dinamo on the same day, 3 December.

Competition information

The UEFA Cup evolved from the Inter-Cities Fairs Cup, and was first contested as the UEFA Cup in 1971/72. This season the UEFA Cup has been reborn as the UEFA Europa League. The new name heralds major changes to the competition, which has a new 48-team group stage with centralised marketing of broadcast rights, a presenting sponsor - Spanish car manufacturer SEAT - and an official matchball in addition to centralised sponsorship from the knockout stage and a new logo and visual identity.

• **Disciplinary information:** As a rule, a player who is sent off is suspended for the next match in a UEFA club competition. The Control and Disciplinary Body is entitled to augment this punishment. In the case of repeated cautions, from the group stage a player is suspended for one match after three cautions in three different matches, as well as following any subsequent odd-numbered caution (fifth, seventh, ninth, etc). Single yellow cards and pending suspensions are always carried forward either to the next stage of the competition or to another club competition in the current season.

• **Locally-trained players rule:** In February 2005, UEFA announced the 'A' list that teams submit for UEFA club competitions will continue to be limited to 25 players, and from the 2008/09 season at least eight places are reserved for players trained by the club's own football academy of which half can be players trained by other clubs from within the same association of the said club. The 'B' list also continues to exist – involving an unlimited number of Under-21 players who have been at the club for any uninterrupted period of two years since their 15th birthday.

A club-trained player is defined as a player who has been registered for a minimum of three seasons with the club between the age of 15 and 21, whereas an association-trained player is one who has been registered for at least three seasons by the club or by other clubs affiliated to the same association between the age of 15 and 21.

• **Away goals rule:** For matches played under the cup (knockout) system, the team which scores the greater aggregate of goals in the two matches qualifies for the next round. If the two teams involved in a tie score the same number of goals over the two legs, the team which scores more away goals qualifies for the next stage. If this procedure does not produce a result, i.e. if the two teams score the same number of goals at home and away, extra time of two periods of 15 minutes shall be played at the end of the second leg. If during extra time, both teams score the same number of goals, away goals count double (i.e. the visiting club qualifies). If no goals are scored during extra time, penalty kicks determine which team qualifies.

• **Player registration:** UEFA regulations state that for all UEFA Europa League matches from the start of the Round of 32, a club may register a maximum of three new eligible players within their squad of 25 for the remaining matches in the current competition. One player from the above quota of three who has played UEFA club competition matches for another competing club in the current season may exceptionally be registered, provided that the player has not been fielded by another club in the UEFA Europa League this season or by a club that has transferred from the UEFA Champions League to the UEFA Europa League following the group stage.

• **Assistant referees experiment:** The 144 UEFA Europa League group-stage games will be overseen by six match officials, in an experiment endorsed by the International Football Association Board (IFAB), with two additional assistant referees taking up positions alongside each goal. The additional assistant referees will provide two extra pairs of eyes to monitor the game, informing the referee of incidents that he may otherwise have missed.
