Toulouse FC will look to halt the FC Shakhtar Donetsk juggernaut in France following their 4-0 Matchday 3 defeat in Ukraine, with the 2008/09 UEFA Cup winners sure of a place in the knockout stage of the UEFA Europa League if they win again in Group J.

Previous meetings

- Matchday 3 produced the two sides' first ever meeting and Toulouse's first competitive game against Ukrainian opposition. Shakhtar's five previous fixtures in France have netted them three wins and two defeats.

Match background

- The 4-0 triumph over Toulouse on Matchday 3 was Shakhtar's biggest home victory in the UEFA Cup or UEFA Europa League, and matched Toulouse's heaviest margin of defeat in European club competition – the French club having also lost 4-0 at Liverpool FC on 28 August 2007 and 5-1 at FC Spartak Moskva on 5 November 1986.
- Shakhtar have set a punishing pace in Group J, scoring four times in all three of their games in the section. Their only defeat in eight competitive European outings this season was a 1-0 loss to FC Barcelona in the UEFA Super Cup. However, they were also dumped out of the UEFA Champions League in the third qualifying round by FC Timișoara on away goals after draws in both legs.
- Shakhtar have won their last two UEFA Europa League away games by three-goal margins, beating Sivasspor 3-0 in the play-offs and then Club Brugge KV 4-1 on Matchday 1.

Team facts

- A former goalkeeper, Toulouse coach Alain Casanova played for Le Havre AC and Toulouse either side of a two-season spell at Olympique de Marseille in which he did not make a single competitive appearance. He replaced Elie Baup as Toulouse coach in May 2008.
- Shakhtar are coached by the hugely experienced Mircea Lucescu, a 74-times capped former Romania striker who spent the bulk of his playing career with FC Dinamo 1948 București. He won Romanian titles as a coach with both Dinamo and FC Rapid București plus Turkish championships with Galatasaray AŞ (2001/02) and Beşiktaş JK (2002/03). Since joining Shakhtar, he has won three Ukrainian Premier League crowns and, of course, the final edition of the UEFA Cup last season.
- Lucescu has a fine record in away games against French sides, with his seven matches as a coach with Galatasaray and Shakhtar netting him four wins – all by one-goal margins – and three defeats. He also coached both those clubs in UEFA Super Cup games at AS Monaco FC's Stade Louis II, winning the 2000 edition with Galatasaray but losing to Barça this season.
- Shakhtar beat Toulouse's Ligue 1 rivals Marseille in last season's UEFA Cup quarter-finals en route to winning the competition in Istanbul.
- Shakhtar go into the game as the highest scoring side in the group stage, with 12 goals from their three games. They also boast the joint best disciplinary record, having picked up just one yellow card and no reds.
- Toulouse host FK Partizan on Matchday 5, with Shakhtar at home to Club Brugge on the same day, 3 December.

Competition information

The UEFA Cup evolved from the Inter-Cities Fairs Cup, and was first contested as the UEFA Cup in 1971/72. This season the UEFA Cup has been reborn as the UEFA Europa League. The new name heralds major changes to the competition, which has a new 48-team group stage with centralised marketing of broadcast rights, a presenting sponsor - Spanish car manufacturer SEAT - and an official matchball in addition to centralised sponsorship from the knockout stage and a new logo and visual identity.

• **Disciplinary information:** As a rule, a player who is sent off is suspended for the next match in a UEFA club competition. The Control and Disciplinary Body is entitled to augment this punishment. In the case of repeated cautions, from the group stage a player is suspended for one match after three cautions in three different matches, as well as following any subsequent odd-numbered caution (fifth, seventh, ninth, etc). Single yellow cards and pending suspensions are always carried forward either to the next stage of the competition or to another club competition in the current season.

• **Locally-trained players rule:** In February 2005, UEFA announced the 'A' list that teams submit for UEFA club competitions will continue to be limited to 25 players, and from the 2008/09 season at least eight places are reserved for players trained by the club's own football academy of which half can be players trained by other clubs from within the same association of the said club. The 'B' list also continues to exist – involving an unlimited number of Under-21 players who have been at the club for any uninterrupted period of two years since their 15th birthday.

A club-trained player is defined as a player who has been registered for a minimum of three seasons with the club between the age of 15 and 21, whereas an association-trained player is one who has been registered for at least three seasons by the club or by other clubs affiliated to the same association between the age of 15 and 21.

• **Away goals rule:** For matches played under the cup (knockout) system, the team which scores the greater aggregate of goals in the two matches qualifies for the next round. If the two teams involved in a tie score the same number of goals over the two legs, the team which scores more away goals qualifies for the next stage. If this procedure does not produce a result, i.e. if the two teams score the same number of goals at home and away, extra time of two periods of 15 minutes shall be played at the end of the second leg. If during extra time, both teams score the same number of goals, away goals count double (i.e. the visiting club qualifies). If no goals are scored during extra time, penalty kicks determine which team qualifies.

• **Player registration:** UEFA regulations state that for all UEFA Europa League matches from the start of the Round of 32, a club may register a maximum of three new eligible players within their squad of 25 for the remaining matches in the current competition. One player from the above quota of three who has played UEFA club competition matches for another competing club in the current season may exceptionally be registered, provided that the player has not been fielded by another club in the UEFA Europa League this season or by a club that has transferred from the UEFA Champions League to the UEFA Europa League following the group stage.

• **Assistant referees experiment:** The 144 UEFA Europa League group-stage games will be overseen by six match officials, in an experiment endorsed by the International Football Association Board (IFAB), with two additional assistant referees taking up positions alongside each goal. The additional assistant referees will provide two extra pairs of eyes to monitor the game, informing the referee of incidents that he may otherwise have missed.
