Tournament preview

Every two years the cream of Europe's young talent gathers for the UEFA European Under-21 Championship, with entertaining play and no little drama often the end result.

Denmark are hosting the 2011 tournament, which is likely to be the biggest football event in the country's history. Joining them in the finals are seven battle-hardened sides who progressed through a gruelling group stage that began in March 2009, before holding their nerve in the play-offs to seal their place. For the first time, all 53 UEFA member associations entered the competition and, given the pedigree of the teams that fell along the way, there is no doubting the quality of those still standing.

The tournament kicks off on Saturday when Denmark face Switzerland and Belarus take on Iceland in Group A. The following day, Group B gets under way with games involving 2009 beaten finalists England, the Czech Republic, Ukraine and Spain.

The Czech Republic were the only side to come through qualifying undefeated and, after stopping holders Germany in their tracks in Group 5, they have high hopes of winning the championship for the first time since 2002. Tomáš Pekhart finished qualifying as the nine-goal top scorer, although the Czechs' sheen of invincibility faded slightly in March when they lost a friendly to France.

If Pekhart took the individual scoring honours en route to Denmark, it was Iceland, runners-up to the Czech Republic in their pool, who really caught the eye in front of goal. They struck a tournament-leading 33 goals, including a stunning 4-1 rout of Germany, to reach their first finals. Since then they have also registered an impressive 2-1 friendly victory in England.

It is a measure of how tough qualification was that only three of the countries that contested the 2009 finals in Sweden are back this time – Belarus, England and Spain – and that of the eight challengers just England (twice), Spain (twice) and the Czechs (once) have won it before.

Where Iceland were the surprise package, Belarus pulled off the most astonishing result in qualifying, overturning a 2-0 play-off first-leg reverse to five-times champions Italy by triumphing 3-0 in Borisov. Two goals within the first five minutes from Vladimir Yurchenko set up that win, yet because of injury Yurchenko will be unable to join the line of rising stars attempting to follow their illustrious predecessors by shining on the U21 stage.

Among these bright young things, Spain can boast two FIFA World Cup winners in Javi Martínez and Juan Mata, while England – the only country to have qualified for a third successive time – call on the likes of Daniel Sturridge and Chris Smalling. For their part, Switzerland will look to Xherdan Shaqiri to continue the significant strides he has made this year.

Ukraine, finalists in 2006, have a squad brimming with UEFA Champions League pedigree and will want to build on the promise of their UEFA European U19 Championship victory in 2009. It is over two years since Denmark played a competitive match, meanwhile, but they will be encouraged by the success of other host nations – the Netherlands having triumphed in 2007 before Sweden made the 2009 semi-finals. Sure to be spurred on by vociferous home support, Keld Bordinggaard's side have much to look forward to – as do fans across the continent.

Playing career: FC Dvina Vitebsk, FC Dinamo Minsk, FC Dinamo Brest, FC Chernomorets Odesa, FC Lokomotiv Moskva, SKN St Pölten, FC Molodechno, FC Temp Shepetivka, Kalk Kaskinen, FC Slavia-Mozyr

Coaching career: FC Slavia-Mozyr (assistant), FC Dinamo Minsk (assistant, caretaker coach), FC Lokomotiv Vitebsk (head coach), FC Smorgon (head coach), Belarus Under-21 (assistant, head coach)

- A renowned striker in the USSR during the 1980s, Kondratyev's best years came while at Dinamo Minsk as they won the Soviet title in 1982 and finished third a year later. He also scored four goals in 14 appearances for the Soviet Union in that period.
- Played various sports in his youth and participated in regional athletics competitions before focusing on football from the age of 15. Quickly graduated from the academy to the first team at Soviet third-tier club Dvina Vitebsk and proved himself a promising frontman.
- Moved to Dinamo Minsk and went on to make 284 top-flight appearances, scoring 92 goals and earning a reputation as being committed, good in the air and having an eye for a goal.
- Started his coaching career in 1998 as an assistant at Slavia-Mozyr and Dinamo Minsk. His best achievement at club level came in 2008 when he guided Smorgon to an eighth-placed finish in Belarus.
- Took charge of the Under-21s and was set target of reaching the UEFA European Championship; dramatically delivered as Belarus recovered from a 2-0 first-leg play-off defeat in Italy to win the return 3-0.

Czech Republic: Jakub Dovalil

Date of birth: 8 February 1974

Nationality: Czech

Playing career: SK Slavia Praha, Kralupy nad Vltavou, SK Motorlet Praha, SV Bergisch Gladbach 09, TJ Tatra Sedlčany

Coaching career: SK Slavia Praha (youth), Czech Republic Under-17, U19, U20, U21

- Dovalil left Slavia's reserve side aged 20, going on to study physical education in Prague and also had a one-year residency in the German football academy in Cologne in 1996/97.
- Remained a lower-league player until 1998, when he moved into coaching at Slavia's junior team before joining the Football Association of the Czech Republic (CMFS) in 2002 as Under-16 coach, taking over the U17 squad two years later.
- First notable success came in 2005/06 when the previous two champions France and Turkey were among the Czechs' victims en route to the UEFA European Under-17 Championship final, where they lost only on penalties to Russia.
- Assistant to Miroslav Soukup at that year's U19 finals as the Czechs reached the semi-finals, Dovalil reprised the role at the 2007 FIFA U-20 World Cup in Canada, where they were runners-up to Argentina.
- Led the U19s at the UEFA European Championship semi-finals on home soil in 2008, that side going on to form the backbone of the U21 squad which Dovalil took over ahead of qualifying for the 2011 finals; took the team to Denmark unbeaten, earning a contract extension until 2014.

Denmark: Keld Bordinggaard

Date of birth: 23 November 1962

Nationality: Danish

Playing career: Odense BK (twice), Wichita Wings, Panionios FC, Vejle BK (twice, once player-coach), Silkeborg IF

Coaching career: Vejle BK (assistant coach, head coach), Denmark (assistant), Denmark Under-21

- A creative and technically gifted attacking midfielder, Bordinggaard was a key part of the OB team that were crowned Danish champions in 1982, being named the country's Talent of the Year 12 months later by which time he had also enjoyed Danish Cup success.

- Bordinggaard – who won four caps for Denmark in an international career that spanned seven years – also showcased his skills in indoor football with American side Wichita Wings, whom he represented in the winter between 1985 and 1988, continuing to play for OB in summer for the first two years.
- After a year in Greece with Panionios returned home in 1989, spending two years with Vejle before a five-year stint at Silkeborg, where he won another league title in 1994. Initially retired as a player in 1997 but was persuaded to don his boots again in 1999/2000, by which time he was also Vejle's assistant coach.
- Took over as the club's head coach in 2001, leaving the following year to become Morten Olsen's assistant with the senior national side. Held that post until 2008, reaching the UEFA EURO 2004 quarter-finals, ultimately stepping down to take charge of the Under-21 team, a post he will leave after the 2011 UEFA European Championship on home soil.
- Sharing a philosophy of attacking football with Olsen, Bordinggaard – who has also passed journalist qualifications – says: "It's important to win football games, but it also matters how you win them."

England: Stuart Pearce

Date of birth: 24 April 1962

Nationality: English

Playing career: Wealdstone FC, Coventry City FC, Nottingham Forest FC, Newcastle United FC, West Ham United FC, Manchester City FC, England

Coaching career: Nottingham Forest FC, Manchester City FC (coach, manager), England Under-21s

- Although his professional career did not start until 1983 when he joined Coventry, Pearce had already made an impact in non-league with Wealdstone, also working part-time as an electrician. After two years at Coventry the no-nonsense left-back moved on to Forest, when he came under the tutelage of Brian Clough.
- The first of his 78 England caps arrived the same year in a friendly against Brazil; Pearce missed a penalty in the semi-final shoot-out defeat by West Germany in the 1990 FIFA World Cup, but successfully converted against Spain and Germany again in EURO '96 – although England lost the latter encounter, again in the last four.
- Won the League Cup in 1989 and 1990 with Forest, who gave him his first chance in management midway through 1996/97, but as player-manager Pearce was unable to keep his side in the top division. Left to continue playing, at Newcastle United FC, before heading home to London to represent West Ham United FC.
- In 2001 Pearce moved on again, linking up with Kevin Keegan as first team coach at Manchester City FC. When Keegan departed in 2005, Pearce took over but was sacked in May 2007.
- Three months beforehand, Pearce had been appointed U21 coach on a part-time basis. He took the role full time after leaving City and guided England to the UEFA European Championship semi-finals in 2007 and the final, where they lost 4-0 to Germany, in Sweden two years later.

Iceland: Eyjólfur Sverrisson

Date of birth: 3 August 1968

Nationality: Icelandic

Playing career: Tindastóll, VfB Stuttgart, Beşiktaş JK, Hertha BSC Berlin

Coaching career: Iceland, Iceland Under-21s (twice)

- Caught the eye of Stuttgart while playing for Iceland U21s, scoring all four goals in a 4-0 win against Finland, and was immediately transferred to the German club in 1989. Spent five seasons in the Bundesliga, winning the title in 1991/92, before joining Beşiktaş in summer 1994.
- Won the Turkish title in his only campaign in Istanbul before returning to Germany to sign for Hertha, then in the second division. They won promotion to the Bundesliga in 1998/99 and Sverrisson continued to play for them, often as captain, until 2003.
- Capped 66 times by Iceland, he returned to his homeland in 2004 to work for the Football Association of Iceland and was operating in youth development and with the U21 side when he was offered the senior job in 2005.
- Was replaced at the end of UEFA EURO 2008 qualifying – which featured a 1-1 home draw with Spain but also a 3-0 defeat by Liechtenstein – yet was back as U21 coach for the start of qualifying for the 2011 UEFA European Championship.

- Guided an Iceland side featuring nine senior internationals to their first U21 final tournament after an impressive campaign which peaked with a 4-1 victory against holders Germany and finished with a play-off defeat of Scotland.

Spain: Luis Milla

Date of birth: 12 March 1966

Nationality: Spanish

Playing career: FC Barcelona B, FC Barcelona, Real Madrid CF, Valencia CF

Coaching career: UD Puçol, Getafe CF (assistant), Spain Under-17s, Spain U19s, Spain U21s

- Began his career in Barcelona's youth ranks, made his debut for the senior side aged 18 against Real Zaragoza in 1984/85. Did not become a first-team regular for four seasons, however, going on to make 54 Liga appearances and winning the UEFA Cup Winners' Cup (1988/89) and Copa del Rey (1989/90).
- Then signed for Barça's great rivals Real Madrid, where he remained until 1997, scoring three times in 165 Liga outings. His time with the Merengues proved rewarding, yielding two Liga titles, a Copa del Rey and two Spanish Super Cups.
- Won the first of his three Spain caps in a 4-0 triumph against Hungary on 15 November 1989. Ended his playing career in 2001 after four seasons at Valencia, picking up another Copa del Rey medal along with a Spanish Super Cup.
- First turned to coaching with Puçol in 2006/07, guiding the Valencia-based side to 12th in the third division. Then snapped up to serve as Michael Laudrup's assistant at top-flight Getafe before taking over Spain's U17s and, not long afterwards, the U19s.
- Reached the final of the 2009/10 UEFA European Under-19 Championship, where Spain lost to hosts France. It was at that tournament that it was announced Milla would take over the U21s and he promptly steered the side to the 2011 finals via a play-off victory against Croatia.

Switzerland: Pierluigi Tami

Date of birth: 12 September 1961

Nationality: Swiss

Playing career: FC Chiasso, AC Bellinzona, FC Lugano, FC Locarno

Coaching career: FC Lugano, FC Locarno, Switzerland (coaching staff), Switzerland Under-18s, Under-21s

- Spent his entire career as a defender in the Italian speaking part of Switzerland. He represented Lugano and Locarno as both a player and coach, qualifying for his UEFA Pro Licence in June 2003
- Moved to the Swiss Football Association; between July 2006 and UEFA EURO 2008 on home soil, he was part of Jakob 'Köbi' Kuhn's coaching staff for the senior national side.
- Continued to assist next Switzerland coach Ottmar Hitzfeld, scouting fringe players for the seniors. Also studied Switzerland's opponents in 2010 FIFA World Cup qualifying, producing video clips for team meetings.
- Then took charge of Under-18 national team before being offered the U21 job on 1 July 2009 after the incumbent Pierre-André Schürmann accepted an offer from Neuchâtel Xamax FC.
- His philosophy is to play "bravely in attack and compact in defence. I ask of my players that they are capable of adapting to variable systems. I want to see 11 people working in attack as well as defence."

Ukraine: Pavlo Yakovenko

Date of birth: 19 December 1964

Nationality: Ukrainian

Playing career: FC Metalist Kharkiv, FC Dynamo Kyiv, FC Sochaux-Montbéliard

Coaching career: FC Metalurh Nikopol, FC Uralan Elista, Ukraine (amateurs), FC Borysfen-2 Boryspil, Ukraine Under-17s, Ukraine Under-19s, Ukraine Under-21s (twice), FC Khimki, FC Kuban Krasnodar

- After starting at Metalist Kharkiv, an 18-year-old Yakovenko moved to Dynamo in 1982, winning three Soviet titles and three Soviet Cups as well as the 1986 UEFA Cup Winners' Cup.
- Part of the USSR team to reach the 1986 FIFA World Cup but missed 1988 UEFA European Championship and 1990 FIFA World Cup due to injuries, which also limited his success during a brief stint in France.

- Scored his only USSR goal in the second of 19 appearances – in a 6-0 victory against Hungary in 1986. His volleyed finish against SK Rapid Wien in the 1986 UEFA Cup Winners' Cup quarter-final first leg is rated as one of the best goals in Dynamo's history.
- Started coaching career at home-town club Metalurh Nikopol before establishing an experimental youth academy at Dynamo, which developed the likes of Artem Milevskiy and Olexandr Aliyev.
- Steered Ukraine to the 2002 UEFA European Under-17 Championship and semi-finals of U19 final tournament two years later. He left U21 set-up during qualification for 2006 tournament but returned in 2008.
