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## ***UEFA Champions League Final ticket sales***

### **Tickets for Moscow final go on sale on 28 February**

UEFA announced today in Moscow that the tickets sales for the UEFA Champions League Final 2008, to be played at the "Luzhniki" Stadium in Moscow on 21 May at 20:45 CET (22:45 local time), will go on sale next Thursday 28 February at 12:00 CET exclusively via Europe's football website uefa.com.

The general public will be able to apply for up to two tickets per applicant between 28 February 12:00 CET to 19 March 12:00 CET. Once the application period has finished, allocation will be decided by lottery and every valid application will enter the ballot, independent of the time of submission within the application period.

The net capacity of the "Luzhniki" Stadium for the UEFA Champions League Final 2008 will be 69,500. 75% of the tickets are reserved for the general public and the supporters of the two finalists; each finalist club is able to take up to 21,000 tickets and distribute these directly to its supporters, and 10,500 tickets are available for sale to fans worldwide via uefa.com.

The remaining tickets will be allocated to the European football family, comprising UEFA, the local organising committee, national associations, commercial partners and broadcasters.

There are three price categories for the general public:

Category 1	200.00 EUR
Category 2	140.00 EUR
Category 3	80.00 EUR

The following administration charges (including postal charges) will apply per ticket order:

10.00 EUR – per ticket order within Russia
30.00 EUR – per ticket order within Europe
40.00 EUR – per ticket order outside Europe

Payment can be done by credit card only, and applicants will be informed by e-mail by 2 April 2008 if they have been successful in the lottery. Tickets will be dispatched as from mid-April 2008 by secure express courier.

All applicants are bound by the ticketing terms and conditions. Action will be taken in cases of infringement. Online applications will be checked to ensure that anyone banned from attending football matches is unsuccessful in any attempt to purchase tickets. UEFA underlines that no tickets are being distributed via agencies or brokers. UEFA also encourages fans not to be lured into deals with touts who not only demand exorbitant prices but are often not in possession of the tickets they purport to have for sale.
