Rosenborg BK will be looking to capitalise on home advantage as they start their UEFA Cup campaign with a Round of 32 tie against FC Zenit St. Petersburg. The Russian side took just one point from two away games in the group stages, but will be keen to extend an impeccable record against Norwegian opposition.

- Rosenborg's UEFA Champions League campaign started well as they ended a sequence of 16 away games without a win by coming from behind to pick up three points against Olympiacos CFP. Per Ciljan Skjelbred and Øyvind Storfjord were both on target in the 3-1 victory, but three successive losses by Olympique Lyonnais and Real Madrid CF twice ended hopes of qualifying. A 1-1 draw with Olympiacos guaranteed third place in Group F, however, before the Norwegian side again lost to Lyon.
- Zenit also started their UEFA Cup Group H campaign with a win, as goals from Olexandr Spivak, a penalty, and Andrei Arshavin set them on course for a 2-1 victory against Vitória SC. A 1-0 defeat at Bolton Wanderers FC followed before Vlastimil Petržela's side all but confirmed their place in the last 32 with a 2-1 win at home to Sevilla FC, with Aleksandr Kerzhakov scoring both goals. A point at Beşiktaş JK followed on Matchday 5 as Zenit secured second place in the section.
- The two sides have never before met in UEFA competition, but both have previously faced teams from their respective countries. Rosenborg have a poor record against Russian sides, losing three of their four previous encounters, although they have won one of two games at the Lerkendal stadium.
- That came in the 1992/93 UEFA Cup in the second leg of their first-round tie against FC Dinamo Moskva when they triumphed 2-0, but it did little to change the overall complexion of the tie as Dinamo were already leading 5-1 after the first encounter.
- Rosenborg took another two-goal lead against FC Spartak Moskva in the first group stage of the UEFA Champions League three years later but the Russian team stormed back with four unanswered goals to make it 4-2. They continued that momentum in the reverse fixture at the Luzhniki stadium, scoring four more before Karl-Petter Løken gave Rosenborg a late consolation.
- Zenit have met just one Norwegian side before, when they were drawn against Vålerenga IF in the first round of the 1985/86 UEFA Cup Winners' Cup. Sergei Dimitrev broke the deadlock to set the home side on course for a 2-0 win in the first leg at the Petrovsky stadium, and repeated that feat in Norway two weeks later as Zenit completed a 4-0 aggregate victory.

- Such has been their recent dominance of Norwegian football, Rosenborg have been involved in every UEFA Champions League since the 1995/96 season with the exception of the 2003/04 campaign when they exited the competition at the third qualifying round stage.

- Their best performance to date in UEFA club competition coincides with their only involvement in the knockout stages of the UEFA Champions League, when in the 1996/97 season, the Norwegian side lost 3-1 on aggregate to the eventual beaten finalists, Juventus.

2005/06 season

- **UEFA Champions League qualifying:** Last year, Rosenborg won the 2004 Norwegian Tippeligaen on goal difference from Vålerenga IF (but Vålerenga triumphed in 2005 with Rosenborg adrift in seventh position). It meant once more, the third qualifying round, which for Rosenborg has become a habit with six appearances in the past six seasons. This season, they improved their record to five wins from six by defeating Romanian champions FC Steaua Bucuresti.

- The two sides shared a 1-1 draw in Bucharest, but Rosenborg took control in the return leg in Trondheim as they raced to a three-goal lead thanks to the efforts of Jan Gunnar Solli (38), Alexander Ødegaard (57) and a Mirel Radoi (60) own goal. However, Radoi (74) atoned for his error and when Iacob (76) added a second for the visitors, Rosenborg had to dig deep to hold on for the win.

- **UEFA Champions League group stage:** With Steaua tamed, Rosenborg stunned Greek champions Olympiacos CFP by recording a 3-1 away victory on the opening matchday. Olympiacos actually opened the scoring thanks to Alejandro Lago's own goal after 19 minutes, but Rosenborg hit back through Per Ciljan Skjelbred (42), a Dimitrios Mavrogenidis (48) own goal and Øyvind Storflor (90+4).

- But the Norwegian champions were unable to extend their unbeaten run. Lyon came knocking on Matchday 2 and continued their impressive form with Cris scoring the only goal of the game on the stroke of half-time.

- Although they opened the scoring, Rosenborg left Madrid with a 4-1 defeat at the end of Matchday 3. Roar Strand gave them a shock 40th-minute lead only for the Spanish side to nit back through Jonathan Woodgate (48), Raúl González (52), Iván Helguera (68) and David Beckham (82).

- Two first-half goals carried Madrid to a third successive UEFA Champions League victory - and the knockout stages of the competition - on Matchday 4 at the expense of a spirited Rosenborg side who were unfortunate to find goalkeeper Iker Casillas at the top of his form. A Mikael Dorsin own goal (26) followed by a close-range effort from Guti (41) enabled the visitors to survive an awkward second half.

- Substitute Thorstein Helstad's late equaliser denied ten-man Olympiacos a first-ever away win in the UEFA Champions League on Matchday 5 and allowed Rosenborg to guarantee a third place finish. Helstad struck with two minutes remaining after Rivaldo

had seemingly set Olympiacos on course for a first victory outside Greece in 28 attempts midway through the first half. Helstad's goal earned Rosenborg the point they needed to guarantee a UEFA Cup place.

- Prior to Matchday 6, both Olympique Lyonnais and Rosenborg knew their fate in the competition with the French side advancing to the knockout stages while their Norwegian opponents were destined for the UEFA Cup. Lyon won thanks to a last-gasp goal from Fred to secure a 2-1 away win. Karim Benzema had opened the scoring for Lyon after 33 minutes, but Daniel Braaten headed a 68th-minute equaliser after the home side had hit the woodwork on two occasions.

Key facts

- Their last appearance in the UEFA Cup came during the 2003/04 season after losing out on a place in the UEFA Champions League at the third qualifying round stage to RC Deportivo La Coruña. Rosenborg overcame FK Ventspils (10-1 on aggregate) and FK Crvena Zvezda (1-0 on aggregate) before exiting at the hands of SL Benfica on away goals at the third round phase.

- To date in UEFA club competition, Rosenborg have played on 138 occasions with 52 wins, 27 draws and 59 defeats. In that spell, the Norwegian side have scored 207 goals while conceding 234 times.

Club facts: Zenit

- FC Zenit St. Petersburg are involved in UEFA club competitions for the fifth time in the past seven seasons. Overall, they have featured in UEFA club competitions in nine separate seasons having made their first appearance as Zenit Leningrad in the 1981/82 UEFA Cup when representing the Soviet Union.

- Their last involvement in UEFA club competitions came during the 2004/05 season in the UEFA Cup but they failed to advance from the group stage. They defeated AEK 5-1 at home with Aleksandr Kerzhakov scoring a hat-trick in their opening fixture, but then lost 2-1 away to LOSC Lille Métropole. They would then draw at home against Sevilla FC (1-1), who they will meet again this season, and away to TSV Alemannia Aachen (2-2), a result that ended their hopes of qualification to the knockout phase.

- Zenit initially entered the 2004/05 UEFA Cup at the second qualifying round stage, but accounted for SV Pasching on away goals (3-3) before defeating FK Crvena Zvezda 6-1 on aggregate in the first round proper.

- Their previous best performances in UEFA club competitions were two appearances in the second round of the 1985/86 European Champion Clubs' Cup and 1989/90 UEFA Cup when the club was known as Zenit Leningrad.

- **UEFA Cup qualifying:** Zenit entered the competition having finished fourth in the Russian Premier-Liga last season. For the second season in succession, the Russian side began their UEFA Cup campaign in the second qualifying round stage as a qualifying berth in the UEFA Champions League continued to elude them. Meeting the

same opponents for the second time in two years in the form of Austria's SV Pasching, the two sides repeated the scoreline of 12 months previous when the tie ended 3-3 overall. But once more Zenit advanced on away goals – this time following two draws. The Russian side drew 2-2 away with Aleksandr Kerzhakov and Andrei Arshavin on target. They were then held to a 1-1 draw at home with Oleksandr Spivak (11) on the mark from the penalty spot.

- **UEFA Cup first round:** Zenit then drew familiar foes in the first round when paired with AEK Athens FC as the two sides met in last season's group stage. The tie was scoreless after the first leg in St. Petersburg before Zenit won 1-0 in Athens thanks to Arshavin's 89th-minute winner.

- **UEFA Cup group stage:** An Oleksandr Spivak (39) penalty and Arshavin's (54) second-half strike proved enough for Zenit to claim a 2-1 victory in their opening UEFA Cup group stage engagement against Portuguese side Vitória SC although midfielder Vladislav Radimov saw red five minutes from time.

- But the Russian side then lost away to Bolton Wanderers FC on Matchday 2 as Kevin Nolan scored the only goal of the game at the Reebok stadium. The Bolton captain reacted quickest to a rebound in the 24th minute to slot the ball past Kamil Čontofalský in Zenit's goal.

- On Matchday 3, Kerzhakov struck twice to give Zenit victory against Sevilla FC and put the Russian side on the brink of qualification for the knockout stage. The Russian international opened the scoring after 11 minutes and then doubled the home team's advantage in the 89th minute. There was still time for Javier Saviola (90+3) to pull a goal back, however, and only a fine save from Zenit goalkeeper Kamil Čontofalský prevented the Primera División side from scraping a point.

- Zenit survived a first-half onslaught to earn a 1-1 draw in Istanbul against Beşiktaş JK on Matchday 4. The Russian side - playing their last match in the group stage - came under intense pressure before İbrahim Akın (25) gave Beşiktaş the lead midway through the first half, but Oleksandr Gorshkov (30) soon equalised and a composed second-half display from Zenit ensured the points were shared.

- Despite not competing on the final matchday, Zenit ended the group in second place, level on points with first-placed Sevilla after two wins and a draw from their four outings. Bolton also qualified with six points while Beşiktaş (five) and Guimarães (one) missed out.

Key facts

- To date, Zenit have played 42 matches in UEFA club competitions. In those games, the Russian side won 21, drew nine and lost 12 times with 76 goals scored and 55 conceded.

Injuries hamper Rosenborg rest

With the UEFA Cup set to resume after its winter break, uefa.com looks at the form of the 32 clubs involved in first-leg ties this week.

With the Norwegian season still months off restarting, Rosenborg have had a restful winter, after being limited to friendlies since they were eliminated from the UEFA Champions League. But Per-Mathias Høgmo's team have nonetheless been blighted by injury, with Per Ciljan Skjelbred (broken leg) and Thorstein Helstad (foot) both long-term absentees, while Daniel Braaten and Jan Gunnar Solli are struggling with groin strains. Ørjan Berg is recovering after an ankle operation and illness forced Bjørn Tore Kvarme and Øyvind Storfjord to be isolated in their rooms at Rosenborg's training camp in La Manga.

An under-strength side still managed to eke out a 2-1 win against Danish outfit FC København in Spain, with Frode Johnsen and Karim Essediri both on target. Essediri is not eligible for the UEFA Cup as he and goalkeeper Lars Hirschfeld both played for Tromsø IL earlier in the competition, so Høgmo has brought in Burkina Faso striker Yssouf Kone, while recalling Harald Brattbakk and Alexander Lund Hansen from loan spells.

Stability has been the key for Zenit during the winter break. They managed to stave off advances from a number of sides to retain the services of striker Aleksandr Kerzhakov and midfielder Andrei Arshavin. A trio of players have left the Petrovsky stadium, however, with Alan Kasaev, Mikhail Kozlov and Victor Stroeve departing.

Meanwhile, three players have been added to the squad. Defender Jaroslav Nesvadba has been brought in to provide cover for Czech left-back Pavel Mareš by coach Vlastimil Petržela, while Korean Republic international Young-Min Hyun will compete for a starting place on the wing. Russian Under-21 midfielder Oleg Trifonov, meanwhile, will give Petržela more choice in the centre of the pitch.
