Manchester United FC will look to cement their position at the top of Group B when they welcome Beşiktaş JK to Old Trafford on Matchday 5.

- The English champions booked their place in the last 16 when they fought back to draw 3-3 with PFC CSKA Moskva last time out and, with a three-point lead over VfL Wolfsburg, they can take another step towards top spot by beating Beşiktaş.
- The visitors' UEFA Champions League hopes ended with their Matchday 4 home defeat by Wolfsburg but they could yet overturn the three-point deficit on third-placed CSKA and claim a UEFA Europa League berth.
- Another motivating factor for Beşiktaş is the memory of their last visit to England's north-west when they suffered a 8-0 defeat at Liverpool FC – their biggest European loss and a UEFA Champions League record.

Previous meeting

- Paul Scholes scored the only goal 13 minutes from time when the clubs met for the first time in Istanbul on 15 September.

Match background

- It would be unwise for anybody to leave Old Trafford early given United's remarkable habit of scoring late in this season's competition. Scholes's winner at Beşiktaş set the tone, with United hitting five of their seven goals so far in the final 13 minutes.
- United's late comeback against CSKA extended their unbeaten home record in the UEFA Champions League to 23 matches.
- Wayne Rooney will have fond memories of United's last visit from a Turkish club – he hit a debut hat-trick in a 6-2 victory against Fenerbahçe SK in a group-stage fixture on 28 September 2004. Beşiktaş custodian Rüştü Reçber was in the Fenerbahçe goal that night.
- Beşiktaş have lost five and drawn two of the seven away matches they have played since they last won on their travels in the UEFA Champions League, a 2-0 success at United's Premier League rivals Chelsea FC in October 2003.

Team ties

- Dimitar Berbatov scored for former club Tottenham Hotspur FC in a 2-0 win at Beşiktaş in the UEFA Cup group stage in October 2006.
- United's Rio Ferdinand, Gary Neville, Michael Owen, Rooney and Scholes were in the England team that ran out 2-0 winners against a Turkey side featuring Nihat Kahveci and Rüştü in a UEFA EURO 2004™ qualifier in Sunderland in April 2003.
- Ryan Giggs and Neville were part of the United side who missed out on the 1993/94 UEFA Champions League group stage after an away-goals defeat by Istanbul outfit Galatasaray AŞ in the second round – United drew 3-3 at Old Trafford, then 0-0 in Istanbul.
- Bobô, Serdar Özkan, İbrahim Toraman and İbrahim Üzülmez were all in the Beşiktaş starting lineup for the club's 8-0 defeat at Anfield on 6 November 2007.

- It was not the first heavy defeat Üzülmöz had suffered on English soil – he was in the Beşiktaş side that lost 6-0 at Leeds United AFC in the 2000/01 group stage, together with Nihat, then in his first spell at the club. Last season Nihat was in the Villarreal CF team beaten 3-0 at Arsenal FC in the UEFA Champions League quarter-finals.
- Beşiktaş coach Mustafa Denizli has his own unhappy memories of England – he was in charge of the Turkey side beaten 8-0 by the national team at Wembley Stadium in a UEFA European Championship qualifier in October 1987.
- Beşiktaş's Italian defender Matteo Ferrari spent 2005/06 in England with Everton FC but did not play against United.

UEFA milestones

- The 2008/09 final defeat by FC Barcelona brought an end to United's 25-match unbeaten run – the longest in the competition's history. They had last tasted defeat at AC Milan on 2 May 2007. AFC Ajax and FC Bayern München shared the previous record of 19 matches unbeaten.
- United have scored 397 goals in the European Champion Clubs' Cup and conceded 199.
- They have also conceded 146 goals in the UEFA Champions League, group stage to final.

UEFA Champions League statistics

- United have had 38 shots on goal, the highest total in the competition.
- The English have been caught offside 27 times, more than any other side.
- Nemanja Vidić's next booking will incur a suspension.

- United climbed up to second place in the Premier League by stretching their unbeaten league record at Old Trafford to 12 games. Sir Alex Ferguson's team have won 27 and lost only one of their last 31 home matches in the English top flight.
- Darren Fletcher's goal was his third in the league this season, equalling his most prolific campaigns of 2004/05, 2006/07 and 2008/09.
- Antonio Valencia has now scored four goals in his last seven United appearances having managed none in his first eleven.
- Of United's 26 league goals this season 19 have come in the second half, nine in the last 15 minutes.
- United suffered a second defeat in three league matches – and a second successive away reverse – at Chelsea FC on 8 November, going down 1-0 thanks to John Terry's late goal.
- Sir Alex Ferguson's side had won 12 of their previous 14 matches before facing PFC CSKA Moskva on Matchday 4, but followed that draw with defeat at Stamford Bridge before getting back to winning ways against Everton.
- After scoring against Tottenham Hotspur FC on 12 September, Ryan Giggs has registered in the top flight in each of his 20 campaigns with United and is the only player to find the net in all 18 seasons of the Premier League era.
- United will host Tottenham in the League Cup quarter-finals on 1 December, a repeat of last year's final which Sir Alex's team won on penalties after a goalless 120 minutes.

- Evra and Nani helped France and Portugal respectively to qualify for next year's World Cup finals with play-off wins, although there was disappointment for O'Shea and Gibson.

- Berbatov became Bulgaria's leading goalscorer with his double in Malta taking him to 48 goals – one more than previous record holder Hristo Bonev.

- Rooney and former United player Cristiano Ronaldo have been shortlisted for the FIFA World Player of the Year award. The winner will be announced in Zurich on 21 December.

- Beşiktaş have conceded 99 goals in the European Champion Clubs' Cup.

- Tomáš Sivok is one of only four players to have collected four yellow cards, and serves a one-game ban on Matchday 5.

Latest domestic information

- **Saturday 21 November: Beşiktaş JK 3-0 Fenerbahçe SK (Fink 55, Bobô 57, Uğurİnceman 83)**

- Beşiktaş lifted themselves to within four points of the Süper Lig summit with a comprehensive victory against early pacesetters and Istanbul rivals Fenerbahçe, who lost Kazım Kazım to a 75th-minute red card. It was Beşiktaş' first league win against their city rivals since April 2005.

- Michael Fink registered his second league goal for the club, having scored against Istanbul BB SK on the opening day of the season. Uğur İnceman's late effort was his first in the Süper Lig since joining Beşiktaş in 2008, while captain İbrahim Üzülmöz set up two goals.

- The win – the biggest of the season for Beşiktaş – represented the Turkish titleholders' seventh consecutive league triumph having managed just one in their first six outings. Indeed, Beşiktaş took just six points from their first six league matches this term – their worst start to a campaign since 2004/05.

- Discounting the automatic 3-0 win awarded against Ankaraspor AŞ on 27 September, Beşiktaş have scored only 13 goals in 13 league games. However, they boast the best defensive record in the division, having conceded merely six times.
- Indeed, Beşiktaş have kept clean sheets in their last four league games and have not conceded since André Moritz's 89th-minute penalty for Kasımpaşa SK on 17 October, 361 minutes ago.
- Nihat Kahveci's opener against Kasımpaşa was his first in 39 games for club and country since scoring twice against the Czech Republic at UEFA EURO 2008™ on 15 June last year. He struck 18 Liga goals for Villarreal CF in 2007/08.
- Mert Nobre is without a goal in 20 games since scoring in the 3-2 win at Hacettepe SK on 7 March.
- Holders Beşiktaş have been drawn with Manisaspor, Kasımpaşa, İstanbul BB and third-tier Konya Şeker SK in Group D of the Turkish Cup.

- Became the first Turkish coach to win the title with Fenerbahçe in 2000/01.
- Hired in summer 2008, he led Beşiktaş to a domestic double in his debut season, becoming the first coach to win Süper Lig titles with all three big Istanbul clubs – triumphing in his first full campaign with each.

• **UEFA Champions League:** Group stage milestones

Holders FC Barcelona are looking to avoid becoming the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/00 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage).

In 1992/93, Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and were beaten 4-3 on aggregate in the second round by PFC CSKA Moskva.

S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta became the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League in 2007/08 when he featured against Olympiacos CFP on Matchday 1 at the age of 43 years and 168 days. The record was previously held by Alessandro Costacurta, the AC Milan defender who played against AEK Athens FC in the 2006/07 season at the age of 40 years and 211 days. Ballotta was aged 43 years 252 days when he featured against Real Madrid CF on Matchday 6.

Laurent Blanc is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 36 years and 339 days, having found the net for Manchester United FC in their 3-2 defeat of Olympiacos CFP on 23 October 2002.

Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared in the UEFA Champions League. He was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was then sent off in the 37th minute.

Barcelona, Manchester United and Milan have all finished as group winners on ten occasions, one more than Real Madrid and Juventus.

Four teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain FC (1994/95), FC Spartak Moskva (1995/96) and Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage).

In 2006/07, PFC Levski Sofia joined 1. FC Košice in being the only team to have played in the UEFA Champions League and never picked up a point. The Slovakian side have not returned to the competition since losing all six games in their only campaign to date in 1997/98. Six other teams have gone through a single group stage campaign without picking up a point: FC Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08), SK Rapid Wien (2005/06) and RSC Anderlecht (2004/05) plus Spartak Moskva and Bayer 04 Leverkusen (2002/03, first and second group stage respectively) and Fenerbahçe SK (2001/02, first group stage).

Manchester United scored 20 goals in the 1998/99 group stage, more than any other side has managed. Barcelona scored 19 times in the 1999/2000 first group stage.

Dynamo conceded 19 goals in their six outings in 2007/08, equalling the record let in during a group stage set by Ferencvárosi TC in the 1995/96 campaign.

No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), AFC Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea FC (2005/06), Liverpool FC (2005/06) and Villarreal CF (2005/06) all let in just one.

Before their 3-1 win against Sporting Clube de Portugal on Matchday 6 of the 2006/07 campaign, FC Spartak Moskva went 22 games without a victory in the competition, surpassing the unwanted record set by AEK Athens FC on Matchday 3 of the same campaign.

The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is seven points. The first to do it, since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96, were Legia Warszawa that same season before Bayer Leverkusen managed it in 1999/2000 and Liverpool in 2001/02. FC Lokomotiv Moskva and eventual finalists Juventus both progressed with seven points in 2002/03, a feat achieved by Rangers FC and Werder Bremen in 2005/06.
