Match background

FC Internazionale Milano welcome FC Bayern München for the first leg of a round of 16 tie that provides a repeat of last season's UEFA Champions League final.

- For Bayern it is an early opportunity to avenge their defeat in a final that Inter won 2-0 to claim their first European crown in 45 years, and third overall. The Bavarian side can take heart from history, having won on their two previous trips to Milan to face Inter.
- This match marks Inter's first in the UEFA Champions League since Leonardo replaced Rafael Benítez as coach in December. José Mourinho, architect of their victory against Bayern at the Santiago Bernabéu, left the club last summer.

Previous meetings

- Two Diego Milito goals (35, 70) secured Inter's triumph against Bayern on 22 May last year. The full lineups were:
Bayern: Butt, Lahm, Van Buyten, Demichelis, Badstuber, Robben, Van Bommel, Schweinsteiger, Altıntop (Klose 63), Müller, Olić (Gomez 74).
Inter: Júlio César, Maicon, Lúcio, Samuel, Chivu (Stanković 68), Zanetti, Cambiasso, Sneijder, Eto'o, Milito (Materazzi 90), Pandev (Muntari 79).
- The teams also met in the UEFA Champions League in the 2006/07 group stage. Felix Magath's Bayern won 2-0 at Inter in September 2006 through goals from Claudio Pizarro (81) and Lukas Podolski (90+1), with Inter reduced to nine men by the dismissals of Zlatan Ibrahimović and Fabio Grosso. Patrick Vieira's added-time equaliser earned Roberto Mancini's visitors a 1-1 draw in the Munich return, cancelling out Roy Makaay's opener.
- Bayern beat Inter in the clubs' only previous two-legged contest in the 1988/89 UEFA Cup third round, thanks to a spectacular comeback. Aldo Serena (60) and Nicola Berti (71) gave Inter a 2-0 first-leg win in Munich but Bayern hit back, scoring three goals in eight first-half minutes in the return through Roland Wohlfarth (33), Klaus Augenthaler (37) and Jürgen Wegmann (40). Although Serena (45) pulled one back, Bayern's 3-1 win took them through on away goals.
- Jupp Heynckes was then in charge of Bayern with Giovanni Trapattoni, a future coach of the Bavarian club, at the Inter helm.

Match background

- Bayern enter the contest with a superior record in this season's competition, having topped Group E with five wins. Only Real Madrid CF managed more than their 15 points and only Arsenal FC and Tottenham Hotspur FC scored more than Bayern's 16 goals.
- Inter finished behind Tottenham in Group A with three wins, one draw and two defeats. Although beaten twice away, they are undefeated in ten UEFA Champions League home games and have won the last seven, including a 4-0 success against Bundesliga side SV Werder Bremen on Matchday 2.
- Inter's home record against German visitors is: W10 D1 L4.
- Since the group stage ended, Inter have added the FIFA Club World Cup to their trophy collection – the final act of Benítez's reign.
- For Leonardo this is only the second experience of UEFA Champions League football as a coach, after he led AC Milan to the round of 16 last season. Van Gaal, by contrast, is in his ninth campaign.
- Bayern suffered two 3-2 defeats on Italian soil in 2010. They went down at ACF Fiorentina in the 2009/10 round of 16 but advanced on away goals thanks to a 2-1 first-leg success. On Matchday 5 this season, with qualification already secured, they surrendered a two-goal lead to lose at AS Roma. Their last victory in Italy was a 4-1 success at Juventus in December 2009.
- Bayern's overall record away to Italian opposition is: W4 D2 L9.
- Inter lost the 1996/97 UEFA Cup final to FC Schalke 04 on penalties at San Siro after the sides had each won 1-0 at home.

Team ties

- Bayern coach Van Gaal twice faced Italian opposition in the UEFA Champions League final with AFC Ajax. In 1995 his Ajax team overcame Milan 1-0, before losing the following season's showpiece to Juventus after a penalty shoot-out. Van Gaal also guided Ajax to victory against Torino FC in the 1992 UEFA Cup final.

- Lúcio played for Bayern between 2004 and 2009, winning the Bundesliga title and German Cup three times. He appeared alongside Jorg Bütt in the Bayer 04 Leverkusen side beaten in the 2002 UEFA Champions League final.
- Robben got the better of Júlio César, Maicon and Lúcio when the Netherlands beat Brazil 2-1 in last year's FIFA World Cup quarter-final thanks to two goals from Inter's Wesley Sneijder.
- Dejan Stanković was in the Serbia side that beat Germany in the group stage of the World Cup. Sulley Muntari was a substitute for Ghana in their 1-0 loss to Germany in the same group.
- Eto'o scored a penalty for Cameroon in a 2-1 defeat against Arjen Robben's Netherlands in last year's World Cup group stage.
- Milito and Walter Samuel were on the bench when Argentina lost 4-0 to Germany in the quarter-finals in South Africa with goals from Thomas Müller and Miroslav Klose (2).
- Lúcio and Miroslav Klose were on opposing sides as Brazil beat Germany 2-0 in the 2002 World Cup final.
- Marco Materazzi helped Italy overcome Franck Ribéry's France on penalties in the 2006 World Cup final, scoring Italy's goal in a 1-1 draw and converting their second penalty in a 5-3 shoot-out win.
- Netherlands colleagues Robben and Sneijder also played together at Real Madrid CF before joining Bayern and Inter respectively in 2009.
- On 9 February a Germany team including Philipp Lahm, Holger Badstuber, Bastian Schweinsteiger, Müller and Klose drew 1-1 with Italy in a friendly international in Dortmund, Klose scoring the home team's goal. Andrea Ranocchia and Thiago Motta featured for the visitors.

- Yuto Nagatomo started at left-back as Chivu completed his four-match ban, retrospectively given for violent conduct in the win against AS Bari on 3 February.
- Inter have won nine out of nine in all competitions at San Siro since 14 November when Zlatan Ibrahimović scored the only goal as AC Milan ended Inter's 46-game unbeaten run at home in Serie A.
- Inter have won 12 of their 15 fixtures since their 3-0 defeat at SV Werder Bremen. Two came at the FIFA Club World Cup, which the Nerazzurri captured in what was Rafael Benítez's final act as coach. Leonardo was appointed on 24 December and since his arrival a 13-point deficit to Serie A leaders AC Milan has dwindled.
- Inter beat AS Roma 5-3 on 6 February, the highest scoring game in 94 encounters between the sides at San Siro. They will meet again in the Coppa Italia semi-finals, with the first leg away on 20 April before the 11 May return.
- The Nerazzurri lost 1-0 at Juventus on 13 February, their sixth league defeat of the campaign – two more than they suffered in the whole of last term.
- Javier Zanetti made his 520th Serie A appearance for Inter in the 3-2 win against AC Cesena on 19 January, breaking Giuseppe Bergomi's club record.
- Eto'o has scored 31 goals in 39 appearances for club and country this term.

Injury news

- Wesley Sneijder sat out Saturday's game with a minor thigh problem.
- Lúcio (out since 30 January) and Diego Milito (6 February) are sidelined with thigh problems though the former is back in full training.
- MacDonald Mariga (from 26 January) and Dejan Stanković (26 January) returned after thigh knocks on 16 February.
- Walter Samuel could miss the rest of the season after damaging knee ligaments on 6 November.

- Brazilian-born Thiago Motta made his Azzurri debut in a 1-1 friendly draw with Germany on 9 February.
- Nagatomo was ever-present as Japan won January's AFC Asian Cup under former Inter coach Alberto Zaccheroni.
- Maicon and Sneijder were named in the UEFA.com users' Team of the Year; José Mourinho was elected coach.
- Milito was named Player of the Year at the Italian footballers' association's 2010 Oscar del Calcio awards. Júlio César was selected as best goalkeeper, Samuel best defender, while Maicon claimed the goal of the year gong for his strike against Juventus in April. Mourinho took the best coach prize.
- Eto'o was named African Player of the Year for a record fourth time on 20 December.

- Bastian Schweinsteiger scored his first header in 239 Bundesliga appearances, while Müller took his tally to eight in his last nine outings for Bayern.
- Gomez has scored ten goals in eight games for Bayern and 27 in 31 matches for the club this season, including four hat-tricks.
- Bayern have scored 22 goals in seven games in 2011.
- On 12 February Franck Ribéry and Arjen Robben appeared together for the first time in 273 days, since last season's German Cup final, as Bayern beat TSG 1899 Hoffenheim 4-0.
- Bayern have won their last ten home games, scoring 34 goals in the process.
- Philipp Lahm has started the club's last 95 competitive games.
- Bayern will meet FC Schalke 04 in the German Cup semi-finals on 2 March, a repeat of last year's lineup when Robben's stunning extra-time solo effort decided it.
- Bayern accrued eight points from their first seven games – their worst ever start to a Bundesliga campaign.
- In September Louis van Gaal's side drew 0-0 with SV Werder Bremen and 1. FC Köln – the first time the German champions have recorded back-to-back goalless draws at home in the Bundesliga.

Injury news

- Kroos was a substitute at Mainz, his first appearance since injuring his metatarsal on 13 December.
- Thomas Kraft has been ever-present in the starting XI since supplanting Jörg Butt in the Bayern goal during the winter break but was taken off at half-time on Saturday with a head injury. Gomez finished the match but aggravated an ankle problem.
- Miroslav Klose has played five games for Bayern since the end of September because of a hamstring problem.
- Robben made his first appearance of the season on 15 January after recovering from a torn left thigh muscle. A substitute, he replaced Ribéry, who picked up a knee injury that ruled him out of the next three games.
- Diego Contento has not featured since suffering a stress fracture to his spine on 22 January and Rouven Sattelmair injured his bicep at the start of October but both are back in training.
- Ivica Olić was ruled out for six months after knee surgery on 9 November.

Coaching career: AC Milan, FC Internazionale Milano

- Started out as a left-back but is best known as an attacking midfielder. Spent much of his playing career in Brazil, winning the national championship with Flamengo and São Paulo.
- Had two-year stints in Spain and Japan before one year with PSG and a successful four-year spell with Milan, from 1997 to 2001. A San Siro crowd favourite, played a key role in Milan winning the Serie A title in 1999.
- Earned a FIFA World Cup winners' medal with Brazil as a defender in 1994 but missed the closing stages of the tournament after being sent off in the first knockout round. As a midfielder, helped Brazil finish runners-up to hosts France in the 1998 World Cup and retired with eight goals in 60 international games.
- Returned to Milan for the 2002/03 season, his last before retiring, and helped the Rossoneri win the Coppa Italia. Became Milan's technical director in 2008 and was made coach in May 2009 despite having no coaching background.
- In his sole season in charge, guided Milan to third place in Serie A and last 16 of UEFA Champions League before stepping down in May 2010. That December, succeeded Rafael Benítez as Inter coach, signing a six-month deal.

- Having never made it beyond the reserve team at his first club, Ajax, Van Gaal spent most of his playing career as a Sparta midfielder, retiring in 1987 after a season with AZ, where he started his coaching career as an assistant.
- Took on a similar coaching role at hometown club Ajax, under Leo Beenhakker, from 1988 to 1991 before moving up to the top job on his mentor's departure.
- Had six glorious years at Ajax, winning three Eredivisie titles, a Dutch Cup, the 1992 UEFA Cup and the 1995 UEFA Champions League; defended that title in 1996 all the way to a penalty shoot-out defeat by Juventus in the final. Was awarded an Order of the Oranje-Nassau in 1997 and made a knight.
- Moved to Spain the same year for a three-season stint at Barcelona, winning two Liga titles and a Copa del Rey. Became Netherlands coach in 2000 in an unsuccessful bid to qualify the Oranje for the 2002 FIFA World Cup. Returned briefly to Barça before a spell out of coaching.
- Took over at Alkmaar in 2005, steering them to their first Eredivisie title since 1981 in April 2009. Appointed coach of Bayern a month later, as a replacement for caretaker Jupp Heynckes, and became the first Dutch coach to win the Bundesliga in his first season, also adding the German Cup and reaching the UEFA Champions League final.

UEFA Champions League knockout stage: Did you know?

- Teams have recovered from a first-leg deficit to go through to the next stage on 22 occasions, although only once – AFC Ajax's defeat of Panathinaikos FC in the 1995/96 semi-finals – has a side gone through after losing the first leg at home. The biggest losing margin a side has overturned was achieved by RC Deportivo La Coruña in the 2003/04 quarter-finals when they fought back from a 4-1 defeat at AC Milan to win 4-0 at home.
- Nineteen ties have been decided on the away goals rule, including five where the triumphant team lost the first leg.
- FC Bayern München hold the record for the biggest first-leg lead with a 5-0 success at Sporting Clube de Portugal in the 2008/09 first knockout round, eventually going through 12-1 after a 7-1 home victory in the second leg.
- Ten ties have now gone to penalties, including the game between Arsenal FC and AS Roma in the 2008/09 first knockout round. Five of these were finals – 1996, 2001, 2003, 2005 and 2008. The first two-legged tie decided on spot-kicks was PSV Eindhoven's 4-2 win against Olympique Lyonnais on 13 April 2005 after a 2-2 aggregate draw.
- In all, 17 ties have required extra time. So far seven have been decided by extra time alone: four quarter-finals, two first knockout round encounters and the 2007/08 semi-final between Chelsea FC and Liverpool FC.
- The 2008/09 last-16 encounter between Bayern and Sporting featured more goals (13) over its two legs than any previous UEFA Champions League knockout tie, Bayern prevailing 12-1.
- There has never been a knockout tie ending goalless after two legs. Nine have finished 1-0 on aggregate, most recently Manchester United FC's narrow victory against FC Barcelona in the 2007/08 semi-finals.
- Bayern's 4-0 defeat of Lyon in 2009/10 is the joint biggest aggregate win in a UEFA Champions League semi-final, equalling Juventus' 6-2 victory against Ajax in 1996/97.
- Clarence Seedorf is the only player to win the European Champion Clubs' Cup with three clubs (AFC Ajax 1995, Real Madrid CF 1998, AC Milan 2003, 2007). Liverpool's Bob Paisley (1977, 1978, 1981) is the only coach to win three times.
- Ottmar Hitzfeld (BV Borussia Dortmund 1997, Bayern 2001), Ernst Happel (Feyenoord 1970, Hamburger SV 1983) and José Mourinho (FC Porto 2004, FC Internazionale Milano 2010) are the only coaches to win the trophy with two clubs.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Champion Clubs' Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United (2008, 2009) have all returned to the final as holders only to lose.

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having been aged 43 years 252 days when he featured against Real Madrid CF on Matchday 6 of the 2007/08 competition.
- Filippo Inzaghi is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 87 days, in AC Milan's 2-2 draw against Real Madrid CF on 3 November 2010.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared in the UEFA Champions League. He was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against Steaua on 23 November 1994. He was then sent off in the 37th minute.
