Match background

FC Bayern München are just one step away from their dream of contesting the UEFA Champions League final in their home stadium but first they must overcome a Real Madrid CF side who visit Bavaria for the first leg of a duel between two authentic heavyweights of European football.

- The match pits Bayern coach Jupp Heynckes, who steered Madrid to the European crown in 1998, against José Mourinho, the man who engineered Bayern's downfall at the hands of FC Internazionale Milano in the 2010 final at the Santiago Bernabéu.
- Bayern will enter the contest buoyed by both an impeccable home record en route to the last four and an unbeaten record at home against Madrid.
- Between them the teams have 13 European Cups but both are hungry to add to their haul with Bayern, four-times winners, seeking a first title since 2001 and Madrid their first since 2002 and a record tenth overall.

Previous meetings

- Bayern hold the upper hand with ten wins to Madrid's six from the clubs' 18 past matches. The Bavarian side's home record against Madrid is W8 D1 L0.
- The clubs have met in four previous European Cup semi-finals with Bayern prevailing three times (1976, 1987, 2001) to Madrid's one (2000). Iker Casillas is the only survivor of the two most recent semi-finals.
- Both teams have won four of their eight previous two-legged encounters in the competition. The most recent came in the 2006/07 round of 16 when Bayern prevailed on away goals, losing 3-2 in Spain but winning 2-1 in Munich.
- The teams for that Munich encounter on 7 March 2007 were:

- Roy Makaay, with the fastest goal in UEFA Champions League history, and Lúcio scored for Ottmar Hitzfeld's hosts before a late Ruud van Nistelrooy penalty for Fabio Capello's Merengues. The teams each finished with ten men, with Mark van Bommel and Mahamadou Diarra sent off.

Match background

- Madrid are unbeaten in this season's competition but Bayern have posted six straight home wins and overall have won 13 of their last 14 European home outings. The only blip came in the 2010/11 round of 16 when Inter won 3-2 in Munich.
- With four wins from five and just one goal conceded, Madrid's away form is almost as impressive but their record on German soil augurs less well. The Merengues' 22 previous visits have brought 15 losses and just one victory – 3-2 against Bayer 04 Leverkusen in 2000/01.
- Bayern, by contrast, have an excellent home record against Spanish opposition, which reads W12 D5 L1. Their solitary defeat was a 3-2 reverse against RC Deportivo La Coruña in 2002/03.
- Bayern have a 7-6 win-loss record in two-legged contests with Spanish clubs in UEFA competition. Madrid's record against German sides is 10-7.

- Bayern twice overcame Spanish opposition in European Cup finals, beating Club Atlético de Madrid after a replay in 1973/74 and Valencia CF on penalties in 2000/01.

- Madrid have won all three European finals they have played against German sides. They lifted the 1959/60 European Champion Clubs' Cup after a famous 7-3 success against Eintracht Frankfurt, beat 1. FC Köln in the 1985/86 UEFA Cup, and defeated Bayer 04 Leverkusen in the 2001/02 UEFA Champions League.

- The winners will face Chelsea or Barcelona in the final in Munich on 19 May.

Team ties

- Heynckes won the UEFA Champions League in his solitary season at the Madrid helm in 1997/98, when they finished fourth in the Liga. He also had spells coaching Athletic Club (1992-94 and 2000-03) and CD Tenerife (1996/97).

- Heynckes has never beaten Spanish opposition in two-legged European ties as a coach. His four defeats include a 7-0 reverse at RC Celta de Vigo with SL Benfica in the 1999/2000 UEFA Cup and an incredible 1985/86 UEFA Cup tie with VfL Borussia Mönchengladbach where his side beat Madrid 5-1 at home but still lost on away goals. With Leverkusen last term he lost to Villarreal CF in the UEFA Europa League round of 16.

- As a Mönchengladbach player, Heynckes hit four goals in a 9-2 aggregate victory against Real Zaragoza in the 1974/75 UEFA Cup. In the following season's European Cup he scored against Madrid yet lost on away goals.

- Mourinho got the better of Bayern as Chelsea FC manager in the 2004/05 quarter-finals, though he was suspended for both legs. Chelsea won 4-2 in London and went through despite losing 3-2 in Munich.

- Casillas, Sergio Ramos and Xabi Alonso helped Spain to a 1-0 UEFA EURO 2008 final win against a Germany side including Philipp Lahm, Bastian Schweinsteiger and Mario Gomez. Manuel Neuer, Jérôme Boateng, Toni Kroos, Sami Khedira and Mesut Özil featured along with those six players when Spain earned another 1-0 success in the countries' 2010 FIFA World Cup semi-final.

- In the quarter-finals of the same competition, Ángel Di María and Gonzalo Higuaín lost 4-0 to Germany with Argentina. Higuaín scored the only goal in Argentina's 1-0 friendly defeat of Germany at Bayern's stadium in March 2010.

- Kaká was a goalscorer when his Milan side eliminated Bayern in both the 2005/06 and 2006/07 seasons.

- Arjen Robben scored 11 goals in 50 Liga appearances for Madrid between 2007 and 2009.

- Altıntop left Bayern for Madrid in 2011 after four seasons in Munich, 63 Bundesliga appearances and seven goals.

- Khedira was at VfB Stuttgart from 2006 to 2010, featuring in three wins, four losses and a draw against Bayern.

- Özil was on the winning side just once in eight games against Bayern with FC Schalke 04 and SV Werder Bremen, scoring twice.

- Bayern have committed 148 fouls and collected 21 yellow cards, both more than any other side in the semi-finals.
- In contrast, their totals of 52 shots wide and 15 offsides is the lowest in the last four.
- Mario Gomez is the competition's second highest scorer with 11 goals, three fewer than Lionel Messi.
- Franck Ribéry has set up five goals, the joint highest total along with Kaká, Karim Benzema and SL Benfica's Nicolás Gaitán.
- Ribéry has been fouled 32 times, more than any other player.
- Bastian Schweinsteiger is available again after a one-game ban; David Alaba, Jérôme Boateng, Toni Kroos, Luiz Gustavo and Thomas Müller will incur a suspension with their next bookings.

- Jupp Heynckes made five changes to the team which lost to Borussia Dortmund three days earlier. Philipp Lahm, Luiz Gustavo, Ribéry, Gomez and Kroos dropped to the bench, with Diego Contento, Rafinha, Anatoliy Tymoshchuk, Ivica Olić and Schweinsteiger brought into the starting XI.
- Lahm's omission ended his run of 105 successive top-flight starts, a sequence dating back to April 2009.
- Bayern drew a blank for the second consecutive match as their run of 11 straight home wins in all competitions came to an end. They are eight points behind leaders Dortmund with three Bundesliga fixtures remaining.
- The club's 800th home outing in the Bundesliga produced their first goalless draw at the Fußball Arena München since the visit of 1. FC Köln on 18 September 2010.
- Bayern's nine-game unbeaten run in all competitions, including eight victories, was ended by a 1-0 loss to Dortmund on 11 April.
- Gomez scored twice as Bayern beat FC Augsburg 2-1 on 7 April and has struck 40 goals in his last 45 appearances for club and country.
- Heynckes's side have won just seven of their last 19 away games in all competitions in regulation time.
- The Bavarian outfit had won 20 of their 22 home games in all competitions this season prior to Saturday, losing the other two 1-0 to Dortmund (19 November) and VfL Borussia Mönchengladbach (7 August).
- Ribéry has scored 11 goals in the Bundesliga this term, equalling his previous best set in 2007/08.
- Heynckes's charges will meet Dortmund again in the German Cup final in Berlin on 12 May.
- Bayern's 2-0 win against VfL Wolfsburg on 28 January was Heynckes's 456th Bundesliga victory as coach and player, surpassing Otto Rehhagel's German top-flight record.
- Between 7 August and 18 October, Manuel Neuer and Bayern went a club record 1,147 minutes without conceding.

- Daniel Van Buyten has been unavailable with a broken metatarsal since 20 January.
- Breno, out since having a knee operation on 11 May, is yet to play this season. He was an unused substitute against Wolfsburg on 28 January but has since undergone further knee surgery.

- Bayern confirmed on 4 April that Gomez had signed a contract extension, tying him to the club until 2016.
- Schweinsteiger's elder brother Tobias, 30, will join Bayern's reserve team this summer from third division side SSV Jahn 2000 Regensburg.

- In February it was announced that Xherdan Shaqiri will join from FC Basel 1893 in the summer on a four-year deal.
- In November, Neuer won €500,000 for charity in the German version of television show Who Wants to be a Millionaire?

- Madrid have scored 345 goals in the UEFA Champions League, group stage to final. José Callejón's strike in the quarter-final second leg was their 750th in the European Cup.
- Matchday ten was Madrid's 450th game in UEFA competition.

- José Mourinho's side have conceded six goals, the best defensive record of the teams still involved. They have had 86 shots on goal and been caught offside 45 times, both more than any other side in the last four.
- Karim Benzema and Kaká have provided five assists so far, the joint highest total in the competition along with Bayern's Franck Ribéry and Nicolás Gaitán of SL Benfica.
- Gonzalo Higuaín has been caught offside 14 times, more than any player still involved and the second highest total overall behind Zlatan Ibrahimović (21).

- Shorn of the suspended Xabi Alonso, Madrid increased their tally of Liga goals this term to 107 – equalling the club record set in 1989/90 – with a comeback win against Sporting, who finished the encounter with ten men following Roberto Canella's late dismissal.
 - Cristiano Ronaldo surpassed his 40-goal Liga haul of last season and has now scored 59 times in 55 games for club and country this term.
 - Madrid had registered in 41 successive games until a 0-0 draw against Valencia CF on 8 April.
 - The Merengues responded by beating Club Atlético de Madrid 4-1, Ronaldo registering his seventh Liga hat-trick of the season.
 - Madrid have scored 107 Liga goals this season, five more than they managed in the previous campaign and in 2009/10.
 - Ronaldo scored his 100th and 101st Liga goals in the 5-1 win against Real Sociedad de Fútbol on 24 March. He is the quickest player to reach the century, his 92 games breaking Ferenc Puskás' 105-match mark.
 - The Portugal forward has struck 14 Liga hat-tricks for Madrid, two more than Puskás's tally for the club, but still some way off Alfredo Di Stéfano's record (22). He has also converted 24 successive spot kicks for the club since failing against UD Almería on 5 December 2009.
 - The Merengues have won 37 of their last 44 games in all competitions and are unbeaten in their last 20, winning 15 since their 2-1 Copa del Rey defeat by FC Barcelona on 18 January.
 - Benzema has struck 16 goals in 22 games in 2012; Higuaín has scored eight in his last 12 outings.
 - Madrid scored 67 goals in the first half of their Liga campaign, eclipsing the record set by Barcelona (61) last term. Ronaldo contributed 23, taking him past César Rodríguez's Liga record of 22 for Barcelona in 1950/51.
 - Mourinho's side claimed a club record 11 successive away wins before a 2-2 Copa del Rey draw with the Azulgrana on 25 January.

- Marcelo missed the defeat of Atlético because of a back problem but returned for the visit of Sporting.
 - Ángel Di María made his first start since 17 December against Atlético having previously been restricted to just four substitute appearances in 2012 because of a thigh injury.

- One of the best strikers in Bundesliga history, Heynckes hit 220 goals in 369 games for Mönchengladbach and Hannover from 1964 to 1978; won four titles and a German Cup with Mönchengladbach and was the league's top scorer in 1974 (30 goals) and 1975 (27).
- Aged 34, replaced Udo Lattek as Mönchengladbach coach in 1979; mentored the young Lothar Matthäus but failed to win any trophies, losing to FC Bayern München in the 1983/84 German Cup final and reaching the UEFA Cup semi-finals three seasons later.
- Replaced Lattek again in 1987, this time at Bayern, winning 1989 and 1990 titles; club general manager Uli Hoeness called his decision to sack Heynckes in October 1991 "the biggest mistake of my career".
- Moved to Spain, earning Athletic Club a place in the 1994/95 UEFA Cup. His Tenerife side then reached 1996/97 UEFA Cup semi-finals, earning Heynckes a season as Madrid coach; led Los Merengues to UEFA Champions League glory in 1997/98 but left that summer.
- Following a lean spell, stepped in as caretaker manager at Bayern in April 2009 following Jürgen Klinsmann's dismissal; replaced Bruno Labbadia as Leverkusen coach the same summer, beginning with German record run of 24 unbeaten Bundesliga games. His side finished second to Borussia Dortmund in 2010/11, Heynckes leaving to take charge of Bayern for a third time at the end of the campaign.

Real Madrid CF: José Mourinho

Coaching career: SL Benfica, UD Leiria, FC Porto, Chelsea FC, FC Internazionale Milano, Real Madrid CF

- A former teacher, Mourinho had spells working at Sporting Clube de Portugal, Porto and FC Barcelona as a coaching assistant in the 1990s.
- As coach, had a brief, nine-game stay at Benfica and a highly successful tenure at Leiria before really making his mark after his arrival at Porto in January 2002. In his first full season, 2002/03, Porto won the UEFA Cup and a domestic double. The next year they retained their league title and claimed the UEFA Champions League with a 3-0 defeat of AS Monaco FC in Gelsenkirchen.
- Joined Chelsea in 2004 and led the club to the League Cup and their first league championship for 50 years in his first season. Followed up with the league title again in 2006, and both the League Cup and FA Cup in 2007.
- Left Chelsea in September 2007 and stayed out of football until joining Inter in June 2008. In his first campaign the Nerazzurri retained their Serie A crown, a feat they repeated in 2009/10 when they also added the Coppa Italia and the UEFA Champions League crown, their first European Cup win since 1965.
- Victory at the Santiago Bernabéu was Mourinho's last act as Inter coach before joining Madrid on a four-year deal. His first season featured the club's first Copa del Rey victory in 18 years and a UEFA Champions League semi-final appearance.

- Howard Webb has made tremendous progress in recent years, both in his native England – where highlights include the 2006/07 League Cup final and the 2008/09 FA Cup final – but also abroad, particularly in 2009/10.
- His appointment on matchday two of the 2006/07 campaign was his first taste of the UEFA Champions League proper, reward for an impressive performance at the UEFA European Under-21 Championship in Portugal.
- A former police officer who enjoys keeping fit, Webb already has a long career behind him having been inspired to pick up the whistle by his father at the age of 18. Took charge of the 2005 FA Community Shield, and that November was in the middle for his first senior international between Northern Ireland and Portugal.
- Having overseen five qualifiers, Webb was referee for two games at UEFA EURO 2008 and in 2008/09 took charge of the UEFA Cup semi-final first leg between Werder Bremen and Hamburger SV.
- The following season he became the fifth Englishman to oversee the European Cup final when FC Internazionale Milano overcame FC Bayern München in Madrid. Even better was to come at the FIFA World Cup, however, where Webb refereed three matches before becoming the first Englishman since Jack Taylor in 1974 to be awarded the final as Spain beat the Netherlands 1-0.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League knockout stage: Did you know?

- Teams have recovered from a first-leg deficit to go through on 28 occasions, including SL Benfica, APOEL FC, FC Bayern München and Chelsea FC in this season's round of 16. Only twice – AFC Ajax's defeat of Panathinaikos FC in the 1995/96 semi-finals and FC Internazionale Milano's win against FC Bayern München in the 2010/11 round of 16 – has a side progressed after a home first-leg loss. The biggest losing margin a side has overturned was achieved by RC Deportivo La Coruña in the 2003/04 quarter-finals when they lost 4-1 at AC Milan but won 4-0 at home.
- Twenty-one ties have been decided on away goals, including six where the triumphant team lost the first leg.
- In all, 19 ties have required extra time. Eight have been decided by extra time alone: four quarter-finals, three round of 16 encounters and the 2007/08 semi-final between Chelsea FC and Liverpool FC.
- Eleven ties have gone to penalties, including five finals – 1996, 2001, 2003, 2005 and 2008. The first two-legged tie decided on spot kicks was PSV Eindhoven's 4-2 win against Lyon on 13 April 2005 after a 2-2 aggregate draw.
- There has never been a knockout tie ending goalless after two legs. Ten have finished 1-0 on aggregate, most recently Tottenham Hotspur FC's narrow victory against AC Milan in the 2010/11 round of 16.
- FC Bayern München hold the record for the biggest first-leg lead with a 5-0 success at Sporting Clube de Portugal in the 2008/09 first knockout round, eventually going through 12-1 after a 7-1 home victory in the second leg. Those two games also featured more goals (13) over its two legs than any UEFA Champions League knockout tie.
- FC Bayern München's 7-0 second-leg defeat of FC Basel 1893 in the 2011/12 round of 16 is the largest margin of victory in a UEFA Champions League knockout match.
- The biggest winning margin in a semi-final game is three goals. AFC Ajax defeated FC Bayern München 5-2 in 1994/95 second leg, while there were 4-1 victories for Juventus (1996/97 and 1997/98) and Valencia CF (1999/2000). Six teams have won 3-0, most recently Bayern's defeat of Olympique Lyonnais in 2009/10.
- That 4-1 win for Juventus against AS Monaco FC in 1997/98 was part of the biggest aggregate semi-final score. The principality club won 3-2 in their home return to make it ten goals in the tie.
- Bayern's 4-0 defeat of Lyon in 2009/10 is the joint biggest aggregate win in a UEFA Champions League semi-final, equalling Juventus' 6-2 victory against Ajax in 1996/97.
- Madrid's 6-0 second-leg win against FC Zürich in 1963/64 is the biggest European Champion Clubs' Cup semi-final victory. Eintracht Frankfurt's 12-4 success against Rangers FC in 1959/60 is the biggest aggregate total.
- Clarence Seedorf is the only player to win the European Cup with three clubs (AFC Ajax 1995, Real Madrid CF 1998, AC Milan 2003, 2007). Liverpool's Bob Paisley (1977, 1978, 1981) is the only coach to win three times.
- Ottmar Hitzfeld (Borussia Dortmund 1997, Bayern 2001), Ernst Happel (Feyenoord 1970, Hamburger SV 1983) and José Mourinho (FC Porto 2004, FC Internazionale Milano 2010) are the only coaches to win the trophy with two clubs.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Champion Clubs' Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United (2008, 2009) have all returned to the final as holders only to lose.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United FC lost the 2011 final in London. Five teams won Champion Clubs' Cup finals on home soil: Real Madrid CF (1957), FC Internazionale Milano (1965), Manchester United FC (1968), AFC Ajax (1972) and Liverpool FC (1978), while Stade de Reims Champagne (1956), AS Roma (1984) and FC Barcelona (1986) all lost finals in their own country.

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in FC Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012. Eight players, including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently FC Bayern München's Mario Gomez on matchday eight this season.
