## Match background

---

FC Bayern München will hope for a happier outcome as they return to the scene of their 2010 UEFA Champions League final defeat but a Real Madrid CF side in scintillating home form will have other ideas.

- José Mourinho engineered Bayern's downfall with FC Internazionale Milano in that 2010 final and is now aiming to deny them a place in this season's showpiece at the Bavarian club's home stadium on 19 May.
- Bayern coach Jupp Heynckes won the UEFA Champions League with Madrid in 1998 but the Santiago Bernabéu has yielded a 100% winning record for the hosts in Europe this term.
- The German club do have the edge thanks to Mario Gomez's 90th-minute winner in the first leg after Mesut Özil (53) had cancelled out Franck Ribéry's 17th-minute goal.
- Between them the clubs have 13 European Cups. Bayern, four-time winners, are seeking a first title since 2001 and Madrid a record tenth overall but their first since 2002.

### Previous meetings

- Bayern hold the upper hand with 11 wins to Madrid's six from the clubs' 19 matches. Madrid's home record is W6 D1 L2.
- The sides have met in four European Cup semi-finals with Bayern prevailing three times (1976, 1987, 2001) to Madrid's one (2000). Iker Casillas is the only survivor of the two most recent semi-finals.
- Both teams have won four of their eight previous two-legged encounters. The most recent came in the 2006/07 round of 16 when Bayern prevailed on away goals, losing 3-2 away before a 2-1 win in Munich.
- Casillas and Gonzalo Higuaín appeared for Madrid in that last meeting at the Santiago Bernabéu, while Daniel Van Buyten, Philipp Lahm and Bastian Schweinsteiger were in the Bayern lineup.

### Match background

- Madrid have won ten of their last 11 home games in the competition, scoring 22 goals in five outings this season. They also have an impressive record against German visitors: W17 D3 L2.
- Bayern's victory at Villarreal CF in September was their first in Spain since 2001. Their record away to Liga opposition is W5 D4 L9.
- Bayern have a 7-6 win-loss record in two-legged contests with Spanish clubs in UEFA competition. Madrid's record against German sides is 10-7.
- For Madrid, this is a record 23rd European Cup semi-final appearance and they are seeking to reach their 13th final. Their semi-final record is W12 L10:

  - Madrid have won three European finals against German sides. They lifted the 1959/60 European Champion Clubs' Cup after beating Eintracht Frankfurt 7-3, overcame 1. FC Köln in the 1985/86 UEFA Cup, and defeated a Bayer 04 Leverkusen side including Jörg Butt in the 2001/02 UEFA Champions League.
  - Bayern beat Club Atlético de Madrid in the 1973/74 European Cup final and Valencia CF on penalties in 2000/01.
  - Of the 35 UEFA competition ties in which Madrid have lost the away leg first they have triumphed on aggregate on 22 occasions. When they have lost away 2-1 first they have won five ties and lost two, most recently against AS Roma in the 2007/08 round of 16 (1-2 home).
  - Bayern have recorded home first-leg victories 46 times in UEFA competition and have triumphed in all but eight ties, including the last six – three en route to the 2010 final. Overall when winning 2-1 at home first they have recorded four aggregate wins and three defeats.

- Team ties**
- Heynckes won the UEFA Champions League in his solitary season at the Madrid helm in 1997/98, when they finished fourth in the Liga. He also coached Athletic Club (1992-94 and 2000-03) and CD Tenerife (1996/97).
  - Heynckes has never beaten Spanish opposition in two-legged European ties as a coach. His four defeats include an incredible 1985/86 UEFA Cup tie with VfL Borussia Mönchengladbach where his side beat Madrid 5-1 at home but lost the second leg 4-0.
  - Heynckes scored in a 1-1 draw at the Bernabéu in the 1975/76 European Cup quarter-final second leg but his Mönchengladbach team lost on away goals.
  - Besides his 2010 final triumph with Inter, Mourinho also got the better of Bayern as Chelsea FC manager in the 2004/05 quarter-finals, though he was suspended for both legs. Chelsea won 4-2 in London and lost 3-2 in Munich.
  - Casillas, Sergio Ramos and Xabi Alonso helped Spain to a 1-0 UEFA EURO 2008 final win against a Germany side including Lahm, Schweinsteiger and Mario Gomez.
  - Manuel Neuer, Jérôme Boateng, Toni Kroos, Sami Khedira and Özil featured along with those six players when Spain earned an identical success in the countries' 2010 FIFA World Cup semi-finals.
  - Kaká was a goalscorer when his Milan side eliminated Bayern in both the 2005/06 and 2006/07 seasons.
  - Arjen Robben scored 11 goals in 50 Liga appearances for Madrid between 2007 and 2009.
  - Hamit Altıntop left Bayern for Madrid in 2011 after four seasons in Munich, 63 Bundesliga appearances and seven goals.
  - Özil won just once in eight games against Bayern with FC Schalke 04 and SV Werder Bremen, scoring twice.
  - Khedira's record against Bayern with VfB Stuttgart was W3 D1 L4.

- José Mourinho's side have scored 33 goals, the joint highest total in the competition along with FC Barcelona. They have had 90 shots on goal and been caught offside 46 times, both more than any other semi-finalist.
- Karim Benzema and Kaká have provided five assists so far, the joint highest total in the competition along with Bayern's Franck Ribéry and Nicolás Gaitán of SL Benfica.
- Gonzalo Higuaín, Xabi Alonso, Sergio Ramos and Fábio Coentrão will incur a ban with their next bookings.

- Sami Khedira's first away goal for the club set Madrid, unchanged from the side that lost at Bayern, on course for a win that leaves them seven points clear of their opponents at the Liga summit with four games to go.
- Madrid had taken just one point from seven previous Liga matches against Josep Guardiola's Barcelona.
- Madrid increased their tally of Liga goals this term to 109, moving two clear of the club record set in 1989/90.
- Cristiano Ronaldo has scored 60 times in 57 games for club and country this term, including a previously unsurpassed 42 goals in the Liga.
- Madrid have registered in all but one of their last 46 games – a 0-0 draw against Valencia CF on 8 April.
- On 24 March, Ronaldo became the quickest player to reach a century of Liga goals for Madrid, his 92 games breaking Ferenc Puskás' 105-match mark.
- Ronaldo has converted 24 successive spot kicks for the club since failing against UD Almería on 5 December 2009.
- The Merengues were 20 matches unbeaten, winning 15, before the first leg in Munich.
- Madrid scored 67 goals in the first half of their Liga campaign, eclipsing the record set by Barcelona (61) last term. Ronaldo contributed 23, taking him past César Rodríguez's Liga record of 22 for Barcelona in 1950/51.
- Mourinho's side claimed a club record 11 successive away wins before drawing 2-2 with Barcelona on 25 January.

- Ribéry's late goal kept Bayern in contention for the Bundesliga title for three more hours before Borussia Dortmund's 2-0 win against VfL Borussia Mönchengladbach gave Die Schwarzgelben an unassailable eight-point lead at the summit with two games to go.
- Jupp Heynckes's side have won just eight of their last 20 away games in all competitions in regulation time. By contrast they have won 12 of their last 13 home matches, drawing the other.
- Heynckes made eight changes to the side that started the first leg against Madrid, with only Manuel Neuer, Luiz Gustavo and Bastian Schweinsteiger retaining their places. Takashi Usami made his first start for the club.
- Ribéry's goal in Bremen took him to 12 in the Bundesliga this term, passing his previous best of 11 set in 2007/08.
- Bayern have now gone two seasons without winning the Bundesliga, their longest drought since Dortmund's last back-to-back titles in 1994/95 and 1995/96; back then, FCB gained consolation with the 1996 UEFA Cup.
- Gomez has struck 41 goals in his last 47 appearances for club and country.
- Alaba became the youngest player to reach 50 Bundesliga appearances for the club against 1. FSV Mainz 05 on 14 April. At 19 years, 295 days, he beat the mark of Hans-Georg Schwarzenbeck (20 years, 17 days).
- Heynckes's charges will meet Dortmund in the German Cup final in Berlin on 12 May.
- Bayern's 2-0 win against VfL Wolfsburg on 28 January was Heynckes's 456th Bundesliga victory as coach and player, surpassing Otto Rehhagel's German top-flight record.

### Real Madrid CF: José Mourinho

**Date of birth:** 26 January 1963

**Nationality:** Portuguese

**Coaching career:** SL Benfica, UD Leiria, FC Porto, Chelsea FC, FC Internazionale Milano, Real Madrid CF

- A former teacher, Mourinho had spells working at Sporting Clube de Portugal, Porto and FC Barcelona as a coaching assistant in the 1990s.
- As coach, had a brief, nine-game stay at Benfica and a highly successful tenure at Leiria before really making his mark after his arrival at Porto in January 2002. In his first full season, 2002/03, Porto won the UEFA Cup and a domestic double. The next year they retained their league title and claimed the UEFA Champions League with a 3-0 defeat of AS Monaco FC in Gelsenkirchen.
- Joined Chelsea in 2004 and led the club to the League Cup and their first league championship for 50 years in his first season. Followed up with the league title again in 2006, and both the League Cup and FA Cup in 2007.
- Left Chelsea in September 2007 and stayed out of football until joining Inter in June 2008. In his first campaign the Nerazzurri retained their Serie A crown, a feat they repeated in 2009/10 when they also added the Coppa Italia and the UEFA Champions League crown, their first European Cup win since 1965.
- Victory at the Santiago Bernabéu was Mourinho's last act as Inter coach before joining Madrid on a four-year deal. His first season featured the club's first Copa del Rey victory in 18 years and a UEFA Champions League semi-final appearance.

### FC Bayern München: Jupp Heynckes

**Date of birth:** 9 May 1945

**Nationality:** German

**Playing career:** VfL Borussia Mönchengladbach (twice), Hannover 96

**Coaching career:** VfL Borussia Mönchengladbach (twice), FC Bayern München (three times), Athletic Club (twice), Eintracht Frankfurt, CD Tenerife, Real Madrid CF, SL Benfica, FC Schalke 04, Bayer 04 Leverkusen

- One of the best strikers in Bundesliga history, Heynckes hit 220 goals in 369 games for Mönchengladbach and Hannover from 1964 to 1978; won four titles and a German Cup with Mönchengladbach and was the league's top scorer in 1974 (30 goals) and 1975 (27).
- Aged 34, replaced Udo Lattek as Mönchengladbach coach in 1979; mentored the young Lothar Matthäus but failed to win any trophies, losing to FC Bayern München in the 1983/84 German Cup final and reaching the UEFA Cup semi-finals three seasons later.
- Replaced Lattek again in 1987, this time at Bayern, winning 1989 and 1990 titles; club general manager Uli Hoeness called his decision to sack Heynckes in October 1991 "the biggest mistake of my career".
- Moved to Spain, earning Athletic Club a place in the 1994/95 UEFA Cup. His Tenerife side then reached 1996/97 UEFA Cup semi-finals, earning Heynckes a season as Madrid coach; led Los Merengues to UEFA Champions League glory in 1997/98 but left that summer.
- Following a lean spell, stepped in as caretaker manager at Bayern in April 2009 following Jürgen Klinsmann's dismissal; replaced Bruno Labbadia as Leverkusen coach the same summer, beginning with German record run of 24 unbeaten Bundesliga games. His side finished second to Borussia Dortmund in 2010/11, Heynckes leaving to take charge of Bayern for a third time at the end of the campaign.

- Viktor Kassai works as a travel agent in his native Hungary and his progress to UEFA's list of Elite referees has ensured plenty of opportunities to broaden his horizons still further.
- Born on 10 September 1975, Kassai has taken charge of more than 100 matches in the Hungarian top flight, getting his first taste of international action in the 2001 UEFA Regions' Cup.
- Kassai, whose principle interests are sports and film, officiated two UEFA Cup matches in 2003/04 and the following season brought his first UEFA Champions League engagement, the second qualifying round first leg between HNK Hajduk Split and Shelbourne FC. Went on to officiate FIFA World Cup and UEFA European Under-21 Championship games the same season.
- In July 2005 Kassai refereed three games at the European U19 Championship in Northern Ireland and has remained a regular in international fixtures ever since, also working at the 2007 FIFA U-20 World Cup in Canada.
- Worked as a fourth official at UEFA EURO 2008, where he was given three matches, and was a referee at the football tournament at the Olympic Games in Beijing later that summer, taking charge of the final as Argentina defeated Nigeria. Oversaw four games at the 2010 World Cup, including the Germany-Spain semi-final, and seven matches in the UEFA Champions League the following season, concluding with the Wembley final between FC Barcelona and Manchester United FC.

### UEFA Champions League knockout stage: Did you know?

- Teams have recovered from a first-leg deficit to go through on 28 occasions, including SL Benfica, APOEL FC, FC Bayern München and Chelsea FC in this season's round of 16. Only twice – AFC Ajax's defeat of Panathinaikos FC in the 1995/96 semi-finals and FC Internazionale Milano's win against FC Bayern München in the 2010/11 round of 16 – has a side progressed after a home first-leg loss. The biggest losing margin a side has overturned was achieved by RC Deportivo La Coruña in the 2003/04 quarter-finals when they lost 4-1 at AC Milan but won 4-0 at home.
- Twenty-one ties have been decided on away goals, including six where the triumphant team lost the first leg.
- In all, 19 ties have required extra time. Eight have been decided by extra time alone: four quarter-finals, three round of 16 encounters and the 2007/08 semi-final between Chelsea FC and Liverpool FC.
- Eleven ties have gone to penalties, including five finals – 1996, 2001, 2003, 2005 and 2008. The first two-legged tie decided on spot kicks was PSV Eindhoven's 4-2 win against Lyon on 13 April 2005 after a 2-2 aggregate draw.
- There has never been a knockout tie ending goalless after two legs. Ten have finished 1-0 on aggregate, most recently Tottenham Hotspur FC's narrow victory against AC Milan in the 2010/11 round of 16.
- FC Bayern München hold the record for the biggest first-leg lead with a 5-0 success at Sporting Clube de Portugal in the 2008/09 round of 16, eventually going through 12-1 after a 7-1 home victory in the second leg. Those two games also featured more goals (13) over its two legs than any UEFA Champions League knockout tie.
- FC Bayern München's 7-0 second-leg defeat of FC Basel 1893 in the 2011/12 round of 16 is the largest margin of victory in a UEFA Champions League knockout match.
- The biggest winning margin in a semi-final game is three goals. AFC Ajax defeated FC Bayern München 5-2 in 1994/95 second leg, while there were 4-1 victories for Juventus (1996/97 and 1997/98) and Valencia CF (1999/2000). Six teams have won 3-0, most recently Bayern's defeat of Olympique Lyonnais in 2009/10.
- That 4-1 win for Juventus against AS Monaco FC in 1997/98 was part of the biggest aggregate semi-final score. The principality club won 3-2 in their home return to make it ten goals in the tie.
- Bayern's 4-0 defeat of Lyon in 2009/10 is the joint biggest aggregate win in a UEFA Champions League semi-final, equalling Juventus' 6-2 victory against Ajax in 1996/97.
- Madrid's 6-0 second-leg win against FC Zürich in 1963/64 is the biggest European Cup semi-final victory. Eintracht Frankfurt's 12-4 success against Rangers FC in 1959/60 is the biggest aggregate total.
- Clarence Seedorf is the only player to win the European Cup with three clubs (AFC Ajax 1995, Real Madrid CF 1998, AC Milan 2003, 2007). Liverpool's Bob Paisley (1977, 1978, 1981) is the only coach to win three times.
- Ottmar Hitzfeld (Borussia Dortmund 1997, Bayern 2001), Ernst Happel (Feyenoord 1970, Hamburger SV 1983) and José Mourinho (FC Porto 2004, FC Internazionale Milano 2010) are the only coaches to win the trophy with two clubs.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Champion Clubs' Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United (2008, 2009) have all returned to the final as holders only to lose.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United FC lost the 2011 final in London. Five teams won Champion Clubs' Cup finals on home soil: Real Madrid CF (1957), FC Internazionale Milano (1965), Manchester United FC (1968), AFC Ajax (1972) and Liverpool FC (1978), while Stade de Reims Champagne (1956), AS Roma (1984) and FC Barcelona (1986) all lost finals in their own country.

### UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in FC Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012. Eight players, including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently FC Bayern München's Mario Gomez on matchday eight this season.
- S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having been aged 43 years 252 days when he featured against Real Madrid CF on matchday six of the 2007/08 edition.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared. He was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
