Match background

CFR 1907 Cluj make their first visit to Manchester United FC with hopes still alive of reaching the UEFA Champions League's last 16 for the first time.

- CFR's 3-1 home victory against SC Braga last time out kept them level on seven points with Galatasaray AŞ although, with an inferior head-to-head record, they must achieve a better result at Old Trafford than the Turkish team manage in Braga if they are to leapfrog them into second place.

- Whatever the outcome CFR are guaranteed at least third place and UEFA Europa League qualification – meaning that for the first time they will be competing in Europe after Christmas.

Match background

- Group H winners United have won both home fixtures to date but CFR are unbeaten on their UEFA Champions League travels this term. They earned victories at FC Slovan Liberec and FC Basel 1893 in qualifying and then won 2-0 at Braga and drew 1-1 at Galatasaray.

- United have won all five previous encounters with Romanian opposition including their 2-1 comeback success in Cluj-Napoca on 2 October against a CFR side then under the tutelage of Ioan Andone.

- United posted 2-0 victories both home and away against FC Oţelul Galaţi in last season's group stage. Wayne Rooney scored two penalties in the away fixture – where Nemanja Vidić was sent off – while Antonio Valencia struck at Old Trafford with Cristian Sârgă adding an own goal.

- In a 2004/05 third qualifying round tie, United overcame an FC Dinamo Bucureşti side led by CFR's former coach Andone. Ryan Giggs scored and Darren Fletcher and Paul Scholes also played in United's 2-1 first-leg win in Bucharest while Fletcher also featured in United's 3-0 second-leg success.

- Cadú is the only survivor of CFR's one previous trip to England, a 2-1 defeat at Chelsea FC in the 2008/09 group stage on 9 December 2008. CFR had held the London club 0-0 at home.

Team ties

- Sir Alex oversaw Aberdeen FC's 5-2 aggregate win against the club now called FC Argeş Piteşti in the 1981/82 UEFA Cup second round.

- Paulo Sérgio was in charge of the Heart of Midlothian FC team that earned a 0-0 draw at Tottenham Hotspur FC in the 2011/12 UEFA Europa League play-offs. However, his Hearts side had already lost their home leg 5-0.

- In May 2006 Nani made his Portugal Under-21 debut against France in the same team as Diogo Valente. Nani was in Sporting Clube de Portugal's youth ranks when Mário Felgueiras was the club's third-choice goalkeeper.

- Scorer of both United goals at CFR, Robin van Persie found the net again in the Netherlands' 4-1 FIFA World Cup qualifying win in Romania later in October. He had hit the second goal in a 2-0 Dutch victory that ended Romania's hopes of progress at UEFA EURO 2008.

- Chris Smalling scored an 83rd-minute winner in England's 2-1 victory against Romania in a UEFA European Under-21 Championship play-off in Norwich in October 2010. Ioan Hora, who is at CFR but not in the UEFA Champions League squad, scored Romania's goal against an England team also including Tom Cleverley, Phil Jones and Danny Welbeck.

- Patrice Evra faced Gabriel Mureşan in France's 2-2 World Cup qualifying draw with Romania in Constanta in October 2008, and lined up against Vasile Maftei in the 1-1 return draw in Paris.

- In the same South Africa 2010 qualifying group, Vidić was in the Serbia team that dismantled Maftei's Romania 5-0 in Belgrade to secure their finals berth. He also played in Serbia's 3-2 victory in Constanta.

- Giggs was in the Wales team denied a 1994 World Cup finals place by a 2-1 home defeat by Romania in Cardiff in November 1993. He was on the receiving end of a 5-1 loss in Bucharest in the same campaign.

- Scholes was a member of the England side eliminated from UEFA EURO 2000 after a 3-2 reverse against Romania in their final group game. He also lost 2-1 to Romania with England at the 1998 World Cup.

UEFA Champions League statistics

- Matchday five ended a run of 20 successive European games in which Sir Alex Ferguson's side had scored, since a goalless draw at Olympique de Marseille in the 2010/11 round of 16.
- United's 3-2 victory against SC Braga on matchday three was only the second time they had come from two behind to win a UEFA Champions League game. The first was a 3-2 triumph over Juventus in the 1998/99 semi-finals.
- This is United's 17th successive UEFA Champions League group stage campaign.
- Ryan Giggs has scored in a record 16 UEFA Champions League seasons. He is also the competition's oldest scorer, at 37 years and 289 days.

Miscellaneous

- United twice came from behind to win 4-3 at Reading FC on Saturday, with all seven goals coming in the opening 34 minutes. Anderson scored the visitors' first, his first league goal in 14 months.
- United have trailed in 14 of their 22 matches this season, but lost only five.
- Darren Fletcher's first league goal in 13 months helped United to a 3-1 home win against Queens Park Rangers FC on 24 November.
- Four days later, Robin van Persie scored the fastest Premier League goal this season, after 33 seconds, as West Ham United FC were beaten 1-0 at Old Trafford.
- United have failed to convert four of their seven penalties this season, from Nani, Van Persie, Javier Hernández and Wayne Rooney.
- Shinji Kagawa has not featured since sustaining a knee injury on matchday three. Nemanja Vidić (also knee) has been unavailable since matchday one.

CFR

UEFA Champions League statistics

- CFR's 2-0 victory against SC Braga on matchday one was only the third time a Romanian side had won away from home in the UEFA Champions League group stage, following FC Steaua București (4-1 at FC Dynamo Kyiv in 2006) and CFR (2-1 at AS Roma in 2008).
- CFR have committed 89 fouls, more than any other side.
- Mário Felgueiras, Ivo Pinto, Cadú and Camora have played every minute of CFR's group stage campaign.
- Rafael Bastos' next booking will incur a suspension.

Miscellaneous

- Diogo Valente struck his first league goal for the club as CFR drew 1-1 at CS Gaz Metan Mediaș on Saturday to give them 29 points from 18 games, ten fewer than at the same stage last term.
- Rui Pedro's seventh goal in six games inspired CFR to a 2-1 defeat of FC Universitatea Cluj on 24 November. He did not find the net at the weekend, however.
- An extra-time goal from Gabriel Mureșan sent hosts CFR into the last four of the Romanian Cup on 28 November at the expense of holders FC Dinamo București, who had two players sent off in the 2-1 defeat.
- Ioan Andone parted company with the club after matchday three and Paulo Sérgio was unveiled as his successor on 30 October in a deal that runs until the end of the season.
- CFR claimed their biggest win this term in Paulo Sérgio's first game on 3 November, beating FC Brașov 5-0.
- CFR suffered three successive defeats in all competitions in October, their worst sequence since losing four in a row between November 2004 and April 2005.
- Ciprian Deac (knee ligaments), Adam Vass (broken foot), Bakary Sare (broken leg) and Ronny (ligaments) were left out of CFR's UEFA Champions League squad after picking up injuries in the opening month of the season. Deac (3 November) and Vass (16 November) have returned to action.

Head coach

Manchester United FC: Sir Alex Ferguson

Date of birth: 31 December 1941

Nationality: Scottish

Playing career: Queen's Park FC, Saint Johnstone FC, Dunfermline Athletic FC, Rangers FC, Falkirk FC (player-coach), Ayr United FC

Coaching career: East Stirlingshire FC, Saint Mirren FC, Aberdeen FC, Manchester United FC

- Shot to prominence at Aberdeen, breaking the big Glasgow clubs' 14-year stranglehold on the Scottish title in 1980.
- Claimed a first continental title three years later when the Dons beat Real Madrid CF to lift the European Cup Winners' Cup – earning him the freedom of the City of Aberdeen.
- Replaced Ron Atkinson at Old Trafford in November 1986, and ended United's 26-year wait for a league title in 1993. Has since added 11 more championships – including the Red Devils' record 19th English crown in 2010/11 – to a domestic collection which includes five FA Cups and four League Cups.
- Guided United to European Cup Winners' Cup glory with victory against FC Barcelona in 1991, though his greatest achievements are the UEFA Champions League triumphs of 1999 and 2008. Also reached UEFA Champions League finals in 2009 and 2011, losing to Barça on each occasion.
- Knighted in June 1999, Sir Alex is head of the UEFA Coaches Panel.

CFR 1907 Cluj: Paulo Sérgio

Playing career: Sporting Club de Portugal, CD Olivais e Moscavide, UD Vilafranquense, CF Os Belenenses, FC Paços de Ferreira, SC Sagueiros, Vitória FC, CD Feirense, CD Santa Clara, Grenoble Foot 38, GD Estoril Praia, SC Olhanense

Coaching career: SC Olhanense, CD Santa Clara (twice), SC Beira-Mar, FC Paços de Ferreira, Vitória SC, Sporting Clube de Portugal, Heart of Midlothian FC, CFR 1907 Cluj

- A product of the SC Sanjoanense youth system, Paulo Sérgio passed through Sporting's ranks, going on to play up front for a number of smaller clubs as well as Liga sides Os Belenenses, Paços de Ferreira and Vitória Setúbal.
- Hung up his boots at Olhanense in 2003, moving straight to the bench and leading the club to promotion to the second division in his first season in charge.
- Left in 2006, and twice coached Azores-based Santa Clara either side of a spell as coach of Beira-Mar; stepped up to Liga with Paços de Ferreira in 2008/09, unexpectedly leading the team to the Portuguese Cup final, which they lost 1-0 to FC Porto.
- Moved to Guimarães in October 2009, leading the club to sixth place in his only season. Replaced Carlos Carvalhal as Sporting coach in summer 2010 but his side struggled for consistency in the league and he left in February 2011 following elimination from the UEFA Europa League round of 32.
- Took over at Hearts that June and, in what proved his only season in charge, guided the Edinburgh club to the Scottish Cup. Succeeded loan Andone at CFR in October 2012.

- An Italian match official from near Vicenza, Daniele Orsato has enjoyed a swift rise up the refereeing ladder since his first taste of the UEFA Champions League in 2007/08.
- That assignment, at the Rangers FC-VfB Stuttgart group game, was as a fourth official, a role with which Orsato would become familiar over the next few seasons. He had already gained plenty of refereeing experience in his native Italy, where he started worked in the third tier in 2002, stepping up to Serie B four years later.
- Orsato featured in the 2009/10 UEFA Champions League group stage as fourth official three times, and got his first taste of UEFA Europa League qualifying as a referee the following year. Was awarded his FIFA badge in 2010, the same year he was appointed to work in Serie A matches.
- Began working as an additional assistant referee in the 2010/11 UEFA Champions League and UEFA Europa League, and oversaw two group matches in the latter competition the following season.
- In the middle for two UEFA EURO 2012 qualifiers, Orsato was promoted to UEFA's Elite Development category in January 2012. The 2011/12 season ended with an unusual honour, as he took charge of FC Dinamo Bucureşti's win against FC Rapid Bucureşti in the Romanian Cup final.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- Holders Chelsea FC are hoping to avoid becoming the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, FC Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round by PFC CSKA Moskva.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United FC (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid CF on matchday six in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens FC in 2006/07.
- Ryan Giggs is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 289 days, in Manchester United's 1-1 draw at SL Benfica on 14 September 2011.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored in the UEFA Champions League, aged 17 years and 195 days. He found the net in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 defeat at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.
- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012. Eight players, including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently FC Bayern München's Mario Gomez on matchday eight last season.
- Before this season Barcelona had finished as group winners on 13 occasions, one more than Manchester United and Real Madrid.
- Barcelona hold the record for successive wins in the UEFA Champions League proper with nine, between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003. RSC Anderlecht's 12 straight defeats (10 December 2003 to 23 November 2005) is also a competition record.
- Five teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain FC (1994/95), FC Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage) and Real Madrid (2011/12).
- Fifteen teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, including Villarreal CF, FC Oţelul Galaţi and GNK Dinamo Zagreb in 2011/12.
- Barcelona scored 20 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, equalling Manchester United's competition record from 1998/99. Barcelona scored 19 times in the 1999/2000 first group stage, a tally matched by Real Madrid last season.
- Only RC Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05) and Maccabi Haifa FC (2009/10) have failed to score in a group stage.
- Dinamo Zagreb conceded 22 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, a new record. The previous highest total was 19, shared by MŠK Žilina (2010/11), Debreceni VSC (2009/10), FC Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08) and Ferencvárosi TC (1995/96).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool FC (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06) and Manchester United (2010/11) all let in just one.
- Before their 3-1 win against Sporting Clube de Portugal on matchday six of the 2006/07 campaign, Spartak Moskva went 22 games without a victory in the competition.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is seven points. The first to do it since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96 were Legia Warszawa that same season before Dynamo Kyiv managed it in 1999/2000 and Liverpool in 2001/02. FC Lokomotiv Moskva and eventual finalists Juventus both progressed with seven points in 2002/03, as did Rangers FC and SV Werder Bremen in 2005/06.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.
