Match background

Valencia CF have beaten FC Bayern München only once in eight meetings but will be hoping for a more favourable result as Group F reaches its climactic stages.

- Losing finalists on their own ground last season, Bayern opened the 2012/13 competition with a 2-1 home win against Valencia, Bastian Schweinsteiger and Toni Kroos on target before Nelson Valdez pulled one back in added time. Valencia's Adil Rami then received a second yellow card, but Mario Mandžukić missed the subsequent penalty.
- Valencia put their first points on the board with a 2-0 home victory over LOSC Lille before a Roberto Soldado hat-trick gave them a 3-0 success at FC BATE Borisov. In the home return the Spanish side were 4-2 winners, joining Bayern on nine points.
- Bayern suffered a surprise 3-1 loss to BATE in Minsk but then won away (1-0) and home (6-1) against LOSC to get back on track.

Previous meetings

- The 19 September contest was the first between the teams since the 2001 UEFA Champions League final in Milan, which was dominated by penalties. Captains Gaizka Mendieta and Stefan Effenberg swapped spot kicks in normal time, Bayern's Mehmet Scholl having also missed from the spot. Oliver Kahn denied Mauricio Pellegrino – now Valencia coach – in the shoot-out to secure a 5-4 Bayern triumph and a fourth European title.

- The lineups on 23 May 2001 were:

- Three of the sides' other seven matches also ended 1-1, including both encounters in the 1999/2000 first group stage. The 1996/97 UEFA Cup first round tie was decided by Valencia's 3-0 home victory, with Bayern winning 1-0 in Germany.
- Valencia's European record against German clubs is W5 D10 L11. At home the statistics are W4 D7 L1 but they have prevailed in just one of five UEFA Champions League fixtures against German visitors, 3-1 against Bayer 04 Leverkusen in last season's group stage. That ended a seven-game winless home run against German opposition in all competitions going back to that 1996 defeat of Bayern.
- Bayern beat Club Atlético de Madrid in the 1973/74 European Champion Clubs' Cup final.
- Bayern's European record away to Liga teams is W5 D4 L10. Last season they won 2-0 at Villarreal CF in the group stage, their first victory in Spain since 2001, with Kroos and Rafinha on the scoresheet. In the semi-final they ousted Real Madrid CF on penalties after both legs finished 2-1 to the home side, Arjen Robben netting a 27th-minute penalty in Madrid.

Team ties

- A UEFA Champions League winner with Real Madrid in 1997/98, Jupp Heynckes has also coached Athletic Club twice and CD Tenerife. The Bayern coach came up against Valencia on 14 occasions over seven seasons in the Liga with a record of W5 D2 L7.
- Javi Martínez played against Valencia 12 times during his career at Athletic, registering four victories and two draws. He scored in Athletic's 3-2 success on 18 January 2009.
- Soldado and Tino Costa both scored past current Bayern keeper Manuel Neuer for Valencia against FC Schalke 04 in the 2010/11 UEFA Champions League round of 16. Neuer had the last laugh as Schalke advanced 4-2 on aggregate.
- Robben was at Real Madrid between 2007 and 2009 with Fernando Gago among his team-mates.
- Claudio Pizarro missed a penalty for Peru in the second minute of their 1-1 draw with an Argentina side containing Gago in a 2014 FIFA World Cup qualifier on 12 September.
- Martínez and Soldado are both Spanish internationals while Jérémy Mathieu, Rami, Franck Ribéry and Aly Cissokho all play for France. Luis Gustavo, Rafinha, Diego Alves and Jonas have each been capped by Brazil.
- Ribéry lasted the full 90 minutes as France drew 1-1 in Spain in a World Cup qualifier on 16 October. Martínez, Soldado and Rami were unused substitutes.

Valencia

UEFA Champions League statistics

- Valencia are eight games unbeaten at Mestalla in the UEFA Champions League, since a 1-0 defeat by Manchester United FC on 29 September 2010. They have won six, including the last four home matches.
- Roberto Soldado's treble on matchday three made him only the 13th player to score more than one UEFA Champions League hat-trick, and the first Spaniard.
- Soldado will incur a suspension with his next booking.
- Valencia have scored ten goals, the joint highest total in the group stage alongside Chelsea FC, Paris Saint-Germain FC, Real Madrid CF and Bayern.

International duty

- Six Valencia players were on senior duty during the international break: Diego Alves (Brazil), Soldado (Spain), Tino Costa (Argentina), Ricardo Costa (Portugal), Sofiane Feghouli (Algeria) and Adil Rami (France).
- Feghouli last month helped Algeria book a place in the 2013 Africa Cup of Nations.

Miscellaneous

- Soldado struck an 89th-minute penalty on Saturday as Valencia beat RCD Espanyol 2-1 to extend their winning run at home to seven matches in all competitions. The visitors had two players sent off late on.
- Aly Cissokho scored his second goal in eight Liga appearances at Real Valladolid CF on 11 November but was later sent off in a 1-1 draw. His total this season is already double what he managed in 143 league outings for FC Gueugnon, Vitória FC, FC Porto and Olympique Lyonnais.
- Éver Banega was ruled out from 19 February to 20 October after breaking his leg having left the handbrake off his car at a petrol station.
- Pablo Piatti has not featured since fracturing his right arm in training on 7 September and suffered a further setback on 9 November with an adductor problem.
- Sergio Canales has not been included in Valencia's UEFA Champions League squad as he recovers from an anterior cruciate ligament problem sustained last season.

Bayern

UEFA Champions League statistics

- Claudio Pizarro's first goal on matchday four was Bayern's 500th in the European Cup. They have conceded 394 in UEFA competition.
- Pizarro's 16-minute hat-trick against LOSC Lille was the third fastest in UEFA Champions League history.
- Bayern are nine home games unbeaten in the UEFA Champions League, discounting last season's final, since a 3-2 loss to FC Internazionale Milano in the 2010/11 first knockout round – their only defeat in 17 home outings in the competition.
- Bayern have scored ten goals, the joint highest total in the group stage alongside Chelsea FC, Paris Saint-Germain FC, Real Madrid CF and Valencia.
- Bastian Schweinsteiger will incur a suspension with his next yellow card.

International duty

- Eleven Bayern players were on senior international duty on Wednesday: Philipp Lahm, Manuel Neuer, Thomas Müller (Germany), Arjen Robben (Netherlands), Franck Ribéry (France), Anatoliy Tymoshchuk (Ukraine), Javi Martínez (Spain), Daniel Van Buyten (Belgium), David Alaba (Austria), Xherdan Shaqiri (Switzerland) and Mario Mandžukić (Croatia).
- Schweinsteiger, Toni Kroos (both ill) and Jérôme Boateng (groin) pulled out of the Germany squad, while Holger Badstuber was sidelined with a groin problem.
- Shaqiri scored a 95th-minute winner as Switzerland claimed a 2-1 friendly victory against Tunisia.
- Robben came up against club-mates Müller, Lahm and Neuer as the Netherlands drew 0-0 with Germany.

Miscellaneous

- Bayern's seven-match winning run away from home in the Bundesliga ended on Saturday as their former midfielder Markus Feulner earned a 1-1 draw for a 1. FC Nürnberg side that played the last 14 minutes with ten men.
- Rafinha, Van Buyten and Tymoshchuk made their first league starts of the season at Nürnberg as Lahm started on the Bayern substitutes' bench for the first time since 16 April 2008.
- Robben suffered a thigh injury against Germany and misses the trip to Valencia.
- Van Buyten made his first competitive appearance of the season on 10 November in a 2-0 home win against Eintracht Frankfurt, replacing Boateng after the full-back ruptured a groin muscle.
- Alaba converted a penalty against Eintracht, his first Bayern goal since 16 December 2011.
- Bayern will face FC Augsburg in the German Cup third round on 18 December.
- Mario Gomez marked his return to action with four goals in Bayern's 6-0 friendly victory against sixth division side FC Falke Markt Schwaben last Tuesday. The 27-year-old has not played since UEFA EURO 2012 having undergone surgery on his ankle on 7 August.
- Neuer is in the running for the FIFA Ballon d'Or award, the winner of which will be announced on 7 January in Zurich. Jupp Heynckes is nominated for the coaching prize.
- Bayern's eight straight Bundesliga victories at the start of the season was a new record, surpassing the mark of seven set by themselves (1995/96), 1. FC Kaiserslautern (2001/02) and 1. FSV Mainz 05 (2010/11). The run ended on 28 October with a 2-1 defeat by Bayer 04 Leverkusen, their first home loss in the fixture in 23 years.
- Bayern's 2-1 win against Valencia on matchday one was their sixth in as many games in 2012/13. The last time they began the season with six successive victories, in 2000/01, they claimed the UEFA Champions League.

- A tall, slender central defender, Pellegrino started at Vélez Sársfield where he lifted the Copa Libertadores in 1994 and captured four Argentinian league titles. Brought to Barcelona by Louis van Gaal, he made 23 appearances in the Blaugrana's 1998/99 Liga success before switching to Valencia, establishing a big reputation.
- With Rafael Benítez at the helm, Valencia won the Liga in 2002 and 2004. The disappointment of losing finals of the 2000 and 2001 UEFA Champions League was eased by UEFA Cup and UEFA Super Cup triumphs in 2004.
- In 2004/05 Pellegrino once again teamed up with Benítez, this time at Liverpool, before returning to Spain to see out his playing career at Alavés.
- After commencing his career as a coach in the youth teams at Valencia, Pellegrino accepted an offer to work alongside Benítez as an assistant with Liverpool and then Inter.
- Capped three times by Argentina, Pellegrino replaced Unai Emery at the Valencia helm in summer 2012.

FC Bayern München: Jupp Heynckes

Coaching career: VfL Borussia Mönchengladbach (twice), FC Bayern München (three times), Athletic Club (twice), Eintracht Frankfurt, CD Tenerife, Real Madrid CF, SL Benfica, FC Schalke 04, Bayer 04 Leverkusen

- One of the best strikers in Bundesliga history, Heynckes hit 220 goals in 369 games for Mönchengladbach and Hannover between 1964 and 1978; won four titles and a German Cup with Mönchengladbach and was the league's top scorer in 1974 (30 goals) and 1975 (27).
- Aged 34, replaced Udo Lattek as Mönchengladbach coach in 1979; mentored the young Lothar Matthäus but failed to win any trophies, losing to FC Bayern München in the 1983/84 German Cup final and reaching the UEFA Cup semi-finals three seasons later.
- Replaced Lattek again in 1987, this time at Bayern, winning 1989 and 1990 titles; club general manager Uli Hoeness called his decision to sack Heynckes in October 1991 "the biggest mistake of my career".
- Moved to Spain, earning Athletic a place in the 1994/95 UEFA Cup. His Tenerife side reached 1996/97 UEFA Cup semi-finals, earning Heynckes a season at Madrid, whom he led to glory in the 1997/98 UEFA Champions League but left that summer.
- Stepped in as caretaker manager at Bayern in April 2009 following Jürgen Klinsmann's dismissal; replaced Bruno Labbadia as Leverkusen coach that summer and began season with a German record run of 24 Bundesliga games unbeaten. His side finished second to Borussia Dortmund in 2010/11 before Heynckes left to take charge of Bayern for a third time, reaching the 2012 UEFA Champions League final at their Fußball Arena München but losing 4-3 to Chelsea FC on penalties.

- Howard Webb has come to the forefront of refereeing in recent years, both in his native England – where highlights include the 2006/07 League Cup final and the 2008/09 FA Cup final – but also abroad, particularly in 2009/10.
- His appointment on matchday two of the 2006/07 campaign was his first taste of the UEFA Champions League proper, reward for an impressive performance at the UEFA European Under-21 Championship in Portugal.
- A former police officer who enjoys keeping fit, Webb already has a long career behind him having been inspired to pick up the whistle by his father at the age of 18. Took charge of the 2005 FA Community Shield, and that November was in the middle for his first senior international between Northern Ireland and Portugal.
- Having overseen five qualifiers, Webb was referee for two games at UEFA EURO 2008 and in 2008/09 took charge of the UEFA Cup semi-final first leg between Werder Bremen and Hamburger SV.
- The following season he became the fifth Englishman to oversee the European Cup final when FC Internazionale Milano overcame FC Bayern München in Madrid. Even better was to come at the FIFA World Cup, however, where Webb refereed three matches before becoming the first Englishman since Jack Taylor in 1974 to be awarded the final as Spain beat the Netherlands 1-0. Followed that with three matches at UEFA EURO 2012.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- Holders Chelsea FC are hoping to avoid becoming the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, FC Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round by PFC CSKA Moskva.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), AFC Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United FC (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- S.S. Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid CF on matchday six in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens FC in 2006/07.
- Ryan Giggs is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 37 years and 289 days, in Manchester United's 1-1 draw at SL Benfica on 14 September 2011.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored in the UEFA Champions League, aged 17 years and 195 days. He found the net in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 defeat at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.
- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012. Eight players, including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently FC Bayern München's Mario Gomez on matchday eight last season.
- Before this season Barcelona had finished as group winners on 13 occasions, one more than Manchester United and Real Madrid.
- Barcelona hold the record for successive wins in the UEFA Champions League proper with nine, between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003. RSC Anderlecht's 12 straight defeats (10 December 2003 to 23 November 2005) is also a competition record.
- Five teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain FC (1994/95), FC Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage) and Real Madrid (2011/12).
- Fifteen teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, including Villarreal CF, FC Oţelul Galaţi and GNK Dinamo Zagreb in 2011/12.
- Barcelona scored 20 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, equalling Manchester United's competition record from 1998/99. Barcelona scored 19 times in the 1999/2000 first group stage, a tally matched by Real Madrid last season.
- Only RC Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05) and Maccabi Haifa FC (2009/10) have failed to score in a group stage.
- Dinamo Zagreb conceded 22 goals in the 2011/12 group stage, a new record. The previous highest total was 19, shared by MŠK Žilina (2010/11), Debreceni VSC (2009/10), FC Dynamo Kyiv (2007/08) and Ferencvárosi TC (1995/96).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool FC (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06) and Manchester United (2010/11) all let in just one.
- Before their 3-1 win against Sporting Clube de Portugal on matchday six of the 2006/07 campaign, Spartak Moskva went 22 games without a victory in the competition.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is seven points. The first to do it since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96 were Legia Warszawa that same season before Dynamo Kyiv managed it in 1999/2000 and Liverpool in 2001/02. FC Lokomotiv Moskva and eventual finalists Juventus both progressed with seven points in 2002/03, as did Rangers FC and SV Werder Bremen in 2005/06.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.
