Match background

Leicester City FC will hope for another famous night of UEFA Champions League football when they host Sevilla FC in the second leg of their round of 16 tie.

- The English champions revived their hopes thanks to Jamie Vardy's first UEFA Champions League goal in Seville. The home side had led 2-0 thanks to goals from Pablo Sarabia and Joaquín Correa, who on his first start in the competition had had an early penalty saved by Kasper Schmeichel.
- That game proved to be the last in charge of Leicester for Claudio Ranieri, however, who was dismissed the following day.
- The tournament newcomers reached this stage as Group G winners while Sevilla secured their third last-16 participation in the last decade as Group H runners-up behind Juventus.

Match background

Leicester

- Leicester have a 100% home record in this season's competition, having beaten FC Porto (1-0), FC København (1-0) and Club Brugge KV (2-1) in the group stage.
- The English title holders have won only one of their four previous two-legged European ties – 7-2 (aggregate) v Glenavon FC in the 1961/62 European Cup Winners' Cup preliminary round.
- Two of the Foxes' three previous European campaigns ended against Spanish opposition. Club Atlético de Madrid eliminated them from both the 1961/62 Cup Winners' Cup first round (1-1 h, 0-2 a) and the 1997/98 UEFA Cup first round (1-2 a, 0-2 h).
- That 1997 Atlético defeat is also the only previous occasion Leicester have lost an away first leg.
- Leicester have never been involved in a penalty shoot-out in UEFA competition.

Sevilla

- Jorge Sampaoli's team are looking to make the last eight of Europe's elite club competition for the first time since their inaugural continental campaign in 1957/58. That run was curtailed by a heavy quarter-final loss to eventual winners Real Madrid CF (0-8 a, 2-2 h).
- Sevilla lost on the two previous occasions they competed in the round of 16 of the UEFA Champions League – against Fenerbahçe SK in 2008 (5-5 agg, 2-3 pens) and PFC CSKA Moskva in 2010 (2-3 agg).
- Sevilla lost just one of seven European away fixtures played in 2016 (W2, D4). They did not concede in any of their three Group H games on the road – winning at GNK Dinamo Zagreb (1-0) and drawing at Juventus and Olympique Lyonnais (both 0-0).
- The Andalusian side have never won in England (D2, L2). In last season's group stage, they took a 1-0 lead at Manchester City FC through Yevhen Konoplyanka but ultimately were beaten by an Adil Rami own goal and a 91st-minute Kevin De Bruyne strike.
- Their sole previous two-legged knockout tie against Premier League opposition brought a 4-3 aggregate success (2-1 h, 2-2 a) against Tottenham Hotspur FC in the 2006/07 UEFA Cup quarter-finals.
- Sevilla overcame Liverpool FC 3-1 in the final of last term's UEFA Europa League in Basel and also saw off Middlesbrough FC 4-0 in the 2006 final.
- Sevilla have won all but one of the 18 UEFA competition ties in which they won the home first leg, the sole exception being against 1. FC Kaiserslautern in the 1982/83 UEFA Cup third round (1-0 home, 0-4 away). Those 17 aggregate victories include two contests in which the home first leg finished 2-1 to Sevilla, with both second legs ending 2-2: that 2007 tie against Tottenham and against FC Zenit in the 2014/15 UEFA Europa League quarter-finals.
- Sevilla's penalty shoot-out record in UEFA competition is W5, L1:
 - 4-3 v PAOK FC (1990/91 UEFA Cup first round)
 - 3-1 v RCD Espanyol (2006/07 UEFA Cup final)
 - 2-3 v Fenerbahçe SK (2007/08 UEFA Champions League round of 16)
 - 4-3 v Real Betis Balompíe (2013/14 UEFA Europa League round of 16)
 - 4-2 v SL Benfica (2013/14 UEFA Europa League final)
 - 5-4 v Athletic Club (2015/16 UEFA Europa League quarter-finals)

Coach and player links

- Steven N'Zonzi took on Leicester three times with Stoke City FC (W2 L1).

- Samir Nasri won his two matches against Leicester with Man. City – both away from home.
- Leonardo Ulloa came off the bench to play Sevilla twice with UD Almería in the 2010/11 Spanish top flight – a 3-1 away victory in December 2010 and a 1-0 home reverse the following May.
- Wilfred Ndidi netted home and away against another Spanish side, Athletic Club, for former club KRC Genk in this season's UEFA Europa League group stage.
- Stevan Jovetić scored past Schmeichel in his Montenegro team's 2-1 defeat in Denmark in a June 2015 friendly. With Fiorentina he struck twice against Liverpool in a UEFA Champions League group stage victory (2-0) in 2009/10.
- Jovetić did not face Leicester during his two seasons in England with Man. City (2013–15, 30 league appearances, eight goals).
- Christian Fuchs registered in FC Schalke 04's 4-3 triumph at Real Madrid in the 2014/15 round of 16, albeit Schalke still lost 5-4 on aggregate.
- Daniel Carriço made three Premier League appearances for Reading FC in 2012/13.

Match facts

Leicester

- Huth and Islam Slimani are a booking away from a ban.
- The English champions, not in action at the weekend, prepared for the second leg with a three-day training camp in Dubai, returning home on 8 March.
- Leicester parted company with Ranieri the day after the first leg in Seville. Under the caretaker guidance of Craig Shakespeare, the Foxes have since beaten Liverpool and Hull City AFC 3-1. On Sunday, Shakespeare was confirmed in charge for the rest of the season.
- The Liverpool victory was Leicester's first in the league since 31 December. It was also their first league goals in that six-game run.
- Leicester have failed to keep a clean sheet in their last 12 matches.

Sevilla

- Vicente Iborra and Nicolás Pareja are a booking away from a suspension, while Gabriel Mercado returns from a one-match ban.
- Sevilla are eight games unbeaten in all competitions, winning five of them, although they have drawn their last two matches 1-1.

Head coach

Craig Shakespeare

Playing career: Walsall FC, Sheffield Wednesday FC, West Bromwich Albion FC, Grimsby Town FC, Scunthorpe United FC, Telford United FC, Hednesford Town FC

Coaching career: West Bromwich Albion FC (caretaker), Leicester City FC (assistant, twice), Hull City FC (assistant), Leicester (caretaker)

- Having spent almost a decade working as an assistant manager, Shakespeare took temporary charge of English champions Leicester in February 2017 following the dismissal of Claudio Ranieri.
- An attacking midfielder in his playing days, Shakespeare spent much of his career with Walsall – with whom he won promotion to the second division in 1988 – making over 350 appearances for the club.
- Joined top-flight outfit Sheffield Wednesday in 1989, but stayed less than a year before joining West Brom, where there was another promotion to the second tier in 1993; went on to make over 100 appearances for Grimsby before winding down his career in non-league.
- Rejoined West Brom in 1999 as football in the community officer and went on to become a coach with first the academy then the reserves; left to become Nigel Pearson's assistant at Leicester in 2008, following the manager to first Hull and then back to Leicester in 2011.
- Remained at Leicester when Pearson was dismissed in summer 2015, filling the same role alongside new manager Ranieri; remarkably, Leicester went on to win the Premier League title for the first time although, with the following campaign threatening to unravel, Shakespeare succeeded Ranieri the following spring after the Italian's dismissal.

Jorge Sampaoli

Date of birth: 13 March 1960

Nationality: Argentinian

Playing career: Newell's Old Boys

Coaching career: Juan Aurich, Sport Boys, Coronel Bolognesi, Sporting Cristal, O'Higgins, Emelec, Universidad de Chile, Chile, Sevilla

- Jorge Sampaoli's career as a promising midfielder was cut short as a double leg fracture forced him to quit playing at the age of 19. He turned to coaching, working with local amateur sides and gaining notoriety after being photographed shouting instructions at his team from up a tree having been refused entry to the ground.
- Following a spell coaching Argentina de Rosario, the reserve team of former club Newell's, his first professional job came in Peru in 2002 with Juan Aurich. He remained in Peru with Sport Boys before leading Coronel Bolognesi into their first international tournament – the Copa Sudamericana – in 2006.
- After a disappointing year at Sporting Cristal, Sampaoli left Peru to reinvigorate his career with O'Higgins in Chile, spending three years with the Rancagua outfit. He spent time with Emelec in Ecuador but it was a 2011 move to Universidad de Chile that established his name.
- It was here where the Argentinian cemented his reputation as one of South America's best coaches. His attacking, attractive style brought back-to-back league titles in addition to the Copa Sudamericana, and he also reached the semi-finals of the Copa Libertadores.
- Appointed Chile manager in 2012 and continued to impose his aesthetically-pleasing style at the highest level. Helped knock Spain out of the 2014 FIFA World Cup group stage before succumbing to Brazil on penalties in the round of 16. He led the Roja to their first piece of silverware 12 months later with a Copa América final victory over his native Argentina. Left shortly afterwards and appointed Sevilla coach in summer 2016, coming within seconds of winning the UEFA Super Cup on his competitive debut only to be denied by Real Madrid.

UEFA Champions League knockout stage: Did you know?

- Teams have overturned a first-leg deficit to go through 39 times, including FC Barcelona, Borussia Dortmund and Leicester City FC in the 2016/17 round of 16. Only twice – AFC Ajax's defeat of Panathinaikos FC in the 1995/96 semi-finals and FC Internazionale Milano's victory against Bayern in the 2010/11 round of 16 – has a side progressed after a home first-leg loss.
- The biggest losing margin a side has overhauled was achieved by FC Barcelona against Paris Saint-Germain in this season's last 16, when they lost 4-0 away but progressed thanks to a 6-1 home success. That eclipsed the previous record held by RC Deportivo La Coruña in the 2003/04 quarter-finals, when they went down 4-1 at AC Milan but won 4-0 at home.
- Twenty-seven ties have been decided on away goals, including eight where the triumphant team lost the first leg.
- In all, 27 ties have required extra time. Eleven have been settled by extra time alone: four quarter-finals, five round of 16 encounters – including Bayern-Juventus in 2015/16 – the 2007/08 semi-final between Chelsea and Liverpool FC, and the 2013/14 final.
- Sixteen ties have gone to penalties, including seven finals – 1996, 2001, 2003, 2005, 2008, 2012 and 2016. The first two-legged tie decided on spot kicks was PSV Eindhoven's 4-2 victory over Olympique Lyonnais on 13 April 2005 after a 2-2 aggregate draw.
- The 2015/16 round of 16 tie between Club Atlético de Madrid and PSV was the first to finish goalless after two legs. Thirteen have finished 1-0 on aggregate, most recently Real Madrid CF's defeat of Manchester City FC in the 2015/16 semi-finals.
- Real Madrid won 6-1 at FC Schalke 04 in the 2013/14 round of 16, equalling the knockout phase record for the biggest first-leg lead – Bayern's 5-0 success at Sporting Clube de Portugal in the 2008/09 round of 16. Bayern eventually went through 12-1 after a 7-1 stroll in the home second leg; that tie also featured more goals (13) over its two legs than any UEFA Champions League knockout tie.
- Bayern hold the record for the largest margin of victory in a UEFA Champions League knockout match having beaten both FC Basel 1893 (2011/12) and FC Shakhtar Donetsk (2014/15) 7-0 in the round of 16 second leg.
- Clarence Seedorf is the only player to lift the European Cup with three clubs (Ajax 1995, Real Madrid 1998, Milan 2003, 2007). Bob Paisley (Liverpool 1977, 1978, 1981) was the first coach to win three times, a feat Carlo Ancelotti (Milan 2003, 2007, Real Madrid 2014) replicated.
- In 2014 Ancelotti also became the fifth coach to win the trophy with two clubs; Ottmar Hitzfeld (Borussia Dortmund 1997, Bayern 2001), Ernst Happel (Feyenoord 1970, Hamburger SV 1983), José Mourinho (FC Porto 2004, Internazionale 2010) and Jupp Heynckes (Real Madrid 1998, Bayern 2013) had previously achieved the feat.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy, with Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to pick up consecutive European Champion Clubs' Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United FC (2008, 2009) have all returned to the final as holders only to lose.
- Only two sides have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome). Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in FC Barcelona's 7-1 triumph against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012, a feat reproduced by FC Shakhtar Donetsk's Luiz Adriano at FC BATE Borisov on 21 October 2014. Eleven more players, also including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Cristiano Ronaldo for Real Madrid on matchday six in 2015/16.
- Cristiano Ronaldo set a new record for a UEFA Champions League stage with 11 goals in 2015/16, eclipsing his own mark of nine goals in 2013/14, which Luiz Adriano matched in 2014/15. Lionel Messi got ten goals in 2016/17; Zlatan Ibrahimović (2013/14), Ruud van Nistelrooy (2004/05), Filippo Inzaghi and Hernán Crespo (both 2002/03) managed eight.
- Messi's hat-trick on matchday three of the 2016/17 competition was his seventh in the competition – two more than Ronaldo.
- SS Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete at this level, having been aged 43 years and 252 days when he figured against Madrid on matchday six of the 2007/08 edition.
- Francesco Totti is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 38 years and 59 days, in AS Roma's 1-1 draw

at PFC CSKA Moskva on 25 November 2014. Ryan Giggs (37 years and 290 days) was the previous record holder.

- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared – he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored, aged 17 years and 195 days, in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 reverse at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.
