## Match background

---

Juventus have an imposing home record in European competition so FC Porto know they have a stiff task if they are to realise their ambition of winning a place in the quarter-finals.

- Juventus also hold the upper hand in this tie as second-half goals from substitutes Marko Pjaca and Dani Alves secured a 2-0 victory at Porto, who had Alex Telles sent off in the 27th minute for a second yellow card.
- Only twice in UEFA Champions League history has a side overturned a home first-leg defeat to win the tie: AFC Ajax against Panathinaikos FC in the 1995/96 semi-finals (0-1 home, 3-0 away) and FC Internazionale Milano against FC Bayern München in the 2010/11 round of 16 (0-1 home, 3-2 away).

### Previous meetings

- Juventus beat Porto 2-1 in the 1984 European Cup Winners' Cup final in Basel, and recorded an away draw (0-0) and a home win (3-1) when the teams met in the 2001/02 UEFA Champions League first group stage.

- The line-ups at Delle Alpi on 23 October 2001 were:

- Clayton struck an early goal for Octávio Machado's visitors before Alessandro Del Piero and Paolo Montero turned the game for Marcello Lippi's Juve. David Trezeguet sealed the victory late on.

- Zbigniew Boniek won the 1984 Cup Winners' Cup final for Giovanni Trapattoni's Juventus with a goal just before half-time. Beniamino Vignola's early effort for Juve was cancelled out as Pedoto's side drew level through António Sousa.

### Match background

#### Juventus

- The Bianconeri won only one home fixture in Group H – drawing the other two – but still finished on top with a three-point advantage.

- They are aiming to reach their tenth UEFA Champions League quarter-final but only their third in the last seven attempts. In last year's round of 16 the two-time European champions drew 2-2 at home to Bayern München, succumbing 4-2 away in extra time.

- In the 2013/14 UEFA Europa League semi-finals they drew 0-0 at home to SL Benfica having lost the Lisbon first leg 2-1 – denying them a place in the final at their own Juventus Stadium.

- Juventus's 12 encounters with Portuguese sides have ended W6 D2 L4; at home it is W3 D1 L1. All four of those defeats came against Benfica.

- The Bianconeri are on a 20-match (W11 D9) unbeaten home run in UEFA competition, dating back to a 2-0 loss against FC Bayern München in April 2013.

- Juve have won all 36 of the UEFA competition ties in which they triumphed in the first leg away from home, most recently against Olympique Lyonnais in the 2013/14 UEFA Europa League quarter-finals (1-0 away, 2-1 home).

- Indeed, only twice have they lost at home after an away victory: against Hamburger SV in the 1989/90 UEFA Cup quarter-finals (0-2 second leg, 3-2 on aggregate) and Olympiacos FC in the 1999/2000 UEFA Cup third round (1-2 second leg, 4-3 on aggregate).

#### Porto

- The two-time champions are in the knockout rounds for the second time in three seasons. Two years ago at this stage they beat FC Basel 1893 5-1 on aggregate (1-1 a, 4-0 h) but went out 7-4 on aggregate in the quarter-finals to Bayern München.
- Porto picked up seven points at home in this season's group stage, winning 1-0 against Club Brugge KV – their first home European victory in five matches – and 5-0 against Group G winners Leicester City FC.
- Attempting to reach the European Cup quarter-finals for the seventh time, the Dragons have won four of their 13 games against Italian hosts (D3 L6).
- Overall their record in 29 European games with Serie A opponents is W8 D9 L12. It includes another defeat on neutral territory, AC Milan triumphing 1-0 in the 2003 UEFA Super Cup in Monaco.
- Nuno Espírito Santo's side qualified for this season's group stage with a 4-1 aggregate play-off victory over AS Roma. After a 1-1 first-leg draw in Portugal they prevailed 3-0 over nine-man Roma in the return, Felipe, Miguel Layún and Jesús Corona scoring.
- Porto have won only one of the six UEFA competition ties in which they lost the home first leg – against Panathinaikos in the 2002/03 UEFA Cup quarter-finals (0-1 home, 2-0 away). Those losses include the sole previous 2-0 home first-leg defeat, against FC Nantes in the 1971/72 UEFA Cup first round (0-2 home, 1-1 away).

### **Coach and Player links**

- Alex Sandro played for Porto between 2011 and 2015, twice winning the Portuguese Liga.
- Dani Alves' first goal in Spain was scored past Iker Casillas in Sevilla's 4-1 Liga win against Real Madrid CF on 9 November 2003.
- In the 2009/10 UEFA Champions League round of 16 second leg, a Miralem Pjanić goal against Casillas earned Olympique Lyonnais a 1-1 draw at Real Madrid CF and a place in the quarter-finals.
- Mario Mandžukić scored twice against Casillas in the 2014/15 Spanish Super Cup and the Liga, Club Atlético de Madrid beating Real Madrid in both matches.
- Mandžukić scored in Atlético's 3-1 league defeat against Nuno Espírito Santo's Valencia CF on 4 October 2014.
- Casillas made his last European appearance for Real Madrid against Juventus as the Bianconeri earned a 1-1 away draw, and a 3-2 aggregate win, in the 2014/15 UEFA Champions League semi-finals.
- Maxi Pereira was sent off in Uruguay's 4-0 defeat in Montevideo against Brazil in the 2010 FIFA World Cup qualifiers; Dani Alves scored the first goal.

### **Match facts**

#### **Juventus**

- Juventus have won their last 31 home games in Serie A. The 2-1 defeat of visitors Milan on Friday – sealed by Paulo Dybala's 97th-minute penalty – stretched their unbeaten sequence to 12 matches.
- The Old Lady's run of ten successive wins in all competitions came to an end when they drew for the first time in the league this season, 1-1 at Udinese Calcio, on 5 March.
- The Bianconeri recovered from a goal down to defeat SSC Napoli 3-1 in the first instalment of their Coppa Italia semi-final on 28 February. The return leg takes place on 5 April, three days after the teams meet in Naples in the league.
- Higuaín has scored 14 goals in his last 18 appearances in all competitions.
- Giorgio Chiellini suffered a minor thigh injury against Udinese and was not involved versus Milan. Stefano Sturaro

(stomach) has not played since 25 February.

### **Porto**

- Hector Herrera, Iván Marcano, Felipe and André Silva are a booking away from a ban.
- Porto have won their last nine Liga fixtures and are unbeaten in the Portuguese top flight since 28 August.
- The Dragons recorded their biggest league victory since January 1999 when they defeated CD Nacional 7-0 on 4 March. Porto had never previously scored seven goals in a game at the Estádio do Dragão.
- Francisco Soares has scored in each of his six Liga appearances since joining Porto in January, nine goals in total.
- Herrera (foot) and Jesús Corona (ankle) have not played since 22 and 26 February respectively.

**Coaching career:** Aglianese Calcio 1923, SPAL 1907, US Grosseto FC, US Sassuolo Calcio, Cagliari Calcio, AC Milan, Juventus

- A creative attacking midfielder, Allegri started out in his native Tuscany with Cuoioielli and then Livorno, his hometown club. First appeared in Serie A for Pisa against Milan in 1988/89 but played only twice that season before heading back to Livorno.
- Returned to Serie A after helping Pescara win promotion in 1992. The following term he scored 12 goals under Giovanni Galeone, the coach Allegri still considers his mentor. After leaving Pescara in 1993, had spells at Cagliari, Perugia, Padova and Napoli before hanging up his boots back in Tuscany with fourth division Aglianese in 2003.
- Moved straight into coaching at Aglianese, prior to taking charge at SPAL and Grosseto. In November 2008 he won the Panchina d'Oro (golden bench) as the third division's best coach having led Sassuolo to promotion.
- Had earlier been appointed by Cagliari whom he led to ninth place in 2009, winning the Panchina d'Oro again, this time as Serie A's best coach. A bad run of results the following season prompted Allegri's dismissal on 13 April 2010 – although he had already done enough to earn a two-year contract at Milan.
- Allegri's first season at San Siro ended with his new club winning the Scudetto for the first time since 2004. Dismissed in January 2014 with Milan 11th in Serie A, that summer he was appointed to succeed Antonio Conte at Juventus. Allegri won the Scudetto and the Coppa Italia with Juventus in his first season, also taking his side to the final of the UEFA Champions League, and added another domestic double in 2015/16.

### Nuno Espírito Santo

- A journeyman goalkeeper as a player, Nuno made his professional debut with Guimarães side Vitória before moving across the frontier from Portugal to Spain to join Deportivo in 1997.
- He also played for Spanish sides Mérida and Osasuna, as well as Dinamo Moskva in Russia, but experienced his greatest success in two spells with Porto, where he won four Liga titles and three Portuguese Cups; was an unused substitute during the Dragons' 2003 UEFA Cup and 2004 UEFA Champions League final victories.
- After completing his coaching qualifications in Scotland – like compatriot and former boss José Mourinho – Nuno cut his teeth with Portuguese outfit Rio Ave. He inspired the modest club to a highest ever sixth-place Liga finish in his first season and the following year led them to two cup finals for the first time in their history, as well as earning the side a maiden UEFA Europa League berth.
- Those feats earned Nuno the top job at Valencia in July 2014, and he propelled the Mestalla outfit to fourth place during his first campaign, thus securing their UEFA Champions League return after a two-season absence.
- Nuno is renowned for his exciting brand of intense, rapid counterattacking football, and has also developed a reputation for putting his faith in fresh, young talents. He resigned from his Valencia post in November 2015 but was not out of work for long, joining Porto the following June.

## Competition facts

---

### UEFA Champions League knockout stage: Did you know?

- Teams have overturned a first-leg deficit to go through 39 times, including FC Barcelona, Borussia Dortmund and Leicester City FC in the 2016/17 round of 16. Only twice – AFC Ajax's defeat of Panathinaikos FC in the 1995/96 semi-finals and FC Internazionale Milano's victory against Bayern in the 2010/11 round of 16 – has a side progressed after a home first-leg loss.
- The biggest losing margin a side has overhauled was achieved by FC Barcelona against Paris Saint-Germain in this season's last 16, when they lost 4-0 away but progressed thanks to a 6-1 home success. That eclipsed the previous record held by RC Deportivo La Coruña in the 2003/04 quarter-finals, when they went down 4-1 at AC Milan but won 4-0 at home.
- Twenty-seven ties have been decided on away goals, including eight where the triumphant team lost the first leg.
- In all, 27 ties have required extra time. Eleven have been settled by extra time alone: four quarter-finals, five round of 16 encounters – including Bayern-Juventus in 2015/16 – the 2007/08 semi-final between Chelsea and Liverpool FC, and the 2013/14 final.
- Sixteen ties have gone to penalties, including seven finals – 1996, 2001, 2003, 2005, 2008, 2012 and 2016. The first two-legged tie decided on spot kicks was PSV Eindhoven's 4-2 victory over Olympique Lyonnais on 13 April 2005 after a 2-2 aggregate draw.
- The 2015/16 round of 16 tie between Club Atlético de Madrid and PSV was the first to finish goalless after two legs. Thirteen have finished 1-0 on aggregate, most recently Real Madrid CF's defeat of Manchester City FC in the 2015/16 semi-finals.
- Real Madrid won 6-1 at FC Schalke 04 in the 2013/14 round of 16, equalling the knockout phase record for the biggest first-leg lead – Bayern's 5-0 success at Sporting Clube de Portugal in the 2008/09 round of 16. Bayern eventually went through 12-1 after a 7-1 stroll in the home second leg; that tie also featured more goals (13) over its two legs than any UEFA Champions League knockout tie.
- Bayern hold the record for the largest margin of victory in a UEFA Champions League knockout match having beaten both FC Basel 1893 (2011/12) and FC Shakhtar Donetsk (2014/15) 7-0 in the round of 16 second leg.
- Clarence Seedorf is the only player to lift the European Cup with three clubs (Ajax 1995, Real Madrid 1998, Milan 2003, 2007). Bob Paisley (Liverpool 1977, 1978, 1981) was the first coach to win three times, a feat Carlo Ancelotti (Milan 2003, 2007, Real Madrid 2014) replicated.
- In 2014 Ancelotti also became the fifth coach to win the trophy with two clubs; Ottmar Hitzfeld (Borussia Dortmund 1997, Bayern 2001), Ernst Happel (Feyenoord 1970, Hamburger SV 1983), José Mourinho (FC Porto 2004, Internazionale 2010) and Jupp Heynckes (Real Madrid 1998, Bayern 2013) had previously achieved the feat.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy, with Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to pick up consecutive European Champion Clubs' Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United FC (2008, 2009) have all returned to the final as holders only to lose.
- Only two sides have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome). Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.

### UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in FC Barcelona's 7-1 triumph against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012, a feat reproduced by FC Shakhtar Donetsk's Luiz Adriano at FC BATE Borisov on 21 October 2014. Eleven more players, also including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Cristiano Ronaldo for Real Madrid on matchday six in 2015/16.
- Cristiano Ronaldo set a new record for a UEFA Champions League stage with 11 goals in 2015/16, eclipsing his own mark of nine goals in 2013/14, which Luiz Adriano matched in 2014/15. Lionel Messi got ten goals in 2016/17; Zlatan Ibrahimović (2013/14), Ruud van Nistelrooy (2004/05), Filippo Inzaghi and Hernán Crespo (both 2002/03) managed eight.
- Messi's hat-trick on matchday three of the 2016/17 competition was his seventh in the competition – two more than Ronaldo.
- SS Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete at this level, having been aged 43 years and 252 days when he figured against Madrid on matchday six of the 2007/08 edition.
- Francesco Totti is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 38 years and 59 days, in AS Roma's 1-1 draw

at PFC CSKA Moskva on 25 November 2014. Ryan Giggs (37 years and 290 days) was the previous record holder.

- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared – he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored, aged 17 years and 195 days, in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 reverse at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.
