Match background

Bayer 04 Leverkusen have it all to do to turn the tables on Club Atlético de Madrid in the UEFA Champions League round of 16; two seasons ago at this stage, the Spanish side came out on top and look well placed for a repeat performance this time round.

- Atlético are in control of the tie again following the first leg in Germany when goals from Saúl Ñíguez, Antoine Griezmann, Kevin Gameiro and Fernando Torres secured a 4-2 victory; Karim Bellarabi and a Stefan Savić own goal gave Leverkusen a glimmer of hope for the return.

- Only twice in UEFA Champions League history has a side overturned a home first-leg defeat to win the tie: AFC Ajax against Panathinaikos FC in the 1995/96 semi-finals (0-1 home, 3-0 away) and FC Internazionale Milano against FC Bayern München in the 2010/11 round of 16 (0-1 home, 3-2 away).

Previous Meetings

- In the 2014/15 first leg, Hakan Çalhanoğlu scored just before the hour to give Leverkusen a 1-0 home victory; Tiago was sent off for the visitors.

- Atlético drew level on aggregate in the return through Mario Suárez and that took it to penalties, the hosts going through 3-2. Hakan Çalhanoğlu, Ömer Toprak and Stefan Kiessling missed for the visitors, Koke failing for Atlético; Fernando Torres settled it by converting the home side's fifth kick.

- The clubs played out two 1-1 draws in the 2010/11 UEFA Europa League group stage. Simão's penalty (51) cancelled out an Eren Derdiyok goal (39) in Madrid on 30 September 2010, before Fran Mérida (72) equalised Patrick Helmes's opener (69) in Leverkusen on 16 December.

- Jupp Heynckes' Leverkusen ended up top of that UEFA Europa League group while the elimination of Quique Sánchez Flores' Atlético, then holders, was confirmed with the matchday six draw at Leverkusen.

Match background

Atlético

- They were European Cup runners-up for the third time last season when going down 5-3 on penalties to neighbours Real Madrid CF in Milan on 28 May.

- The Rojiblancos are looking to reach the quarter-finals of the European Cup for the ninth time. Last season they won a second successive round of 16 tie on penalties, beating PSV Eindhoven 8-7 after two goalless games – a UEFA Champions League first.

- Diego Simeone's men suffered a 1-0 defeat at FC Bayern München on matchday six of this season's Group D which prevented them joining the six teams to have won all six games in a UEFA Champions league group stage, although they still finished as section winners.

- They have won 28 of their last 33 European matches at the Vicente Calderón, losing just twice.

- Atlético are on a seven-match unbeaten run at home to German clubs (W6 D1), dating back to a 1-0 defeat by Borussia Dortmund in the 1996/97 group stage.

- Their home record against Bundesliga opposition is P18 W13 D2 L3.

- Los Colchoneros have won their last seven two-legged ties against German sides. Their last aggregate defeat came against 1. FC Dynamo Dresden in the 1979/80 UEFA Cup first round.

- Atlético lost the 1974 European Champion Clubs' Cup final against Bayern, going down 4-0 in a replay after a 1-1 draw.

- Atlético have won all 20 UEFA competition ties in which they won the away first leg, most recently against AC Milan in the 2013/14 round of 16 (1-0 away, 4-1 home).

Leverkusen

- The German side, who qualified as Group E runners-up behind AS Monaco FC, have never won a last-16 tie and have suffered some heavy defeats at this stage:
2013/14 Paris Saint-Germain 0-4 h, 1-2 a (1-6 agg)
2011/12 FC Barcelona 1-3 h, 1-7 a (2-10 agg)
2004/05 Liverpool FC 1-3 a, 1-3 h (2-6 agg)
- Although the Werksself reached the final in 2002, losing to Real Madrid CF, that was when the tournament featured a second group stage.
- In this season's group stage, Leverkusen recorded two away draws and a 1-0 victory at Tottenham Hotspur FC. They have won two and drawn three of their last six away games in UEFA competition.
- Leverkusen were eliminated in last season's group stage – losing 2-1 at Barcelona and drawing 1-1 at home – and went on to reach the UEFA Europa League round of 16 before losing to Villarreal CF (0-2 a, 0-0 h).
- Leverkusen have lost on their last three visits to Spain and their overall record there is W3 D2 L12. Their last victory in Spain was a 1-0 success at Real Sociedad de Fútbol in the 2013/14 group stage, Toprak's goal securing their place in the last 16.
- Leverkusen have lost their last six two-legged ties against Spanish opposition. Their last victory came when they defeated RCD Espanyol in the 1988 UEFA Cup final (3-3 agg, 3-2 pens).
- Leverkusen have lost all ten UEFA competition ties in which they suffered a home first-leg defeat, most recently against Paris in the 2013/14 round of 16 (0-4 home, 1-2 away). Indeed, only once in those ten ties did they record a second-leg victory.
- Leverkusen's record in three UEFA penalty shoot-outs is W1 L2:

Coach and player links

- Javier Hernández scored the only goal of Real Madrid's 1-0 aggregate win over Atlético in the 2014/15 quarter-finals.
- Hernández also found the net in Mexico's 3-1 win over Šime Vrsaljko's Croatia in the 2014 FIFA World Cup group stage.
- Hakan Çalhanoğlu scored in Turkey's 1-1 draw against Vrsaljko's Croatia in World Cup qualifying in September 2016.
- Diego Godín scored in Uruguay's 3-1 loss to Hernández's Mexico in the 2016 Copa América group stage.
- Simeone faced Leverkusen twice as a player with SS Lazio in the 1999/2000 first group stage, appearing as a late substitute in 1-1 draws in both Germany and Italy.
- Antoine Griezmann scored both France's goals in their UEFA EURO 2016 semi-final victory over Germany. Bernd Leno and Jonathan Tah were unused Germany substitutes.
- Aleksandar Dragović scored in Austria's 2-1 friendly loss to Filipe Luís' Brazil in November 2014.

Match facts

Atlético

- Filipe Luís and Gabi serve one-match bans.
- Atlético's three defeats in 2017 have all been at home, most recently 2-1 against Barcelona on 26 February.
- Griezmann and Gameiro have both scored six goals in their last seven games in all competitions.

Leverkusen

- Hakan Çalhanoğlu and Benjamin Henrichs are suspended. Dragović and Wendell are a booking away from a ban.
- Leverkusen have lost five of their last eight fixtures.
- The Werkself have kept only one clean sheet in their past 11 games.
- Leverkusen parted company with coach Roger Schmidt on 5 March, a day after suffering a 6-2 defeat by Dortmund. Tayfun Korkut has taken charge on a deal until the end of the season.
- Tah has been out with a hamstring injury since 3 February.

Moved to Italy in 1990 to join Pisa; two years later he left for Sevilla, where he played under Argentina's 1986 World Cup-winning coach Carlos Bilardo and – for one season – alongside Diego Maradona.
- Joined Atlético in 1994 and won the Spanish domestic double in his second season, his first major club honours to add to two Copa América titles (1991 and 1993) plus the 1992 FIFA Confederations Cup with Argentina.
- Enjoyed further success after returning to Italy, winning the UEFA Cup with Inter, plus a Serie A and Coppa Italia double in his debut campaign with Lazio (1999/2000). After four years in Rome, he returned to Madrid for a second spell with Atlético before ending his playing career in Argentina with Racing Club.
- Started coaching career with Racing Club and won Argentinian titles with Estudiantes (2006 Apertura) and River Plate (2008 Clausura); brief spells at San Lorenzo, Italian club Catania and Racing (again) preceded his appointment in December 2011 at Atlético.
- Led Atlético to victory in the 2012 UEFA Europa League final against Athletic Club and to a Copa del Rey final triumph over Real Madrid CF in 2013. A year later, Atlético held off FC Barcelona and Madrid to win their first league title since 1996, although they lost to Madrid in the UEFA Champions League final. Took Atlético to another UEFA Champions League final in 2016, although again they lost to Madrid.

Returning to Germany, he was Stuttgart's Under-19 boss before being enticed back to Turkey from 2012–13 to assist national boss Abdullah Avcı.
- Fluent in German, Turkish, English and Spanish, Korkut took his first senior job as coach of Hannover during the 2013/14 winter break, and had a good first year before being dismissed late the following season. He then led Kaiserslautern for around six months in 2016.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League knockout stage: Did you know?

- Teams have overturned a first-leg deficit to go through 39 times, including FC Barcelona, Borussia Dortmund and Leicester City FC in the 2016/17 round of 16. Only twice – AFC Ajax's defeat of Panathinaikos FC in the 1995/96 semi-finals and FC Internazionale Milano's victory against Bayern in the 2010/11 round of 16 – has a side progressed after a home first-leg loss.
- The biggest losing margin a side has overhauled was achieved by FC Barcelona against Paris Saint-Germain in this season's last 16, when they lost 4-0 away but progressed thanks to a 6-1 home success. That eclipsed the previous record held by RC Deportivo La Coruña in the 2003/04 quarter-finals, when they went down 4-1 at AC Milan but won 4-0 at home.
- Twenty-seven ties have been decided on away goals, including eight where the triumphant team lost the first leg.
- In all, 27 ties have required extra time. Eleven have been settled by extra time alone: four quarter-finals, five round of 16 encounters – including Bayern-Juventus in 2015/16 – the 2007/08 semi-final between Chelsea and Liverpool FC, and the 2013/14 final.
- Sixteen ties have gone to penalties, including seven finals – 1996, 2001, 2003, 2005, 2008, 2012 and 2016. The first two-legged tie decided on spot kicks was PSV Eindhoven's 4-2 victory over Olympique Lyonnais on 13 April 2005 after a 2-2 aggregate draw.
- The 2015/16 round of 16 tie between Club Atlético de Madrid and PSV was the first to finish goalless after two legs. Thirteen have finished 1-0 on aggregate, most recently Real Madrid CF's defeat of Manchester City FC in the 2015/16 semi-finals.
- Real Madrid won 6-1 at FC Schalke 04 in the 2013/14 round of 16, equalling the knockout phase record for the biggest first-leg lead – Bayern's 5-0 success at Sporting Clube de Portugal in the 2008/09 round of 16. Bayern eventually went through 12-1 after a 7-1 stroll in the home second leg; that tie also featured more goals (13) over its two legs than any UEFA Champions League knockout tie.
- Bayern hold the record for the largest margin of victory in a UEFA Champions League knockout match having beaten both FC Basel 1893 (2011/12) and FC Shakhtar Donetsk (2014/15) 7-0 in the round of 16 second leg.
- Clarence Seedorf is the only player to lift the European Cup with three clubs (Ajax 1995, Real Madrid 1998, Milan 2003, 2007). Bob Paisley (Liverpool 1977, 1978, 1981) was the first coach to win three times, a feat Carlo Ancelotti (Milan 2003, 2007, Real Madrid 2014) replicated.
- In 2014 Ancelotti also became the fifth coach to win the trophy with two clubs; Ottmar Hitzfeld (Borussia Dortmund 1997, Bayern 2001), Ernst Happel (Feyenoord 1970, Hamburger SV 1983), José Mourinho (FC Porto 2004, Internazionale 2010) and Jupp Heynckes (Real Madrid 1998, Bayern 2013) had previously achieved the feat.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy, with Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to pick up consecutive European Champion Clubs' Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United FC (2008, 2009) have all returned to the final as holders only to lose.
- Only two sides have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome). Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in FC Barcelona's 7-1 triumph against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012, a feat reproduced by FC Shakhtar Donetsk's Luiz Adriano at FC BATE Borisov on 21 October 2014. Eleven more players, also including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Cristiano Ronaldo for Real Madrid on matchday six in 2015/16.
- Cristiano Ronaldo set a new record for a UEFA Champions League stage with 11 goals in 2015/16, eclipsing his own mark of nine goals in 2013/14, which Luiz Adriano matched in 2014/15. Lionel Messi got ten goals in 2016/17; Zlatan Ibrahimović (2013/14), Ruud van Nistelrooy (2004/05), Filippo Inzaghi and Hernán Crespo (both 2002/03) managed eight.
- Messi's hat-trick on matchday three of the 2016/17 competition was his seventh in the competition – two more than Ronaldo.
- SS Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete at this level, having been aged 43 years and 252 days when he figured against Madrid on matchday six of the 2007/08 edition.
- Francesco Totti is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 38 years and 59 days, in AS Roma's 1-1 draw

at PFC CSKA Moskva on 25 November 2014. Ryan Giggs (37 years and 290 days) was the previous record holder.

- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared – he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored, aged 17 years and 195 days, in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 reverse at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.
