## Match background

Juventus will again be banking on their impressive home form as they look to build on a fine away win to record their third two-legged victory against AS Monaco FC and reach a second UEFA Champions League final in three years.

- The Bianconeri are within touching distance of a place in the Cardiff final after Dani Alves twice set up Gonzalo Higuaín to clinch a 2-0 semi-final first-leg victory.
- Juve have won all 11 two-legged ties against French sides, including against Monaco in both the 1997/98 UEFA Champions League semi-finals and the 2014/15 quarter-finals. The latter campaign witnessed their last appearance in the last four; the Bianconeri are now aiming for a ninth European Cup final.
- Monaco, who have never won in Italy in seven trips, losing all but one, are hoping to reach the final for a second time having got that far in 2003/04 – their last semi-final appearance.
- Only twice in UEFA Champions League history have a team overturned a first-leg home defeat to win the tie, and both lost the first game 0-1: AFC Ajax against Panathinaikos FC in the 1995/96 semis (0-1 home, 3-0 away) and FC Internazionale Milano against FC Bayern München in the 2010/11 round of 16 (0-1 home, 3-2 away).

### Previous meetings

• Monaco and Juventus have previous in the UEFA Champions League semi-finals, the Bianconeri prevailing 6-4 on aggregate in 1997/98 en route to losing to Real Madrid CF in the final. In the first leg, Marcello Lippi's Juventus won 4-1 at the Stadio Delle Alpi where Alessandro Del Piero hit a hat-trick (including two penalties) and Zinedine Zidane added a late fourth.

- Jean Tigana's Monaco edged the second leg 3-2, their scorers including Thierry Henry, who joined Juventus for an eight-month spell the following year.
- Massimiliano Allegri's Juve also beat Monaco, coached then as now by Leonardo Jardim, in the 2014/15 quarter-finals, Arturo Vidal's 57th-minute penalty in the first leg in Turin the only goal of the tie.

### Match background

#### Juventus

• This is only Juve's second UEFA Champions League semi-final appearance since 2003, although it is their second in three years – in 2014/15 they beat Real Madrid 3-2 on aggregate (2-1 h, 1-1 a).

• Juve have won the home leg in all but two of their 11 European Cup semi-finals (W9 L2).

• Juve are yet to concede a goal in five knockout games in this season's competition.

• Allegri's team have already encountered French opposition this season, drawing 1-1 at home to Olympique Lyonnais on matchday four. They had won 1-0 in France thanks to a Juan Cuadrado goal.

- Juve are unbeaten in seven matches against French sides, home and away, since a 2-0 loss at FC Girondins de Bordeaux in the 2009/10 group stage. Their record since is W5 L2.
- The Italian outfit have won all 11 of their two-legged contests against Ligue 1 opponents. They are also unbeaten in home games (W10 D3).
- Juventus have won four semi-finals against French clubs in UEFA competition. Aside from their 1998 success over Monaco, they beat FC Nantes at the same stage of the 1995/96 UEFA Champions League (2-0 h, 2-3 a) and Bordeaux in 1984/85 (3-0 h, 0-2 a) and got the better of Paris Saint-Germain in the 1992/93 UEFA Cup (2-1 h, 1-0 a).
- The Bianconeri are on a 22-match (W13 D9) unbeaten home run in UEFA competition, dating back to a 2-0 reverse against FC Bayern München in April 2013.
- Juventus have won three – the last three – of their five home fixtures in this season's competition, drawing the other two, and conceding just one goal. Against FC Barcelona in the quarter-finals, they won 3-0 in the Turin first leg, going through by the same aggregate score.
- Juventus have kept clean sheets in seven of their last nine European home games.
- Juve have won all 37 of the UEFA competition ties in which they triumphed in the first leg away from home, most recently against FC Porto in this season's round of 16 (2-0 away, 1-0 home).
- Indeed, only twice have they lost at home after an away victory: against Hamburger SV in the 1989/90 UEFA Cup quarter-finals (0-2 second leg, 3-2 on aggregate) and versus Olympiacos FC in the 1999/2000 UEFA Cup third round (1-2 second leg, 4-3 on aggregate).

### Monaco

- Monaco are in their fourth European Cup semi-final, and their first since 2004 when they overcame Chelsea FC 5-3 on aggregate (3-1 h, 2-2 a).
- Monaco have never won away in the European Cup semi-finals (D1 L2). They lost 3-0 at AC Milan in a one-off tie in 1993/94 and 4-1 at Juventus in 1995/96, before that 2-2 draw at Chelsea in 2003/04.
- The full list of Monaco's semi-finals is as follows:

- Monaco have scored in all but two of their 15 games in this term's competition, only drawing a blank in the Juve first leg and the 3-0 matchday six defeat at Leverkusen.
- The Ligue 1 outfit have won three of their seven away matches in the current campaign, the 3-2 success at Borussia Dortmund in the quarter-final first leg ending a two-game away losing streak.
- Monaco's record in two-legged ties against Serie A opponents is W1 L5, not including that one-off tie with Milan in 1994. The solitary triumph came against AS Roma in the 1991/92 European Cup Winners' Cup quarter-finals (1-0 on aggregate). Their goalless draw in Rome that season was the only time they have avoided defeat in seven trips to Italy (W0 D1 L6 F2 A14).
- Aside from their UEFA Champions League defeats by Juve and AC Milan, Monaco also lost to Inter in the 1996/97 UEFA Cup semi-finals (1-3 a, 1-0 h) and UC Sampdoria in the last four of the 1989/90 European Cup Winners' Cup (2-2 h, 0-2 a).
- Monaco have lost all five UEFA competition ties in which they lost the home first leg, most recently against Leeds United AFC in the 1995/96 UEFA Cup first round (0-3 home, 1-0 away). That is also the only time in which they won the away match following a home defeat.
- Monaco's penalty shoot-out record in UEFA competitions reads W1 L0:

### Coach and player links

- Allegri's first match as a coach in UEFA competition was against Ligue 1 opposition – a 2-0 home win against AJ

Auxerre with Milan in the 2010/11 UEFA Champions League group stage. Milan also prevailed 2-0 in France.

- Morgan De Sanctis was at Juventus between 1997 and 1999, making three Serie A appearances. He also played for Udinese Calcio, Roma and SSC Napoli in Serie A.
- Andrea Raggi began his career in the Italian fourth division with Carrarese Calcio, the team Juventus goalkeeper Gianluigi Buffon supports and also owned between 2012 and 2015. In Serie A Raggi turned out for US Città di Palermo, Sampdoria, Bologna FC and AS Bari.
- Raggi and Kamil Glik played for Bari in 2010/11, replacing Leonardo Bonucci who had moved to Juve in summer 2010.
- Glik joined Juventus's local rivals Torino FC in summer 2011, playing in nine Turin derbies (eight in Serie A and one in the Coppa Italia). He lost eight of those games, but helped Torino to a 2-1 victory on 26 April 2015.

## Match facts

### Juventus

- Sami Khedira is available after serving a one-match ban in the first leg.
- Juventus have lost only one of their last 24 fixtures, winning 18 of them.
- The first leg with Monaco was Juve's sixth successive clean sheet in the UEFA Champions League; the competition record is ten, set by Arsenal FC in 2005/06. The 621 minutes Juve have gone without conceding is the fifth longest streak in the competition's history; again Arsenal lead the way (995 minutes).
- Eleven different players have found the target for Juventus in the UEFA Champions League this season.
- Juventus had won 33 consecutive home matches in Serie A before a 1-1 derby draw with Torino on Saturday. Higuaín struck an added-time equaliser.
- The Bianconeri have kept six clean sheets in their last eight matches in all competitions.
- Juventus have conceded two goals at home only twice in their last 56 matches: against Bayern München in last season's UEFA Champions League round of 16 (2-2) and Atalanta BC in the Coppa Italia on 11 January this year (3-2).
- Winners of the last two editions of the Coppa Italia, the Old Lady will play SS Lazio in the 2017 final. It is scheduled for 2 June, but if Juve reach the Cardiff final it will be brought forward to 17 May.
- Marko Pjaca will miss the rest of the campaign after tearing knee ligaments on international duty with Croatia in March.
- On 21 April, Juventus agreed a €9.5m deal to sign Uruguayan midfielder Rodrigo Bentancur, 19, from Boca Juniors until 2022.

### Monaco

- Monaco have won 14 of their last 17 games. The exceptions were the first leg with Juve and two losses to Paris

Saint-Germain – 4-1 in the French League Cup final on 1 April and 5-0 in the French Cup semi-finals on 26 April.

- Monaco have score three goals or more on 27 occasions this season.
- Kylian Mbappé has registered 18 goals in his last 20 appearances for Monaco.
- Monaco have scored two or more goals in seven of their last nine away games. Jardim's team have scored two or more in 16 away games this season, although only seven of those matches ended in a result that would be enough for them at Juve.
- Monaco have kept only seven clean sheets in 29 away games in all competitions this season, with three in their last six fixtures.
- The first leg ended Monaco's 13-match winning streak at the Stade Louis II.

**Coaching career:** Aglianese Calcio 1923, SPAL 1907, US Grosseto FC, US Sassuolo Calcio, Cagliari Calcio, AC Milan, Juventus

- A creative attacking midfielder, Allegri started out in his native Tuscany with Cuoioielli and then Livorno, his hometown club. First appeared in Serie A for Pisa against Milan in 1988/89 but played only twice that season before heading back to Livorno.
- Returned to Serie A after helping Pescara win promotion in 1992. The following term he scored 12 goals under Giovanni Galeone, the coach Allegri still considers his mentor. After leaving Pescara in 1993, had spells at Cagliari, Perugia, Padova and Napoli before hanging up his boots back in Tuscany with fourth division Aglianese in 2003.
- Moved straight into coaching at Aglianese, prior to taking charge at SPAL and Grosseto. In November 2008 he won the Panchina d'Oro (golden bench) as the third division's best coach having led Sassuolo to promotion.
- Had earlier been appointed by Cagliari whom he led to ninth place in 2009, winning the Panchina d'Oro again, this time as Serie A's best coach. A bad run of results the following season prompted Allegri's dismissal on 13 April 2010 – although he had already done enough to earn a two-year contract at Milan.
- Allegri's first season at San Siro ended with his new club winning the Scudetto for the first time since 2004. Dismissed in January 2014 with Milan 11th in Serie A, that summer he was appointed to succeed Antonio Conte at Juventus. Allegri won the Scudetto and the Coppa Italia with Juventus in his first season, also taking his side to the final of the UEFA Champions League, and added another domestic double in 2015/16.

### Leonardo Jardim

---

**Date of birth:** 1 August 1974

**Nationality:** Portuguese

**Coaching career:** AD Camacha, GD Chaves, SC Beira-Mar, SC Braga, Olympiacos FC, Sporting Clube de Portugal, AS Monaco FC

- Played football at an amateur level during his youth and despite a passing interest in handball, it was always Jardim's intention to become a coach. Studied physical education at the University of Madeira, and at 24 became the youngest Portuguese coach to obtain a UEFA A licence.
- Three years later, in 2001, appointed assistant coach at Madeiran club Camacha, where he impressed sufficiently to take charge of first-team duties two years later. Left to join Chaves midway through 2007/08, masterminding rise to the second division 18 months later. Also won promotion at Beira-Mar after taking charge in summer 2009 and preserved their top-flight status the following season before stepping down.
- Signed a three-year contract when he succeeded Domingos Paciência at Braga in 2011 but left after only one having guided the club to a third-placed finish, helped by a record-breaking 13 successive league wins at the turn of the year, and into the UEFA Europa League round of 16.
- Confirmed as the new coach of Olympiacos in June 2012, putting pen to paper on a two-year contract, but dismissed the following January despite a ten-point lead in the league. Resurfaced at Sporting, leading the club to second place in the 2013/14 Portuguese Liga.
- Subsequently succeeded Claudio Ranieri at Monaco, guiding the club to the UEFA Champions League quarter-finals in 2014/15, when they finished third in Ligue 1. Jardim and Monaco were third again the following season, overcoming Villarreal CF to return to the group stage.

## Competition facts

---

### UEFA Champions League knockout stage: Did you know?

- Teams have overturned a first-leg deficit to go through 40 times, including FC Barcelona, Borussia Dortmund, Leicester City FC and AS Monaco FC in the 2016/17 round of 16. Only twice – AFC Ajax's defeat of Panathinaikos FC in the 1995/96 semi-finals and FC Internazionale Milano's victory against FC Bayern München in the 2010/11 round of 16 – has a side progressed after a home first-leg loss.
- The biggest losing margin a side has overhauled was achieved by FC Barcelona against Paris Saint-Germain in this season's last 16, when they lost 4-0 away but progressed thanks to a 6-1 home success. That eclipsed the previous record held by RC Deportivo La Coruña in the 2003/04 quarter-finals, when they went down 4-1 at AC Milan but won 4-0 at home.
- Twenty-eight ties have been decided on away goals, including nine where the triumphant team lost the first leg.
- In all, 28 ties have required extra time. Twelve have been settled by extra time alone: five quarter-finals including Real Madrid CF-FC Bayern München in 2016/17, five round of 16 encounters, the 2007/08 semi-final between Chelsea and Liverpool FC, and the 2013/14 final.
- Sixteen ties have gone to penalties, including seven finals – 1996, 2001, 2003, 2005, 2008, 2012 and 2016. The first two-legged tie decided on spot kicks was PSV Eindhoven's 4-2 victory over Olympique Lyonnais on 13 April 2005 after a 2-2 aggregate draw, still the only quarter-final to go to penalties.
- The 2015/16 round of 16 tie between Club Atlético de Madrid and PSV was the first to finish goalless after two legs. Thirteen have finished 1-0 on aggregate, most recently Real Madrid CF's defeat of Manchester City FC in the 2015/16 semi-finals.
- Real Madrid won 6-1 at FC Schalke 04 in the 2013/14 round of 16, equalling the knockout phase record for the biggest first-leg lead – Bayern's 5-0 success at Sporting Clube de Portugal in the 2008/09 round of 16. Bayern eventually went through 12-1 after a 7-1 stroll in the home second leg; that tie also featured more goals (13) over its two legs than any UEFA Champions League knockout tie.
- Bayern hold the record for the largest margin of victory in a UEFA Champions League knockout match having beaten both FC Basel 1893 (2011/12) and FC Shakhtar Donetsk (2014/15) 7-0 in the round of 16 second leg.
- The biggest winning margin in a semi-final game is Bayern's 4-0 defeat of FC Barcelona in the 2012/13 first leg and Madrid's 4-0 win at Bayern in the second leg a year later. AFC Ajax beat Bayern 5-2 in 1994/95, while there were 4-1 wins for Juventus (1996/97 and 1997/98) and Valencia CF (1999/2000). Six teams have won 3-0, most recently Bayern's defeat of Olympique Lyonnais in 2009/10.
- Bayern's 7-0 defeat of Barcelona in 2012/13 is the biggest aggregate win in a UEFA Champions League semi-final. That 4-1 win for Juventus against Monaco in 1997/98 was part of the biggest aggregate semi-final score. The principality club won 3-2 in their home return to make it ten goals in the tie.
- Madrid's 6-0 second-leg win against FC Zürich in 1963/64 is the biggest European Cup semi-final victory. Eintracht Frankfurt's 12-4 success against Rangers FC in 1959/60 is the biggest aggregate total.
- Clarence Seedorf is the only player to lift the European Cup with three clubs (Ajax 1995, Real Madrid 1998, Milan 2003, 2007). Bob Paisley (Liverpool 1977, 1978, 1981) was the first coach to win three times, a feat Carlo Ancelotti (Milan 2003, 2007, Real Madrid 2014) replicated.
- In 2014 Ancelotti also became the fifth coach to win the trophy with two clubs; Ottmar Hitzfeld (Borussia Dortmund 1997, Bayern 2001), Ernst Happel (Feyenoord 1970, Hamburger SV 1983), José Mourinho (FC Porto 2004, Internazionale 2010) and Jupp Heynckes (Real Madrid 1998, Bayern 2013) had previously achieved the feat.
- No team has successfully defended the UEFA Champions League trophy, with Milan (1989, 1990) the last club to pick up consecutive European Champion Clubs' Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United FC (2008, 2009) have all returned to the final as holders only to lose.
- Only two sides have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome). Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.

### UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in FC Barcelona's 7-1 triumph against Bayer 04 Leverkusen on 7 March 2012, a feat reproduced by FC Shakhtar Donetsk's Luiz Adriano at FC BATE Borisov on 21 October 2014. Eleven more players, also including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Cristiano Ronaldo for Real Madrid on matchday six in 2015/16.

- Cristiano Ronaldo set a new record for a UEFA Champions League stage with 11 goals in 2015/16, eclipsing his own mark of nine goals in 2013/14, which Luiz Adriano matched in 2014/15. Lionel Messi got ten goals in 2016/17; Zlatan Ibrahimović (2013/14), Ruud van Nistelrooy (2004/05), Filippo Inzaghi and Hernán Crespo (both 2002/03) managed eight.
- Messi's hat-trick on matchday three of the 2016/17 competition was his seventh in the competition – one more than Ronaldo, who scored his sixth against Bayern in the 2016/17 quarter-finals.
- SS Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete at this level, having been aged 43 years and 252 days when he figured against Madrid on matchday six of the 2007/08 edition.
- Francesco Totti is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 38 years and 59 days, in AS Roma's 1-1 draw at PFC CSKA Moskva on 25 November 2014. Ryan Giggs (37 years and 290 days) was the previous record holder.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared – he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for RSC Anderlecht against FC Steaua București on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored, aged 17 years and 195 days, in Olympiacos FC's 5-1 reverse at Rosenborg BK on 1 October 1997.
