Match background

Lokomotiv Moskva know another Group D defeat would leave their UEFA Champions League hopes in the balance as they welcome Porto, who are looking to build on a solid start to the 2018/19 competition.

- The Portuguese side are joint top of the section on four points, level with Schalke and one ahead of Galatasaray. Loko are fourth, having lost both their first two games without scoring, and will be looking for rapid improvement in their first meeting with Porto.

Form guide

Lokomotiv

- A late goal gave Schalke a 1-0 win in Moscow on matchday two, inflicting a second successive loss on Lokomotiv, who had gone down 3-0 at Galatasaray in their first fixture.
- The Schalke defeat ended Lokomotiv's four-match unbeaten run at home in UEFA Champions League matches, group stage to final –since a 1-0 loss to Real Madrid in March 2003 – and a three-game home winning streak in the competition proper.
- Lokomotiv have won only four of their last 11 European fixtures in Moscow, losing five.
- Russian champions last season for the first time since 2004, Lokomotiv are in the group stage for the fourth time, having not featured since 2003/04 – their third successive appearance – when they reached the round of 16.
- The Moscow club have qualified from their group on their last two appearances.
- In 2017/18, Lokomotiv began in the UEFA Europa League group stage, beating Nice in the round of 32 before suffering an 8-1 aggregate loss against eventual champions Atlético Madrid in the last 16.
- Lokomotiv's last game against Portuguese opponents was a 4-2 loss to Sporting CP in the 2015/16 UEFA Europa League group stage – giving them a record of W1 L2 at home to visitors from Portugal.

Porto

- Held 1-1 at Schalke in their opening fixture, Porto edged to a 1-0 win at home against Galatasaray last time out.
- Porto are in the UEFA Champions League for the 23rd season – the joint highest total ever alongside Real Madrid and Barcelona.
- Porto have reached the round of 16 in the last two years, and have qualified from the group three times in the last four seasons. In 2017/18 they lost 5-0 on aggregate to eventual runners-up Liverpool in the last 16 having been beaten at home by the same scoreline in the first leg.
- Porto have won only one of their last seven European away games (D4 L2), a 3-0 victory at Monaco in last season's group stage. They have drawn the last three.
- Porto last visited Russia for a 1-1 draw at Zenit in the 2013/14 UEFA Champions League group stage. They won on each of their first four trips but the most recent, a 5-2 victory at Spartak Moskva in the 2010/11 UEFA Europa League quarter-finals, is their sole success in their last five matches against Russian clubs, home and away (D2 L2).

Latest news

Lokomotiv Moskva

- On 27 July Lokomotiv suffered a 1-0 extra-time defeat by CSKA in the Russian Super Cup.
- Lokomotiv picked up only two points from their first three Premier League matches – the worst start to a campaign by the defending champions in Russian league history.

- Having won only two of their first eight league matches this season, Loko have picked up victories in the last three, beating Rostov 2-1 on Friday. Solomon Kverkvelia scored the winner, his first goal since 21 September 2017.
- Guilherme kept clean sheets in each of his first two competitive international appearances for Russia, helping them draw 0-0 against Sweden and beat Turkey 2-0 in the UEFA Nations League.
- Éder was on target in Portugal's 3-1 friendly win against Scotland on 14 October – his first international goal since the winner in the UEFA EURO 2016 final against France.
- Fedor Smolov suffered a shoulder injury against Baltika on 26 September and has not played since. Aleksandr Kolomeysev has not played this season due to a hip problem while Jefferson Farfán has a muscle injury and has not played since matchday one.
- Maciej Rybus has been out since sustaining an adductor injury against Krasnodar on 1 September but is back in training.

Porto

- Porto suffered their second league defeat of the season on 7 October, going down 1-0 at Benfica – it took them 28 Liga matches in 2017/18 to lose twice.
- Porto suffered a first home Liga defeat in 36 matches on 25 August, going down 3-2 against Vitória SC. Having led 2-0, it was the first time they had lost at home in the league having been two goals up since 1942/43.
- The Dragons reached the last 16 of this season's Portuguese Cup with a 6-0 win at fourth-tier side Vila Real on Friday. Adrián López scored four times, his first Porto goals since finding the net in a 6-0 UEFA Champions League defeat of BATE Borisov on 17 September 2014.
- Porto kicked off 2018/19 with a 3-1 win against Portuguese Cup holders Aves in the domestic Super Cup on 4 August.
- Vincent Aboubakar suffered a serious knee injury against Tondela on 28 September and is expected to be sidelined for several months.
- Hernâni has been out with a thigh injury sustained during a training session before the Benfica game.*
- Riechedly Bazoer suffered a shoulder injury in a game for Porto's B team on 22 September but returned to play 90 minutes at Vila Real.
- Francisco Soares (adductor) and Chancel Mbemba (knee) were left out of Porto's UEFA Champions League squad due to long-term injuries, although the former has played in the last two league games and scored at Vila Real on Friday.

Head coach

Yuri Semin

Date of birth: 11 May 1947

Nationality: Russian

Playing career: Spartak Orel, Spartak Moskva, Dinamo Moskva, Kairat Almaty, Chkalovets Novosibirsk, Lokomotiv Moskva, Kuban Krasnodar

Coaching career: Pamir Dushanbe, Lokomotiv Moskva (four times), Russia, Dinamo Moskva, Dynamo Kyiv (twice), Gabala, Mordovia Saransk, Anzhi

- One of the most successful Russian coaches of recent times, Semin's playing career took off in 1965 when he was invited to join Spartak Moskva after starring for Russia's Under-21 team at a tournament between the Soviet republics.
- After leaving Spartak, Semin – a midfielder or striker – moved to rivals Dinamo where he won the 1970 USSR Cup. Retired due to injury in 1980 while captain of Kuban having played 280 Soviet League games, scoring 39 goals.
- After receiving his coaching licence he started work at Pamir in 1983 but made his name at Lokomotiv, where he spent 19 years until 2005, interrupted by a short break in 1990 when he was an adviser to New Zealand Under-21s.
- His Lokomotiv side won the 2002 and 2004 titles in addition to four Russian Cups, and reached the UEFA Cup Winners' Cup semi-finals in 1998 and 1999. Having twice served as assistant coach, Semin took over as Russia boss in April 2005, but quit six months later.
- Following a spell as Dinamo coach and a stint as Lokomotiv technical director, Semin won a Ukrainian league title as Dynamo Kyiv boss in 2008/09, but left that summer to rejoin Lokomotiv; he was dismissed late the following year, returning to Dynamo within a month. Moved to Azerbaijan at Gabala in 2013 and, after short spells at Mordovia and Anzhi, took charge at Lokomotiv again in August 2016; claimed his fifth Russian Cup with the club in 2016/17 and a third league title the following year.

Sérgio Conceição

Date of birth: 15 November 1974

Nationality: Portuguese

Playing career: Penafiel, Leça, Felgueiras, Porto (twice), Lazio (twice), Parma, Internazionale Milano, Standard Liège, Koweit Qadsia, PAOK

Coaching career: Standard Liège (assistant), Olhanense, Académica de Coimbra, Braga, Vitória SC, Nantes, Porto

- A right winger with an eye for goal, Sérgio Conceição started out in the youth ranks at hometown side Académica and in 1996 joined Porto, where he won two league titles and a Portuguese Cup before leaving for Lazio in 1998. In Rome, he won the 1998/99 UEFA Cup Winners' Cup and the UEFA Super Cup the same summer, as well as a Serie A title and a Coppa Italia double in 1999/2000.
- He rejoined Lazio after spells at Parma and Inter. Returned to Porto in 2003/04, winning another Portuguese league title under José Mourinho, before finishing his career with spells in Belgium, Kuwait and Greece. Scored 12 goals in 56 Portugal games, including a celebrated hat-trick in a 3-0 win against defending champions Germany at UEFA EURO 2000.
- After retiring, worked as PAOK's sporting director and Standard's assistant coach before taking charge of Olhanense back in Portugal midway through 2011/12, guiding the relegation-threatened side to a comfortable eighth-placed finish.
- Returned to his home town Coimbra – where a stadium has been named in his honour – to lead Académica in 2013, and then took Braga to the 2014/15 Portuguese Cup final, where they lost to Sporting CP on penalties.
- Led Vitória Guimarães in 2015/16, and then pulled Nantes out of a relegation nosedive in France the following season, a respectable seventh-placed finish prompting Porto to hire him on a two-year contract in summer 2017. Rewarded them with a first league title in five years in 2017/18, when Porto also reached the UEFA Champions League last 16.
