Match background

Hoffenheim's inaugural home game in the UEFA Champions League group stage is a first meeting with a Manchester City side needing to regroup swiftly after an unexpected setback on matchday one.

- While Hoffenheim marked their first appearance in the competition proper with a 2-2 draw at Shakhtar Donetsk – Florian Grillitsch scoring Hoffenheim's first UEFA Champions League goal – City opened Group F by slipping to a 2-1 home loss against Lyon, their fourth straight defeat in the competition.

Form guide

Hoffenheim

- Third in last season's Bundesliga – their highest ever finish – Hoffenheim made their European bow against eventual runners-up Liverpool in last season's UEFA Champions League play-offs (1-2 home, 2-4 away). That was their first and only experience of English opposition to date.
- They went on to pick up five points in the UEFA Europa League group stage, finishing fourth in a section that also included Braga, Ludogorets and İstanbul Başakşehir.
- Hoffenheim lost their first two European home matches before beating İstanbul Başakşehir 3-1 on matchday three of last season's UEFA Europa League; they subsequently drew 1-1 against Ludogorets.
- Die Kraichgauer have won only one of their nine European matches, home and away – although, having lost the first four, they have been beaten only once in the last five.
- Hoffenheim are the 13th German club to feature in the UEFA Champions League – a joint competition record with Spain. They are one of three newcomers to the UEFA Champions League group stage this season, alongside Crvena zvezda and Young Boys.
- Aged 31 years 58 days, Julian Nagelsmann became the youngest coach in UEFA Champions League history on matchday one, replacing Viktor Goncharenko, who was 31 years 99 days when BATE took on Real Madrid on matchday one in 2008/09.

Manchester City

- Josep Guardiola's side finished 19 points clear in the English Premier League last season, picking up a record 100 points – although there was frustration as their European campaign ended against familiar opponents, domestic rivals Liverpool running out 5-1 aggregate winners in the quarter-final.
- The 4-0 win at Basel in last season's round of 16 first leg is City's only success in their last three European away games; they lost the other two.
- The Manchester club picked up six points away from home in last season's group stage, winning at Feyenoord (4-0) and Napoli (4-2) before a 2-1 loss at Shakhtar Donetsk on matchday six.
- City have won only one of their last six European matches, home and away – losing the other five.
- City's best performance was reaching the 2015/16 semi-finals; this is their eighth consecutive appearance in the group stage.
- The Citizens have won two of their last four games in Germany, losing only one; in contrast, they suffered five defeats in their first six visits.

- Five of Hoffenheim's last nine Bundesliga games have finished 3-1, including the first two this season, a defeat at Bayern on the opening day and win against Freiburg. On 25 September they also won 3-1 in Hannover; they were beaten 2-1 at home by RB Leipzig on Saturday.
- Kasim Nuhu has been sidelined by an ankle problem since 1 September, while an adductor injury had kept out Kerem Demirbay since matchday one before he returned as a substitute against Leipzig.
- Benjamin Hübner has been out since 3 August due to concussion, while Nadiem Amiri underwent foot surgery in mid-August.
- Dennis Geiger has been out since 10 March because of a hamstring injury. Lukas Rupp has not played this season after suffering a knee injury on 5 May.

**Not in UEFA Champions League squad*

- City won the FA Community Shield for the fifth time overall – and the first since 2012 – with a 2-0 defeat of Chelsea at Wembley on 5 August, Sergio Agüero scoring both goals.
- The matchday one loss at home to Lyon ended City's 12-match unbeaten run in all competitions (W10 D2), since a 2-1 loss at home to Liverpool in last season's UEFA Champions League quarter-final second leg.
- Riyad Mahrez scored his first two City goals in the 5-0 win at Cardiff on 22 September.
- Three days later, Guardiola's side reached the English Cup fourth round with a 3-0 win at Oxford. Mahrez was again on target while 18-year-old Phil Foden scored his first City goal.
- City made it six wins in seven Premier League outings this season with a 2-0 defeat of Brighton on Saturday, a result that took them to the top of the table on goal difference.
- Sergio Agüero has signed a contract extension until 2021.
- Benjamin Mendy has not played since France's 2-1 UEFA Nations League win against the Netherlands on 9 September due to a foot injury.
- Kevin De Bruyne suffered a knee injury in training on 15 August and has been ruled out for up to three months, while Claudio Bravo faces a lengthy spell on the sidelines after sustaining an Achilles problem on 20 August.

Head coach

Julian Nagelsmann

Date of birth: 23 July 1987

Nationality: German

Playing career: 1860 München II, Augsburg II

Coaching career: Augsburg (youth), 1860 München (youth), Hoffenheim (youth), Hoffenheim

- Nagelsmann's playing career began at Issing before a move to Augsburg's youth academy. From 2002 he represented 1860 München for five seasons, starting off in the youth side before being promoted to the second team.
- Injury prevented him from making a single appearance in 2006/07, so he returned to Augsburg, where he picked up a serious knee injury and was forced to retire in 2007 aged just 20 having never played a competitive first-team game.
- Nagelsmann, who has a degree in sports and applied coaching, swiftly took up a post in Augsburg's youth coaching set-up under Thomas Tuchel before two years in charge of 1860's Under-17 side.
- His association with Hoffenheim began in 2010 and he led the club's Under-19s to the league title in 2013/14, his first season. Succeeded Huub Stevens as first-team coach in February 2016, aged just 28 – the youngest coach in Bundesliga history – and guided the club away from the Bundesliga relegation zone by the end of that campaign.
- Took Hoffenheim to a fourth-placed finish in 2016/17 although their subsequent UEFA Champions League adventure lasted only one tie, Liverpool eliminating them in the play-offs. Hoffenheim went on to finish bottom of their UEFA Europa League section but another strong Bundesliga season was rewarded with third place and a debut in the UEFA Champions League group stage. On 21 June 2018 it was announced that Nagelsmann would leave Hoffenheim at the end of 2018/19 to take over as coach of RB Leipzig.

Josep Guardiola

Date of birth: 18 January 1971

Nationality: Spanish

Playing career: Barcelona, Brescia (twice), Roma, Al-Ahly Club, Dorados de Sinaloa

Coaching career: Barcelona B, Barcelona, Bayern München, Manchester City

- Known as 'Pep', he came up through Barcelona's youth ranks to win six Spanish Liga titles, one European Champion Clubs' Cup, a UEFA Cup Winners' Cup and two Copa del Rey trophies from 1990 to 2001. Also had spells with Brescia, Roma, al-Ahly in Doha and Mexico's Dorados de Sinaloa before ending his playing career in 2006. Won 47 caps and Olympic footballing gold with Spain in 1992, but missed the 1998 and 2002 FIFA World Cups through injury.
- Having coached Barcelona's B team, he took charge of the senior side in 2008 and won the UEFA Champions League, Spanish Liga and Copa del Rey in his first season. That was just the beginning of a glorious four-season spell which yielded 14 trophies. In his second campaign, Guardiola steered Barcelona to a second Liga title as well as the Spanish and UEFA Super Cups and the FIFA Club World Cup. Even more success followed in 2010/11 as Barcelona completed a hat-trick of Spanish titles and, for the second time under Guardiola, got the better of Manchester United in the UEFA Champions League final.
- In his final season, 2011/12, Guardiola's team won the UEFA Super Cup and FIFA Club World Cup once more before he signed off his reign with a second Copa del Rey triumph. After a year's break, Guardiola took charge of Bayern in June 2013, replacing Jupp Heynckes.
- Collected the UEFA Super Cup, FIFA Club World Cup, German Cup and, with a record seven games to spare, the Bundesliga title in his first season in Germany. Secured his second successive Bundesliga title the following season, and Bayern again dominated domestically in 2015/16, but all three of Guardiola's UEFA Champions League campaigns in Bavaria ended in the semi-finals.
- Opted for a new challenge at Manchester City in summer 2016 and, though the first year in charge produced Guardiola's first trophy-less campaign as a coach, he and City delivered in style in 2017/18, racking up 100 points in winning the Premier League and adding the English League Cup.
