## Match background

---

Fresh from memorable quarter-final victories, Tottenham and Ajax meet in the UEFA Champions League semi-finals with a place in the Madrid final on offer for the winners.

- Both sides have ended long waits to make it to this stage. While the most recent of Ajax's eight European Cup semi-finals came in 1997, Spurs have featured in the competition's last four only once previously – 57 years ago, in their debut season of European competition.
- Ajax have ousted holders Real Madrid and Italian champions Juventus in this season's knockout rounds, while Spurs have made it to the semi-finals by beating Borussia Dortmund and Manchester City.

### Previous meetings

- The teams have met in only one previous European tie, Spurs winning 6-1 on aggregate in the 1981/82 European Cup Winners' Cup first round.
- Goals from Glenn Hoddle, Mark Falco and Ricardo Villa helped the English club to a 3-1 first-leg win in Amsterdam, the home side's sole response coming from Søren Lerby.
- Falco was again on target in the return at White Hart Lane, scoring the second goal in a 3-0 home win with Tony Galvin and Osvaldo Ardiles also on target.
- Spurs went on to reach the semi-finals of that season's European Cup Winners' Cup, eventually losing 2-1 on aggregate to Barcelona.

### Form guide

#### Spurs

- Spurs were beaten in their only previous European Cup semi-final:  
1961/62: L 3-4 Benfica (1-3 a, 2-1 h)
- Tottenham are the seventh English club to reach the UEFA Champions League semi-finals, an outright competition record that was previously shared with Spain. They are the only one of the four semi-finalists yet to win the European Cup – or indeed reach the final.
- Tottenham have already faced Dutch opposition this season, taking four points from their two group games against PSV Eindhoven (2-2 away, 2-1 home) with Harry Kane scoring three of their four goals. Those results made it six games without defeat against Eredivisie clubs (W4 D2), since a 1-0 loss at home to PSV in the 2007/08 UEFA Cup round of 16 first leg.
- Spurs went on to lose that 2008 tie on penalties despite a 1-0 away win in the second leg, giving them the overall record W3 L3 in two-legged aggregate contests against Dutch teams.
- That 2007 defeat by PSV at White Hart Lane is Spurs' sole home reverse against Dutch clubs (W4 D3) – they have won the last two.
- Tottenham have lost a European final to a Dutch club, going down 4-2 on aggregate against Feyenoord in the 1973/74 UEFA Cup final (2-2 home, 0-2 away).
- Before beating Dortmund 3-0 in this season's round of 16 first leg Tottenham had never won a home match in the UEFA Champions League knockout rounds (D1 L2), scoring just one goal in those first three fixtures. Having beaten Dortmund 3-0 at Wembley in the round of 16 first leg (4-0 aggregate), they were also victorious at home in the quarter-finals, beating Manchester City 1-0 in the first European game at their new stadium to set up an away-goals success after a 3-4 away defeat.
- This season, Mauricio Pochettino's side lost 4-2 at home to Barcelona in their first home game, but beat PSV and Internazionale (1-0) in the next two. That helped them overtake Inter to snatch second place in Group B behind Barça; Spurs had just one point after three matches.
- The London club have won eight of their last ten UEFA Champions League home matches – including the last four – losing the other two. Before beating Dortmund on matchday one in 2017/18, they had won just one of their previous five European home fixtures (D1 L3).
- This is Tottenham's most successful UEFA Champions League campaign; their previous best came in 2010/11, when they reached the quarter-finals.

#### Ajax

- One of Ajax's two European Cup semi-final defeats came against English opponents, Nottingham Forest – then the holders – beating them in the last four in 1980 en route to retaining the trophy.
- Ajax's away record at this stage of the European Cup is therefore W2 D2 L4.
- Ajax's last experience of English opposition came in the 2016/17 UEFA Europa League final, when they lost 2-0 to Manchester United at Sweden's Friends Arena. That ended a three-match unbeaten run against English clubs (W2 D1).
- The Amsterdam club have not lost in their last two visits to England, most recently a 2-2 draw at Manchester City in the 2012/13 UEFA Champions League group stage. A 2-1 reverse at Aston Villa in the 2008/09 UEFA Cup group stage is Ajax's sole defeat in their last five visits (W1 D3).
- Ajax have, however, won only twice away to English clubs in their 11 visits (D5 L4). A 2-1 win at Manchester United in the 2011/12 UEFA Europa League round of 32, in which Toby Alderweireld – now of Tottenham – got the second goal, ended a 40-year wait for an away victory over English opponents, although it failed to overturn a 2-0 first-leg deficit.
- That 1981 loss at Tottenham is Ajax's only away defeat in London, however, where they have otherwise recorded a win and two draws – all against Spurs' local rivals Arsenal.
- Ajax claimed their first European Cup in London, beating Panathinaikos 2-0 in the 1971 final at Wembley.
- Ajax's record in two-legged ties against English clubs is W3 L4; they have lost the last four, most recently that 2011/12 contest against Manchester United.
- The Dutch club were without a win in seven UEFA Champions League knockout phase fixtures (D2 L5), since a 3-2 victory at Atlético Madrid in the 1996/97 quarter-final second leg that completed a 4-3 aggregate success, before this season's knockout rounds, when they have won at Real Madrid (4-1) and Juventus (2-1).
- Ajax had lost their last three UEFA Champions League away games in the knockout phase prior to winning at Real Madrid. Before that sequence started, they had won the previous three and were unbeaten in five (D2).
- The Amsterdammers have lost only one of their 16 European matches in 2018/19 (W9 D6) – the round of 16 first-leg defeat at home to Madrid. They won their first away game at Sturm Graz in the second qualifying round (3-1), drawing the next four – including at Bayern München and Benfica in Group E, both 1-1 – and winning the last three.
- Ajax are the sole side still involved who came through qualifying. They are the first side in European Cup history to reach the semi-finals having come through three qualifying rounds.
- Ajax are the first Dutch club to have reached the UEFA Champions League semi-finals since PSV in 2004/05.

#### **Links and trivia**

- Spurs boast four former Ajax players in their ranks: Alderweireld (2008–13), Jan Vertonghen (2006–12), Davinson Sánchez (2016–17) and Christian Eriksen (2009–13) with the last three all having joined direct from Ajax.
- Eriksen scored 25 goals in 113 Eredivisie matches for Ajax, winning three league titles and one Dutch Cup in Amsterdam. Alderweireld shared in all four trophy triumphs having made 128 league appearances for Ajax, scoring seven goals, while Vertonghen won two championships and two domestic cups with the Dutch club, scoring 23 goals in 155 league outings.
- In 2016/17, Sánchez's sole full season in Amsterdam, Ajax finished second in the Eredivisie, the Colombian making 12 appearances in their run to the UEFA Europa League final.
- Vertonghen spent 2006/07 on loan at RKC Waalwijk, scoring three goals in 12 Eredivisie appearances – including one in a 2-2 draw against Ajax on 8 April 2007.
- Vertonghen and Klaas-Jan Huntelaar were Ajax team-mates between 2006 and 2008 while Eriksen and Alderweireld played alongside Daley Blind from 2009 to 2013.

## Latest news

### Tottenham

- Harry Kane's next appearance in UEFA club competition will be his 50th.
- Tottenham won their first four games at their new stadium without conceding, scoring eight goals, but were beaten 1-0 at home by West Ham on Saturday. Michail Antonio's winning goal was the first by an opposition player in 427 minutes at the ground.
- Spurs have won only five of their last 13 matches, losing seven – the loss to West Ham was their first at home in that sequence.
- Spurs have drawn only four of their 53 games in 2018/19 in all competitions (W32 L17).
- Mauricio Pochettino's side have kept seven clean sheets in their last 21 fixtures.
- Tottenham have lost 17 games in all competitions this season, their most since 2008/09 (19). They have lost six of their past ten league games (W3 D1), as many defeats as they suffered in their previous 28 (W22).
- Kane was taken off in the quarter-final first leg against Manchester City with what Spurs described as "a significant lateral ligament injury" to his left ankle.
- Dele Alli broke two bones in his left hand in the same game; he returned for the second leg against City and has been wearing a protective cast.
- Moussa Sissoko went off just before half-time in the quarter-final second leg at Manchester City with a groin strain and has not featured since; Harry Winks has not played since the first leg of that tie, also due to groin problem.
- Serge Aurier has not played since suffering a hamstring injury in Ivory Coast's 3-0 Africa Cup of Nations qualifying win against Rwanda on 23 March.
- Erik Lamela, who has not played since the round of 16 second leg at Borussia Dortmund, has a hamstring injury.
- Eric Dier was forced off early in England's 5-0 UEFA EURO 2020 qualifying win against the Czech Republic on 22 March with a hip injury, returning in the 1-0 Premier League defeat at Manchester City on 20 April.

### Ajax

- Ajax were without a game at the weekend; their scheduled fixture at De Graafschap was only two days before the first leg, so the whole 33rd Eredivisie round has been postponed as all clubs have to play at the same time in the final two matches. Ajax lead the Eredivisie on goal difference ahead of PSV Eindhoven.
- Ajax have won 13 of their last 15 games, including the last four, in all competitions, the exceptions the quarter-final first leg against Juventus and a 1-0 Eredivisie loss at AZ Alkmaar on 17 March.
- Dušan Tadić, who converted two penalties in a 4-2 win against Vitesse on 23 April, has 17 goals in his last 18 Eredivisie matches and 21 in his last 26 in all competitions.
- That 4-2 home victory against Vitesse broke a Dutch record. Ajax have now scored 160 goals in all competitions in 2018/19 (league 111, UEFA Champions League 32, Dutch Cup 17), surpassing AZ Alkmaar's 1980/81 mark of 158 goals.
- Ajax have won seven of their last eight away games in all competitions, losing the other; they scored 24 goals in that sequence, conceding seven.
- Donny van de Beek has scored in five of Ajax's last eight away matches, including the equaliser at Juventus.
- Noussair Mazraoui and André Onana have both extended their Ajax contracts until 2022.
- Mazraoui suffered an ankle injury in the second leg against Juventus and has not played since.
- On 27 February Ajax reached the Dutch Cup final with a 3-0 win at Feyenoord. They will play Willem II in the final, also in Rotterdam, on 5 May.

**Coaching career:** Espanyol, Southampton, Tottenham

- A tough-tackling central defender, Pochettino was a product of Newell's Old Boys in Argentina where he briefly played with the legendary Diego Maradona during his five years in the senior squad.
- He moved to Europe in 1994 to join Spanish side Espanyol and won the Copa del Rey in 2000, before joining Paris in January 2001. After a stint at Bordeaux, returned to Espanyol, initially on loan, before hanging up his boots in 2006 having won another Copa del Rey. Capped 20 times by Argentina, appearing in the 2002 FIFA World Cup.
- Switched to coaching with Espanyol in January 2009, with the club lying third from bottom in the Spanish Liga; guided them to a tenth-placed finish. Under Pochettino, three further mid-table finishes followed before a slow start to 2012/13 prompted his departure.
- Surprisingly resurfaced in England at Southampton in January 2013, succeeding Nigel Adkins; introduced a high-pressing, attacking style which helped the club keep clear of relegation trouble. In his first full season in charge, took Saints to eighth position with 56 points – a new club record.
- Appointed Tottenham manager on a five-year contract in May 2014, and led the side to the English League Cup final in his debut campaign, only to lose out to Chelsea. The following season, 2015/16, Pochettino's side were in contention to win the club's first league title since 1961 until a draw at Chelsea with two games to go; nevertheless finished third to book a UEFA Champions League return, and finished a place higher, as Premier League runners-up, in 2016/17, before claiming third spot again the following season.

### Erik ten Hag

- Born in Haaksbergen in the east Netherlands close to Enschede, Ten Hag's early days were spent with local club Bon Boys before a move to the youth department of Twente, where he made his professional debut aged 19 in December 1989.
- A defensive midfielder and defender, he then spent two seasons with De Graafschap, winning promotion to Eredivisie in his first, before returning to Twente for two years. Ten Hag moved on to single-season stays at both RKC Waalwijk and Utrecht, and then returned to Twente again in 1996, this time for good.
- Reached the last 16 of the 1997/98 UEFA Cup, losing to Auxerre, and in 2001 he won his only silverware with the club, Fred Rutten's team beating PSV Eindhoven on penalties in the Dutch Cup final with Ten Hag as captain.
- After ending his playing career in 2002 he became head of Twente's youth department, also working as assistant coach for several years, alongside Rutten from 2006/07. Followed the head coach to PSV in 2009, serving as his assistant for three seasons.
- Took his first post as head coach at Go Ahead Eagles, winning promotion to the Dutch top flight in his 2012/13 debut season, before moving on to Bayern München's second team, winning the Regionalliga title in 2014 and working with Josep Guardiola. Took over at Utrecht in summer 2015, winning the Rinus Michels award as the Netherlands' coach of the year 12 months later. Succeeded Marcel Keizer at Ajax in December 2017, leading the club to second place in the Eredivisie at the end of that campaign and into the UEFA Champions League group stage for the first time in four years.

### UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

#### Overall records

- In 2016/17 Real Madrid became the first team to successfully defend the UEFA Champions League trophy, with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the previous club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- Real Madrid then made it three wins in a row in 2017/18, becoming the fourth club to win three or more successive titles in European Cup history, and the first to do it twice.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.

#### Knockout stage

- Real Madrid have qualified for the UEFA Champions League knockout phase a record 23 times, including 22 in succession. They have also played a competition-high 97 knockout phase matches – ahead of Bayern München (91) and Barcelona (90).
- Teams have overturned a first-leg deficit to go through 46 times, including Porto and Juventus in the 2018/19 round of 16. Before this season, only twice – Ajax's defeat of Panathinaikos in the 1995/96 semi-finals and Internazionale's victory against Bayern in the 2010/11 round of 16 – had a side progressed after a home first-leg loss; however, Ajax again (against Real Madrid) and Manchester United (against Paris Saint-Germain) both achieved the feat in the 2018/19 round of 16.
- The biggest losing margin a side has overhauled was achieved by Barcelona against Paris Saint-Germain in the 2016/17 last 16, when they lost 4-0 away but progressed thanks to a 6-1 home success. That eclipsed the previous record held by Deportivo La Coruña in the 2003/04 quarter-finals, when they went down 4-1 at AC Milan but won 4-0 at home; Roma equalled that margin in last season's quarter-finals, turning round a 4-1 first-leg loss at Barcelona with a 3-0 home success.
- Thirty-two ties have been decided on away goals, including 12 where the triumphant team lost the first leg. Bayern and Monaco have benefited from the away goals rule five times – more than any other club – whereas Internazionale have been eliminated by that method a record four times.
- In all, 29 ties have required extra time. Thirteen have been settled by extra time alone: six round of 16 encounters including Porto-Roma this season, five quarter-finals, the 2007/08 semi-final between Chelsea and Liverpool, and the 2013/14 final between Real Madrid and Atlético Madrid.
- Sixteen ties have gone to penalties, including seven finals – 1996, 2001, 2003, 2005, 2008, 2012 and 2016. The first two-legged tie decided on spot kicks was PSV Eindhoven's 4-2 victory over Lyon on 13 April 2005 after a 2-2 aggregate draw, still the only quarter-final to go to penalties. Bayern, Chelsea and Atlético Madrid have all appeared in three shoot-outs, sharing the competition record, with Bayern, Atlético and Liverpool having won the most (two apiece).
- The 2015/16 round of 16 tie between Atlético Madrid and PSV was the first to finish goalless after two legs. Thirteen have finished 1-0 on aggregate, most recently Real Madrid's defeat of Manchester City in the 2015/16 semi-finals.
- Liverpool (versus Porto) and Bayern (versus Beşiktaş) both won 5-0 in the 2017/18 round of 16, equalling the knockout phase record for the biggest first-leg lead – Real Madrid's 6-1 victory at Schalke in 2013/14 and Bayern's 5-0 success at Sporting CP in 2008/09, both also in the round of 16.
- Bayern eventually beat Sporting by a record aggregate margin of 12-1 after a 7-1 stroll in the home second leg; that tie also featured more goals (13) over its two legs than any UEFA Champions League knockout tie until it was equalled by Liverpool's 7-6 aggregate win against Roma in the 2017/18 semi-final.
- Bayern and Manchester City jointly hold the record for the largest margin of victory in a UEFA Champions League knockout match. Bayern beat both Basel (2011/12) and Shakhtar Donetsk (2014/15) 7-0 in the round of 16 second leg, while City beat Schalke by the same scoreline at the same stage of the 2018/19 competition.
- A record five clubs from England participated in the 2017/18 knockout phase. England has also provided four clubs on seven other occasions – as has Spain four times and Germany twice. England is the only nation to have provided four quarter-finalists in a season, 2018/19 being the third occasion after 2007/08 and 2008/09.
- Real Madrid have featured in 13 UEFA Champions League semi-finals, one more than Barcelona and two more than

## Bayern.

- The biggest winning margin in a UEFA Champions League semi-final game is Bayern's 4-0 defeat of Barcelona in the 2012/13 first leg and Madrid's 4-0 win at Bayern in the second leg a year later. AFC Ajax beat Bayern 5-2 in 1994/95, a margin Liverpool equalled against Roma last season, while there were 4-1 wins for Juventus (1996/97 and 1997/98), Valencia (1999/2000) and Manchester United (2010/11). Eight teams have won 3-0, most recently Real Madrid's defeat of Atlético Madrid in 2016/17.
- Bayern's 7-0 defeat of Barcelona in 2012/13 is the biggest aggregate win in a UEFA Champions League semi-final. Liverpool's 7-6 aggregate victory against Roma in 2017/18 is the highest-scoring semi-final tie.
- Madrid's 6-0 second-leg win against Zürich in 1963/64 is the biggest European Cup semi-final victory. Eintracht Frankfurt's 12-4 success against Rangers FC in 1959/60 is the biggest aggregate total.
- Clarence Seedorf is the only player to lift the European Cup with three clubs (Ajax 1995, Real Madrid 1998, Milan 2003, 2007). Bob Paisley (Liverpool 1977, 1978, 1981) was the first coach to win three times, a feat Carlo Ancelotti (Milan 2003, 2007, Real Madrid 2014) and Zinedine Zidane (2016, 2017, 2018) have replicated.
- In 2014 Ancelotti also became the fifth coach to win the trophy with two clubs; Ottmar Hitzfeld (Borussia Dortmund 1997, Bayern 2001), Ernst Happel (Feyenoord 1970, Hamburg 1983), José Mourinho (Porto 2004, Internazionale 2010) and Jupp Heynckes (Real Madrid 1998, Bayern 2013) had previously achieved the feat.

## Goalscoring records

- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer Leverkusen on 7 March 2012, a feat matched by Shakhtar Donetsk's Luiz Adriano at BATE Borisov on 21 October 2014. Eleven more players, also including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Cristiano Ronaldo for Real Madrid on matchday six in 2015/16.
- Cristiano Ronaldo set a new record for a UEFA Champions League group stage with 11 goals in 2015/16, eclipsing his own mark of nine in 2013/14, which Luiz Adriano matched in 2014/15 and Ronaldo himself equalled in 2017/18. Lionel Messi got ten goals in 2016/17; Zlatan Ibrahimović (2013/14), Ruud van Nistelrooy (2004/05), Filippo Inzaghi, Hernán Crespo (both 2002/03) and Robert Lewandowski (2018/19) managed eight.
- Messi's hat-trick against PSV Eindhoven on matchday one of the 2018/19 competition was his eighth in the competition, a mark Ronaldo matched against Atlético Madrid in the round of 16 second leg.

## Oldest and youngest players

- Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid on matchday six in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens in 2006/07.
- Francesco Totti is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 38 years and 59 days, in Roma's 1-1 draw at CSKA Moskva on 25 November 2014. Ryan Giggs (37 years 290 days) was the previous record holder.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for Anderlecht against Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Peter Ofori-Quaye is the youngest player to have scored in the UEFA Champions League, aged 17 years and 195 days. He found the net in Olympiacos's 5-1 defeat at Rosenborg on 1 October 1997.
