Match background

Undefeated at home in the UEFA Champions League for over seven years, Barcelona will be confident of clinching a 13th successive quarter-final berth as Napoli visit the Camp Nou with their round of 16 tie level at 1-1.

- The first leg in Naples, the first ever meeting between the sides, ended 1-1, Antoine Griezmann scoring in the 57th minute to cancel out Dries Mertens' first-half opener, a goal that made the Belgian Napoli's all-time joint leading scorer.
- That draw preserved both teams' unbeaten record in this season's competition; however, while Barça have won their last 12 ties at this stage, Napoli are bidding to progress beyond the round of 16 for the first time.

Form guide

Barcelona

- Barcelona finished with 14 points in Group F, four ahead of second-placed Borussia Dortmund. Half of those came at home, the Catalan club beating Inter (2-1) and Dortmund (3-1) and being held 0-0 by Slavia Praha – the first time they had failed to score in a home group game since 2012.
- Ansu Fati's winner at Inter on Matchday 6 made him the youngest goalscorer in UEFA Champions League history, aged 17 years 40 days. He eclipsed the previous record, which had stood since 1 October 1997, set by Olympiacos's Peter Ofori-Quaye (17 years 195 days).
- Barcelona are unbeaten in 35 UEFA Champions League home matches, a run that started in September 2013 (W31 D4); the 5-1 defeat of Lyon in last season's round of 16 second leg eclipsed the previous competition record of 29 set by Bayern München between March 1998 and April 2002.
- The Blaugrana's record at home to Serie A clubs is W18 D6 L2. They are unbeaten in their last 15 home fixtures against Italian visitors, winning 12, since losing 2-1 to Juventus in the 2002/03 quarter-final second leg.
- Spanish champions for the 26th time in 2018/19, their fourth title in five years, this is Barcelona's 24th UEFA Champions League campaign, a competition record they share with Real Madrid. They have now reached the round of 16 or better for the last 16 seasons, winning their group every year from 2007/08 onwards. They are unbeaten in their last three group stage campaigns, and have come through their section undefeated a record 13 times.
- In 2018/19, Barcelona eased past Lyon in the last 16 (0-0 a, 5-1 h) and Manchester United in the quarter-finals (1-0 a, 3-0 h) before a 3-0 first-leg victory against Liverpool in the last four, only for the English club to turn the tables in stunning style at Anfield (0-4).
- Barcelona have been in the round of 16 every year from 2004/05 onwards, winning 13 of those 15 ties. They lost two of the first three ties, most recently against Liverpool in 2006/07, but have won their last 12 – recording a home victory in all 12 ties. They have never lost a round of 16 tie when playing the second leg at home.
- Barcelona won all three home games in last season's knockout rounds, and are unbeaten in 14 knockout games at the Camp Nou (W12 D2), since a 3-0 loss to Bayern München in the 2012/13 semi-final second leg.
- Barcelona's record in two-legged ties against Italian sides is W8 L5. They have lost their last two, both in the UEFA Champions League quarter-finals, against Juventus in 2016/17 (0-3 a, 0-0 h) and Roma the following season (4-1 h, 0-3 a).
- The Blaugrana have lost only two of their last 30 UEFA Champions League fixtures (W18 D10).
- Barça have been European champions on five occasions, most recently in 2015.
- Barcelona have recorded 26 away first-leg draws in UEFA competition, winning 21 of those ties on aggregate, including against Lyon in last season's round of 16 (0-0 a, 5-1 h). They have won ten of the 12 ties in which they drew 1-1 in the away first leg, most recently against Chelsea in the 2017/18 round of 16 (3-0 h).
- Barcelona's record in six UEFA penalty shoot-outs is W5 L1:
 - 5-4 v AZ Alkmaar, 1977/78 UEFA Cup second round
 - 3-1 v Ipswich Town, 1977/78 UEFA Cup third round

Napoli

- Napoli finished second in Group E with 12 points, one behind Liverpool. They picked up five points away from home, drawing at Genk (0-0) and Liverpool (1-1) either side of a 3-2 success at Salzburg.

- Serie A runners-up for the second season running in 2018/19, this is Napoli's sixth UEFA Champions League campaign – all in the last nine seasons – and the third to have extended into the knockout rounds. They reached the round of 16 in 2011/12 and 2016/17.
- Both those previous last-16 ties ended in defeat against the eventual winners; Real Madrid beat Napoli 3-1 home and away in 2016/17, five years after Chelsea turned round a 3-1 first-leg defeat in Naples with a 4-1 extra-time success in the return.
- Napoli have won only seven of their last 21 matches in the UEFA Champions League, group stage to final (D7 L7) – all those victories bar this season's Matchday 3 success at Salzburg coming at the Stadio San Paolo.
- Having finished third behind Paris Saint-Germain and Liverpool in last season's group stage, Napoli beat Zürich (5-1 aggregate) and Salzburg (4-3) in the UEFA Europa League before losing 2-0 away to Arsenal and 1-0 at home in the quarter-finals.
- This season's win at Salzburg and the success at Zürich in 2018/19 are Napoli's only victories in their last nine European away fixtures (D4 L3).
- Napoli have lost their last four two-legged ties against Spanish opposition: their overall record is W1 L5, the sole victory against Valencia in the 1992/93 UEFA Cup first round (5-1 a, 1-0 h), with that 2017 tie against Madrid the most recent.
- Napoli's overall record away to Spanish opponents is W2 L5, with defeats on their last three visits. They have not won in their last seven matches against Liga sides, home and away (D3 L4).
- Napoli have lost all five ties in UEFA competition in which they drew the home first leg, most recently against Dnipro in the 2014/15 UEFA Europa League semi-finals (1-1 h, 0-1 a). That was the second tie in which they drew 1-1 in Naples in the first game; the other came earlier that season against Athletic Club in the UEFA Champions League play-offs (1-3 a).

• Diego Maradona represented both clubs, signing for Barcelona in 1982 and winning the Spanish Super Cup and the Copa del Rey in his first season. In 1984, after 38 goals in 58 games for the Spanish club, he joined Napoli, going on to win the 1989 UEFA Cup, two Serie A titles, the Coppa Italia and the Italian Super Cup with the Partenopei.

Latest news

Barcelona

- Barcelona finished second in the 2019/20 Liga, five points behind Real Madrid, having picked up 24 points from their last 11 matches following the resumption of the Spanish season on 13 June. Barça had led the standings by two points prior to the pause in the season.
- Lionel Messi finished as the Liga's top scorer for the seventh time – and the fourth year in a row – with 25 goals. He also supplied 21 assists.
- Having reached the last six Copa del Rey finals and won four of them, Barcelona were eliminated from this season's competition at the quarter-final stage, going down 1-0 at Athletic Club on 6 February.
- Luis Suárez, who was out between the 3-2 defeat by Atlético Madrid in the Spanish Super Cup semi-final on 9 January and 13 June having undergone an operation on his knee, finished the Liga season by scoring five times in seven matches to make it 16 goals in total.
- Ousmane Dembélé has been out since sustaining a thigh injury on Matchday 5.
- Samuel Umtiti, whose most recent appearance came in the 2-2 draw at Celta Vigo on 27 June, is carrying a knee injury.
- Arthur has agreed a deal to join Juventus at the end of the season, while Miralem Pjanić will move in the opposite direction.
- Barcelona completed moves for Francisco Trincão (Braga) and Matheus Fernandes (Palmeiras) in January; both players joined their new club on 1 July.

Napoli

- Kostas Manolas made his 50th appearance in the UEFA Champions League, group stage to final, in the first leg.
- Napoli ended the Serie A campaign in seventh place, winning 18 of their 38 games and losing 12.
- The Partenopei have already won a trophy this season, lifting the Coppa Italia. On 13 June they reached the final courtesy of a 1-1 draw at home against Inter following their 1-0 win in Milan on 12 February; four days later Napoli defeated Juventus 4-2 on penalties in the final after a goalless draw in Rome to earn Gennaro Gattuso his first trophy as a coach.
- Napoli won four of their next five Serie A matches (L1), but finished the season with only three wins in their last seven outings (D2 L2).
- Matteo Politano, who joined from Inter in January, scored his first goal for Napoli in added time to secure a 2-1 win against Udinese on 19 July. His second Napoli goal was also in added time, in the last league match of the season, a 3-1 win over Lazio on 1 August.
- Arkadiusz Milik (11 goals) was the only Napoli player to reach double figures in Serie A this term; Dries Mertens ended the campaign with nine goals.
- Mertens has not scored since the 2-2 draw against AC Milan on 12 July but is now Napoli's all-time top scorer with 125 goals, four more than Marek Hamšík; he overtook the Slovakian with his goal in the Coppa Italia semi-final second leg against Inter.
- On 17 June, Mertens renewed his contract until 2022.
- Lorenzo Insigne suffered a thigh injury against Lazio on the final day of the Serie A season.
- Kévin Malcuit, who was removed from Napoli's UEFA Champions League squad in January, returned as a late substitute in the 2-0 loss at Inter on 28 July; he had not played since damaging knee ligaments during a 1-1 draw with SPAL on 27 October.
- On 31 July Napoli announced the signing of Nigerian striker Victor Osimhen, who joins on a five-year contract from French side LOSC Lille.

- Enrique 'Quique' Setién Solar started out as a beach football player in the northern Spanish region of Cantabria, representing his country at the sport.
- He then played for local side Real Racing Club for 12 seasons over two spells, where his performances in central midfield earned him the nickname 'El Maestro' (The Máster). Setién won the 1985 Spanish Super Cup with Atlético, and had spells at Logroñés and Levante either side of his second stint at Racing Club before hanging up his boots in 1996.
- A member of Spain's 1986 FIFA World Cup squad, he earned three caps for his country.
- Started out in coaching with his home-town club in 2001 before spells in the lower leagues with Poli Ejido, Logroñés and Lugo and a brief stint with the Equatorial Guinea national team. A keen chess fan who has played against former world champions Anatoly Karpov and Garry Kasparov, he stepped up to the Spanish top flight when named Las Palmas coach in October 2015, keeping the Canary Island side in the division.
- In 2017 he joined Real Betis, leading them to sixth position in the Liga that season and the UEFA Europa League round of 32 in 2018/19 before leaving the Seville club at the end of the campaign. A disciple of Barcelona legend Johan Cruyff, playing the kind of possession-based passing style that has become synonymous with the Catalan club, he was named Barça coach on 13 January 2020, signing a two-and-a-half year deal to replace Ernesto Valverde.

Gennaro Gattuso

Date of birth: 9 January 1978

- Gattuso joined Rangers as a teenager after Perugia suffered relegation from Serie A in 1997 and returned to Italy in October 1998, joining first Salernitana and then, at the start of 1999/2000, Milan.
- After helping the Azzurrini win the UEFA European Under-21 Championship, he marked his first start for the senior national side with the only goal of the game against England in a November 2000 friendly in Turin.
- Though a fringe player for Italy at the 2002 FIFA World Cup and UEFA EURO 2004 he was a key protagonist at the 2006 World Cup, winning the man of the match award in the quarter-final against Ukraine and excelling in the final against France; also appeared at UEFA EURO 2008 and the 2010 World Cup, retiring after the latter tournament having won 73 caps.
- A UEFA Champions League and UEFA Super Cup winner with Milan in 2003 and 2007, and part of the side that suffered a dramatic defeat by Liverpool in the 2005 UEFA Champions League final, Gattuso also won the Scudetto in 2004 and 2011, the Coppa Italia in 2003 and the FIFA Club World Cup in 2007. Hung up his boots in 2013 after a season in Switzerland with Sion, where he took his first steps into management as player-coach as the replacement for Víctor Muñoz in February 2013.
- Left Sion that May and subsequently had short spells in charge at Palermo and in Greece with OFI Crete before leading Pisa to promotion to Serie B in 2015/16. Returned to Milan in May 2017 as coach of the Under-19 Primavera side, stepping up to the first team in November following Vincenzo Montella's departure. Left the club in May 2019, and returned to coaching seven months later, succeeding his former Rossoneri boss Carlo Ancelotti at Napoli.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

Overall records

- In 2012/13, Chelsea became the first defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to CSKA Moskva.
- In 2016/17 Real Madrid became the first team to successfully defend the UEFA Champions League trophy, with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the previous club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- Real Madrid then made it three wins in a row in 2017/18, becoming the fourth club to win three or more successive titles in European Cup history, and the first to do it twice.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.

Group stage

- Barcelona have finished as group winners on 21 occasions, five more than Real Madrid and Bayern München and six more than Manchester United. Barça also hold the record for the most unbeaten group stage campaigns with 13, five more than Real Madrid.
- Bayern München (2 April 2013 to 27 November 2013) and Real Madrid (23 April 2014 to 18 February 2015) jointly hold the record for successive wins in the UEFA Champions League proper with ten. Bayern surpassed the previous mark of nine, set by Barcelona between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003.
- Seven teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain (1994/95), Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage), Real Madrid (2011/12 and 2014/15) and Bayern München (2019/20).
- Twenty-one teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, most recently AEK Athens in 2018/19.
- In 2017/18, Paris Saint-Germain set a new group stage record by scoring 25 goals, one more than Bayern München managed in 2019/20. Liverpool are next on the list having scored 23 in 2017/18 with Borussia Dortmund hitting 21 in 2016/17. Manchester United (1998/99), Barcelona (2011/12, 2016/17) and Real Madrid (2013/14) all managed 20.
- Only Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05), Maccabi Haifa (2009/10) and Dinamo Zagreb (2016/17) have failed to score in a group stage.
- BATE Borisov conceded 24 goals in 2014/15, a new group stage record which was matched by Legia Warszawa in 2016/17. The previous mark, 22, was held by Dinamo Zagreb (2011/12) and Nordsjælland (2012/13).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06), Manchester United (2010/11), Monaco (2014/15), Paris Saint-Germain (2015/16) and Barcelona (2017/18) all let in just one.
- Matchday 6 of 2013/14 marked FCSB's 23rd successive game in the competition without a victory, surpassing the previous record of 22 set by Spartak Moskva between December 2000 and November 2006.
- Anderlecht hold the unwanted record for successive defeats in the competition, group stage to final, having lost 12 in a row between December 2003 and November 2005. Dinamo Zagreb are next with 11 consecutive losses on two occasions, from September 2011 to November 2012 and ongoing since September 2015.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is six points: Zenit in 2013/14 and Roma in 2015/16. Since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96, ten teams have made it through with seven points: Legia Warszawa (1995/96), Dynamo Kyiv (1999/2000), Liverpool (2001/02, second group stage), in 2002/03 Lokomotiv Moskva (first group stage) and eventual finalists Juventus (second group stage), Rangers and Werder Bremen (2005/06), Galatasaray (2013/14), Basel (2014/15) and Atalanta (2019/20).
- Napoli failed to qualify from their group with 12 points in 2013/14, the highest total of any team not to reach the next stage when the top two in each section progressed. Dynamo Kyiv (1999/2000, second group stage), Borussia Dortmund (2002/03, second group stage), PSV Eindhoven (2003/04), Olympiacos and Dynamo Kyiv (both 2004/05),

Werder Bremen (2006/07), Manchester City (2011/12), Chelsea and Cluj (both 2012/13), Benfica (2013/14), Porto (2015/16) and Ajax (2019/20) all missed out with ten points.

Goalscoring records

- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer Leverkusen on 7 March 2012, a feat matched by Shakhtar Donetsk's Luiz Adriano at BATE Borisov on 21 October 2014. Eleven more players, also including Messi, have scored four times in a game, most recently Cristiano Ronaldo for Real Madrid on Matchday 6 in 2015/16.
- Cristiano Ronaldo set a new record for a UEFA Champions League group stage with 11 goals in 2015/16, eclipsing his own mark of nine in 2013/14, which Luiz Adriano matched in 2014/15 and Ronaldo himself equalled in 2017/18. Lionel Messi got ten goals in 2016/17; Zlatan Ibrahimović (2013/14), Ruud van Nistelrooy (2004/05), Filippo Inzaghi, Hernán Crespo (both 2002/03) and Robert Lewandowski (2018/19) managed eight.
- Messi's hat-trick against PSV Eindhoven on Matchday 1 of the 2018/19 competition was his eighth in the competition, a mark Ronaldo matched against Atlético Madrid in that season's round of 16 second leg.

Oldest and youngest players

- Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid on Matchday 6 in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens in 2006/07.
- Francesco Totti is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 38 years and 59 days, in Roma's 1-1 draw at CSKA Moskva on 25 November 2014. Ryan Giggs (37 years 290 days) was the previous record holder.
- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for Anderlecht against Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Ansu Fati's winner for Barcelona at Inter on Matchday 6 in 2019/20 made him the youngest goalscorer in UEFA Champions League history, at the age of 17 years 40 days. He eclipsed the previous record of Olympiacos's Peter Ofori-Quaye (17 years 195 days) that had lasted since 1 October 1997.
