## Match background

---

Atalanta's memorable first UEFA Champions League campaign resumes with a quarter-final meeting against Paris Saint-Germain at Lisbon's Estádio do Sport Lisboa e Benfica.

- While the Italian side are in only their third European quarter-final – and first for 29 years – Paris are in the UEFA Champions League last eight for the fifth time in eight seasons and are looking to reach a first semi-final since 1995.
- Atalanta are unbeaten in their two games against French opponents while the most recent of Paris's two wins in 20 matches against Italian clubs came in March 1996.

### Form guide

#### Atalanta

- Atalanta picked up seven points in the group stage to qualify as Group C runners-up, seven behind Manchester City and one ahead of Shakhtar Donetsk. The Italian club took only one point from their first four games and have suffered their two heaviest European defeats this season, losing 4-0 away to Dinamo Zagreb on Matchday 1 before a 5-1 loss at Manchester City in their second away game.
- Atalanta got their first point on the board with a 1-1 draw at home to City in their fourth fixture. They then picked up their first UEFA Champions League win with a 2-0 defeat of Dinamo in Milan and snatched a place in the last 16 thanks to a 3-0 win at Shakhtar on Matchday 6.
- Valencia were then dismantled in the round of 16, Atalanta winning 4-1 at home and 4-3 away with Josip Iličić scoring all the goals in Spain – the first time a player has scored four goals away in a UEFA Champions League knockout phase match – to take his side into a first European Cup quarter-final.
- The victory against Dinamo ended Atalanta's six-match winless run in Europe (D3 L3). The successes at Shakhtar and at home and away against Valencia have made it four consecutive European victories, a new club record; their previous best was three in a row in the 2018/19 UEFA Europa League qualifying phase.
- Before Matchday 1 the Italian club were unbeaten in seven matches in continental competition; they have still lost only four of their last 22 European games (W11 D7).
- This is Atalanta's 44th European match, and their seventh campaign in continental competition. They reached the European Cup Winners' Cup semi-finals in 1987/88 and the UEFA Cup quarter-finals three years later.
- Atalanta's record in European quarter-finals is W1 L1. They were 3-1 aggregate victors against Sporting CP in the 1987/88 European Cup Winners' Cup but lost 2-0 to Internazionale over two games in the 1990/91 UEFA Cup.
- Third in Serie A in 2018/19, their highest ever finish, and Coppa Italia runners-up, this is Atalanta's third successive European campaign. They came through the UEFA Europa League group stage in 2017/18, losing to Borussia Dortmund in the round of 32 (2-3 a, 1-1 h), and were beaten 4-3 on penalties by Copenhagen in the play-offs of the same competition in 2018/19 after the tie had finished goalless; Atalanta had earlier eliminated Sarajevo (10-2 aggregate) and Hapoel Haifa (6-1).
- Atalanta lost five of their first six away European matches (D1) but have since suffered only four defeats in 15 (W6 D5) and just three in the last 11 (W5 D3).
- Atalanta were the only team to make their UEFA Champions League group stage debut in 2019/20 – they were the tenth Italian club to feature and the 141st overall – and were one of two round of 16 debutants along with Germany's RB Leipzig, who have also reached the quarter-finals.
- The Italian club's record in UEFA knockout ties is W9 L6.
- This is only Atalanta's third fixture against a French club; they took four points off Lyon in the 2017/18 UEFA Europa League group stage, winning 1-0 at home after a 1-1 away draw in which Alejandro Gómez scored the Italian side's goal.
- Atalanta's record in Portugal is D1 L1, both those games coming in Lisbon against Sporting CP. They lost 3-1 in the 1963/64 European Cup Winners' Cup preliminary round second leg (3-3 aggregate, 1-3 replay) and drew 1-1 in the quarter-final second leg of the same competition in 1987/88 (3-1 aggregate).
- Atalanta have yet to feature in a UEFA penalty shoot-out.

#### Paris

- This is Paris's sixth appearance in the UEFA Champions League quarter-finals, where their record is W1 L4:

- Paris have won only two of their ten European Cup quarter-final matches (D4 L4). After their sole previous victory in a last-eight tie, in 1994/95, they lost to AC Milan in the semi-finals.
- Paris won all but one of their six games in this season's group stage, dropping points only in a 2-2 draw at Real Madrid on Matchday 5. They beat the Spanish side 3-0 at the Parc des Princes in the opening round of fixtures, and twice defeated Club Brugge (5-0 a, 1-0 h) and Galatasaray (1-0 a, 5-0 h).
- In the round of 16, the French club overturned a 2-1 first-leg defeat at Borussia Dortmund to progress thanks to a 2-0 home win, their first aggregate knockout victory since March 2016.
- Thomas Tuchel's side had the best defensive record in this season's group stage having conceded only twice, both goals against Madrid, and have now conceded only four times, still fewer than any other club.
- Paris have won ten of their last 15 UEFA Champions League matches (D3 L2) and have now scored in 32 consecutive games in the competition.
- Ligue 1 champions for the seventh time in eight years in 2019/20, and ninth time overall, this is the French side's eighth successive UEFA Champions League campaign.
- Semi-finalists in 1995, Paris have been knocked out in the round of 16 in the last three seasons having been eliminated in the quarter-finals in the four previous campaigns. In 2018/19, Paris looked set to reach the last eight after a 2-0 first-leg victory at Manchester United in the round of 16, but bowed out on away goals following a 3-1 home defeat.
- Paris last visited Portugal for a 2-1 defeat at Benfica in the 2013/14 UEFA Champions League group stage, a match that also took place at the Estádio do Sport Lisboa e Benfica. That made it three losses from three visits to both Lisbon and the ground, all against Benfica; their overall record in Portugal is W1 D1 L5, the sole success a 1-0 victory at Braga in the 2008/09 UEFA Cup round of 16 second leg.
- Paris have drawn their last six games against Italian clubs, most recently home (2-2) and away (1-1) with Napoli in the 2018/19 UEFA Champions League group stage. They have not beaten a Serie A side since a 3-1 defeat of Parma in the quarter-final second leg of their victorious UEFA Cup Winners' Cup campaign in 1995/96; that is their sole success in their last 15 matches with Italian clubs (D7 L7) and only their second overall (D9 L9).
- The Parisian club's record in knockout ties against Italian opponents is W3 L5; they won the most recent, defeating Brescia on away goals in a 2001 UEFA Intertoto Cup final (0-0 h, 1-1 a).
- Paris's European penalty shoot-out record is W0 L1:

- Verratti is an Italian international but has never played in Serie A having moved to Paris after leading Pescara to promotion to the top flight in 2012. He was sent off for a second bookable offence in Pescara's 2-0 home defeat by Atalanta in Serie B on 11 September 2009.
- Icardi scored seven goals in 13 games against Atalanta during his time in Serie A, including a hat-trick in Inter's 7-1 win at San Siro on 12 March 2017. Remo Freuler got the visitors' consolation goal.
- Both Thiago Silva and Marquinhos won the two Serie A games they played against Atalanta while in Italy.

## Latest News

### Atalanta

- Atalanta ended the 2019/20 Serie A season in third place, setting new club records for points (78) and victories (23).
- Atalanta also had the best attacking record in Serie A with 98 goals scored in 38 games – the highest total since Milan scored 118 goals in 1949/50.
- The Orobici won six consecutive games after football resumed in Italy, a run only broken by Cristiano Ronaldo's added-time penalty for Juventus in a 2-2 draw on 11 July.
- Gian Piero Gasperini's side won nine and drew three of their first 12 matches after football resumed, Inter ending their unbeaten run with a 2-0 victory in Bergamo on 1 August on the final matchday of the season.
- Duván Zapata and Luis Muriel both scored 18 Serie A goals for Atalanta this season, 11 of Muriel's coming as a substitute. Josip Iličić ended the campaign with 15 league goals.
- Robin Gosens scored nine goals this season having never previously managed more than three in a single league campaign.
- Alejandro Gómez ended the season with 14 assists, behind only Lazio's Luis Alberto (15) in the Serie A rankings.
- On 14 July Atalanta defeated Brescia 6-2. It was the sixth time this season that they had scored five or more goals in a game; they also hit seven on three occasions.
- Iličić has not played since the 2-2 draw at Juventus on 11 July. He has not scored since putting four goals past Valencia in Atalanta's last UEFA Champions League outing.
- José Palomino has been out since suffering a thigh injury in the 2-1 win at Parma on 28 July while goalkeeper Pierluigi Gollini was forced off with a knee injury just four minutes into the loss against Inter four days later.

### Paris

- Paris have won two trophies in their last two games, completing a fourth domestic treble. On 24 July, they defeated St-Étienne in the French Cup final, Neymar scoring the only goal at the Stade de France. It was their record-extending 13th victory in the competition.
- A week later Paris returned to the venue to clinch a record ninth League Cup, beating Lyon 6-5 on penalties after 120 goalless minutes. After ten successful spot kicks, Keylor Navas saved from Bertrand Traoré, leaving Pablo Sarabia to convert the winning kick.
- Paris were also crowned French champions for the third year in a row, seventh in eight seasons and ninth time overall.
- Paris have lost only one of their last 30 games in all competitions (W25 D4) – at Dortmund, in the round of 16 first leg. Their previous defeat was a 2-1 league reverse in Dijon on 1 November.
- Aged 17 years 253 days Tanguy Kouassi struck twice in a 4-4 draw at Amiens on 15 February, making him the second youngest player ever to score a Ligue 1 double for Paris after Lionel Justier in March 1976 against Nîmes (17 years 212 days).
- Paris have scored 65 goals in 20 matches in all competitions in 2020.
- Paris had found the net in 36 consecutive matches in all competitions, following a 2-0 home defeat against Reims on 25 September, before the goalless draw with Lyon in the League Cup final.
- Paris played four friendlies between 12 July and 5 August, scoring 21 goals without conceding in winning all four. In their last game before travelling to Portugal they defeated Sochaux 1-0 at the Parc des Princes on 5 August, Eric Maxim Choupo-Moting scoring the only goal.
- Juan Bernat, who missed the cup finals with calf and thigh muscle injuries, returned against Sochaux, although Marco Verratti sat out the match having suffered a calf problem in training on 4 August.
- Mbappé missed the League Cup final having suffered an ankle injury in the French Cup final. The joint leading marksman in the 2019/20 Ligue 1 with 18 goals, he is Paris's top scorer this year with 12 goals, two more than Neymar and Sarabia.
- Thiago Silva, Layvin Kurzawa, Mauro Icardi (all thigh) and Marquinhos (leg) were all taken off in the French League

Cup final.

- Abdou Diallo had not played since 26 January due to a thigh problem before coming on in that match against Lyon. Colin Dagba had been out since spraining a knee during the 2-0 French Cup victory at Pau on 29 January but returned as a first-half substitute in the final against St-Étienne.

- Paris's record goalscorer Edinson Cavani left the club as a free agent on 30 June, when Thomas Meunier joined Dortmund.

**Official UEFA Champions League Man of the Match award introduced**

**UEFA will give out an official Man of the Match award after every UEFA Champions League knockout stage game to recognise the top performers in Europe's top club competition. UEFA Technical Observers at each UEFA Champions League game from the round of 16 on will decide who deserves the Man of the Match, with an official award being handed to the successful players after full-time in recognition of their roles in decisive moments, tactical maturity, creativity and inspiration, exceptional skill and fair play.**

**Coaching career:** Juventus (youth), Crotone, Genoa, Internazionale, Palermo (twice), Genoa, Atalanta

- Gasperini came up through Juventus youth ranks alongside Italy legend Paolo Rossi but never played in Serie A for the Bianconeri, only appearing in the Coppa Italia. Loaned to Reggiana in 1977/78, he joined Palermo for the following campaign.
- After spells at Cavese and Pistoiese, the midfielder moved to Pescara in 1985 and captained the team to promotion to Serie A two years later; scored on his top-flight debut in September 1987 and stayed at the club until 1990, ending his career in the lower divisions with Salernitana and Vis Pesaro.
- After seven successful years as coach in Juventus's youth system, Gasperini took over at Crotone in 2003, leading the southern side into Serie B during his first season before joining Genoa in 2006; again gained promotion in his debut campaign, taking his new club up to the highest division and winning the Panchina d'Argento (Silver Bench) as Serie B's coach of the season.
- Famous for his attacking football and tactical knowledge, in 2008/09 Gasperini led Genoa to fifth place in Serie A, losing out on a place in the UEFA Champions League to Fiorentina only on the head-to-head rule. The first Genoa coach to win three Serie A derbies against city rivals Sampdoria, he was sacked after only ten games of the 2010/11 season.
- Had three months as Inter coach in 2011 before two short spells at Palermo and three years back in charge at Genoa. Appointed Atalanta coach in June 2016, his first season in Bergamo ended with the club in fourth place, earning their first European campaign in 27 years; Atalanta reached the 2017/18 UEFA Europa League round of 32 and finished third in Serie A the following season to reach the UEFA Champions League group stage for the first time.

### Thomas Tuchel

- Tuchel had a fairly undistinguished playing career, retiring prematurely in 1998 due to injury. His first off-pitch role was with the Stuttgart youth team. He subsequently joined Augsburg, where he coached the U19s and reserve sides as well as serving as academy coordinator.
- Tuchel moved to Mainz in 2008 and was initially in charge of the U19s, whom he led to a German title. A year after joining the club, Tuchel succeeded Jørn Andersen as coach of the senior team. He went on to help the club qualify twice for the UEFA Europa League, though Mainz were eliminated at the third qualifying round stage on both occasions.
- He took over from Jürgen Klopp in the Dortmund dugout prior to the 2015/16 campaign and led his side to the UEFA Europa League quarter-finals, where they came up against Klopp's Liverpool team – and lost 5-4 on aggregate.
- Dortmund fared well under Tuchel in the Bundesliga in 2015/16, racking up 78 points to finish second behind Bayern München and qualify automatically for the 2016/17 UEFA Champions League group stage. They were also beaten by Bayern in the German Cup final in Tuchel's debut season.
- Tuchel's first coaching honour followed in 2016/17, Dortmund overcoming Eintracht Frankfurt 3-1 in the German Cup final in what proved to be his last match in charge; he left the club three days later and returned to football 12 months later, signing a two-year deal to replace Unai Emery at Paris and winning the club's second successive league title in his first season in charge to earn a contract extension until 2021. In 2019/20 he led the team to a domestic treble of Ligue 1, Coupe de France and League Cup.

### UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

#### Overall records

- In 2016/17 Real Madrid became the first team to successfully defend the UEFA Champions League trophy, with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the previous club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- Real Madrid then made it three wins in a row in 2017/18, becoming the fourth club to win three or more successive titles in European Cup history, and the first to do it twice.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.

#### Knockout stage

- In 2019/20 Real Madrid qualified for the UEFA Champions League knockout phase for a record 24th time, including 23 in succession. They have also played a competition-high 99 knockout phase matches – ahead of Barcelona (94) and Bayern München (93).
- In all, 30 ties have required extra time. Fourteen have been settled by extra time alone: six round of 16 encounters including Atlético-Liverpool in 2019/20, five quarter-finals, the 2007/08 semi-final between Chelsea and Liverpool, and the 2013/14 final between Real Madrid and Atlético Madrid.
- Sixteen ties have gone to penalties, including seven finals – 1996, 2001, 2003, 2005, 2008, 2012 and 2016. The first two-legged tie decided on spot kicks was PSV Eindhoven's 4-2 victory over Lyon on 13 April 2005 after a 2-2 aggregate draw, still the only quarter-final to go to penalties. Bayern, Chelsea and Atlético Madrid have all appeared in three shoot-outs, sharing the competition record, with Bayern, Atlético and Liverpool having won the most (two apiece).
- There have been 208 UEFA Champions League quarter-finalists. Spain has provided the largest number (51), followed by England (44), with Germany in third place on 31. Twelve other countries have provided teams for the last eight.
- In 2019/20 Barcelona reached a record 13th successive European Cup quarter-final.
- Barça and Bayern have both reached 18 UEFA Champions League quarter-finals, two more than Real Madrid.
- The biggest European Cup quarter-final victory was Real Madrid's 8-0 first-leg defeat of Sevilla in 1957/58
- Manchester United's 7-1 win against Roma in 2006/07 is the biggest victory in a UEFA Champions League quarter-final match. Bayern beat Porto 6-1 in 2014/15, Barcelona have twice won 5-1, against Chelsea after extra time (1999/2000) and Shakhtar Donetsk (2010/11), while there have been four 4-0 victories.
- Bayern and Manchester City jointly hold the record for the largest margin of victory in a UEFA Champions League knockout match. Bayern beat both Basel (2011/12) and Shakhtar Donetsk (2014/15) 7-0 in the round of 16 second leg, while City beat Schalke by the same scoreline at the same stage of the 2018/19 competition.
- A record five clubs from England participated in the 2017/18 knockout phase. Including 2019/20, England has also provided four clubs on eight other occasions – as has Spain five times and Germany twice. England is the only nation to have provided four quarter-finalists in a season, 2018/19 being the third occasion after 2007/08 and 2008/09.
- There are four clubs from two nations in the round of 16 for only the third time in 2019/20. England and Spain both had four apiece in 2008/09, and there were four each from England and Germany in 2013/14.
- Clarence Seedorf is the only player to have lifted the European Cup with three clubs (Ajax 1995, Real Madrid 1998, Milan 2003, 2007). Bob Paisley (Liverpool 1977, 1978, 1981) was the first coach to win it three times, a feat Carlo Ancelotti (Milan 2003, 2007, Real Madrid 2014) and Zinedine Zidane (2016, 2017, 2018) have replicated.
- In 2014 Ancelotti also became the fifth coach to win the trophy with two clubs; Ottmar Hitzfeld (Borussia Dortmund 1997, Bayern 2001), Ernst Happel (Feyenoord 1970, Hamburg 1983), José Mourinho (Porto 2004, Internazionale 2010) and Jupp Heynckes (Real Madrid 1998, Bayern 2013) had previously achieved the feat.

#### Goalscoring records

- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer Leverkusen on 7 March 2012, a feat matched by Shakhtar Donetsk's Luiz Adriano at BATE Borisov on 21 October 2014. Fourteen more players, also including Messi, have scored four times in a game, including two Bayern players, Serge Gnabry

and Robert Lewandowski, in this season's group fixtures at Tottenham Hotspur and Crvena zvezda respectively, plus Atalanta's Josip Iličić at Valencia in the round of 16 second leg.

- Cristiano Ronaldo set a new record for a UEFA Champions League group stage with 11 goals in 2015/16, eclipsing his own mark of nine in 2013/14, which Luiz Adriano matched in 2014/15 and Ronaldo himself equalled in 2017/18. Messi got ten goals in 2016/17, as did Lewandowski this season; Zlatan Ibrahimović (2013/14), Ruud van Nistelrooy (2004/05), Filippo Inzaghi, Hernán Crespo (both 2002/03), Lewandowski (2018/19) and Erling Braut Haaland (2019/20) all managed eight.

- Messi's hat-trick against PSV Eindhoven on Matchday 1 of the 2018/19 competition was his eighth in the competition, a mark Ronaldo matched against Atlético Madrid in that season's round of 16 second leg.

#### **Oldest and youngest players**

- Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid on Matchday 6 in 2007/08 aged 43 years and 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens in 2006/07.

- Francesco Totti is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 38 years and 59 days, in Roma's 1-1 draw at CSKA Moskva on 25 November 2014. Ryan Giggs (37 years 290 days) was the previous record holder.

- Celestine Babayaro is the youngest player to have appeared; he was 16 years and 87 days when he started for Anderlecht against Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994. He was sent off in the 37th minute.

- Ansu Fati's winner for Barcelona at Inter on Matchday 6 in 2019/20 made him the youngest goalscorer in UEFA Champions League history, at the age of 17 years 40 days. He eclipsed the previous record of Olympiacos's Peter Ofori-Quaye (17 years 195 days) that had lasted since 1 October 1997.
