Match background

Manchester City are closing in on a fourth successive quarter-final appearance as they hold a 2-0 first-leg lead against Borussia Mönchengladbach.

- The English side took control of this tie – Gladbach's first in the UEFA Champions League round of 16 – with victory in the first leg, played like this game at Budapest's Puskás Aréna, thanks to a goal in each half from Bernardo Silva and Gabriel Jesus.
- While City eased into the last 16 as Group C winners, recording five victories in their six matches and conceding only one goal, Gladbach finished second behind Real Madrid in a tight Group B to reach the knockout stages for the first time in only their third campaign in the UEFA Champions League proper.
- City are in the round of 16 for the eighth season running and have won their last three ties at this stage; in contrast this is Mönchengladbach's first European Cup knockout tie, outside qualifying, in over 40 years.

Previous meetings

- City and Mönchengladbach met in the UEFA Champions League group stage in both 2015/16 and 2016/17, the English club winning three of those four fixtures – although the last of them, on Matchday 5 in the latter campaign, ended in a 1-1 draw in Germany with Raffael's opener cancelled out by David Silva in first-half added time.
- Sergio Agüero's hat-trick had helped City to a 4-0 win at home to Mönchengladbach on Matchday 1 of that 2016/17 season. Josep Guardiola's side went on to finish second behind Barcelona with nine points, four ahead of André Schubert's Mönchengladbach who finished third.
- City won 2-1 in Mönchengladbach on 30 September 2015. After Joe Hart's first-half penalty save from Raffael, Gladbach scored through Lars Stindl but City responded through Martin Demichelis and Agüero's last-minute penalty.
- City fought back once more to consign Gladbach to a fourth-placed finish in the group when beating them 4-2 on Matchday 6. The visitors had led 2-1 after Julian Korb and Raffael overturned David Silva's goal, but City struck three times in the last ten minutes, Raheem Sterling (twice) and Wilfried Bony ensuring they won the section.
- The teams' only previous knockout tie came in the 1978/79 UEFA Cup quarter-finals, Mönchengladbach winning 4-2 on aggregate (1-1 a, 3-1 h) en route to lifting the trophy. Ewald Lienen cancelled out Mick Channon's goal in the first leg at Maine Road and Gladbach won the return 3-1 thanks to goals by Christian Kulik, Hans-Günter Bruns and Karl Del'Haye. Kazimierz Deyna scored for City.

Form guide

Manchester City

- City scored three goals in each of their first three Group C victories this season, beating Porto (3-1), Marseille and Olympiacos (both 3-0) before a 1-0 win in Greece on Matchday 4 secured progress. A goalless draw in Porto in their penultimate fixture confirmed City in first place before a closing 2-0 win at home to Marseille.
- It is 616 minutes since City conceded a UEFA Champions League goal, Luis Díaz's 14th-minute opener for Porto on Matchday 1. The record for the competition, set by Arsenal in 2005/06, is 995 minutes, with Juventus second in the all-time rankings on 690 minutes.
- Jesus has scored in City's last four round of 16 matches, and in all five of his appearances at this stage of the UEFA Champions League.
- City finished second in the 2019/20 Premier League and bowed out of the UEFA Champions League at the quarter-final stage for the third season running, going down 3-1 against Lyon in their one-off tie in Lisbon.
- City had finished first in their group with 14 points (W4 D2) before seeing off Real Madrid in the last 16, winning 2-1 away and at home against the 13-time European champions.
- This is the Cityzens' tenth UEFA Champions League campaign; they have been involved every season since 2011/12.
- City have scored 50 goals in their last 20 UEFA Champions League matches; over the last three seasons their record is W19 D4 L3 with 66 goals scored and 22 conceded.
- Guardiola's team are unbeaten in 11 home European matches (W10 D1) since a 2-1 loss against Lyon on Matchday 1 in 2018/19.
- City's best UEFA Champions League performance was reaching the 2015/16 semi-finals.
- City have featured in the round of 16 every season from 2013/14 onwards. Their record at this stage is W4 L3; last season's win against Madrid was their third successive last-16 victory.
- City have won their last three home matches in the UEFA Champions League knockout phase – and four of the last

six (L2) – but overall have won only five of their 11 home knockout matches in the competition (D2 L4). In the round of 16, their home record is W3 D1 L3.

- City have already faced German opponents in the UEFA Champions League round of 16, beating Schalke 10-2 on aggregate in the 2018/19 edition. A 7-0 home win in that second leg is the club's record victory in UEFA club competition.
- That aggregate win against Schalke made City's record in two-legged ties against German clubs W2 L2. They had also beaten the Gelsenkirchen side in the semi-finals of their victorious European Cup Winners' Cup campaign in 1969/70; they lost in the UEFA Cup quarter-finals to Mönchengladbach in 1978/79 and Hamburg 30 years later.
- That was the Cityzens' fifth successive home victory against Bundesliga visitors; a 3-2 defeat by Bayern München in 2013 is their sole loss to German opposition in Manchester (W8 D2).
- The 1-1 draw in Mönchengladbach in November 2016 is the only one of City's last ten matches against German clubs they have failed to win, stretching back to a 1-0 loss at Bayern in September 2014.
- City had never played a German club on neutral territory before this tie. Before the first leg against Mönchengladbach, they had played only once previously in Hungary, a 1-0 win at Budapest Honvéd in the 1970/71 European Cup Winners' Cup second round first leg at the Bozsik József Stadion.
- City have never failed to win a European tie after an away first-leg victory. There have been 11 such contests, including in the round of 16 in each of the last two seasons – against Schalke in 2018/19 and Real Madrid last season. They have only won the away game 2-0 once before, against EB/Streymur of the Faroe Islands in the 2008/09 UEFA Cup first qualifying round (2-0 h).
- City's record in two UEFA penalty shoot-outs is W2 L0:

Mönchengladbach

- This is Mönchengladbach's third UEFA Champions League appearance, both previous participations – in 2015/16 and 2016/17 – ending in group stage elimination. Fourth in their debut campaign, the German club finished third 12 months later.
- This season, the German club conceded late goals to draw each of their first two fixtures 2-2, shipping a 90th-minute equaliser at Internazionale before drawing at home to Real Madrid, a match in which they had led 2-0 until the 87th minute. Gladbach then stormed to the top of Group B with a 6-0 win at Shakhtar Donetsk, Alassane Pléa scoring a hat-trick in his club's record away UEFA Champions League victory; their biggest home success followed on Matchday 4 with a 4-0 defeat of the Ukrainian side at Borussia-Park, and that proved enough for second place despite subsequent defeats at home to Inter (2-3) and in Madrid (0-2).
- Mönchengladbach took part in the UEFA Europa League group stage in 2019/20, finishing third behind İstanbul Başakşehir and Roma in their section. Marco Rose's side picked up eight points (W2 D2 L2) from their six fixtures.
- The Foals have won four of their last ten European games (D2 L4) and only five of the last 20 (D8 L7).
- This is only Mönchengladbach's third game in Budapest and Hungary; the first leg followed a 3-0 win against local side Vasas in the 1977/78 European Cup first round first leg at the Népstadion, which was demolished in 2016 to make way for the new Puskás Aréna.
- The Matchday 6 loss at Real Madrid ended Mönchengladbach's seven-match unbeaten run in European away games (W3 D4); it was their first away loss since a 4-0 reverse at Barcelona on Matchday 6 of the 2016/17 UEFA Champions League.
- Mönchengladbach are one of two teams making their first round of 16 appearance this season, along with Lazio.
- Although Mönchengladbach took part in the UEFA Champions League play-offs in 2012/13, losing 4-3 on aggregate to Dynamo Kyiv, this is their first knockout tie in the European Cup proper since a 4-2 loss over two legs against Liverpool in the 1977/78 semi-finals (2-1 h, 0-3 a).
- Gladbach lost their first three two-legged knockout ties against English clubs but have been victorious in the last two, most recently beating Arsenal in the 1996/97 UEFA Cup first round having won both matches 3-2.
- The German club have twice lost European finals to English clubs, both against Liverpool; in the 1972/73 UEFA Cup (2-3 aggregate) and the European Cup four years later (1-3).
- Mönchengladbach's only European meetings with Premier League opponents since 1996 have been their five games against City; that win at Arsenal is their only away success against an English team (D2 L4).

- Mönchengladbach have won only one of the five UEFA ties in which they were beaten in the home first leg, although that came in the most recent, against Fiorentina in the 2016/17 UEFA Europa League round of 32 (0-1 h, 4-2 a). They have never before lost the home first game 2-0, although they have twice gone down by two-goal margins, to Monaco in the 1996/97 UEFA Cup second round (2-4 h, 1-0 a) and Dynamo Kyiv in the 2012/13 UEFA Champions League play-offs (1-3 h, 2-1 a).

- Gladbach lost their only previous UEFA penalty shoot-out:
3-4 v Everton, 1970/71 European Champion Clubs' Cup second round

- Oleksandr Zinchenko's goal past Yann Sommer earned Ukraine a 2-1 UEFA Nations League win against Switzerland on 3 September 2020; Nico Elvedi and Breel Embolo were also on the losing side in Lviv.

- Bernardo Silva's next appearance in the UEFA Champions League, group stage to final, will be his 50th.

- City's 21-match winning run in all competitions was ended by a 2-0 home derby defeat against Manchester United on 7 March. Bruno Fernandes opened the scoring from the penalty spot after 101 seconds, the earliest Premier League goal City have conceded at the City of Manchester Stadium.

- That was also the first time City had trailed in 20 Premier League fixtures.

- The Citizens were also unbeaten in 28 games in all competitions (W25 D3), since a 2-0 Premier League loss at Tottenham on 21 November, before losing to United.

- Defeat by United was City's second at home this season in all competitions and a first since a 5-2 Premier League loss to Leicester on 27 September; their home record otherwise is W17 D2. They had won nine in a row before losing to United.

- Josep Guardiola's side bounced back with a 5-2 win at home to Southampton on 10 March, Riyad Mahrez and Kevin De Bruyne both scoring twice.

- City were 3-0 winners at Fulham on Saturday, John Stones making it four Premier League goals for the season with the opener – he had never previously managed more than one in a campaign – with Gabriel Jesus and Sergio Agüero, a penalty, scoring the others.

- The weekend was only Agüero's fourth Premier League start this season after knee and hamstring problems. His goal was his first in the league since 21 January 2020.

- Stones scored only once in his first 170 Premier League appearances for Everton and City, but now has four goals in his last ten games.
- City have won their last 13 away games in all competitions, surpassing the previous record for an English top-flight team of 11 they set themselves between May and November 2017.
- İlkay Gündoğan, who also found the net against Southampton, has scored ten goals in 14 Premier League appearances in 2021.
- City have also reached the English League Cup for the fourth year in a row – and the sixth time in eight seasons – with wins away to Arsenal in the quarter-finals (4-1) and Manchester United in the semis (2-0). City, who have won the trophy three years running, will play Tottenham at Wembley on 25 April.
- Guardiola's side are also into the FA Cup quarter-finals thanks to a 3-0 home win against Birmingham and 3-1 successes at Cheltenham and Swansea. They will visit Everton in the last eight on 20 March.
- Nathan Aké has not played since 26 December due to a hamstring injury.
- De Bruyne was included in the UEFA.com fans' Men's Team of the Year 2020.

- Gladbach have lost their last six games in all competitions, going down 3-1 at Augsburg on Friday night. It is their longest run of defeats since they lost eight in a row in 1989/90.
- Marco Rose's team are without a win in eight games, since a 2-1 German Cup success in Stuttgart on 3 February. Their record since is D1 L7.
- Gladbach have won only six of their last 22 matches in all competitions (D6 L10).
- Mönchengladbach have failed to score in four of their last seven matches, and three of the last five.
- Three days after the first leg against Manchester City they succumbed 3-2 in Leipzig, letting slip a 2-0 lead.
- On 2 March Gladbach lost 1-0 at home in the German Cup quarter-finals against Borussia Dortmund, going down by the same scoreline at home to Bayer Leverkusen four days later.
- After 25 Bundesliga matchdays Gladbach have amassed 33 points – 16 less than at the same stage of last season.
- Christoph Kramer (ankle) and Jonas Hofmann (muscular problems) both missed the game against Leverkusen, with Hofmann returning to play 90 minutes on Friday.
- Ramy Bensebaini missed Friday's defeat at Augsburg with a knock.
- Mamadou Doucouré has been sidelined since December because of muscular problems.
- On 15 February Gladbach announced that coach Rose will leave the club to join Dortmund at the end of the season.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

Overall records

- In 2016/17 Real Madrid became the first team to successfully defend the UEFA Champions League trophy, with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the previous club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United (2008, 2009) have all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- Real Madrid's 2018 triumph made them the first team to win three successive European Cups twice. The Spanish side won the first five editions of the tournament, between 1956 and 1960; Ajax (1971–73) and Bayern München (1974–76) have also lifted the trophy three years in a row.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.

Knockout stage

- Real Madrid have qualified for the UEFA Champions League knockout phase a record 25 times, including 24 in succession. They have also played a competition-high 99 knockout phase matches – ahead of Bayern München and Barcelona (both 96).
- Teams have overturned a first-leg deficit to go through 49 times, including six in 2018/19 – a competition record for a single season – and Paris Saint-Germain in last season's round of 16.
- Before 2018/19, only twice – Ajax's defeat of Panathinaikos in the 1995/96 semi-finals and Internazionale's victory against Bayern in the 2010/11 round of 16 – had a side progressed after a home first-leg loss. However, Ajax again (against Real Madrid) and Manchester United (against Paris Saint-Germain) both achieved the feat in the 2018/19 round of 16 before Tottenham (against Ajax) did likewise in the semi-finals.
- The biggest losing margin a side has overhauled was achieved by Barcelona against Paris in the 2016/17 last 16, when they lost 4-0 away but progressed thanks to a 6-1 home success. That eclipsed the previous record held by Deportivo La Coruña in the 2003/04 quarter-finals, when they went down 4-1 at AC Milan but won 4-0 at home; Roma equalled that margin in the 2017/18 quarter-finals, turning round a 4-1 first-leg loss at Barcelona with a 3-0 home success, while in the 2018/19 semi-finals Liverpool lost 3-0 in the first leg at Barcelona but went through after a 4-0 home victory.
- Thirty-five ties have been decided on away goals, including 13 where the triumphant team lost the first leg. Bayern and Monaco have benefited from the away goals rule five times – more than any other club – whereas Internazionale have been eliminated by that method a record four times.
- In all, 31 ties have required extra time. Fifteen have been settled by extra time alone: eight round of 16 encounters including Porto-Juventus in 2020/21, five quarter-finals, the 2007/08 semi-final between Chelsea and Liverpool, and the 2013/14 final between Real Madrid and Atlético.
- Sixteen ties have gone to penalties, including seven finals – 1996, 2001, 2003, 2005, 2008, 2012 and 2016. The first two-legged tie decided on spot kicks was PSV Eindhoven's 4-2 victory over Lyon on 13 April 2005 after a 2-2 aggregate draw, still the only quarter-final to go to penalties. Bayern, Chelsea and Atlético have all appeared in three shoot-outs, sharing the competition record, with Bayern, Atlético and Liverpool having won the most (two apiece).
- The 2015/16 round of 16 tie between Atlético and PSV was the first to finish goalless after two legs. Thirteen have finished 1-0 on aggregate, most recently Real Madrid's defeat of Manchester City in the 2015/16 semi-finals.
- Liverpool (versus Porto) and Bayern (versus Beşiktaş) both won 5-0 in the 2017/18 round of 16, equalling the knockout phase record for the biggest first-leg lead – Real Madrid's 6-1 victory at Schalke in 2013/14 and Bayern's 5-0 success at Sporting CP in 2008/09, both also in the round of 16.
- Bayern eventually beat Sporting by a record aggregate margin of 12-1 after a 7-1 stroll in the home second leg; that tie also featured more goals (13) over its two legs than any UEFA Champions League knockout tie until it was equalled by Liverpool's 7-6 aggregate win against Roma in the 2017/18 semi-final.
- Bayern and Manchester City jointly hold the record for the largest margin of victory in a UEFA Champions League knockout match. Bayern beat both Basel (2011/12) and Shakhtar Donetsk (2014/15) 7-0 in the round of 16 second leg, while City beat Schalke by the same scoreline at the same stage of the 2018/19 competition.
- A record five clubs from England participated in the 2017/18 knockout phase. Including 2019/20, England has also provided four clubs on eight other occasions – as has Spain six times and Germany three. England is the only nation

to have provided four quarter-finalists in a season, 2018/19 being the third occasion after 2007/08 and 2008/09.

- There are four clubs from two nations in the round of 16 for only the fourth time in 2020/21 (Germany and Spain). England and Spain both had four apiece in 2008/09, there were four each from England and Germany in 2013/14 while in 2019/20 Spain and England each had four representatives.
- Clarence Seedorf is the only player to have lifted the European Cup with three clubs (Ajax 1995, Real Madrid 1998, Milan 2003, 2007). Bob Paisley (Liverpool 1977, 1978, 1981) was the first coach to win it three times, a feat Carlo Ancelotti (Milan 2003, 2007, Real Madrid 2014) and Zinedine Zidane (2016, 2017, 2018) have replicated.
- In 2014 Ancelotti also became the fifth coach to win the trophy with two clubs; Ottmar Hitzfeld (Borussia Dortmund 1997, Bayern 2001), Ernst Happel (Feyenoord 1970, Hamburg 1983), José Mourinho (Porto 2004, Internazionale 2010) and Jupp Heynckes (Real Madrid 1998, Bayern 2013) had previously achieved the feat.

Goalscoring records

- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer Leverkusen on 7 March 2012, a feat matched by Shakhtar Donetsk's Luiz Adriano at BATE Borisov on 21 October 2014. Fourteen more players, also including Messi and Robert Lewandowski twice, have scored four times in a game, most recently Olivier Giroud for Chelsea at Sevilla in the 2020/21 group stage. That was the fourth quadruple in succession to be scored away from home after Bayern's Serge Gnabry and Lewandowski (group stage v Tottenham and Crvena zvezda respectively) and Josip Iličić (Atalanta v Valencia, round of 16 second leg) all achieved the feat in 2019/20.
- Cristiano Ronaldo has scored 67 goals in the UEFA Champions League knockout rounds, more than any other player. Messi is second on 47 goals, ahead of Lewandowski (24), Thomas Müller (23), and Karim Benzema, Raúl González and Andriy Shevchenko (all 18).
- Messi's hat-trick against PSV Eindhoven on Matchday 1 of the 2018/19 competition was his eighth in the competition, a mark Ronaldo matched against Atlético de Madrid in that season's round of 16 second leg.

Oldest and youngest players

- Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid on Matchday 6 in 2007/08 aged 43 years 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens in 2006/07.
- Francesco Totti is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 38 years 59 days, in Roma's 1-1 draw at CSKA Moskva on 25 November 2014. Ryan Giggs (37 years 290 days) was the previous record holder.
- Youssoufa Moukoko is the youngest player to have appeared, aged 16 years 18 days for Borussia Dortmund at Zenit on 8 December 2020. He replaced Celestine Babayaro, who was 16 years 87 days when he started for Anderlecht against Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994; Babayaro was sent off in the 37th minute.
- Ansu Fati's winner for Barcelona at Inter on Matchday 6 in 2019/20 made him the youngest goalscorer in UEFA Champions League history, at the age of 17 years 40 days. He eclipsed the previous record of Olympiacos's Peter Ofori-Quaye (17 years 195 days) that had lasted since 1 October 1997.
