## Match background

---

Shakhtar Donetsk and Sheriff bring down the curtain on their respective UEFA Champions League campaigns with the Moldovan side secure in third place in Group D.

- Sheriff kicked off their first group campaign in the competition in style with a 2-0 home defeat of Shakhtar thanks to goals from Adama Traoré (16) and Momo Yansane (62). A famous 2-1 victory at Real Madrid followed, but a subsequent run of three defeats, including a 3-0 loss at home to the Spanish side on Matchday 5, has derailed Sheriff's chances of a top-two finish.
- Shakhtar have picked up only one point, from a goalless draw at home to Inter on Matchday 2; their hopes of claiming third place ahead of Sheriff were ended by a 2-0 loss in Milan last time out.

### Previous meetings

- The teams' sole contest before this season came in the 2003/04 UEFA Champions League second qualifying round, a goalless first leg in Tiraspol preceding a 2-0 Shakhtar win in Donetsk thanks to second-half goals from Zvonimir Vukić and Brandão.
- Shakhtar failed to make the group stage, however, losing 3-2 on aggregate to Lokomotiv Moskva in the third qualifying round.

### Form guide

#### Shakhtar

- Shakhtar's run of four successive Ukrainian Premier League titles was ended in 2020/21 as they finished second to Dynamo Kyiv, ending the season 11 points adrift. Defeat in the Ukrainian Cup quarter-finals ensured the Pitmen finished without a trophy for the first time since 2014/15.
- That meant Shakhtar started the 2021/22 European campaign in the third qualifying round, where they beat Genk 2-1 in both Belgium and Ukraine. They needed extra time to see off Monaco in the play-offs (1-0 a, 2-2 h), a 115th-minute own goal from the French club's defender Ruben Aguilar proving decisive.
- UEFA Champions League quarter-finalists in 2010/11, Shakhtar are in the group stage for the 16th time and have now been eliminated at this juncture on 12 occasions, including the last four.
- Shakhtar's 2020/21 European campaign started in the UEFA Champions League group stage where, despite beating Real Madrid 3-2 away and 2-0 at home, they finished third in Group B behind the Spanish side and Borussia Mönchengladbach having picked up only two more points, although they did edge out Inter. A team coached by Luís Castro then overcame Maccabi Tel-Aviv in the UEFA Europa League round of 32 (2-0 a, 1-0 h) before losing to Roma in the last 16 (0-3 a, 1-2 h).
- Castro was replaced after two years as Shakhtar coach by Roberto De Zerbi, who joined from Sassuolo in the summer.
- Shakhtar have won only four of their last 24 UEFA Champions League matches, group stage to final (D9 L11).
- The Pitmen have also managed only five wins in their last 18 home European matches (D7 L6).
- Shakhtar also won their only other UEFA tie against Moldovan opponents, beating Zimbru Chişinău in the 1997/98 UEFA Cup Winners' Cup qualifying round (1-1 a, 3-0 h).

#### Sheriff

- Sheriff's success in coming through qualifying for the first time means Moldova are the 34th country to feature in the group stage and the first newcomers since Azerbaijan, with Qarabağ, in 2017/18.
- Sheriff are the 146th team to appear in the group stage, and the only debutants in 2021/22.
- Domestic champions for the 19th time – and sixth in succession – in 2020/21, Sheriff are also the only Moldovan side to reach the UEFA Europa League group stage having appeared in 2009/10, 2010/11, 2013/14 and 2017/18.
- Sheriff were beaten 5-3 on penalties by Dundalk after a 1-1 home draw in last season's one-off UEFA Europa League third qualifying round tie. They had started the season in the UEFA Champions League, beating Fola Esch of Luxembourg 2-0 at home in the first qualifying round before a 2-1 loss at Qarabağ in the next stage.
- The Tiraspol club were unbeaten in their eight UEFA Champions League qualifying matches this season, winning both legs against both Teuta of Albania in the first qualifying round (4-0 a, 1-0 h) and Alashkert of Armenia in the second (1-0 a, 3-1 h). They were held 1-1 at 1991 European champions Crvena zvezda in the first leg of their third qualifying round tie, but Danilo Arboleda's goal at the end of the first half at the Sheriff Stadion proved enough to send the home side through.
- Sheriff then saw off group stage regulars Dinamo Zagreb in the play-offs, a 3-0 home win preceding a goalless draw

in Croatia.

- Defeat at Inter on Matchday 3 ended Sheriff's 11-match unbeaten European run (W8 D3). They have conceded three goals in each of their last three games, losing 3-1 away and at home against Inter before the 3-0 loss against Madrid.
- That loss at Inter was only Sheriff's second reverse in their last ten away European games (W5 D3).
- Aside from their three matches with Shakhtar, Sheriff's only other games against Ukrainian opponents came in the 2010/11 UEFA Europa League group stage, when they beat Shakhtar's great rivals Dynamo Kyiv 2-0 in Tiraspol on Matchday 2 before a goalless draw in Kyiv in the final round of games.

#### **Links and trivia**

- Sheriff head coach Yuriy Vernydub spent the majority of his playing career in his native Ukraine, representing Spartak Zhytomyr (1983–84), Kolos Nikopol (1987), Dnipro (1988), Prykarpattya (1988–89), Metalurh Zaporizhia (1989–93) and Torpedo Zaporizhia (1994–97).
- Following three spells as assistant coach at Metalurh Zaporizhia and, between 2009 and 2011, Zorya Luhansk, Vernydub took over as head coach of the latter in 2011.
- During eight years at helm of Zorya, he guided them to the Ukrainian Cup final in 2015/16, where they lost 2-0 to Shakhtar, and third place in the Ukrainian Premier League the following season.
- Matchday 1 was only Vernydub's fourth win as a coach against Shakhtar in his 24th fixture (D1 L19).

#### **Latest news**

##### **Shakhtar**

- Shakhtar are unbeaten in 16 domestic games (W14 D2) since a 2-1 home league loss against Olexandriya on 7 August. They beat Lviv 6-1 at home on Friday, their seventh straight league success with 24 goals scored and four conceded in that run.
- Six different players found the net against Lviv, Tetê opening the scoring with his ninth goal in ten league games and substitutes Artem Bondarenko and Yuhym Konopliia getting their first Shakhtar goals. Marlos, who had not scored since 25 September, and Taras Stepanenko, whose last Shakhtar goal came on 13 August, both struck for the second time in the league this season.
- On 28 November Shakhtar were 1-0 winners at Inhulets, Tetê scoring the only goal.
- Georgiy Sudakov, who missed Shakhtar's 2-0 loss to Inter on Matchday 5 with an injury, started against Inhulets and Lviv. Ismaily and Alan Patrick have been absent for the last three games, Fernando for the last two.
- Yevhen Konoplyanka was an unused substitute against Inter on Matchday 5 and Lviv on Friday having been sidelined by injury since 21 August.
- Júnior Moraes, Shakhtar's top scorer in 2018/19 and 2019/20, has returned to training with the team having been out since 24 April with a cruciate knee ligament injury.
- Dentinho left Shakhtar on 8 November following the end of his contract.
- Summer signing Lassina Traoré, who was Shakhtar's top scorer this season with nine goals in 14 games in all competitions before Tetê got his tenth of the campaign on Friday, is expected to miss the rest of the season due to a knee injury suffered against Inter on Matchday 2.
- Shakhtar reached the Ukrainian Cup quarter-finals with a 3-0 win at Chornomorets on 27 October, Marcos Antônio and Dentinho getting the goals.
- Shakhtar won the Ukrainian Super Cup on 22 September, beating Dynamo Kyiv 3-0 with Traoré scoring twice and Alan Patrick once.

##### **Sheriff**

- No Sheriff player had featured in the UEFA Champions League, group stage to final, before this season. Fifteen made their debuts on Matchday 1, Keston Julien doing likewise on Matchday 2 and Dumitru Celeadnic, Serafim Cojocari and Maxim Cojocaru making their first appearances at Inter on Matchday 3.
- Sheriff have played only 16 league games this season, three or four fewer than any other Moldovan club, due to their participation in UEFA Champions League qualifying.
- Sheriff's nine-game winning league run, which had featured 36 goals scored and only one conceded, was ended by a goalless draw at leaders Petrocub on 2 December.
- That result left Sheriff a point behind Petrocub with three games in hand.

- The Tiraspol team were 7-0 winners at home to Dinamo-Auto on 28 November; they have put seven goals past Dinamo in all three of the clubs' meetings in 2021/22.
- Having opened the Moldovan First Division season with a 1-0 loss at home to Bălți – one of only four defeats for Sheriff this season in all competitions – the Tiraspol club have won 13 and drawn two of their subsequent 15 league games, scoring 51 goals and conceding only four.
- A 1-1 draw at Zimbru on 19 September is the only other league game this season in which Sheriff have dropped points.
- Abdul Basit Khalid, who is not in the UEFA Champions League squad, had scored in five successive league games before drawing a blank against Petrocub.
- Frank Castañeda, who was Sheriff's top league scorer last season with 28 goals, has managed six in 15 league appearances in 2021/22, level with Momo Yansané. Adama Traoré and Sébastien Thill both have five.
- Sheriff were 6-0 winners at home to Saxan in the Moldovan Cup round of 16 on 27 October. They will be at home to Petrocub in the quarter-finals in April.
- Sheriff lost 4-2 on penalties to cup winners Sfintul Gheorghe after a 2-2 draw in the Moldovan Super Cup on 26 June.
- Midfielder Moussa Kyabou is still out with an injury.
- Yansané returned as a substitute on Matchday 5, his first appearance since 16 October due to injury, and scored twice against Dinamo-Auto.
- Jasurbek Yakhshiboev was an unused replacement against Real Madrid but has missed Sheriff's last two games through injury.
- Henrique Luvannor returned to Sheriff in July after seven years in the UAE before leaving again in August, this time for Saudi Arabian club Al-Taawoun. Luvannor scored four goals in this season's UEFA Champions League qualifying rounds.

## Competition facts

### UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

#### Overall records

- Chelsea in 2012/13 are the only defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to CSKA Moskva.
- In 2016/17 Real Madrid became the first team to successfully defend the UEFA Champions League trophy, with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the previous club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United (2008, 2009) all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- Real Madrid then made it three wins in a row in 2017/18, becoming the fourth club to win three or more successive titles in European Cup history, and the first to do it twice.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern München were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.
- Bayern's victory against Paris Saint-Germain in the 2020 UEFA Champions League final was their 11th successive win in the competition (18 September 2019 to 23 August 2020), setting a new record that they extended to 15 before being held at Atlético de Madrid on Matchday 5 in 2020/21. Bayern themselves (2 April 2013 to 27 November 2013) and Real Madrid (23 April 2014 to 18 February 2015) jointly held the previous best with ten, one more than Barcelona's winning run between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003.

#### Group stage

- Barcelona have finished as group winners on 21 occasions, three more than Bayern München, four more than Real Madrid and five more than Manchester United. Barça also hold the record for the most unbeaten group stage campaigns with 13, five more than Real Madrid.
- Seven teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain (1994/95), Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage), Real Madrid (2011/12 and 2014/15) and Bayern (2019/20).
- Twenty-one teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, most recently AEK Athens in 2018/19.
- In 2017/18, Paris Saint-Germain set a new group stage record by scoring 25 goals, one more than Bayern München managed in 2019/20. Liverpool are next on the list having scored 23 in 2017/18 with Borussia Dortmund hitting 21 in 2016/17. Manchester United (1998/99), Barcelona (2011/12, 2016/17) and Real Madrid (2013/14) all managed 20.
- Only Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05), Maccabi Haifa (2009/10) and Dinamo Zagreb (2016/17) have failed to score in a group stage.
- BATE Borisov conceded 24 goals in 2014/15, a new group stage record which was matched by Legia Warszawa in 2016/17. The previous mark, 22, was held by Dinamo Zagreb (2011/12) and Nordsjælland (2012/13).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06), Manchester United (2010/11), Monaco (2014/15), Paris Saint-Germain (2015/16), Barcelona (2017/18) and Manchester City (2020/21) all let in just one.
- Matchday 6 of 2013/14 marked FCSB's 23rd successive game in the competition without a victory, surpassing the previous record of 22 set by Spartak Moskva between December 2000 and November 2006.
- Marseille hold the record for successive defeats in the competition, group stage to final, having lost 13 in a row between March 2012 and November 2020. The 2-0 loss at home to Porto on Matchday 4 of the 2020/21 competition surpassed Anderlecht's previous competition record of 12 losses in a row between December 2003 and November 2005. Dinamo Zagreb are next with 11 consecutive losses on two occasions, from September 2011 to November 2012 and September 2015 to December 2016.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is six points: Zenit in 2013/14 and Roma in 2015/16. Since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96, ten teams have made it through with seven points: Legia Warszawa (1995/96), Dynamo Kyiv (1999/2000), Liverpool (2001/02, second group stage), Lokomotiv Moskva (2002/03, first group stage) and eventual finalists Juventus (2002/03, second group stage), Rangers and Werder



Bremen (2005/06), Galatasaray (2013/14), Basel (2014/15) and Atalanta (2019/20).

- Napoli failed to qualify from their group with 12 points in 2013/14, the highest total of any team not to reach the next stage when the top two in each section progressed. Dynamo Kyiv (1999/2000, second group stage), Borussia Dortmund (2002/03, second group stage), PSV Eindhoven (2003/04), Olympiacos and Dynamo Kyiv (both 2004/05), Werder Bremen (2006/07), Manchester City (2011/12), Chelsea and Cluj (both 2012/13), Benfica (2013/14), Porto (2015/16) and Ajax (2019/20) all missed out with ten points.

### Goalscoring records

- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer Leverkusen on 7 March 2012, a feat matched by Shakhtar Donetsk's Luiz Adriano at BATE Borisov on 21 October 2014. Fifteen more players, also including Messi and Robert Lewandowski twice, have scored four times in a game, most recently Sébastien Haller for Ajax at Sporting CP on Matchday 1 in 2021/22. That was the fifth quadruple in succession to be scored away from home after Bayern's Serge Gnabry and Lewandowski (group stage v Tottenham and Crvena zvezda respectively) and Josip Iličić (Atalanta v Valencia, round of 16 second leg) all achieved the feat in 2019/20 and Olivier Giroud did likewise for Chelsea at Sevilla in the 2020/21 group stage.

- Cristiano Ronaldo set a new record for a UEFA Champions League group stage with 11 goals in 2015/16, Messi got ten goals in 2016/17, a figure matched by Robert Lewandowski in 2019/20; Ronaldo (2013/14, 2017/18) and Luiz Adriano (2014/15) scored nine while Zlatan Ibrahimović (2013/14), Ruud van Nistelrooy (2004/05), Filippo Inzaghi, Hernán Crespo (both 2002/03), Lewandowski (2018/19) and Erling Braut Haaland (2019/20) all managed eight.

- Messi's hat-trick against PSV Eindhoven on Matchday 1 of the 2018/19 competition was his eighth in the competition, a mark Ronaldo matched against Atlético de Madrid in that season's round of 16 second leg.

### Oldest and youngest players

- Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid on Matchday 6 in 2007/08 aged 43 years 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens in 2006/07.

- Francesco Totti is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 38 years 59 days, in Roma's 1-1 draw at CSKA Moskva on 25 November 2014. Ryan Giggs (37 years 290 days) was the previous record holder.

- Youssoufa Moukoko is the youngest player to have appeared, aged 16 years 18 days for Borussia Dortmund at Zenit on 8 December 2020. He replaced Celestine Babayaro, who was 16 years 87 days when he started for Anderlecht against Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994; Babayaro was sent off in the 37th minute.

- Ansu Fati's winner for Barcelona at Inter on Matchday 6 in 2019/20 made him the youngest goalscorer in UEFA Champions League history, at the age of 17 years 40 days. He eclipsed the previous record of Olympiacos's Peter Ofori-Quaye (17 years 195 days) that had lasted since 1 October 1997.
