Match background

Paris Saint-Germain's latest bid for a first UEFA Champions League crown kicks off at Club Brugge, where their sole previous visit proved a memorable one for Kylian Mbappé.

- The French side have reached the knockout rounds in each of the last nine seasons, while all eight of Club Brugge's previous UEFA Champions League campaigns have ended in the group stage.
- The 2020/21 runners-up Manchester City are also in Group A, which therefore contains the beaten finalists from the last two seasons, with Leipzig completing the section.

Previous meetings

- Paris recorded two victories against Club Brugge when the teams were paired together in the 2019/20 group stage. Mbappé came off the bench to score a hat-trick in the final half-hour in a 5-0 Paris win in Bruges on Matchday 3, Mauro Icardi having scored the first two goals; Icardi got the only goal at the Parc des Princes two weeks later.
- Those six points helped Paris finish first in Group A on 16 points; they went on to reach their first UEFA Champions League final only to lose 1-0 to Bayern München in Lisbon. Club Brugge were third on three points, and were subsequently eliminated in the UEFA Europa League round of 32.

Form guide

Club Brugge

- Club Brugge are making their fourth successive group stage appearance and ninth overall, three behind Anderlecht's Belgian record.
- In 2020/21, the Belgian side finished third behind Borussia Dortmund and Lazio but ahead of Zenit in Group F, picking up eight points (W2 D2 L2) to move into the UEFA Europa League.
- Club Brugge lasted just one tie in the UEFA Europa League, however, going out in the round of 32 to Dynamo Kyiv (1-1 a, 0-1 h).
- Philippe Clement's side claimed Club Brugge's 17th Belgian league title last season, and a third in four years.
- Club Brugge have never progressed to the UEFA Champions League knockout rounds in their eight previous appearances. They have come third in their section in each of the last three campaigns.
- Blauw-Zwart have won only three of their last 26 fixtures in the UEFA Champions League proper (D9 L14).
- Club Brugge won three of their first five home games against French visitors in UEFA competition (L2), but only two of the most recent seven (D2 L3). Their last win against a French club in Bruges was a 1-0 defeat of Toulouse in the UEFA Europa League group stage in December 2009.

Paris

- Runners-up to Bayern in the 2019/20 UEFA Champions League final, Paris again reached the latter stages of last season's competition, going out to Manchester City in the semi-finals (1-2 h, 0-2 a).
- A team coached by Thomas Tuchel were first in Group H last season, picking up 12 points to finish level with Leipzig but ahead on head-to-head record with Manchester United third and İstanbul Başakşehir fourth. Paris won four of their group games, losing at home to United and in Leipzig.
- With Mauricio Pochettino having replaced Tuchel as coach, Paris got the better of Barcelona (4-1 a, 1-1 h) and Bayern (3-2 a, 0-1 h) in the knockout stages before losing to City.
- Having lost at home to Bayern in the quarter-final second leg, Paris have been beaten in their last three UEFA Champions League games.
- This is the French side's tenth successive UEFA Champions League campaign and 14th in total, two behind Lyon's national record.
- Although Paris missed out on the Ligue 1 title for only the second time in nine years in 2020/21, finishing second a point behind LOSC Lille, they did win the French Cup for the record 14th time overall and the sixth time in seven seasons.
- The French club failed to win any of their first three games away to Belgian sides (D2 L1) but have scored 14 goals without conceding in winning their last three such contests.

- Born in the Paris suburbs, Stanley Nsoki joined Paris Saint-Germain's academy in 2014 and went on to make 16 appearances for the club in all competitions before signing for Nice in 2019. He played 44 times in all competition for Nice, from where he signed for Club Brugge this summer.

- Club Brugge's league record so far this season is W4 D2 L1. They have scored 15 goals, conceding 11, and were 3-0 winners at home to Oostende on Friday.
- Noa Lang, Club Brugge's top scorer last season with 16 league goals, made it three for the new campaign with a double against Oostende on his seventh appearance. Hans Vanaken got the other goal, making it three in his last four league outings.
- Phillipe Clement's side were 4-0 winners at Zulte Waregem on 15 August, their biggest victory so far this season.
- Club Brugge were beaten 6-1 at Gent on 29 August, their heaviest loss in all competitions since a 5-0 defeat at Manchester United in the UEFA Europa League round of 32 second leg on 27 February 2020, and their biggest league reverse since they went down by the same scoreline at Anderlecht on 11 November 2012.
- Lang, Vanaken and Charles De Ketelaere are Club Brugge's joint top scorers this season on three goals apiece.
- Champions Club Brugge beat cup winners Genk 3-2 in the Belgian Super Cup on 17 July; it was the club's 19th appearance in the match, one short of Anderlecht's competition best, and a record 16th win.
- Vanaken scored in Belgium's 5-2 win in Estonia in 2022 FIFA World Cup qualifying on 2 September. He also provided two assists in a 3-0 win at home to the Czech Republic three days later.
- José Izquierdo, who rejoined the club in the summer four years after leaving for Brighton, is yet to return to fitness following a series of knee injuries.

- Lionel Messi has made 149 appearances in the UEFA Champions League, group stage to final. Only Iker Casillas (177 appearances), Cristiano Ronaldo (176 before Matchday 1) and Xavi Hernández (151) have played 150 or more matches in the competition proper.
- Paris have taken maximum points from the first five games in Ligue 1 this season, scoring 16 goals in the process. They have recorded only two clean sheets, however, in a 2-0 win at Reims on 29 August and a 4-0 home win against Clermont on Saturday.

- Messi made his Paris debut in that win at Reims while Gianluigi Donnarumma made his first appearance on Saturday.
- Mbappé is the joint top scorer in Ligue 1 so far this season with four goals, including Paris's third at the weekend.
- Ander Herrera scored twice at the weekend, making it three in Ligue 1 this season; he managed one in each of his first two campaigns for Paris.
- Midfielder Nathan Bitumazala, 18, made his Ligue 1 debut as a late substitute against Clermont.
- Paris's run of eight successive French Super Cup wins ended on 1 August as they suffered a 1-0 defeat against Ligue 1 champions LOSC Lille.
- Georginio Wijnaldum scored the Netherlands' second goal as they defeated Montenegro in Eindhoven 4-0 in 2022 FIFA World Cup qualifying on 4 September.
- Donnarumma played his first minutes this season as European champions Italy set a new world record for the longest unbeaten international run of 36 games. The new Paris goalkeeper featured in World Cup qualifiers against Bulgaria (1-1), Switzerland (0-0) and Lithuania (5-0).
- Messi became South America's all-time male top scorer at international level on 9 September with a hat-trick for Argentina against Bolivia in Buenos Aires. That lifted his international tally to 79 goals – two more than Brazil legend Pelé's previous record figure.
- Messi captained Argentina to Copa América victory in the summer – his first major international trophy. New Paris team-mate Ángel Di María scored the only goal of the final against hosts Brazil.
- Another new Paris signing, Sergio Ramos, has not played yet due to a calf injury.
- Mbappé (calf) and Marco Verratti (knee) both picked up injuries on international duty, although the former started against Clermont on Saturday.
- Colin Dagba (ankle) and Layvin Kurzawa (adductors) are yet to play this season.
- Mauro Icardi returned as a late substitute on Saturday having been out with a shoulder injury since 23 August.
- Presnel Kimpembe, who appeared in all three France games during the recent international break, was replaced late on in the 2-0 win against Finland on 7 September due to a sore Achilles, but started at the weekend.
- Donnarumma was named Player of the Tournament at UEFA EURO 2020. He featured in all seven games as the Azzurri took the trophy, with new Paris team-mate Verratti making five appearances.
- On 23 July Paris coach Mauricio Pochettino signed a one-year contract extension, until 30 June 2023.
