Match background

Beşiktaş have not featured in the UEFA Champions League group stage since 2017/18 and return to the competition with a home game against a Borussia Dortmund side that have become regulars in the competition's knockout stages in recent years.

- This Group C opener brings together the clubs for the first time in more than 30 years and Beşiktaş will be looking to improve their home record against German visitors to make a positive start to their latest UEFA Champions League campaign.
- Ajax and Sporting CP complete the section.

Previous meetings

- The sides' only past meetings came in the 1989/90 European Cup Winners' Cup first round, Dortmund winning 1-0 in Turkey and 2-1 in Germany.
- Dortmund lost to eventual winners Sampdoria in the next round.

Form guide

Beşiktaş

- This is the eighth time Beşiktaş have appeared in the group stage; among Turkish clubs, only Galatasaray (16) have featured more frequently.
- Beşiktaş last appeared in 2017/18, when they won their section unbeaten ahead of Porto, Leipzig and Monaco to reach the round of 16 for the first time only for Bayern München to prove too strong in the first knockout round (0-5 a, 1-3 h).
- The Black Eagles were champions of Turkey for the 16th time in 2020/21, their third triumph in six years. They also lifted the Turkish Cup for the tenth time, completing the domestic double for the third time and the first since 2008/09.
- The Turkish side's 2020/21 UEFA Champions League campaign lasted a single match, a 3-1 loss at PAOK in the one-off second qualifying round tie.
- Beşiktaş therefore moved into the UEFA Europa League but again fell at the first hurdle, Rio Ave winning 4-2 on penalties in Istanbul after a 1-1 draw in the third qualifying round.
- Beşiktaş's best European Cup campaign came in 1986/87 when they got to the quarter-finals before losing 7-0 on aggregate to Dynamo Kyiv.
- That home defeat by Bayern in 2018 was the Turkish club's last game against German opponents, and made their overall record versus German clubs W2 D1 L8. At home it is W1 L4, the sole success a 2-0 defeat of Leipzig on Matchday 2 of that 2017/18 campaign.
- Beşiktaş have won only one of their last six home European matches (D1 L4).

Dortmund

- Dortmund boasted the top scorer in the 2020/21 UEFA Champions League, Erling Haaland scoring ten goals in his eight appearances, all in his first six games.
- That helped BVB finish first in Group F ahead of Lazio, Club Brugge and Zenit with four wins and 13 points. They then edged out Sevilla in the round of 16 (3-2 a, 2-2 h), Haaland scoring four of their five goals, before losing 2-1 away and at home against eventual runners-up Manchester City in the quarter-finals.
- Third in the Bundesliga behind Bayern München and Leipzig in 2020/21, and winners of the German Cup for the fifth time with a 4-1 defeat of Leipzig in the final, this is Dortmund's 16th UEFA Champions League campaign; they were winners in 1997, and runners-up in 2013. BVB have now reached the round of 16 or better in seven of their last eight participations.
- Having parted company with Lucien Favre in December 2020, Dortmund's knockout games last season were overseen by Edin Terzić; Marco Rose joined as coach from Borussia Mönchengladbach in July.
- BVB are unbeaten in their four previous away games against Turkish clubs, winning three including the most recent, a 4-0 success at Galatasaray in the 2014/15 UEFA Champions League group stage in which Marco Reus scored the third goal.
- Home and away, Dortmund have won six of their eight games with Turkish teams, the sole defeat a 2-0 loss at home to eventual winners Galatasaray in the 1999/2000 UEFA Cup fourth round first leg (0-2 aggregate).

- Beşiktaş forward Michy Batshuayi spent the second half of 2017/18 season on loan at Dortmund, scoring seven goals in ten Bundesliga appearances and two more in his four UEFA Europa League outings. His team-mates

included Roman Bürki, Manuel Akanji, Marco Reus, Dan-Axel Zagadou, Raphaël Guerreiro and Mahmoud Dahoud.

• Pongračić made his senior debut for Croatia in a 3-3 friendly draw against Turkey on 11 November 2020. His partner at centre-back was Beşiktaş's Vida.

• Karaman scored an added-time equaliser in Turkey's 3-3 friendly draw against a Germany side including Emre Can, Dahoud, Julian Brandt and Nico Schulz on 7 October 2020.

• Alex Teixeira was in the Shakhtar Donetsk side beaten by Dortmund in the 2012/13 UEFA Champions League round of 16 (2-2 a, 3-0 h), Mats Hummels scoring BVB's second equaliser in the first leg in Ukraine.

• Hummels was part of the Bayern München team that eased past Beşiktaş in the 2017/18 round of 16 (5-0 h, 3-1 a).

• On 10 October 1998 Beşiktaş coach Sergen Yalçın was in the starting line-up of the Turkey team that defeated Germany 1-0 in Bursa in UEFA EURO 2000 qualifying, their first competitive win against their opponents.

• The Turkish champions have picked up ten points from their first four league games of the new season, home wins against Rizespor (3-0), Fatih Karagümrük (1-0) and, on Saturday, Yeni Malatyaspor (3-0), plus a goalless draw at Gaziantep.

• Beşiktaş are therefore yet to concede a Süper Lig goal this season, the first time they have started the season with four clean sheets since 1985/86.

• Michy Batshuayi scored his first two goals for Beşiktaş on Saturday, when Miralem Pjanić – who set up the Belgian's first goal – and substitute Can Bozdoğan made their club debuts.

• Cyle Larin, who finished as Beşiktaş's top scorer in the 2020/21 Turkish Super League with 19 goals, opened his account for the current campaign with the final goal against Rizespor on 13 August.

• Summer signing Alex Teixeira scored his first Beşiktaş goal in the win at Fatih Karagümrük on 28 August.

• Kenan Karaman was on target as Turkey won 3-0 in Gibraltar in 2022 FIFA World Cup qualifying on 4 September.

• Miralem Pjanić scored Bosnia and Herzegovina's first goal from the penalty spot and set up the second in a 2-2 draw at home to Kazakhstan on 7 September.

• Atiba Hutchinson scored the opening goal in Canada's 3-0 win at home to El Salvador in World Cup qualifying on 8

September.

- Larin was on target in both games as Canada drew 1-1 at home to Honduras on 2 September and away to the United States three days later.
- Kenan Karaman featured in all three of Turkey's matches at UEFA EURO 2020. Rıdvan Yılmaz was the only other current Beşiktaş player in the squad, although he did not play.
- Domagoj Vida made four appearances as Croatia reached the UEFA EURO 2020 round of 16. Batshuayi also made one substitute appearance for quarter-finalists Belgium.
- Alex Teixeira suffered a thigh strain in that win at Fatih Karagümrük. He started on Saturday but was replaced before half-time after a recurrence of the problem.
- Vida was replaced midway through the first half against Yeni Malatyaspor with a heel injury that is expected to sideline him for three weeks.
- Umut Meraş suffered a calf strain in training with Turkey and missed the weekend win.

- On 14 August Dortmund started the Bundesliga season with a 5-2 win against Eintracht Frankfurt, Erling Haaland scoring twice and providing three assists.
- A week later BVB lost 2-1 in Freiburg, followed by a 3-2 success against Hoffenheim on 27 August. Haaland scored the winner in added time.
- Dortmund were 4-3 winners at Bayer Leverkusen on Saturday, Haaland scoring twice more including the decisive goal from the penalty spot.
- On 17 August Marco Rose's team lost 3-1 at home to Bayern München in the German Super Cup.
- In the first round of the German Cup Dortmund prevailed 3-0 at third tier Wehen Wiesbaden on 7 August, Haaland scoring all three goals. Dortmund will be at home to 2. Bundesliga side Ingolstadt in the second round on 26 October.
- Haaland now has 45 goals in 47 league appearances for Dortmund, and 65 in 65 competitive games for the club.
- Haaland scored in all three of Norway's recent World Cup qualifiers – against the Netherlands (1-1) on 1 September, in Latvia three days later (2-0) and three in a 5-1 win against Gibraltar on 7 September.
- On 2 September Axel Witsel scored in Belgium's 5-2 win in Estonia.
- Three days later Marco Reus was on target for Germany in a 6-0 success against Armenia. He missed Germany's third game in Iceland due to knee problems but returned to Dortmund's starting line-up on Saturday.
- On 7 September Donyell Malen completed the scoring for the Netherlands in a 6-1 win against Turkey.
- Youssoufa Moukoko, who became Germany's youngest debutant aged 16 years 286 days, scored twice in a 6-0 success in 2023 UEFA European Under-21 Championship qualifying in San Marino on 2 September. Five days later the striker also was on target in a 3-1 win in Latvia.
- Giovanni Reyna played the first of the United States' three World Cup qualifiers in El Salvador on 2 September (0-0), but missed the games against Canada and Honduras due to a thigh injury and was also absent for Dortmund on Saturday.
- Thomas Meunier sat out Belgium's internationals due to muscular problems but played 90 minutes for Dortmund at the weekend.
- Emre Can (thigh) and Nico Schulz (muscular) both missed the games against Hoffenheim and Leverkusen.
- Thorgan Hazard has been out since the Frankfurt match because of an ankle injury.
- Dan-Axel Zagadou, who has been sidelined since the end of March, has undergone knee surgery.
- Mateu Morey, who has been left out of Dortmund's UEFA Champions League squad, is facing a long spell on the sidelines having suffered a knee injury on 1 May.
- On 29 July Dortmund announced that Mahmoud Dahoud had extended his contract until 2023. On his 18th birthday

on 29 June Jude Bellingham's contract was automatically extended until 2025.

Competition facts

UEFA Champions League: Did you know?

Overall records

- Chelsea in 2012/13 are the only defending champions to fail to get through a group stage since the UEFA Champions League began. (This record, like the others, includes the seasons between 1999/2000 and 2002/03 that featured a second group stage). In 1992/93, Barcelona were the reigning European Champion Clubs' Cup holders and lost 4-3 on aggregate in the second round to CSKA Moskva.
- In 2016/17 Real Madrid became the first team to successfully defend the UEFA Champions League trophy, with AC Milan (1989, 1990) the previous club to win consecutive European Cups. Milan (1994, 1995), Ajax (1995, 1996), Juventus (1996, 1997) and Manchester United (2008, 2009) all returned to the UEFA Champions League final as holders only to lose.
- Real Madrid then made it three wins in a row in 2017/18, becoming the fourth club to win three or more successive titles in European Cup history, and the first to do it twice.
- Only two teams have ever won the UEFA Champions League on home soil: Borussia Dortmund (1997, final in Munich) and Juventus (1996, final in Rome), while Manchester United lost the 2011 final in London and 12 months later Bayern München were beaten in the showpiece in their own stadium, the Fußball Arena München.
- Bayern's victory against Paris Saint-Germain in the 2020 UEFA Champions League final was their 11th successive win in the competition (18 September 2019 to 23 August 2020), setting a new record that they extended to 15 before being held at Atlético de Madrid on Matchday 5 in 2020/21. Bayern themselves (2 April 2013 to 27 November 2013) and Real Madrid (23 April 2014 to 18 February 2015) jointly held the previous best with ten, one more than Barcelona's winning run between 18 September 2002 and 18 February 2003.

Group stage

- Barcelona have finished as group winners on 21 occasions, four more than Real Madrid and Bayern München and six more than Manchester United. Barça also hold the record for the most unbeaten group stage campaigns with 13, five more than Real Madrid.
- Seven teams have recorded six successive victories in a UEFA Champions League group stage: Milan (1992/93), Paris Saint-Germain (1994/95), Spartak Moskva (1995/96), Barcelona (2002/03, first group stage), Real Madrid (2011/12 and 2014/15) and Bayern (2019/20).
- Twenty-one teams have gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without picking up a single point, most recently AEK Athens in 2018/19.
- In 2017/18, Paris Saint-Germain set a new group stage record by scoring 25 goals, one more than Bayern München managed in 2019/20. Liverpool are next on the list having scored 23 in 2017/18 with Borussia Dortmund hitting 21 in 2016/17. Manchester United (1998/99), Barcelona (2011/12, 2016/17) and Real Madrid (2013/14) all managed 20.
- Only Deportivo La Coruña (2004/05), Maccabi Haifa (2009/10) and Dinamo Zagreb (2016/17) have failed to score in a group stage.
- BATE Borisov conceded 24 goals in 2014/15, a new group stage record which was matched by Legia Warszawa in 2016/17. The previous mark, 22, was held by Dinamo Zagreb (2011/12) and Nordsjælland (2012/13).
- No team has ever gone through a UEFA Champions League group stage without conceding a goal. Milan (1992/93), Ajax (1995/96), Juventus (1996/97 and 2004/05), Chelsea (2005/06), Liverpool (2005/06), Villarreal (2005/06), Manchester United (2010/11), Monaco (2014/15), Paris Saint-Germain (2015/16), Barcelona (2017/18) and Manchester City (2020/21) all let in just one.
- Matchday 6 of 2013/14 marked FCSB's 23rd successive game in the competition without a victory, surpassing the previous record of 22 set by Spartak Moskva between December 2000 and November 2006.
- Marseille hold the record for successive defeats in the competition, group stage to final, having lost 13 in a row between March 2012 and November 2020. The 2-0 loss at home to Porto on Matchday 4 of the 2020/21 competition surpassed Anderlecht's previous competition record of 12 losses in a row between December 2003 and November 2005. Dinamo Zagreb are next with 11 consecutive losses on two occasions, from September 2011 to November 2012 and September 2015 to December 2016.
- The lowest total for a team qualifying from the group stage is six points: Zenit in 2013/14 and Roma in 2015/16. Since three points for a win was introduced in 1995/96, ten teams have made it through with seven points: Legia Warszawa (1995/96), Dynamo Kyiv (1999/2000), Liverpool (2001/02, second group stage), Lokomotiv Moskva (2002/03, first group stage) and eventual finalists Juventus (2002/03, second group stage), Rangers and Werder

Bremen (2005/06), Galatasaray (2013/14), Basel (2014/15) and Atalanta (2019/20).

- Napoli failed to qualify from their group with 12 points in 2013/14, the highest total of any team not to reach the next stage when the top two in each section progressed. Dynamo Kyiv (1999/2000, second group stage), Borussia Dortmund (2002/03, second group stage), PSV Eindhoven (2003/04), Olympiacos and Dynamo Kyiv (both 2004/05), Werder Bremen (2006/07), Manchester City (2011/12), Chelsea and Cluj (both 2012/13), Benfica (2013/14), Porto (2015/16) and Ajax (2019/20) all missed out with ten points.

Goalscoring records

- Lionel Messi became the first player to score five goals in a match in Barcelona's 7-1 win against Bayer Leverkusen on 7 March 2012, a feat matched by Shakhtar Donetsk's Luiz Adriano at BATE Borisov on 21 October 2014. Fourteen more players, also including Messi and Robert Lewandowski twice, have scored four times in a game, most recently Olivier Giroud for Chelsea at Sevilla in the 2020/21 group stage. That was the fourth quadruple in succession to be scored away from home after Bayern's Serge Gnabry and Lewandowski (group stage v Tottenham and Crvena zvezda respectively) and Josip Iličić (Atalanta v Valencia, round of 16 second leg) all achieved the feat in 2019/20.

- Cristiano Ronaldo set a new record for a UEFA Champions League group stage with 11 goals in 2015/16, Lionel Messi got ten goals in 2016/17, a figure matched by Robert Lewandowski in 2019/20; Ronaldo (2013/14, 2017/18) and Luiz Adriano (2014/15) scored nine while Zlatan Ibrahimović (2013/14), Ruud van Nistelrooy (2004/05), Filippo Inzaghi, Hernán Crespo (both 2002/03), Lewandowski (2018/19) and Erling Braut Haaland (2019/20) all managed eight.

- Messi's hat-trick against PSV Eindhoven on Matchday 1 of the 2018/19 competition was his eighth in the competition, a mark Ronaldo matched against Atlético de Madrid in that season's round of 16 second leg.

Oldest and youngest players

- Lazio goalkeeper Marco Ballotta is the oldest player to compete in the UEFA Champions League having featured against Real Madrid on Matchday 6 in 2007/08 aged 43 years 252 days. Alessandro Costacurta is the oldest outfield player; the Milan defender was 40 years and 211 days when he played against AEK Athens in 2006/07.

- Francesco Totti is the oldest player to score in the competition, aged 38 years 59 days, in Roma's 1-1 draw at CSKA Moskva on 25 November 2014. Ryan Giggs (37 years 290 days) was the previous record holder.

- Youssoufa Moukoko is the youngest player to have appeared, aged 16 years 18 days for Borussia Dortmund at Zenit on 8 December 2020. He replaced Celestine Babayaro, who was 16 years 87 days when he started for Anderlecht against Steaua Bucureşti on 23 November 1994; Babayaro was sent off in the 37th minute.

- Ansu Fati's winner for Barcelona at Inter on Matchday 6 in 2019/20 made him the youngest goalscorer in UEFA Champions League history, at the age of 17 years 40 days. He eclipsed the previous record of Olympiacos's Peter Ofori-Quaye (17 years 195 days) that had lasted since 1 October 1997.
