Match background

Atlético de Madrid's Group B prospects are hanging in the balance as they welcome an AC Milan side who travel to Spain knowing they have to win.

- Atleti, who ended Milan's last UEFA Champions League campaign in the 2013/14 last 16, have slipped to third place after home (2-3) and away (0-2) defeats against section winners Liverpool. Held 1-1 at home by Porto on Matchday 1, their sole victory is the 2-1 success at Milan in their second fixture, in which Rafael Leão gave the home side a 20th-minute lead before Milan's Franck Kessié was dismissed in the 29th minute for a second bookable offence. Atlético had to wait to capitalise before late goals from Antoine Griezmann (84) and Luis Suárez (90+7pen) gave them the points.
- Atlético must avoid defeat to stay in contention to reach the round of 16 without having to depend on other results.
- Milan picked up their first point on Matchday 4, drawing 1-1 at home to Porto after defeats at Liverpool (2-3) and Porto (0-1) either side of their home loss to Atlético. They must win to stay in contention for either a round of 16 or UEFA Europa League place but will be unable to finish in the top two regardless of their own result if Porto win at Liverpool.

Previous meetings

- The teams were paired together for the only previous time before this season in that 2013/14 UEFA Champions League round of 16 tie.
- Diego Costa scored the only goal of the first leg at San Siro and added two more as Atleti won the return 4-1, Arda Turan and Raúl García also finding the net after Kaká had briefly made it 1-1 on the night.
- Koke started both legs for Atlético.
- Atlético went on to reach the final, losing 4-1 after extra time to Real Madrid in Lisbon.

Form guide

Atlético

- Champions of Spain for the 11th time in 2020/21, Atlético finished two points ahead of Real Madrid in the final Liga standings to give them their second league championship under Diego Simeone, who also guided them to the title in 2013/14.
- This is Atlético's 12th UEFA Champions League group campaign, level with Valencia; only Barcelona and Real Madrid (both 26 participations) have featured more among Spanish sides.
- All but two of Atleti's previous 11 group appearances have extended into the knockout stages; this is their ninth successive group campaign.
- Last season, Simeone's side finished second in their section behind holders Bayern München, picking up nine points. They were the only side to deny Bayern victory in Group A, the 1-1 draw in Madrid on Matchday 5 ending the German club's record run of UEFA Champions League victories at 15.
- Atlético then lost 1-0 against Chelsea in the first leg of their round of 16 tie, a game that was played in Bucharest, before a 2-0 defeat in London.
- The Madrid club have reached the quarter-finals or better in five of their last eight UEFA Champions League campaigns – all under Simeone.
- Matchday 2 is one of only six Atlético wins in 18 European matches (D4 L8).
- The Matchday 3 loss to Liverpool was just Atleti's second in the last 31 European games in their own stadium (W22 D7) and the first since another defeat by English visitors, 1-2 to Chelsea on Matchday 2 in 2017/18.
- Atlético's last home game against Italian visitors ended in a 2-2 draw against Juventus on Matchday 1 of the 2019/20 UEFA Champions League, a match in which they had been two goals down.
- That ended Los Colchoneros' run of six successive home wins against Serie A sides, in which they scored 14 goals and conceded only one. Atleti have not lost at home to Italian visitors since a 3-1 reverse against Parma in the 1998/99 UEFA Cup semi-final first leg (2-5 aggregate).
- Atleti lost the 2016 UEFA Champions League final on penalties to Real Madrid at Milan's home ground San Siro, going down 5-3 on spot kicks after a 1-1 draw. Yannick Carrasco scored their goal; Antoine Griezmann missed a penalty in normal time but converted his side's first kick in the shoot-out.

Milan

- European Cup winners on seven occasions, Milan are making their first appearance in the group stage since 2013/14. This is the 18th time they have featured, four behind Juventus's Italian record of 22.

- Milan's last 11 UEFA Champions League campaigns have all extended into the knockout rounds, although five of the last six have ended in the round of 16.
- The Rossoneri were beaten by Atlético in the 2013/14 last 16 having finished second in their section behind Barcelona, picking up nine points from their six matches.
- Milan have featured in European competition only three times since that 2014 defeat by Atlético, all in the UEFA Europa League. They reached the round of 16 in 2017/18, losing to Arsenal (0-2 h, 1-3 a), before failing to progress beyond the group stage the following season.
- In 2020/21, Stefano Pioli's team finished first in Group H ahead of LOSC Lille, Sparta Praha and Celtic, picking up 13 points, before knocking out Crvena zvezda on away goals in the round of 32 (2-2 a, 1-1 h). Once more they came unstuck against English opposition in the last 16, however, going out 2-1 on aggregate to Manchester United (1-1 a, 0-1 h).
- The Rossoneri had lost five successive UEFA Champions League matches before drawing with Porto last time out, and have one win in their last 11 games in the competition (D4 L6). A 3-0 success at Celtic on Matchday 5 in 2013/14 is their only victory in seven away games, group stage to final (D1 L5).
- Milan are the only Italian side to win the UEFA Champions League more than once having triumphed in 1994, 2003 and 2007. They were also beaten finalists in 1993, 1995 and 2005 but have not reached the quarter-finals since 2011/12.
- The Rossoneri's last games against a Spanish club before losing to Atlético on Matchday 2 came in the 2018/19 UEFA Europa League group stage, when they lost 2-1 at home and drew 1-1 away against Real Betis.
- Defeat to Atleti this season made it eight games without a win versus Liga opponents (D2 L6). A 2-0 victory at home to Barcelona in the 2012/13 UEFA Champions League round of 16 first leg – a tie Milan went on to lose 4-2 on aggregate – is their only success in 18 matches against Spanish sides, home and away (D7 L10).
- Milan's last win in Spain came at Real Madrid in the 2009/10 UEFA Champions League group stage (3-2); their record since is D2 L6.

- Alessandro Florenzi was an unused substitute as Italy defeated Koke's Spain on penalties in the UEFA EURO 2020 semi-final on 6 July. Five days later he came on as a late replacement as the Azzurri defeated Kieran Trippier's England in the final, again on penalties.
- Someone played for Milan's city rivals Inter between 1997 and 1999, and for Lazio between 1999 and 2003. He also coached Catania in Serie A in 2011.
- Someone faced Milan ten times in Serie A, winning only once. However he scored three goals in two Milan derbies in 1997/98, one in a 2-2 draw and two in a 3-0 Inter win.

- Simeone's assistant Nelson Vivas also played for Inter, between 2001 and 2003.

Latest news

Atlético

- Héctor Herrera made his 50th appearance in the UEFA Champions League, group stage to final, on Matchday 4.
- On Saturday an 87th-minute Felipe goal, his first in the Liga since 4 January 2020, gave Atlético a 1-0 win at home to Osasuna. They have picked up seven points in the last five minutes of league matches this season, fewer only than Osasuna (nine) in the Spanish top flight.
- Atlético drew 3-3 with Valencia on 7 November despite leading 3-1 after 90 minutes.
- Šime Vrsaljko scored Atleti's third against Valencia, his first ever Liga goal having joined in 2016 and his first in all competitions for the club since a Copa del Rey effort against Cardassar in January 2020.
- Atlético have conceded the opening goal in five of their last 11 Liga matches.
- The 2-0 loss at Liverpool on Matchday 4 was only the third time Atlético have failed to score this season and the first since a 1-0 defeat at Alavés on 25 September.
- That defeat at Alavés was Atlético's only one in their 13 league fixtures this season (W7 D5).
- Atleti have conceded 13 goals in their first 13 Liga matches this season; at the same stage of 2020/21, they had let in five. They last conceded more in 2011/12, shipping 20 in their first 13 fixtures.
- Thomas Lemar was replaced at half-time in a 2-2 draw against Real Sociedad on 24 October after suffering an injury to his right thigh, returning to play 65 minutes on Saturday.
- Marcos Llorente suffered a thigh injury in a 2-0 win against Barcelona on 2 October; he came on as a late substitute against Liverpool on Matchday 3 but aggravated the problem, returning to action only at the weekend.
- Kieran Trippier suffered a shoulder injury that forced his early substitution against Valencia and has not played since. João Félix missed Atlético's weekend win with a shin problem.
- Antoine Griezmann became France's third highest scorer outright with his 42nd goal – a penalty – in the 8-0 home win against Kazakhstan on 13 November that sealed Les Bleus' qualification for Qatar.
- Yannick Carrasco scored in the 3-1 victory over Estonia on 13 November that confirmed Belgium's place at the 2022 FIFA World Cup.
- Luis Suárez is on the 30-man shortlist for the Ballon d'Or, with the winner to be announced on 29 November.

Milan

- Zlatan Ibrahimović has scored 48 UEFA Champions League goals, group stage to final, although his last strike in the competition came for Paris Saint-Germain against Manchester City in the quarter-final first leg on 6 April 2016.
- On 7 November Milan dropped points for only the second time in Serie A this season as they were held 1-1 by neighbours Inter.
- That preceded Milan's first Serie A defeat of the season, a 4-3 loss at Fiorentina on Saturday despite Ibrahimović's double. That made the Swede the first player in his 40s to score twice in a match in the top five European leagues this century.
- The Rossoneri have won ten of their 13 league games in 2021/22, including seven in a row before drawing with their local rivals.
- After 13 games, Milan have the second best attack in Serie A with 29 goals scored, three behind Inter, and the third best defence with 15 goals conceded.
- Milan earned 32 points from the first 12 games in Serie A for the first time since three points for a win was introduced in 1994/95.
- On 13 October goalkeeper Mike Maignan had keyhole surgery to resolve a recurring left wrist problem.
- Samu Castillejo has not played since suffering a thigh injury against Bologna on 23 October.
- Davide Calabria picked up a calf injury after coming on as a substitute in Italy's 1-1 draw against Switzerland in 2022 FIFA World Cup qualifying on 12 November and sat out Milan's weekend loss.
- Alessio Romagnoli missed the derby against Inter with a thigh injury and was an unused replacement at Fiorentina.
- Simon Kjær has extended his contract with Milan until June 2024. The 32-year-old arrived at the club in January 2020 and his deal at San Siro was due to expire in the summer.
- Denmark captain Kjær and the Danish medical team, whose quick reactions and expertise saved the life of Christian

Eriksen at UEFA EURO 2020, were presented with the 2021 UEFA President's award in Istanbul on 26 August

- Kjær is on the 30-man shortlist for the Ballon d'Or, with the winner to be announced on 29 November.
