Match background

Wolfsburg welcome Group G leaders Salzburg to Germany knowing a first win in this season's UEFA Champions League is an increasingly pressing priority.

- Salzburg strengthened their grip on the section on Matchday 3, opening up a four-point cushion with a 3-1 home win in what was the first fixture between the teams. Although Karim Adeyemi's third-minute opener was cancelled out by Lukas Nmecha within 12 minutes, two second-half strikes from Noah Okafor (65, 77) made it two home wins from two for Salzburg, who lead the section by four points from Sevilla with Wolfsburg and LOSC Lille on two.
- Salzburg are the only side in Group G to have won a game, their defeat of Wolfsburg following a 2-1 victory against LOSC on Matchday 2; the Austrian champions had drawn 1-1 at Sevilla in their first outing. That game featured four penalties, a UEFA Champions League record, Salzburg scoring one and missing two; both their goals against LOSC also came from the spot.
- Wolfsburg drew their first two games, at LOSC (0-0) and at home against Sevilla (1-1), and have changed coaches since Matchday 3, Mark van Bommel leaving the club on 24 October.

Form guide

Wolfsburg

- Wolfsburg are making their third group stage appearance, after 2009/10 – when they failed to progress to the round of 16 – and 2015/16, when they reached the quarter-finals.
- The Wolves were first in their section six years ago, collecting 12 points from a group that also included Manchester United, PSV Eindhoven and CSKA Moskva. They beat Gent in the round of 16 (3-2 a, 1-0 h) before being thwarted by eventual winners Real Madrid in the last eight (2-0 h, 0-3 a).
- Wolfsburg have since featured in the UEFA Europa League twice; they were eliminated by Shakhtar Donetsk in the 2019/20 round of 16 (1-2 h, 0-3 a).
- In 2020/21, the German club were 4-0 winners at Albania's Kukës in the one-off second qualifying round before a 2-0 home victory against Desna Chernihiv; they then lost 2-1 at AEK Athens in their play-off.
- The German club have won three of their last five home European games (D1 L1), the draw with Sevilla ending a five-match winning UEFA Champions League run in their own stadium.
- Wolfsburg were fourth in the 2020/21 Bundesliga, their highest finish since ending as runners-up in 2014/15.
- Wolfsburg's only other matches against Austrian opponents came in the 2005 UEFA Intertoto Cup second round, when they followed a 2-2 home draw against Sturm Graz with a 3-1 away win.

Salzburg

- Salzburg are taking part in a third successive group stage campaign. They were third in their section behind Liverpool and Napoli in 2019/20, having qualified automatically to make their first group appearance since 1994.
- In 2020/21, Salzburg beat Maccabi Tel-Aviv in the play-offs before again finishing third in their group, picking up four points in Group A. They lost both games against Bayern München and Atlético de Madrid, but won 3-1 at Lokomotiv Moskva after a 2-2 home draw to finish ahead of the Russian club.
- A side coached by Jesse Marsch therefore moved into the UEFA Europa League, where they lost 2-0 at home and 2-1 away against eventual winners Villarreal in the round of 32. It was the second successive European campaign in which Salzburg had been eliminated at that stage following their 2019/20 loss against Eintracht Frankfurt (1-4 a, 2-2 h).
- Having suffered 13 successive defeats in UEFA Champions League qualifying before 2019/20, Salzburg won 5-2 on aggregate against Maccabi in last season's play-offs (2-1 a, 3-1 h) and were also victorious at the same stage this season, seeing off Brøndby (2-1 h, 2-1 a).
- This is Salzburg's fourth group stage appearance, a new Austrian record; they had previously been level with Sturm Graz on three.
- Salzburg won one of their three away games on each of their three previous UEFA Champions League appearances. They have won two of their last four away European matches (D1 L1) having managed two victories in the previous nine (D1 L6).
- Marsch left Salzburg to join RB Leipzig in the summer after two years in the post; he has been succeeded by German-born Matthias Jaissle, who returned to Salzburg after six months in charge of Liefering having been Salzburg's Under-18 coach between 2019 and January 2021.
- The Austrian club won an eighth successive Bundesliga title in 2020/21 – their 15th overall – adding the Austrian

Cup to complete a hat-trick of domestic doubles and an eighth in total, all in the last ten seasons.

- Adeyemi has won four of Salzburg's five penalties in this season's group stage, missing one at Sevilla but scoring both against LOSC. Luka Sučić took two penalties in Seville, scoring the first but missing the second.
- Salzburg are facing German opponents in the group stage for the second season in a row having conceded nine goals against Bayern München in 2020/21 (2-6 h, 1-3 a).
- Salzburg's record against teams from across the border is W6 D4 L7. In Germany it is W2 D1 L5; they have conceded seven goals in losing their last two matches there.

- Salzburg players Nico Mantl, Adeyemi (both Munich), Philipp Köhn (Dinslaken), Kilian Ludewig (Hamburg) and Alexander Walke (Oranienburg) were all born in Germany, as was coach Jaissle (Nürtingen).
- Jaissle was in the youth set-up at Stuttgart between 2001 and 2006 before moving on to Hoffenheim, for whom he made 60 league appearances before his 2014 retirement. He promptly moved into coaching with Leipzig's Under-17 side, where he was in charge until 2017.

Latest news

Wolfsburg

- Wolfsburg were 2-0 victors at Bayer Leverkusen on Saturday, their first win in nine games in all competitions (D3 L5), ending a four-match losing streak, the last of which was a 2-0 reverse at home against Freiburg on 23 October.
- Having opened the league season with four victories, the Wolves had not won for five games, losing four in a row before Saturday's success.
- The day after the Freiburg game Wolfsburg parted company with coach Mark van Bommel, unveiling former Werder Bremen boss Florian Kohfeldt as his successor on 26 October.
- Maximilian Arnold made his 260th Bundesliga appearance for Wolfsburg against Freiburg, surpassing Diego Benaglio's club record. He scored the second goal at the weekend, his first since 19 February.
- Maxence Lacroix was sent off in the closing moments at Leverkusen – the defender's second red card in his last three Bundesliga appearances.
- Luca Waldschmidt has missed Wolfsburg's last three games because of thigh problems, while Wout Weghorst and

Niklas Klinger have been sidelined by illness.

- Yannick Gerhardt started on Saturday, his first appearance since 2 October due to a metatarsal injury.
- Xaver Schlager has been out since 29 August with a knee injury.
- After suffering an ankle injury on 31 July Paulo Otávio made his first appearance this season as a substitute at Salzburg on Matchday 3 before starting against Freiburg.
- William, who suffered a knee injury on loan at Schalke at the beginning of May, returned to team training during the recent international break.
- Bartosz Białek has not played since 28 April because of a knee injury.
- Schlager, William and Białek were all left out of Wolfsburg's UEFA Champions League squad.

Salzburg

- Salzburg have won 18 of their 21 games in all competitions this season, the exceptions the Matchday 1 draw at Sevilla, a league fixture at Altach on 16 October, both games ending 1-1, and Saturday's 2-2 draw at Ried. They have scored 58 goals and conceded only 15.
- Behind after nine minutes at Ried, Salzburg scored twice late on after missing a penalty but were then pegged back by an added-time equaliser.
- A 3-1 win at home to LASK on 3 October was Salzburg's 14th successive Austrian Bundesliga victory, matching Rapid Wien's league record set in 1987, before Altach ended the run.
- The win against LASK was also the 42nd consecutive home league game in which Salzburg had scored, a new Austrian Bundesliga record they extended with a 4-1 success at home to Sturm Graz on 24 October.
- Salzburg had won eight successive away Austrian Bundesliga games, eclipsing the club record set in 2011, before being held at Altach, Saturday's result making it two draws in a row.
- Salzburg were 3-0 winners at second division St. Pölten in the Austrian Cup last 16 on 27 October, Daouda Guindo opening the scoring with his first goal for the club.
- Salzburg are unbeaten since a 3-2 league defeat at Tirol on 21 April; their record since is W24 D4.
- Saturday was the first time the Austrian champions had conceded more than one goal in any game this season. They have managed seven clean sheets, although the shut-out against St. Pölten is their only one in seven games.
- The Austrian champions have scored in their last 39 games in all competitions, since a 2-0 loss at home to Villarreal in the UEFA Europa League round of 32 on 18 February. That is the only one of Salzburg's last 48 games in which they have failed to find the net.
- Eighteen different players have scored for Salzburg this season, Guindo the most recent addition to the list.
- Karim Adeyemi is the Austrian Bundesliga's top scorer on ten goals. He has six in his last six Salzburg matches in all competitions.
- Benjamin Šeško has not played since damaging a hamstring in the draw at Altach on 16 October.
- Oumar Solet suffered a knee injury in a 2-0 home win against Rapid on 19 September and has undergone surgery.
- On 4 October, Salzburg were named team of the season at Austria's annual Bruno Awards. Jesse Marsch and Patson Daka, who both departed in the summer, took the coach and player prizes respectively.
