Match background

SL Benfica and PSV Eindhoven go head to head in the UEFA Europa League quarter-finals renewing acquaintances for the first time since 1998, the last of their five encounters.

Previous meetings

- The Benfica v PSV tie is the only 2010/11 UEFA Europa League quarter-final to involve teams that have met before. In statistical terms, honours are even after five ties, with both sides sporting W1 D3 L1 records.

- Benfica have lost one and drawn one in Lisbon, while PSV have drawn both their games on home soil against the Eagles.

- The teams first met in the 1974/75 UEFA Cup Winners' Cup quarter-finals; Benfica drew 0-0 in Eindhoven but lost 2-1 at home to Kees Rijvers' side in the second leg.

- The teams for that tie in Lisbon on 19 March 1975 were:

- Guus Hiddink's PSV then beat António Oliveira's Benfica 6-5 on penalties to win the 1987/88 European Champion Clubs' Cup final in Stuttgart, Hans van Breukelen saving the decisive spot kick from full-back António Veloso.

- The teams for that game on 25 May 1988 were:

- Their most recent meetings were in the 1998/99 UEFA Champions League group stage, Graeme Souness's Benfica winning 2-1 at home and drawing 2-2 away against Sir Bobby Robson's side.

- Current Benfica forward Nuno Gomes played in both legs, scoring once in Lisbon and twice in Eindhoven.

- The sides for their last meeting in Lisbon on 30 September 1998 were:

Benfica: Preud'homme, Sousa, Andrade, Ronaldo, Bruno Basto, Pembbridge, Poborský (Pringle 77), Hugo Leal, Thomas (Kandaurov 60), Nuno Gomes (Deane 77), João Pinto.

PSV: Waterreus, Abel Xavier, Van Nistelrooy, De Bilde (Nilis 63), Kolkka, Faber, Marcos, Iwan (Rommedahl 63), Khokhlov, Lucius, Van der Doelen (Bruggink 80).

- Abel Xavier, who played in both legs of this tie for PSV, had represented Benfica from 1993 to 1995.

Match background

- Including those previous meetings with PSV, Benfica have played 17 games against Dutch sides, with the record W6 D6 L5 (W5 D1 L2 in Lisbon). Aside from the 1988 European Cup final, Benfica played another game against Dutch opponents on neutral territory, losing 3-0 to AFC Ajax in a 1968/69 European Cup quarter-final replay in Paris.

- PSV's nine games against Portuguese opponents have ended W2 D4 L3 (W1 D1 L2 in Portugal).

- Benfica are unbeaten in four UEFA Europa League games – three wins and a draw – and have lost only one of their last 12 European home matches, with a 2-1 loss to FC Schalke 04 in this season's UEFA Champions League group stage breaking up a run of ten wins and one draw.

- PSV are unbeaten in their last five European away games, registering four wins and a draw on their travels, and scoring nine goals in the process.

- Benfica were eliminated by Liverpool FC at this stage of last season's UEFA Europa League, winning 2-1 at home before going down 4-1 at Anfield.

Team facts

- Óscar Cardozo and Franco Jara are Benfica's top UEFA Europa League scorers this season with two goals each since the Eagles entered the competition in the round of 32.

- Marcelo, Erik Pieters, Ola Toivonen and Balázs Dzsudzsák have featured in all ten of PSV's games since the start of the UEFA Europa League group stage. Hungary striker Dzsudzsák is their top scorer in the competition this season with four goals.

- Benfica's Javier Saviola took on PSV with AS Monaco FC in the 2004/05 UEFA Champions League round of 16; his side lost 1-0 in Eindhoven and 2-0 at home.
- The second leg of this tie will be Benfica's 100th UEFA Cup and UEFA Europa League fixture. Their next defeat will be their 100th in UEFA club competition; this is their 332nd European fixture, making them the most experienced side left in the competition.
- Benfica boss Jorge Jesus has coached in one previous UEFA club competition game against a Dutch side, with his SC Braga team winning 2-1 at sc Heerenveen in the 2008/09 UEFA Cup group stage.
- With Braga and FC Porto also in the running, this is the first time three Portuguese sides have made the quarter-finals of the same UEFA competition.
- All four UEFA Europa League last-eight ties pit sides that have been in this competition since the start of the group stage (FC Dynamo Kyiv, Porto, PSV and Villarreal CF) against clubs that transferred from the UEFA Champions League group stage (FC Spartak Moskva, FC Twente, Braga and Benfica).
- The overall winners will take on the victors of the contest between Dynamo and Braga in the semi-finals on 28 April and 5 May, playing the second leg at home. The winners of that tie will be the nominal away side in the final at the Dublin Arena on 18 May.
- Should Braga meet Benfica, it would be the first time that two Portuguese sides would go head to head in a UEFA club competition tie.

Head coach

Playing Career: Sporting Clube de Portugal, GD Peniche, SC Olhanense, CF Os Belenenses, GD Riopele, Juventude SC, UD Leiria, Vitória FC, SC Farense, CF Estrela da Amadora, Benfica e Castelo Branco, SR Almancilense

Coaching career: Amora FC, FC Felgueiras, CF Estrela da Amadora (twice), Vitória FC, Vitória SC, Moreirense FC, UD Leiria, CF Os Belenenses, SC Braga, SL Benfica

- Initially a midfielder at Sporting, Jorge Jesus enjoyed a long if low-key career with a number of smaller Portuguese sides before moving into coaching with fourth division Amora after hanging up his boots in 1989, leading them to a title.
- More success followed at Felgueiras, whom he led from the third division to the Liga in successive seasons, though they were relegated in their third campaign under his command in 1995/96.
- Further Liga experience came at hometown side Estrela da Amadora, Setúbal and Guimarães, though he endured another relegation with Moirense in 2005/06.
- Made a splash with Belenenses in 2006/07, leading them to fifth place in the Liga and the Portuguese Cup final, where a 1-0 defeat by Sporting allowed his side to compete in the UEFA Cup the following season.
- Even better followed at Braga in 2008/09 as he guided them to UEFA Intertoto Cup success and subsequently the UEFA Cup round of 16. A fifth-place Liga finish prompted Benfica to lure him back to Lisbon in 2009 and Jesus rewarded their faith with the league title and League Cup in his debut campaign.

PSV Eindhoven: Fred Rutten

Date of birth: 5 December 1962

Nationality: Dutch

Playing career: FC Twente

Coaching career: FC Twente (twice), FC Schalke 04, PSV Eindhoven

- Schooled at amateur side Alverna Wijchen, Rutten joined Twente at 15, made his debut as a defender at 17 in 1979 and remained with the Enschede club for 307 league games, retiring in 1992 due to a hip injury.
- Capped once by the Netherlands in a 1988 friendly, Rutten remained at Twente to serve his coaching apprenticeship, acting as youth coach and then assistant coach before getting the top job in 1999. He won the Dutch Cup in 2000/01, the club's first trophy in 24 years.
- Left Twente to head PSV's youth department, then spent 2002 to 2006 as Guus Hiddink's assistant, winning three Dutch titles. With Hiddink busy working as the club's technical director and coach of Australia, Rutten did much of the day-to-day training work.
- Returned to Twente as coach and technical director in 2006 and was named Coach of the Year in 2008 as his side finished fourth for a second season in succession, beating Ajax in an end-of-season play-off to enter UEFA Champions League qualifying.
- That summer he moved to Schalke where he lasted less than a year, leaving in March 2009. Rutten swiftly found employment back at PSV, where he signed a three-year contract; his side went unbeaten through the first 25 games of the 2009/10 season, but eventually finished third.
