Match background

- This game will bring back memories of Iceland's first-ever major tournament fixture, when they lost 3-1 to France to open UEFA Women's EURO 2009.
- Hólmfrídur Magnúsdóttir gave Iceland a dream start after six minutes but two penalties – one from Camille Abily, the other by Sonia Bompastor – prefigured a stunning Louisa Nécib goal to give France victory.
- The sides had also met in qualifying, where Iceland's 1-0 home win in June 2007 had alerted many people to their new ability to compete to reach major tournaments.
- France won the home return fixture to top the group but Iceland qualified through the play-offs.
- The teams then faced off in 2011 FIFA Women's World Cup qualifying with France prevailing 2-0 at home and 1-0 away.
- In fact, since that loss in Iceland ten years ago, France have gone on a European-record run of 41 straight qualifying group victories.
- The 2007 success is Iceland's only win against France in nine competitive meetings though they did hold them to a 3-3 home draw in the countries' first encounter in 1995 – a qualifier for the 1997 finals – losing the others.
- In those games France have scored 19 goals to Iceland's six; the sides have never met in a friendly.
- Iceland's Sara Björk Gunnarsdóttir and France's Élise Bussaglia were colleagues at Wolfsburg.

What to watch out for: In terms of raw talent, France perhaps ought to have been the dominant nation in Europe in recent years, rather than having suffered a series of quarter-final near-misses, at global level as well as in the past two EUROs. The UEFA Women's Champions League supremacy of Lyon, with a very similar squad to Les Bleues, is proof of that.

But it has not happened and three years after replacing Bruno Bini as coach, Philippe Bergeroo has himself made way for Olivier Echouafni. Can he help France turn their habitual superiority in big matches into goals? That is the key for the team who, on paper, should be Germany's strongest challengers.

One to watch: Sara Björk Gunnarsdóttir (midfielder, Rosengård)

What to watch out for: Long before Iceland's heroics at UEFA EURO 2016, the women had established themselves at the top level, qualifying in 2009 and getting through their group four years later. They achieved qualification this time with relative ease, only dropping points in a last-match defeat by Scotland with a finals place already secure.

The goals of Margrét Lára Vidarsdóttir (other than during a spell of maternity leave) have continued to propel the Icelanders, aided by the long-standing creative hub of Hólmfríður Magnúsdóttir, Harpa Thorsteinsdóttir and Sara Björk Gunnarsdóttir, and backed up by Dagný Brynjarsdóttir and Fanndís Fríðriksdóttir. A tendency to ship goals in the biggest games has been their Achilles heel, however.
