Match background

- Both these sides lost their openers on Sunday 1-0, Norway against the Netherlands and Belgium versus Denmark.
- Belgium are making their debut in a major finals while Norway have qualified for every FIFA Women's World Cup and UEFA Women's EURO other than the first European tournament in 1984.
- Norway have won nine of these teams' ten competitive meetings, the exception a 0-0 away draw in qualifying for the 1993 European finals. Norway were to win that title.
- Norway's 8-0 victory in Oslo in September 1992 remains Belgium's joint-record margin of defeat.
- Belgium did, however, win their only friendly against Norway 3-2 in Sint-Truiden in May 2015.
- Tessa Wullaert scored an 87th-minute winner in that match after Norway had twice equalised.
- That result was a little revenge for Belgium losing both of their Women's World Cup qualifiers against Norway for that year's finals.
- Kristine Minde hit a hat-trick for Norway in their 4-1 World Cup qualifying home win over Belgium at the Ullevaal Stadion in September 2013.
- In the return Norway prevailed 2-1 in Louvain with Ingvild Stensland and Ada Hegerberg scoring before Aline Zeler pulled one back.
- Wullaert is a Wolfsburg club-mate of Norway's Caroline Graham Hansen.

What to watch out for: In men's football they talk of Germany as a 'tournament team' but in the female game Norway have a claim to that title. They have exceeded expectations at the last three EUROS, getting to two finals and the 2009 last four, despite not possessing a squad to match their 1995 world champions or 2000 Olympic gold medallists.

Just like four years ago, they have qualified only to then change coach – this time Roger Finjord has departed, the assistant to Even Pellerud up until summer 2015 citing the commute to Oslo from his home in northern Norway as the cause. Results had also been mixed but Finjord's successor Sjögren, fresh from winning the Swedish title with Linköping, will inherit an exciting forward line of UEFA Best Women's Player in Europe 2015/16 Hegerberg, fit-again Caroline Graham Hansen and a re-inspired Isabell Herlovsen.

What to watch out for: A gradual improvement since Ives Serneels took over in 2011 has resulted in a maiden qualification for Belgium. In 2013 qualifying, they were just two points behind second-placed Iceland (and four off Norway), losing only one of their four games against that pair.

A similarly promising showing in 2015 World Cup qualifying boosted their seeding for this tournament, and they comfortably made it through behind England, whom they held away from home. Foreign club experience for the likes of Justien Odeurs, Lorca Van de Putte, Janice Cayman and all-time top scorer Tessa Wullaert has certainly enhanced their credentials.
