## Match background

---

- Both teams suffered tournament debuts with derby defeats on Wednesday, Portugal going down 2-0 against Spain while Scotland were on the wrong end of a finals record 6-0 scoreline versus England.
- Scotland and Portugal meet for the tenth time as they continue their debut final tournament campaigns in Rotterdam.
- They have met six times in competitive games, all UEFA Women's EURO qualifiers, with Scotland winning three, one draw and two Portugal victories.
- In 2009 qualifying, when Scotland reached the play-offs, they were held 0-0 at home but won 4-1 away with Jennifer Beattie's opener prefiguring a Julie Fleeting hat-trick.
- In 2005 qualifying, Scotland triumphed 2-1 at home and 8-1 away.
- By contrast, in 1995 qualifying Portugal won 8-2 at home and 2-1 in Scotland.
- Including friendlies – all three of which came between 2001 and 2002 – they have faced off nine times, Scotland winning five, drawing two and losing two.
- The goal count is 23-16 in Scotland's favour.

**What to watch out for:** In 2009 they were pipped in the play-offs by Russia on away goals, and four years later they conceded twice deep into extra time in Spain to be foiled at the last. Yet after those near-misses, Scotland are now in their first final tournament, dropping points in qualifying only at home to Iceland.

The longest-serving coach at the finals, Anna Signeul will end her 12-year Scotland reign by leading them in their first-ever major tournament. However, their preparations have been marred by injuries to Kim Little and Jennifer Beattie, two crucial players. While Jane Ross was a ten-goal qualifying joint-top scorer and the likes of Lisa Evans, Rachel Corsie, Ifeoma Dieke and the promising Erin Cuthbert mean Scotland still have a strong squad, they would have loved to have England-based Little and Beattie for the keenly-awaited opener against their neighbours.

**Coach:** Francisco Neto

**One to watch:** Cláudia Neto (midfielder, Linköping)

**What to watch out for:** All the other finals debutants commenced qualifying in the second tier of seeds, but Portugal were drawn from Pot 4 and ranked 25th of the 40 competing countries. Even so, they overhauled both the Republic of Ireland and Finland to earn a play-off, beating the latter in a memorable comeback from two goals down, Cláudia Neto hitting a hat-trick in a 3-2 triumph.

It was the third time they had been one two-legged tie away from the finals and, despite being held 0-0 at home by Romania, the return fixture ended 1-1 after extra time, a strike from debutant Andreia Norton securing Portugal a surprise EURO place on away goals. While they have experience of facing the elite sides from hosting the annual Algarve Cup each March, this is a huge step up for the Portuguese, even with a squad containing players with foreign know-how like Neto, Ana Borges and Ana Leite.
